# Editor's Comment

The parish council has similarly been contacted and several attempts have been made to resolve the problem.

In fairness, the problem seems to have lessened in recent times, presumably because the clamping firm involved has been persuaded to adopt a less aggressive approach. But the fact remains that signs displayed around a shopping centre - albeit not that shopping centre - albeit not that prominently - warning shoppers they are likely to be clamped, are not exactly good for business.

The Government has decided to introduce the ban in a bid to tackle rogue clamping operators who exploit drivers by charging exorbitant fees. Private firms will be banned from clamping or towing away vehicles but will still be able to ticket parked cars and landowners will be able to install barriers to prevent parking.

We accept that clamping was introduced in Culcheth in an attempt to protect parking spaces intended for shoppers from long-stay parkers, but we have always thought it was taking a sledgehammer to crack a nut. It has been made worse by the inflexible attitude of the clampers and the fact that the car parks involved look like public car parks rather than private one's.

The ban could be in place early next year when, presumably, the "clamping signs" will have to be removed. We would suggest that before they are replaced by some other restriction, consideration be given to allowing time to see if any restrictions are needed at

NOWHERE will there be more rejoicing over the proposed ban on wheel clamping on

private land, than in Culcheth.

Over recent years, we have been repeatedly approached by angry motorists who have found their cars clamped in Culcheth's shopping centre.

### Were the wildflowers blooming waste of time?

WAS the 'wildflower meadow' created on Culcheth's village green worthwhile?

Culcheth Members Glazebury Parish Council want to know what local people think - before deciding whether or not to plant more

next year. Coun Keith Bland said: "People seem to have differing opinions. Some have come to us and said how pleased they were and how beautiful the flowers

"Others have said they were disappointed and did not think much of the display. A particular criticism was that the flowers were predominantly yellow, rather than a mix of colours. "Last year we got a grant from the neighbourhood board to pay for the

flowers. If we are to do it again we will

have to fund it ourselves and the cost is around £1,200.

"We would really like people to let us know what they would like.

Wildflower planting in other parts of the borough has proved a great success - even benefiting the wildlife.

But at Culcheth the flowers appear to

have been trampled down in some areas leading councillors to wonder if they are only suitable for traffic islands where few people go.







# The Plough Inn

A VISITOR to Croft might easily miss The Plough Inn-and those that do are missing a little gem.

It's right at the end of Heath Lane, well away from the main village centre and, in fact, almost in Kenyon. It rightly styles itself as a "country pub" and, indeed, has a bar which still attracts locals who want to chat over a quiet pint as well as a cosy area for bar meals and a bijou restaurant set out with tables with spotless white tablecloths.

These were served in healthy portions and were well cooked and presented by a chef who clearly knew what he was about.

Among other dishes on the menu were a curry of the day, home made steak and ale pie, poached salmon with lemon parsley butter and Cumberland sausage. All were available with a choice of chips or a variety of potatoes.


It takes people with extremely healthy appetites to tackle three courses at The Plough but we managed an apple crumble and custard that was just like mother used to make.

Since TV chefs Hugh Fearnley-Whittingstall, Jamie Oliver and Gordon Ramsey began crusading against bad diets and championing organic alternatives, there has been a steady change in public attitudes towards where food comes from and how animals bred for food are treated.

And the latest additions to the Styles' family are testament to that message getting through.

message getting through.

Meet Shaw Street's newest residents, chickens Florence, Rocky (Balboa) and Bluebell and ducks Quacker and Crispy (so-called because of an initial dash for freedom towards the Chinese at the Pack Horsel.

They belong to Jo Styles and her fiance Jon Hall.

"After seeing programmes like Hugh Fearnley-Whittingstall's Chicken out! and The Big Food Fight, it's hard to carry on seeing food in the same

way," Jo said.
"We've got a small bit of land at the back of our yard which we wanted to grow vegetables on, and getting some animals just felt like the next step."

According to the British Egg Industry
Council, in the UK we consume 10
billion eggs a year and spend £700
million on them.

The hens will lay between 270 and 300 eggs per yeár, the ducks around 260.

Costing less than £10 to buy each bird, depending on how old they are, the average family could save more than £100 a year on chicken eggs.

Jon built the chicken run from two

doors and a bookshelf.

"The house is the most expensive bit, but you can find them second-hand

"They only need a square foot to sleep in and three square feet in the

Most chickens in battery farms live in a space no bigger than the page

you are reading.

A new trend has emerged in re-homing rescued battery chickens, which can become depressed in their surroundings, lowering their productivity, meaning they would otherwise be sold for other purposes.

The family barely throws away any waste, feeding kitchen scraps and old vegetable plants to the animals.

And the animal waste, which Jon said makes the best fertilizer, is composted to go on the vegetable patch.

"The most important thing for me," Jon said "is that it teaches kids to understand where food comes from".

Jo and Jon have just welcomed their first child, Emily, into their ever expanding brood.

It is unclear how many people are

shunning supermarkets to raise their own free-range poultry, but there is a wealth of information online and backyard coops are springing up across Culcheth

# Horse and public safety on the roads

On Saturday August 14 at about 2.30pm I witnessed a very distressing sight in Culcheth on Warrington Road at the junction near the Old Culcheth High School

An old bay horse had been pulling a gold painted wooden wedding carriage out of Shaw Street. When we arrived at the scene the horse was on its stomach in the middle of the road still harnessed. The horse remained in this position for some time. As an experienced rider myself I approached the carriage drivers to ask if they needed help. They said that the horse had slipped and was all right. When they managed to get it up on to its feet, it hung its head low and seemed very shaken by what had happened.

The drivers then proceeded to get it to trot on at a fast pace out of the village a few moments later, even though the horse's front right leg seemed to have been affected by the incident. It would have been better for the horse if it had gone off at a steadier pace.

The wedding party inside the carriage did not seem to be aware of what was going on. I appreciate that this was a very happy day for them but it clearly did not look very safe. It but in clearly dat not look very sale. It is a very busy road, as many people know, and there could have been a more tragic ending for the horse or any other road user.

hope that if any similar events that are planned in the future, more thought is given to the suitability of the horse to draw the carriage and to the particular route that is being used, with the welfare of the horse as a major consideration for all involved.


