I would appeal to everyone to be vigilant and if you believe you know the person or persons responsible for these shooting activities, please inform the authorities or your local councillor.

It is certainly very worrying that these kind of incidents have been taking place for at least 10 years and 1 would be most suprised if others weren't aware who was responsible.

Fears cat killer targeting family pets

VILLAGERS fear a cat killer is targeting family pets in the Culcheth area, following the disappearance of four cats in recent weeks, with a total of 10 being shot or disappearing so far this year.

In March this year a Bengal kitten from the Derwent Road area of Culcheth, was shot and killed by an air rifle pellet and found dead in a neighbour's garden in nearby Savarn Poad Severn Road.

Then in April a cat from the Shaw Street area was shot and injured by a pellet specifically designed for hunting and efficiently killing small animals.

There have been other shooting incidents in the area spanning a 10 year-period and now with four cats disappearing in recent weeks residents fear the cat killer is increasing activity. Local resident Michaela Simpson,

whose own pet Nelson (pictured right) has been missing for several weeks said: "Someone must be behind the missing presumed dead cats, so if more people are aware of what has been going on, then perhaps someone will see or notice something unusual and report it. "The police have been made aware, but without evidence cannot

follow up on any suspicions. "There are two cats missing from Derwent, one from Bent a Lane and our cat from Medway. Only a few months ago a cat was shot on Derwent and another taken to the

vets, also after being shot. "It's horrendous that this is happening to much loved pets and it's causing significant upset and

distress," added Michaela. Local Cllr Chris Vobe said: "I have spoken with a number of residents in the Newchurch area about this issue.

"It is very distressing for pet owners to learn that these shootings have been taking place, but we urge people to remain vigilant and report any matters of concern to local police."

Suzanne aims to swim the Channel



A WOMAN from Culcheth has vowed to swim the Channel in the name of charity -despite having a double hip replacement just two years ado.

ago. Suzanne Crippin, 28, recently completed two big swims - the Great North Swim in the Lake District and the Great Manchester Swim in Salford - to raise money for The Richard Sharp Sensory Library. The project is a tactile library, which is made up of themed boxes full of different textured items, such as a Christmas box with tinsel, crackers, baubles and more. The boxes are designed to stimulate

baubles and more. The boxes are designed to stimulate communication and memories for people who are both deaf and blind, in memory of Richard Sharp, who suffered from MELAS syndrome, a rare condition which took his sight, hearing and eventually his life. Suzanne (pictured), who had to have a double hip replacement after developing Avascular Necrosis, said:

developing Avascular Necrosis, said: "I met Sarah Sharp, Richard's widow, not long after the operation and was really touched by her determination and positivity.

"I got into swimming as part of my physiotherapy after having my hip operation and, after hearing about Sarah's project realised I could use my passion for it to make a difference.

She is also due to take part in The Great London Swim at Docklands in preparation for her end goal of

eventually swimming the Channel. Suzanne is taking her training seriously, practicing six days a week for at least an hour racking up two to three miles per day.

'I'm on a missión to raise as much as I can for the sensory library;

as I can for the sensory library; I've already managed to raise over £1100 in just a few weeks. "I plan to swim all five locations in the Great Swim Series next year and hopefully once I get to that stage I'll be ready to reach my end and finally unim the Channel goal and finally swim the Channel. I'm determined to get there!" added Suzanne.

The sensory library will be based in Northwich, at deafness charity Deafness Support Network's offices there.
