Dentist wins second planning battle

LYMM dentist Jill Cooper has won a second planning battle to enable her to expand her surgery against the wishes of her neighbours.

A government-appointed inspector has ruled that she can have a second dentist at her practice in Rushgreen Road - without the need for obscure glazing in a rear, first floor staff room and office.

Last May, borough council

planners approved Mrs Cooper's application for planning consent to increase the size of her surgery to make room for a second dentist.

But they imposed a condition that obscure glazing be installed in the rear window. More than 20 neighbours had opposed the proposals on the grounds of inspected pairs pathians. increased noise, parking problems

and lack of privacy.

They claimed 1,000 NHS patients were already using the surgery, plus a number of private patients and argued that if the numbers doubled

the problems would worsen.

Mrs Cooper subsequently appealed against the condition that she must have obscure glazing and the inspector who dealt with her appeal has ruled that it is

Itchy cats and dogs

Do you have an itchy dog or cat? One of the most common ailments seen in dogs and cats is itchy red skin or hair loss. This month we will cover some of the main causal factors of dermatitis (skin infection) in pets.

By far the most common cause of dermatitis is an allergy. Pets can be allergic to anything from insect bites to grass pollen (just like us). Fleas are the biggest culprit but can be swiftly eliminated by using a flea preparation available from the

If your pet only becomes itchy at a certain time of year then a seasonal allergy may be the causal factor. This is a reaction to a stimulus that occurs for a short period of time (i.e. grass or tree pollen).

Pets can also be allergic to things like washing powder, new carpets, house dust mites and even dog food! Thankfully there is a simple blood test available at Lymm Veterinary Surgery which can help us to determine what

your pet is allergic to.

Often the licking and scratching that your pet does can make the allergy worse by causing a secondary infection.

antibiotic tablets or cream

Sometimes an underlying disease can cause skin problems. underlying Thyroid imbalances may cause dull, flaky or greasy coat and some times itching and hair loss. Skin and ear infections are common with a condition called Cushing's Disease.



THE hugely popular annual Lymm Duck Race is set to take place on Easter Monday (April 5) with the aim of raising thousands of pounds for local good causes.

Last year's event raised over £4000 for local charities and community projects including: Cotebrook house, Riding for the Disabled, Steps (a local charity who work with children with limb disorders) and the revitalised Lymm Youth Club.

The Lymm Duck race is organised and run by the Lymm and District Round Table, who, as well as local charities and community projects, have also supported the Haiti appeal this year.

The format will follow last year's successful programme with the village closed to traffic to allow room for children's rides and local food outlets such as the Crazy Catering Company's Hog Roast and Moo Cow coffee van, plus the usual visiting traders.

The road closure makes the village centre a safer place for kids and also lends a little to the carnival atmosphere.

Tabler Scott Swiffen said: "The ducks themselves are already in training and will be launched upstream from the village and will then storm to a photo finish at the village duck pond!"

This year it's hoped that local charities and organisations will come along and help run some stalls. Possible suggestions include: Hook a Duck, Balloon Races, Easter Bonnet Competitions, etc.

Cross on the three Saturday mornings prior to the event and on the day itself.

Scott added: "Try and get your duck early as last year's queues on the day were very long. We are selling the $\mathfrak L1$ ducks as usual but there are also corporate and super sponsorship ducks. 

LAUGHTER and mystery will be the script when a Lymm theatre group takes its final bow this summer after 20 'really useless' years.

Players will call time on 'The Really Useless Theatre Company' after performing 'The Scramblings at Spriggly Torch' in June, as part of the Lymm Festival line up for 2010.

Richard Coleman and his former colleague Fred Aylin set up the 'am dram' group by chance in 1990 after staging a school production of the pantomime 'Cinderella'

"We thought we'd try and do a pantomime," said Richard, a teacher pantomime," said Richard, a teacher at Lymm High School, "but it went better than we ever could have hoped, so we just carried on."
"We ended up doing

performances and a matinee, so that was it - for the next 12 years we performed six shows a year.

The group of parents, governors and students pinched the name as a funny take on Lloyd Webber's 'Really Useful' production company and set about entertaining the people of

It moved away from panto and linked up with Lymm Festival, performing shows with more participation, offering audiences the chance to buy a table and bring food along to performances.

Over the years hundreds of Lymm

residents have been involved in the productions - around 40 pupils a year were involved in the early

pantomimes, both acting and behind the scenes.

The company has also raised over £10,000 for a range of local charities, including the Children's Adventure Farm and the Lymm based

Now rehearsals have started for its 20th and final show. The script, written by Richard, promises mystery and laughter – and sadness as the curtain comes down for the final time.



kLt Norman David Black remembered by a gravestone at St Mary's Church, although it is unlikely that his remains are interred there.

He was among some 1,500

He was among some 1,500 British and Native troops killed at the Battle of Isandhiwana, Natal, in South Africa on January 22, 1879 and most were buried under whitewashed stone cairns several weeks after the battle.

Dr Critchley said: "The Battle of Isandhlwana took place only hours before the famous defence of Rorke's Drift, when 11 VCs were awarded, but is not so well known.



Speed limits cut at danger hot spots

PLANS to cut the speed limit in danger hot-spots across Lymm village have been welcomed by a local safety campaigner.

The proposals, which are now set to be approved, will cut the speed limit on A56 Higher Lane to 40mph from the Jolly Thresher to Whiteleggs Lane, where the 30mph zone will

begin.

Campaigners hope this will

improve safety for pedestrians and motorists by slowing down the traffic entering the area.

High Legh Road, Burford Lane and Mill Lane are also set to become 40mph from the boundary of High Legh to the 30mph in Mill Lane. Cherry Lane will be reduced to

40mph from the clematis nursery near Cherry Farm to the present 30mph just before Booths Lane, making it safer for pedestrians and children heading for Cherry Tree School.

Lymm councillor and long term ad safety campaigner Sheila road safety campaigner Sheila Woodyatt, said: "The national speed limit, 60mph, exists on certain parts of Higher Lane and the side roads. We get cars whizzing along, going

like mad past people's houses."
"Whatever else you do, you cannot legislate for the idiots who take no notice and keep speeding.

"In Burford Lane and High Legh Road, there are many older people and young children about – and the speed of some cars is ridiculous."

"I am delighted that the proposals for the reduction in speed limit are set to be approved. This is long standing campaign of mine after many complaints from the local residents.

Sheila will be contacting police to see if Police Officers or Community Support Officers can carry out regular speed checks on the roads affected.

Double yellow lines at the junction of Boothshill Road and Highfield Road are also likely to be given the green light, which will improve visibility for local residents.

Red tarmac and slow signs have already been put in place at Camsley Bridge as well as hatchings and turning markings and a pedestrian refuge at the top of Barsbank Lane.

I wonder how often Chris Wakefield has negotiated the difficult process of turning onto Booths Hill Road from Highfield Road?Even he, I think, would agree that turning right is extremely difficult, particularly when cars are parked on Booths Hill Road near to the junction.

Garden store refused

PLANNING chiefs have refused permission for a garden store with office space above it in the grounds of a house in Cherry Lane, Lymm.
