Editor's Comment



WHAT are we to make of the controversy surrounding Walton Hall and Gardens?

Firstly, surely, we must recognise that the public uproar is an indication of the affection local people feel for the hall and its grounds.

Secondly we must agree - and the borough council has already accepted this - that the council's communication with the public on this issue has been poor.

Thirdly - and now we begin to stray into difficult areas - we should try and accept that it is not too late to put

things right.
We can accept the council's

argument that they could not consult until there was something to consult

on - but only to a certain extent.

The public deserved to be consulted as soon as the idea of a partnership with a private sector company was even thought of. Certainly before the partner was chosen.

Councillors can hardly be surprised there is public disquiet when the consultation starts only after the partner has been chosen and the

identity of that partner leaks out.

The fact that the partner was selected from a "shortlist" of just one only makes matters worse. The public is bound to see it as a "done deal" and to distrust everything the council now savs.

So how to put things right? Ideally, the council and the Contessa hotel group should come up with a proposal that will remove the fears of local people that public access to the hall and grounds will

be lost.

If they can't, probably the only solution will be to scrap the so-called master plan, go back to square one and start again. Openly and transparently.

Sponsored toilets?



Walton Hall: Council faces a challenge

THE borough council's controversial plan to go into partnership with a private company to develop Walton Hall as a luxury hotel and conference centre is to be examined by Town Hall scrutiny chiefs.

Coun Terry O'Neill, leader of the Labour opposition group on the council, has "called in" the executive board's decision to continue talks with hotel group Contessa, despite assurances from the council that full public consultation will take place before a final decision is taken.

He questions the legality of the decision because, he maintains, the consultation will be only on a "master plan" drawn up by thé council and the company.

There was no prior consultation on the vision for Walton Hall and no proper, open procurement process, he says.

Scrutiny chiefs will now examine the decision process closely - although they cannot force the executive board to change its decision.

The strength of public feeling - reported in Village Life last month -



was demonstrated when more than 200 angry residents demonstration outside the Town Hall when the executive board met to consider the

A petition signed by more than 7,000 people was handed in and the meeting heard more than 17,000 people had supported the "Save Walton Hall" camparign on the social

vivalin Hall campaign on the social networking site Facebook.

After a lengthy debate, the board unanimously approved two proposals to agree a draft master plan as a basis for public consultation, with the results of the consultation to be reported back to the board for consideration, and to approve continued discussions Contessa.

Council leader Ian Marks admitted



the council's communication with the public had not been ideal. But he argued that until the master plan had been drawn up there had been no detailed proposal on which to consult the public.

"The proper consultation starts tonight," he said. "The irony is, we are

all on the same side. We all want to save Walton Hall and Gardens."

The meeting was told there would be widespread consultation with exhibitions, leaflets, and copies of the draft master plan in libraries and other public buildings. The council wanted everyone to contribute.

Playing field could be 'tribute to the Queen'

A CALL has been made for a popular playing field in Stockton Heath - threatened by housing development - to be saved as a tribute to the Queen.

Resident Michael Foxall told Stockton Heath Parish Council that he was anxious to save Cartwright's Field. He suggested the land should be included in a campaign headed by Prince William to save hundreds of playing fields across the country.
They would be named as Queen

Elizabeth II Playing Fields, to mark the Monarch's Diamond Jubilee in 2012.

Mr Foxall complained the land, which has planning permission for affordable housing, had been fenced off and children denied access.

He said: "Since I moved to the area in 1982 this land has always been available to children. This is an ideal spot for a possible park.
"What better tribute to Her Majesty

during her Diamond Jubilee?" In the 1930s King George V, then Prince of Wales, had a programme to make playing fields available for youths, he said.

Chairman Coun Roughsedge said Alexandra Park had originated in this way. Mr Foxall said Stretton Parish Council was considering the scheme and that he planned to also talk to Appleton. The field was a "perfect place" for such a playing field.

"I am asking the parish council to back me to make sure that Cartwright's Field stays as it has been for the last 20 years as a place for children to play."



Vandal attack on historic garden

POLICE are stepping up patrols around the historic Grappenhall Heys Walled Garden following a third attack by vandals.

Hooligans broke into the garden overnight and caused extensive damage to plants, shrubs and property - the main target apparently a fruit cage which has now been vandalised three times since it was installed last year.

In addition a pair of gates were heavily damaged and a newly installed marquee in the rear countyard was also vandalised. A tree was pulled down and a wide range of fruit and vegetable plots were damaged.

Bob Jennings, age 67, of Appleton found the damage on a Sunday morning when opening up the garden.

Volunteer worker Bob, a member of the Friends of Grappenhall Heys Walled Garden, who has been helping out there since 1991, said: "I was completely taken aback to see the devastation again. It really makes you wonder if it is all

Police are investigating the incident and have confirmed that patrols would now be increased in the area.

Green belt home given the go-ahead

A PLAN to convert a Green Belt stable block into a new home has been given the go-ahead, despite from fierce objections councillors.

The borough council's planning sub-committee approved the scene at Birch Tree Farm, Appleton in the face of claims that applicant John Bryan deliberately circumvented planning regulations.

Strong objections were lodged by Appleton Parish Council.
Coun Brian Axcell claimed the

Coun Brian Axcell claimed the building - erected less than nine years ago - had never been used as stables.

He said: "If permission were to be granted for residential use, planning regulations would have been circumvented. Permission would have been gained for something which would certainly have been refused if an application for residential use had been made at the outset."

Appleton Parish Council argued

that the application was contrary to borough council policy on managing the housing supply which stated that conversions of farm buildings for residential development would not be allowed.

Planning officers admitted a residential application in 1991 would probably have been refused but said the issue now was for the reuse of a building in the Green Belt.

Residents only parking

PLANS to set up "residents' only" parking schemes in Stockton Heath have moved a step closer.

Parish Council members heard the borough council was shortly to start consultation in one of the areas - bounded by Fairfield Road, Alexandra Road and Victoria Road where parking problems occurred. Clerk Peter Briggs said he felt it was a "positive step" that consultation was starting. Other areas had been defined and would be considered in the future.

Coun Sonia Boggan said the defined area included Gaskell Street and Warburton Street, where parking had been a constant problem. Many properties in the area were flats and there were many cars parked there in the evenings and at weekends.

Mystery posts


TWO mystery posts in Stockton Heath are to be removed.

VILLAGERS at Appleton Thorn near Warrington, were transported back to medieval times during the annual Bawming the Thorn ceremony.

Youngsters from Appleton Thorn

Primary School performed the traditional Bawming the Thorn Dance, while other youngsters dressed in fancy dress as pupils danced around the Bawm tree, which has origins dating back to the days of the crusades.

Each June, the village hosts the ceremony of "Bawming the Thorn". The cyrrent form of the ceremony dates from the Nineteenth Century, when it was part of the village's "Walking Day".

The ceremony stopped in the 1930's, but was later revived by the then headmaster, Mr. Bob Jones in

"Bawming the Thorn" occurs on the Saturday nearest to Midsummer's

"Bawming" means "decorating" during the ceremony the thorn tree is
decorated with ribbons and garlands.
According to legend, the hawthorn
at Appleton Thorn grew from a cutting

of the Holy Thorn at Glastonbury, which was 'itself said to have sprung from the staff of Joseph of Arimathea, the man who arranged for Jesus's burial after the Crucifixion.

Other parish councils in the area rotated the roles in a more fair and equitable way.

"I am energetic and keen to serve the residents of Stockton Heath, and would have brought a new dimension to the role. We, as councillors, need to engage more with borough council officers to get things done, rather than relying upon the clerk," he added.

Money Column

Budget not as bad as first feared

So we now have the first budget from the Tory/Libdem coalition, and in many ways it is not as bad as many people feared.

Firstly, the widely expected increase in VAT from the current rate of 17.5% to 20% has been confirmed. However, the implementation of this increase has been delayed until 4th January 2011. It is to be hoped that this delay is sufficient to avoid the 'double-dip' recession that many commentators fear will be the result of this increase. It will certainly enable everyone to time any major expenditure that they may be planning over the next twelve months to avoid this increased cost.

increased cost.
Secondly, Capital Gains Tax has been increased from 23 June 2010 as expected from prior annuncement by expected from prior announcements by government spokespeople. However, the increases are again not as large as many commentators feared. There is now a 'basic' rate of CGT which remains at 18%. If, however, after all allowances have been taken the total of a person's income and capital gains is enough to breach the higher rate threshold for income tax then any capital

gains above that threshold will be taxed at 28%. This compares with the worst fears of some commentators who fears of some commentators who expected all capital gains to be taxed at the taxpayers marginal rate, which would have meant tax rates of 20% and 40%, with some larger gains even being taxed at 50%.

And there is even better news on capital gains in that the rate for assets qualifying for Entrepreneurs Relief has remained at 10%. Not only that, the lifetime limit on the value of gains that are eligible for Entrepreneurs Relief has been increased from £2m to £5m.

Thirdly, progressively lower rates of Corporation Tax have been announced

as follows:

The vast majority of companies are one-man owner managed companies paying at the small companies rate and so the reduction is not huge for those, but it is still better than the rises planned

but it is still better than the rises planned by the previous government. It is not all good news, however. The planned reduction in government spending, for instance, will have a huge impact on the economy in this area. And there are increases in other areas of taxation. We have run out of space but we would be pleased to advise further on the whole hudget.

I read the article "Falling on Deaf Ears "in Village Life (June)where a gentleman had walked out of a meeting as he could not hear as he was wearing a hearing aid. He suggested that if there was a loop system in the room he could have participated in the discussion. The councillors answer to this was that they would try to talk louder.

May I suggest that that is not the answer and if anyone has experienced deafness they would realise this! Very many people, however loud they talk, do not look at the person they are talking to, do not speak clearly and also often put their

unconsciously. The best and only answer to deafness is a loop system; these are very often available in theatres, churches and public buildings, the best ones often being in crematoriums. Deaf people very often feel left out in many social events as they tend to hear only half a conversation and feel disinclined to contribute to the conversation in case they have misheard and throw something something spurious into the conversation. We can always have a laugh about it, not hearing or mishearing, but it is embarrassing. I speak from experience. The gentleman at the meeting was disenfranchised which is a fundamental right of all British people. The council carry the legal obligation to cater for disabled people, a right

hands over their mouths. Deaf people

to a certain extent lip-read even fairly

enshrined in law. The cost of the hardware for a loop for the Village Hall would be £300/£400 and is obtainable from suppliers on line, as is confirmation of price.
