Opinion

THE death of a woman after her car plunged into the Manchester Ship Canal at Stockton Heath is indeed a tragedy and it is clear from the tributes paid by her family that Valerie Pritchard was much loved and still living life to the full.

At 72, she had an active social life, attended art classes, enjoyed craft work, was a keen gardener and loved watching Warrington Wolves Rugby League team.

We send our sincere condolences to all her family and friends, who will be missing her so much and we also pay tribute to those people at the scene who tried in vain to save her before her car disappeared beneath the water

Just why her car left the road, crashed through metal railings and plunged into the canal may never be

But we know we are not alone in wondering why this waterway which, over the last 120 years has made millions for its owners and is now set to be revived to make millions more, has such flimsy fencing where it runs alongside busy roads and why rescue boats are not readily available.

THE prospect of a six week Christmas Market on Knutsford's Little Heath has been greeted with alarm and despondency by nearby residents and we are not surprised.

People living nearby accept the annual May Day Festival and the giant funfair that accompanies it with considerable goodwill. After all, the festival was established 150 years ago this year, so it was there long before many of the houses which enjoy an open view across the expanse of The Heath and the Little Heath.

But a Christmas Market, with 100 wooden chalets selling a wide variety of goods, a licensed bar, Santa's grotto and a Christmas Tree forest, operating

from November 14 to December 23 and staying open as late as 9pm? That's a different kettle of fish!

We hear the promises of increased footfall in Knutsford during the Christmas period. Of the need to draw trade into the town. Of the desire of the promoters to ensure everyone benefits. And we hear with incredulity the assertion that Cheshire is missing out on Christmas spirit and that this glitzy encampment will put things

In fact, we believe it is more likely to draw business away from the "real" town – the shops of King Street and Princess Street – robbing them of trade at their busiest time of the year.

It is also likely to leave the Little Heath - and the Heath, which would be used for parking - scarred for months.

But perhaps most worrying is that, apparently, some members of the Town Council actually support the

Susan calls time on 113-year-old family business

FAMILY business Whites Sports is closing down after 113 years trading, the last 40 years on Warrington Market.

Once a chain of shops in Stockton Heath, Knutsford and Warrington current owner Susan White from Appleton Thorn has decided it is now time to retire.

To celebrate their 113 years of trading as a family business she resurrected the 1974 'Whites Sports Darts Trophy Challenge' when she was joined by customers young and old, past and present, along with Warrington Wolves' Mascot Wolfie and player Ryan Atkins.

The business was established by Mr J.E.White in April 1901 and eventually handed the business onto his eldest son, Norman White in 1940, who then past it onto his two sons John and Paul White in 1969.

Since losing John and Paul in 2009 and 2007, Paul's wife Susan (68) has successfully run the business in Warrington Market.

She was a keen badminton player in the 1960's and after marrying Paul in 1969 became a big Wires fan and took up competitive fencing during the 1970's.

She was then an aerobics instructor across the town during the 1980's and in more recent years she has taken up yoga, pilates and aqua aerobics.

Fourth generation family member Adam White with help from brother, Roger and cousin Nick White have been busy helping Susan organise the closure and also taking the shop online in recent months.

Susan said: "It's now time for me

to retire and spend more quality time with my family and friends. I'm looking forward to getting out in my garden this summer and being able to have time off to hopefully watch Warrington Wolves win the Challenge Cup and Grand Final."

She said it hadn't been an easy decision to call it a day but it has become increasingly difficult to compete with website based shops and the out of town multiples.

"One hundred and thirteen years is quite an achievement to sustain any family business and on behalf of all the White family I'd like to say a huge thank you to all our past and present customers, staff and fellow traders that have been loyal and good friends

to Whites Sports Shop over the years. "Adam White, Susan's youngest son added: "We may be leaving the town centre but will still be trading and sharing our 113 year heritage online at www.whitessports.com. The website will allow customers to continue to purchase their favourite flags, darts, bowls and snooker accessories from Whites Sports."

From the late 1960s to the mid 1980s they also had shops in Stockton Heath, opened by Liverpool and England '66 world cup winner Roger Hunt and Knutsford (opened by rugby league legend Alex Murphy. Last year Whites Sports were

Showpeople can set up home on their own land

A FAMILY of travelling show people have won a planning battle for the right to set up home on a piece of Green Belt land they bought for £300,000.

Government-appointed inspector Richard Clegg has ruled that sisters Gail Camm and Deborah Seldon, their husbands and three children, can live on the site off Hall Lane, Stretton in two chalets with caravan extension.

Mr Clegg dealt with an appeal by the sisters after they were refused planning consent following objections from more than 100 local residents, Stretton Parish Council and the Stretton Residents' Group.

He ruled that although sites for travelling show people would normally be considered inappropriate in the Green Belt unless there were very special circumstances.

In this case he believed the

limited impact on the openness of the Green Belt and the clear need for additional accommodation for travelling showpeople in the area, plus the personal circumstances of the two families, amount to special circumstances.

The two families claimed to have local connections in that they had attended fairs and galas in the area for more than 40 years.

Objectors claimed the applicants

were not genuine travelling show people, that they had failed to consult with planners in line with planning regulations and that the development would have a harmful impact on the Green Belt and a nearby Listed building.

They also feared noise, traffic impact, pollution and harm on wildlife would be caused if the plan went ahead.



What is financial risk?

I am often surprised by peoples misunderstanding of financial risk.

We then have a review process which measures the performance of these funds on a regular basis, this is called tactical asset allocation. Tactical, because like a football coach they may set a team up to play a one off game, unlike maybe he would for the whole season.

"Watch what you drink" warning

WARRINGTON'S director of public health, Dr Rita Robertson, has urged local people to keep careful tabs on how much they drink.

Her warning comes after new national figures revealed that 325 people in Warrington have died from alcohol-related causes in the last nine years – almost 40 per cent of them during the last three years alone.

Dr Robertson said it was extremely important that people keep themselves aware of just how much alcohol they are drinking – and called on the government to introduce a minimum price per alcohol unit, to target the heavy drinking problem which is responsible for most of the deaths.

U-turn will mean 'old' lamps for new!

COUNCIL chiefs did a swift U-turn when villagers complained about new "modern" street lamps being erected in a picturesque conservation area.

Work was halted on the project in Grappenhall village – and the new lamps are to be replaced with "old".

The 21st century-style lamp standards already erected will be replaced with new heritage-style lamps more in character with the historic village.

Eventually all the lamps will be renewed in heritage style.

It's all part of a £600,000 Warrington Borough Council scheme to restore the village's landmark cobbled street over a period of five years.

Cllr Mike Biggin said: "The mistake could have been avoided in the first place if there had been some consultation about the street lamps. As soon as I realised what was happening I contacted the borough and, to be fair, the project was halted. There were a lot of complaints from local residents."

Grappenhall and Thelwall Parish Council has been pressing for years for the cobbled street to be properly restored instead of being constantly patched-up.

The work will be phased over five years because of the cost. But work will start after Easter, with the pavements being tackled first.

Cllr Biggin said: "Parking issues will also be dealt with. People were furious when they were 'booked' for parking outside St Wilfrid's Church while attending Sunday services. But we have persuaded the borough to designate the adjoining area outside the Parr Arms pub as a parking area.

"It will all take five years, but in the end we will have a fully reinstated village street in character with the surrounding buildings."

Planning victory over historic church windows

CHURCH leaders have won a lengthy planning battle to re-glaze four historic stained glass windows – but not without a struggle.

Planning chiefs have agreed to the alterations at the 18th century, Georgian, Grade 2* Listed St John's Parish Church at Knutsford.

The proposals, designed to let more light into the church, involved relocating some ground floor windows to the first floor - and they split the local community. Members of the parochial church council, nearly 30 residents and a local councillor were in favour. Knutsford Town Council and the Knutsford Conservation and Heritage Group were against. The Georgian Society and the Victorian Society had no objections. English Heritage did not object on heritage grounds but conceded there could be other considerations, such as the community value of the windows in the existing positions.

Cheshire East Council's conservation officer raised strong objections and planning officers recommended the scheme be thrown out. But councillors decided to visit the church to see for themselves.

Even then they couldn't decide and delegated the decision to the northern area manager, the committee chairman and ward councillors. This group eventually decided the project could go ahead.

The four windows, installed in Victorian times, were the work of Heaton Butler and Bayne, leading stained glass makers of the period whose work includes the Brunel memorial window in Westminster Ahhey.





Money Column

Director of a company? Do you assume you are protected by the limited company status?

Limited Liability - Under limited liability a director or investor is only liable for the money they have invested. For example, if a company is formed and a £1,000 of shares are purchased and the company subsequently goes bankrupt, the liability is limited to the £1,000 invested, even if it owes £50,000. Are Unfortunately, for a company director there are 4 main exceptions which mainly benefit the VATman as follows: 1) when a director is suspected of fraud; 2) where a director is an undischarged bankrupt; 3) a director sets up a new business following the failure of a previous one; and 4) when directors pay themselves unauthorised dividends

Fraud - If one or more directors are responsible for a tax fraud within the company they will be held personally liable for some of the company debts. EG. The finance director writes out cheques for unreal purchases and so that their actions cannot be traced they abrigate purchase and puts fabricate purchase invoices and puts them through the business claiming back the misrepresented VAT. The VATman finds out and the company is assessed for overclaimed VAT and a penalty for fraudulent evasion is imposed. As the dishonest conduct was due to the Finance Director, the penalty may be transferred in whole or in part from the company to them. This can also be applied to managers of a company and not just the director(s)

Un-discharged bankrupts - It is an

offence for an un-discharged bankrupt to act as a director, or to directly/ indirectly take part in the formation or management of a company (unless agreed by the court) If they do they are automatically personally liable for any debts for the new company. The VATman will not have finished there, a person who is involved in the management of the company the management of the company and who acts, or is willing to act, on the instructions of an undischarged bankrupt is also personally responsible for the debts of the company.

New business – If a business goes bankrupt owing the VATman a large amount of VAT and one or more of the directors sets up a new business the

directors sets up a new business, the VATman can demand a "security" on the new business, designed to cover any possible debt that the new company may run up. Although the security is




placed on the new business, if it trades as a sole proprietor, the individual is responsible for paying it on the debts run up by the old company Unauthorised dividends – A director

can only take dividends from a business if they are represented by profit after debts are taken into account. If directors take dividends when the company has debts they are actually taking a loan from the company. If the company owes money to the VATman, he will treat the 2dividend2 payments as a debt to the company and pursue the debtor (the director) for repayment of the loan to clear the debt.
