Lymm Runners pioneer 40 mile ultra run route

Warrington's first ultradistance run

- a 40 mile loop around the town which starts and finishes in Lymm. Dubbed the "Warrington Way", the route from Lymm mostly follows public footpaths, trails, and country

It takes in Rixton, Birchwood, Croft, Winwick, Burtonwood, Bold, Penketh, Moore, Hatton, Stretton, and High Legh before ending in

Lymm again.
Fourteen Lymm Runners took on all or part of the gruelling route on nearly the shortest day of the year
Saturday December 20 – starting

at 7am and finishing about 4pm. In very wet conditions, runners Georgina Walker and Phil Rowen were delighted to complete the full 40 miles for the first time.

running just two years ago with Lymm Runners, and would never have imagined that by now I would be taking on an ultra like this! Those last few miles were so incredibly tough, but I made it."

Run organiser Kieran Walshe said: "We are planning to organise a race on this fabulous 40 mile route in 2015 - which runners can enter either solo, or in relay teams of 4 people. There are no ultradistance races in Warrington at the moment, and it's a growing sport with lots of people who've done a marathon wanting to find a new challenge. Community Energy for Lymm comes a step closer

LOW Carbon Lymm's "Lymm Community Energy" has formally been established as a Community Benefit Society.

Zoe Cohen, Chair of Low Carbon Lymm said: "We are delighted to announce

that Lymm Community Energy has now been formally established as a Community Benefit Society with the Financial Conduct Authority."

Lymm Community Energy (LCE) has been set up by Low Carbon Lymm in collaboration with Warrington Borough Council. LCE is a new social enterprise which will create opportunities to invest in Lymm's energy future. As a Community Benefit Society, LCE will enable local people and organizations to invest in renewable energy installations that benefit the local community. LCE is the first

renewable energy installations that benefit the local community. LCE is the tirst community energy company in Warrington.

LCE will raise funds by issuing shares to investors who will then become members of the Society. The groups first projects will be solar photovoltaic (PV) systems fitted to community buildings. The occupants of the buildings will get lower cost energy, whilst the investors will get a return on their investment – and any surplus will fund community energy efficiency projects.

LCE aim's to install systems on buildings that benefit as many community members as possible, such as schools, community centres, libraries, church halls and sports clubs. They plan to open their first share offer early in 2015 and for the first scheme to be operational in Spring/Summer 2015. You can pre-register

Comedian Arthur Smith to perform in Lymm

COMEDIAN and TV and radio presenter Arthur Smith is to headline Lymm Festival's "Winter Warmer" programme with his one-man show "At Your Service" at Statham Lodge Hotel on Sunday, February 1.

Arthur was one of many standup performers on the alternative comedy scene in the 1980s and still performs today in much the same manner.

He has regularly attended the Edinburgh Fringe comedy festival since 1977, compered the long-running Hackney Empire New Act of the Year competition final and also written a bedy of serious or also written a body of serious or semi-serious work, including stage plays such as 'An Evening with

Gary Lineker'.

Musical comedy shows such "Arthur Smith sings Leonard Cohen" were broadcast on BBC Radio 4, where Arthur has also programmes such as "Excess Baggage" and "Loose Ends." A regular on TV comedy panel

games, Arthur also took over as narrator of the TV series "A Life of Grime" after the death of John Peel.

He was also one of the Grumpy Old Men of the television series of that name and has appeared on many television comedy panel games.

Warrington born instrumentalist Pete Price is to make his first major appearance at the Lymm Festival since 2007.

Pete is best known as a guitarist Pete is best known as a guirarisi and singer influenced by blues legends such as Big Bill Broonzy, Blind Blake, Robert Johnson and Blind Boy Fuller. But he also acknowledges the influence of Led Zeppelin, the Kinks and the Rolling Stones and has a wide and varied apparticipating including expectives. including repertoire versions of Latin American dance

tunes, Indian Ragas, Celtic harp

and Eastern European music.
His album "Big Road Blues", has consolidated his reputation by demonstrating his complete mastery of classic country and Delta blue's styles as well as ragtime, jazz and beyond - not to mention his own compositions! By his teens he was a competent ukulele, mandolin and tin whistle player and soon after he was drawn to the acoustic guitar.

His recent concert at The Pyramid, Warrington, quickly sold out so demand for tickets is likely to be high.

Lymm councillor to stand for Parliament

LYMM councillor Bob Barr has been selected as the Liberal Democrat Parliamentary candidate for Warrington South in May's General Election.

A Lymm parish councillor since 2004 and a borough councillor since 2006, Cllr Barr has lived in Lymm since 1982 with his wife, Caroline and daughters Sarah and Katie.

An academic geographer, he has taught about Warrington since 1975, so feels he knows the constituency

He is an internationally recognised expert in geographical information systems and was awarded an OBE

"for services to geography" in 2008. He has been called on on numerous occasions to serve as an expert adviser to government in his

Currently, he is deputy leader of the Liberal Democrat Group on

Warrington Borough Council.

He said: "I want to represent
Warrington because it is a fascinating and successful town that faces many challenges.


"The project of integrating the New Town areas with the old town has never been properly completed. It is now more important than ever, with new powers and funds on offer


to Manchester and Liverpool, that Warrington's voice is heard.

"I wouldn't be interested in representing any other constituency. Having lived in Warrington South for half my life I want to be an MP to represent the town and to ensure that we get a fair deal from central government. I believe that I am very well qualified to do that. I am the only candidate from the three main parties with true roots here and a long record of serving the residents of Lymm and Warrington"

Cllr Barr said the 2010 election result saw Warrington South become a three way marginal, with the results for the three major parties closer than at any other time in the constituency's

history. He added: "Voters in Lymm have the opportunity to make a real difference to the result of the next general election, because their votes will really count. Any of the major party candidates could win this seat and that can lead to real influence in Westminster.

Chair of governors Keiran Walshe said Mr Williams recognised the improvements made in the school over the last year, but also understands that there was still much to do to see the school and its

much to do to see the school and its students achieve their full potential. Mr Williams attended a comprehensive school in North Wales, then went to the University of Cambridge and graduated with a first in politics and social sciences. He then worked for a time in industry, before training as a history teacher at Oxford University, and has worked in a number of different schools. He is

a keen sports player, particularly hockey which he played at an international level for Wales when he was at school.

For the past 18 months the school has been under the leadership of interim executive principal Tarun Kapur from the Dean Trust.

Mr Kapur was drafted in following the suspension of former Head Teacher Angela Walsh, who eventually resigned.

Mr Walshe added: "The school has gained a great deal from the experienced leadership of Mr Kapur and the support of other colleagues from the Dean Trust.

"I have no doubt we will continue to work together in the future in a number of areas."

Thanks to a WREN Landfill



Plan to re-develop "sprawling" site

A MAJOR plan for the re-development of a sprawling, four-acre site at Lymm for leisure, storage, distribution or office use has been given the go-ahead by Warrington planners.

The development will take place at Tanyard Farm Estate, off Rush Green Road, Lymm and will involve the demolition of the sprawling,

poor quality buildings and hardstanding currently existing on the site.

Members of the borough council's planning committee were told the

development – which would have parking for 56 cars - adjoined the site of the former Rush Green Service Station, which has already been given planning consent for a new supermarket.

Some 57 parking spaces had been approved as part of the

supermarket plan.

Lymm Parish Council offered qualified support for the scheme. While they welcomed proposals to tidy up the site they were concerned that the proposed building would be "rather voluminous and intrusive" and might not fit in with adjacent Green Belt land.

There was also concern about the extra traffic that would be

refere was also concern about the exital inflict lind would be attracted to the site, particularly as there would be parking for 113 vehicles on the development and adjoining supermarket scheme.

Neighbours were concerned at the height of proposed buildings, intensification of use of the site, the visual impact and traffic

implications.

But there was also support from people who welcomed promised

landscaping improvements.

Officers argued that overall the development was acceptable, subject to suitable design safeguards.

The committee imposed conditions that the car park should have a

"grass-crete" surface and suggested that the applicant should carry out improvements to adjoining land which was currently an eyesore.
