It has been lovingly restored and now carries passengers. It will arrive in Lymm on June 19 ready to offer trips to children as part

Vision became a reality

TWENTY five years ago Lymm resident Marje Caine had a vision.

She wanted the Downes Syndrome boy called Timmy that she and her husband Mike had fostered, to have the education and training that the national charity called MacIntyre Care provided for people with learning difficulties.

Marje had worked with MacIntyre at its headquarters.

in Bedfordshire before she, her husband Mike and four children moved to Lymm. However there was no MacIntyre service anywhere in the North West.

Marje (pictured right) was profoundly deaf due to meningitis when a small girl, but this did not stop her vision. She contacted MacIntyre and asked them which was needed to get them to come to the NW. Λ what was needed to



A daunting action program with a timescale of at least five years was explained. With her dedication and help from friends the time it actually took was reduced to less than three years.

MacIntyre was set up in Warrington and has since expanded into, Chester, Wirral, Ellesmere Port and Bury.

Marje saw her vision grow becoming Head of Service at MacIntyre's Learning Centre. Some of the major undertakings of the Learning Centre include a cafe run by MacIntyre and its learners at the Gateway Centre, a large garden at the back of Victoria Park with an orchard, propagating and growing areas for flowers and vegetables as well as a beautiful Healing Garden.

The latest venture is the Community art and crafts Gallery next door to B&M in Warrington, which displays works by MacIntyres learners and local

Marje now aged 72, still works part-time. She has seen her dream grow in the North West to its present size of over 200 employees, looking after hundreds of people with learning difficulties. Not bad for a woman who through it all was profoundly deaf

ON a cold and windy evening members of Heatley WI thought a talk about ice cream would not be appropriate.



The meeting ended with tea, coffee, chocolate biscuits and a good chat.







Association spokesman and retired planner Ian Estall said: "House-building interests are pressing for Warrington to accept a bigger share of housing with Lymm and Oughtrington very much in their sights. Whilst the Borough Council has produced a strong case for limiting future house-building, the Association is concerned that developers might see new

Government policy as encouraging a more free and easy approach to releasing land for building.

"The Association is pleased that its determination to protect the Green Belt is shared by Lymm Parish Council. We have both put our case to the Council's planners and trust that this will help them to win the argument at the public examination of the plan which takes place in Warrington, starting

on 30 April, with the outcome to be known later this year."

Association founder member, Joyce Penlington, is keen that local people should to be kept informed of events as they unfold and hopes to be able to spread the word through a local meeting to be held in the near future.

Cyclists - does this ring a

CYCLISTS who use the Bridgewater Canal towpath and the Trans Pennine Trail at Lymm pose a threat to pedestrians - and themselves -according to a local man. Alan Arstall has been walking

both the towpath and the trail in recent months as he recuperates after a triple heart by-pass operation - and as a result has become aware of how many cyclists don't have bells on their bikes.

He said: "A walker cannot always hear a cyclist approaching from behind and I have witnessed a

"It is not just the walkers at risk-it's the cyclists as well. Particularly on the canal towpath, where they shouldn't be cycling anyway.

between one cyclist and a group of walkers who did not hear him approaching from behind. "The cyclist claimed the walkers had not heard his bell - but I spotted

Mr Arstall also expressed surprise at a number of dog walkers who carry "poop scoops" and plastic bags, use them to pick up their dog's mess - but then throw the plastic bags away.

"It would be better to leave dog mess on the ground to rat away.

mess on the ground to rot away naturally than to leave it lying around in plastic bags," he said.
