In recent years, the association has also put on an open day as part of the Stockton Heath Festival.



Highways dispute took planners back 246 years

IT was been one of the longestrunning highways disputes at Appleton in living memory - and it might not be over yet.

Researchers have gone back as far as the 1765 Appleton and Lymm Enclosure Act to decide whether Firs Lane - and an adjoining section of Park Lane are maintainable at public expense.

The Appleton and Lymm Enclosure Award of 1768 has been studied, as have commercial maps published between 1777 and 1831 and the Highways Act of 1835.

Nothing definite has been established - but borough council highways officer John Thorp has finally concluded that, on the balance of probabilities, Firs Lane and an unadopted length of Park Lane, are public carriageways maintainable at public expense.

It all started in 2009 when a Firs Lane resident challenged the borough council for including the road as an available route for cycling in a guide to cycle ways in the borough.

The complainant asserted there were no public rights of way over Firs Lane, which, he said, was privately maintained. Council officers had assumed it to a highway, privately maintainable.

Town Hall chiefs decided the issue was whether Firs Lane should be left as it was, formally adopted by the council or designated as a wholly publicly maintainable road.

Residents were divided. Some wanted to maintain the status quo, even though it would mean they had to pay for maintenance themselves. Others wanted the council to maintain it. Few, if any, wanted it to be adopted which would mean it being properly surfaced, kerbed and lit.

The borough's traffic committee has decided on a compromise publicly maintainable road.

Appleton parish councillor John Price said: "The majority of residents wanted to maintain the status quo, but most seem to feel they can live with the compromise.

"They feel that if the road is adopted and becomes a properly surfaced road it will become a 'rat run' for motorists using it as a short cut.

"But at least one resident wants to take the matter further to try and keep things as they are.'



Thelwall - city of legend

LEGEND says it was once a city. It is most famous for a viaduct that isn't even in the same parish.

Electric car scores well on safety

THE first ever crash test on an electric car carried out by Euro NCAP - the European New Car Assessment Programme - has allayed safety fears about the new vehicles.

A Mitsubishi I-MiEV supermini was awarded an overall score of four out of a possible five stars.

As a result, crash test experts believe five star protection is attainable for future electric cars.

Edmund King, the AA's president, welcomed the test result.

Three-in-one car unveiled

VOLVO have unveiled the V60 plugin hybrid - which they claim features the best properties of three different car types in one, single attractive sports wagon.

Three buttons on the centre console give the driver access to either an electric car with a range of up to 50km, a high-efficiency hybrid with carbon dioxide emissions averaging just 49g/km or a muscular, fun-to-drive car with acceleration from 0-100km in just 6.9 seconds.

He said: "This i-MiEV sets a benchmark in safety that other electric vehicles will have to achieve. From the point of view of future buyers, the success of this crash test will dispel much of the worry about what happens when an electric car is involved in a significant crash."

The same 4-star rating applies to the Citroen C-Zero and the Peugeot iOn, both of which are structurally identical to the Mitsubishi i-MiEV and have the same interior fittings and levels of safety equipment.

Crash testers' chief worry was how well the car's batteries stood up to the impact and the effectiveness of cutoff switches in insolating the highvoltage battery. Euro NCAP observed that no electrical or fire hazards were detected during the testing of the i-

Euro NCAP has recently crash tested four other new cars and awarded stars as follows: Dacia Duster (small offroad 4x4) 3 stars; Mitsubishi ASX (small family) 5 stars; Nissan Juke (supermini) 5 stars; Hyundai ix20 (small MPV) 5 stars.



Save money by driving slower

AS fuel costs soar, millions of motorists are driving more slowly on motorways to try and save money.

Some 59 per cent of all drivers say they are reducing speeds to cut fuel consumption - and among women drivers, the figure rises to 65 per cent.

Drivers are now paying more than £10 more per tank of diesel than a year ago, and more than £8.40 more per tank of petrol, according to one survev.

Sticking to the speed limit, especially on motorways is one of the most effective ways to cut fuel costs. Cruising at 80mph is not only illegal, but it uses up to 25 per cent more fuel than driving at 70mph.

Experts say that sticking to the 70mph limit on motorways can save £500 a year on fuel.

Will motorists who say they will drive slower actually do so? The evidence suggests they are doing. Speeds on local motorways appear to have dropped in the last 12 months although of course there are still plenty of those drivers who appear to think the speed limits only apply to other people!

How big a problem is record keeping?

During the development of HMRC's new powers, and when the tax authority was ready to start bringing forward legislation, it set out its objectives for compliance checks on taxpayers including businesses.

It is envisaged that an officer of HMRC might begin a compliance check in respect of any of the relevant taxes for one or more of a number of purposes. These include checking that:

- a tax return, amendment to a return or claim is correct
- statutory record keeping requirements are being met

 tax has not been underpaid or over-
- any issues concerning possible tax

avoidance are considered."

The second of these objectives is now generating some publicity and HMRC is expected to target smaller businesses to check the quality of their records during 2011. Although the stated intention of the record keeping checks is to ensure that smaller firms are keeping adequate records, there are potentially more serious issues at stake than a "slapped wrist" for poor records. There is not presently any evidence that HMRC is planning a "big stick" approach to smaller businesses, but

the consultation process that concluded on 28 February made it clear that there will be a focus SME record keeping in 2011. There is also some history for HMRC of looking at business records (in the relatively recent past) and being dismayed with what was observed!

'Interventions'

The 2006 Budget included details of HMRC's plans to use new approaches to compliance. Business and the compliance. accountancy profession were consulted to see how this might work. Although this all occurred five years ago, the work done then will have a bearing on what happens

Almost as soon as the consultation closed, HMRC announced a trial of the new methods that started on 10 July 2006. The accountancy profession's view was that the trial was set under way far too quickly, and many advisers had doubts

about participating in the trial.

Although the 2006 pilot scheme was much criticised, a number of key lessons were highlighted in the evaluation report produced in April 2007. These are likely to shape compliance developments over the next few years, and indeed are likely to form the basis of the entire structure of

compliance effort in the medium term.

There is a risk that some of the more specific issues arising have not had sufficient attention from the profession. The pilot scheme review included the following comment, which highlighted the specific issue of record keeping: "Some taxpayers are not able to declare the correct amount of the profession and the second that it has been seen to be a second to the second that it has been seen to be a second to the se of tax because their business records are not adequate. If this is left unaddressed it could subsequently lead to more

significant errors."

HMRC identified the poor records they observed in the trial as a key risk to the integrity of the tax system. It would be naïve to expect that this conclusion would not form a major part of the compliance drive in the future.





Bid to unlock answer to multi-million pound problem

AN ingenious way to stop wheelie bins going missing – and save local authorities hundreds of thousands of pounds a year - has been devised.

The Oasis Bin-Loc is simple to install and operate, making the bin impossible to remove, and has an attachment that prevents anyone accessing the contents.

Prescot Oasis, a social enterprise business that uses its profits to transform deprived communities through jobs, training and business development, came across the idea after asking residents at a communal block where they had been doing landscape gardening if they could suggest improvements to the area where they live.

The residents complained about missing or vandalised wheelie bins and Oasis Project Director Colin Hill set about finding a solution. After extensive enquiries he discovered there was no product available and began the process of

inventing the Bin-Loc.

Mr Hill said: "We believe our Bin-Loc system provides a cost-effective answer to wheelie bin theft, fires and identity theft, as well as providing a cost-saving and environmental solution to communal waste disposal."

The Bin-Locs are made in Prescot and Prescot Oasis hopes to set up a factory in the area to manufacture and tailor the product for individual local authorities.


