A LYMM resident has been appointed a non-executive director of leading mental health trust Mersey Care NHS Trust.

LYMM Historic Transport Day is aiming to "take to the air" this year with an even more complete look at transport heritage than last year's inaugural event - with organisers hoping for a fly past of pre-war bi-planes.

After some initial concerns about the need for more volunteers the good news is that Lymm Historic Transport Day is all set to go again on Sunday June 29 – the last day of Lymm Festival.

Event Director Alan Williams said: "This was a big, complicated event last year and we were running with quite a small team. Fortunately though, some of the local exhibitors have stepped forward to take on key roles and things are now starting to take shape with a great team.

Some of last year's favourites are now confirmed for a return like "Saturn" the last of the Shropshire "flyboats" which a hundred years ago was carrying cheese to Manchester but now delivers heritage education to local schools. And just as last year the event will have everything from penny-farthing bicycles to steam rollers as well as hundreds of classic cars. The accent will be on joining in where possible with rides and

parades that all the family can enjoy. Cheshire Fire Service will be rolling up with a vintage 1949 Fire Folling up with a Vintage 1949 Fire Engine and the organisers are also hoping to have a fly past of pre-war bi-planes. "Friends of the Forties" will be providing the music on the main event field for what promises to be another memorable day that aims to recapture some of the local wartime spirit.

Wartime spirit. Last year's event even resulted in a book celebrating Lymm's Transport Heritage "The Wheels and the Water" which sold over 500 copies in just four weeks in December. Part of the profit from the book will go toward funding this year's event. The organizers are still keen to

House can be built in garden

A NEW detached house can be built in the garden of an existing property in Rushgreen Road, Lymm, planners have decided. Members of Warrington's planning committee approved the outline proposals despite objections from neighbours, Lymm Parish Council and the reservations of local borough councillors.

reservations of local borough councillors. The meeting was told a meeting had been held between neighbours and the applicant in an attempt to resolve differences but those who attended felt their concerns had been dismissed by the applicant. As a result they still objected, particularly about the loss of privacy and light. Other objections referred to overdevelopment of the site, loss of amenity, additional traffic and noise and disturbance. Two neighbours said they would support the scheme provided the new dwelling was no higher than single storey.

dwelling was no higher than single storey. Although it was an outline application, the committee was told the new property would be of two storeys but small in scale. There would be a single access to serve both dwellings, which would involve widening the existing access. One tree would be removed from the site, together with an existing Anderson shelter.



IT will probably be at least 12 months before there is any change to the current pay-and-display parking system at Lymm – if indeed there is to be any change at all.

This seems to be the situation following a meeting between shopkeepers' representatives, local councillors and transportation chiefs from the borough council.

But the most likely outcome seems to be a "pay-as-you-leave" system, with the first hour free. Council chiefs were unwilling to reinstate the two hour free period

because this would not produce enough revenue to cover the cost of

enough revenue to cover the cost of running the car parks. But local councillors Bob Barr, Ian Marks and Sheila Woodyatt were united in supporting the two hour free period and pledged to continue the fight to get it restored. Another option discussed was

one where traders would refund parking charges to customers in return for a minimum spend and shopkeepers hope to arrange a meeting to consider this soon as it would require a measure of agreement between traders.

Shopkeepers' representatives took the opportunity to urge the borough to improve car park signage and also suggested that

the Davies Way and Henry Street car parks should be treated as one large car park and made a one way system.

way system. Parking problems in Brookfield Road were also discussed. After the meeting, Cllr Woodyatt said while some positives had emerged, she was concerned that the borough was comparing Lymm with Stockton Heath.

"There is absolutely no comparison" she said. "Stockton Heath is a much larger shopping centre and Lymm stands to lose much more from parking restrictions." Cllr Marks said he was disappointed to see that council officers seemed not to be

considering the impact of parking charges on shopkeepers and were only concerned about making the

only concerned about making the car parks profitable. "There is no doubt trade in Lymm is being damaged by the parking charges. Footfall is down but, perhaps even more important, people are not spending enough time in the village." There will be no changes to the present system until a new parking

present system until a new parking services contract is awarded in

July and any change is likely to be trialled at Stockton Heath before being introduced in Lymm.

In the meantime, the borough will be studying the latest car park technology.




