LYMM milkman Raymond Broadsmith received a British Empire Medal in the Queen's Birthday Honours List.


The 48-year-old has been a volunteer for Lymm May Queen Festival, since 1975 when he was just 10-years-old.



THE UK has one of the poorest savings rates of all developed economies, resulting in a growing 'savings gap' - the difference between what people need to save for retirement or long term future, and what they actually are saving.

## Marje is worthy winner of Rotary's top community award

A woman who has touched the lives of thousands of people with her ongoing charity work was the worthy winner of Lymm Rotary Club's annual Cyril Bell Award for services to the community.

Marjorie Caine received the "Cyril Bell Memorial Award" trophy which is held for one year, a personal certificate and a cheque for  $\pounds500$  made out in favour of her chosen charity. Her sponsor was the Inner Wheel Club of Lymm.

Marge, as she is best known, was born in Burnley and moved to Blackpool in her teens. She married Mike in 1962 and they moved to Bedfordshire in the late 1960's with their two children, Heather and Andrew. This was when Marge first got involved with "People with Learning Difficulties" (PWLD) which she has continued with until this day.

She took a local job at a home with a man wanting to set-up a charity called MacIntyre, to look after and provide special care and education for people with learning difficulties. At this time it was mainly children with Down's syndrome who were often shunned by people in those days. She was now expecting

Matthew, their third child.
Two Down's children were abandoned and taken to the Home where the boss adopted one and Marge and Mike fostered the other, a little boy called Timmy. The Caine's now had two babies and two small children. In the late 1960's she started

experiencing hearing difficulties caused by meningitis and within a year had to use hearing aids. the time the family moved to Lymm in 1972 she was profoundly deaf. At this time there was no MacIntyre provision in North West England but Timmy went to a special boarding school in Bedfordshire, returning home for the holidays.

Her deafness became so severe that she studied and qualified in lip reading, later offering courses at Lymm High School teaching others. She worked with her students for several years.

Marge desperately wanted a MacIntyre presence in the North West and the CEO agreed that if West and the CEO agreed that if there was sufficient interest they would set one up. She worked tirelessly and 120 people turned up to a public meeting. It usually took five years to organise a MacIntyre group but Marge, being the dynamo that she is, created one in two years. Sadly, at this time, Marge's Timmy died suddenly and while the family was devastated. Marge worked on was devastated, Marge worked on, gradually developing the group into having 200 employees, looking after hundreds of "People with Learning Difficulties"

She raised money and acquired

premises to introduce an old for new baby clothes swapping facility. She knew that children between one and five years old quickly grew out of their clothes so Mums were able to bring clothes as a gift to MacIntyre and take away larger, washed and ironed clothes at a fraction of the ironed clothes at a traction of the price of new clothes. The PWLD washed, sewed and ironed the clothes helping them to develop skills in handling money and getting ordinary people to meet PWLD. This project lasted 5 years.

Marge persuaded Warrington Borough Council to let them use waste land in Victoria Park, Warrington, where her PWLD would work with the gardening tasks.

other groups with the gardening tasks and then set about raising money for

the project.

Produce was sold to pay for more tools and equipment and the project helped MacIntyre people to appreciate and learn horticultural tasks. This project is ongoing.

MacIntyre have a cafe where

learners are taught to cook, bake, prepare meals and make sandwiches for the general public. Learners are also taught how to deal with people and use a till.

The latest venture is called, "The Best of Northern Art". Marge, again using her persuasive powers with Warrington Council, obtaining the use of premises in the centre of town. The premises were too big for them, so they teamed-up with local artists and crafts people to display and sell their work, with MacIntyre taking a

percentage to cover costs.

Marge has touched the lives Marge has touched the lives of thousands of people, always for the better. These include deaf people, "People With Learning Difficulties", parents and families of PWLD, volunteers and employees of MacIntyre in the North West. In addition to the benefits, she has also raised awareness and spread information about PWLD.

She tried to retire when she was sixty – but became Head of Service. She then tried to retire at sixty five – but was asked to continue

Marge DID retire at seventy as Head of Service BUT she still works for MacIntyre two days a week and is a voluntéer two days a week when she is involved with raising money from any source she can.

## Rotary club secure a little girl's schooling

LYMM Rotary Club have helped secure a little South African girl's schooling.

Amina Neumann is a pretty, softly spoken little girl who deserves a chance in life.

She attends "Little Sparklers", part of Hope Education, where they educate, feed and support children in the East London area of South Africa who are either infected or affected by HIV and Aids.

Amina lives in Reeston, a dirt-poor area. There is no access to electricity or running water. There are no flush toilets and a bucket system is used as a toilet. These buckets are collected weekly and emptied. There is a huge

crime problem in this area and she is exposed to the threat of abuse and violence daily.

Her father drinks excessively and verbally abuses Amina and just recently he has kicked the mother and child out of their home and they are now seeking alternative accommodation.

The cost of Amina's schooling is £61.58 per month. This includes a first class education, 2 hot meals a day and transport to school and home again. The parents pay £30 per month school fees and transport costs.

Lymm Rotary club has paid Amina's school fees and transport costs for the rest of this year.

The senior teacher at "Little Sparklers", Penny Gasson, sent the following e-mail to the club, "Thank you so much. Amina's Mom will be overjoyed to know that Amina's schooling is sponsored for the rest of the year."


