Editor's Comment

JUDGING by reader feedback and what I am hearing on my travels the single biggest issue currently being discussed in the village is car parking.

The new pay and display systems on the village car parks - and the double parked traffic on Brookfield Road, are both hot topics at the moment

We hear that potential visitors to the village centre are staying away because of the reduction in free parking from two hours to one - while on Brookfield Road the double parking is causing real highway dangers and it will only be a matter of time before there 'is a serious accident.

Elsewhere in this edition you can

read about both issues - but it would appear the real issue is the long over due traffic and car parking survey which has been promised by the borough council for many months, if not years - which is still not scheduled to take place until at least the summer!

Just how long does it take for a couple of highway experts to visit Lymm, review the parking and traffic and present a report on their findings? Is it the case that the council have

made so many cut backs there are now simply not enough bodies available to get out to do the survey?



LYMM has a new youth café aiming to keep young people off the streets on Friday evenings. The Hub will be held at the Sanctuary Café, off the Davies Way car park, on

The borough council's development management committee rejected the plan to build a bungalow off Longbutt Lane, at its junction with Grammar School Road, after visiting the site.

Over a period of some 40 years there have been five previous planning applications for the site, all of which have been turned down

The most recent, two years ago, was for three affordable dwellings and went to an appeal before being finally refused. Other previous schemes have involved two retail units and a detached house with garage. In recent years, the site has lain

unused but at one time horses were grazed on it.

Nineteen nearby residents had lodged objections, along with Lymm Parish Council and local borough councillor Sheila Woodyatt. She said: "The site is totally

Car park changes lead to parking chaos

COUNCIL changes to free parking in the village centre car parks is being blamed for creating even more chaos on Brookfield Road.

During the working day vehicles e double parked causing are siginificant highway dangers, with the problem getting worse since Warrington Borough Council reduced free parking in the village centre from two hours to one.

Commenting on the parking problems Cllr Ian Marks said: "There have been parking and traffic problems on Brooktield Road for many months but the changes to parking on Davies Way and Henry Street car parks have made it even more chaotic.

"Cars park on both sides of the road and at times it is extremely difficult for vehicles to get through.



Some people think they are helping by parking on the pavement but this makes it impossible for mums with prams or disabled people. They have to go on the road, which is positively

dangerous. "The Council made a big mistake by imposing pay-and-display on both Henry Street and Davies Way. It has been a tremendous benefit for both visitors and traders on Pepper Street and they should have

just installed it on Henry Street. Instead the Council has been plain greedy and has imposed it on both čar párks together.

Olympic singing star set to appear with local choir

borough council. "The new, shorter free parking times on the car parks are driving people away from the village. "Is this what we want for Lymm? Surely not! It is about time people at the borough council listened to what the people of Lymm say. "The parish council has been putting pressure on the borough to think again about the car parks ever since the changes were first proposed, but the borough will not listen. listen

"On Dickensian Day the car parks were full, because waiting was banned in all the side roads around the village. "But at

"But at other times they are frequently half-empty while people are driving around looking for spaces to

"It is a terrible waste of an asset-and it is not doing the village any good."

Free parking is restricted to one hour on all three car parks while previously Pepper Street was available free for two hours and the other two were free all the time.



Rugby club raise £70,000 for good causes

LYMM Rugby Union Club has helped raise a staggering $\pounds70,000$ for good causes following a serious neck injury to one of their players.

'Bosh' Bennett was left Alex paralysed after suffering the neck injury in February 2012 and a subsequent celebrity 'Legends' rugby match and dinner featuring an array of internationals, on its own raised £56,000 for injured players' charities.

World Cup winners lason Robinson and Jason Leonard led out a host of top players, including former England internationals Nick Easter, Martin Corry and Kyran Bracken for Rugby Club last July. Many had played with Alex during his rugby career which included stints with Saracens, Orrell and England B.

Total fundraising, which included participation in the Great North Run, the Manchester to Blackpool bike ride, the Lymm 10k and corporate and individual donations, exceeded £.7 0,000.

These funds have been raised to support a range of causes including the RFU Injured Players Foundation, Spinal Research, the RPA Benevolent Fund (now Restart) both generally and specifically to assist in Alex's recovery rehabilitation needs, and other projects in spinal injury or with injured players and the upgrading of medical facílities at Lymm'RFC.

Alex was severely paralysed following the accident, with fears that he would never walk again. He has slowly been building his strength and endurance and is now able to walk around independently at home without the need for any walking aids. He is confident and positive about the future, including going back to work, and determined that his injury is a catalyst for positive development in both injured player support and that of spinal injuries

rehab. "The support my family and I have received from the rugby community has been truly humbling," said Alex. "It has set the standard for how an

injured rugby player and family should be looked after and I am immensely proud to be a member of



Lymm Rugby Club." Danny McNicholl, Chairman of Lymm Rugby Club, said: "Bosh is a remarkable individual to have achieved the progress he has made. achieved the progress he has made. We are all extremely grateful for the support this initiative has been given, and Alex is subsequently receiving during his recovery. In rugby, to be injured in this way is the nightmare scenario for any player and this serves to illustrate how the extended rugby family rallies round when it really matters." really matters.


