Opinion

WE keep hearing about council cutbacks and the steps that local authorities are being forced to take to save money.

But we find it surprising that when residents from Willow Drive, Stockton Heath approached Warrington Borough Council with a suggestion that trees be planted at the rear of their homes to attract birds into their gardens and make the area more attractive, they were told the council was looking to remove trees to save work.

The residents were not asking for money, nor for trees to be planted. They were simply seeking permission to plant trees.

Just what extra work a dozen saplings would bring we are not sure. Surely the authority is not reduced to the stage that sweeping up a few leaves would be a problem?

Stockton Heath Parish Council is backing the residents. Members believe the area is crying out for trees.

We would suggest the residents keep pushing the borough who might, eventually, come to the conclusion that by continuing to say no they are simply making themselves looking foolish.

CLOSING a shopping street to traffic while a local festival takes place is one thing. But making it a permanent pedestrianised area is another.

For two half days, King Street, Knutsford was closed for an innovative celebration of the town's heritage – the Knutsford Promenades.

Schools, churches, community groups and individuals enacted scenes from the town's colourful past, in effect transforming the street into a giant theatre. Thousands of local people turned out to watch and the event proved so successful that there is talk of doing it again next year.

But now the Town Council has

commissioned a design study to pave the way for a pedestrian priority scheme for the street – a decision that has been described as a milestone in its history.

It is certainly true that in parts of King Street, pedestrians and motor vehicles do not mix well and it is also true that a "pedestrian priority" scheme does not necessarily mean a total ban on traffic.

So we hope we are preaching to the converted when we caution against too drastic a "solution" to the street's traffic problems.

Knutsford is a significant shopping centre, with busy day and evening economies, which relies on more than the local population if it is to prosper.

Any plan that makes it difficult for car owners to reach the shop, the restaurant or hotel they wish to visit could be perilous.

Sisters in charity ride

TWO sisters have completed a 140-mile charity cycle ride in aid of a charity close to their hearts — Hospice at Home.

Physiotherapist Sheila Nesbitt, from Stockton Heath, did the three-day Whitehaven to Tynemouth ride with her sister Sarah.

Sheila said: "This was by far the hardest thing I have ever done, not helped by really poor weather and an unexpectedly long climb on Day 3, but the feeling of achievement at the end made it all worthwhile."

A team of 50 women were involved in the ride and raised a total of more than £25,000 for the Hospice at Home charity.



Online petition opposes housing schemes

AN online petition has been launched for people who want to fight plans for nearly 400 new homes at Mobberley.

It has been started by action group RAMS – Residents Against Mobberley Sprawl – to try and persuade Cheshire East Council to reject the plans when they are submitted.

Developers LPC Living want to build the homes on part of the 39-acre Harman Technology site, off Ilford Way. The scheme would include a new headquarters for Harman, which employs 200 people.

There would be open space provision, footpaths linking the site to Mobberley and existing footpaths.

Members of RAMS attended a consultation exhibition at the Rajar Building and claim the vast majority of local people are opposed to the scheme.

RAMS are also opposed to proposals put out for consultation by Cheshire East Council itself for another housing development in Mobberley.

The group says: "Our local amenities are already overstretched and will not be able to cope with the hundreds of new families these developments will bring to the area.

"Both sites border onto Smith Lane, a road that narrows to a single track in places that is completely unsuitable for the amount of traffic these developments will create.

"Residents understand the need for new housing in the borough and Mobberley has expanded significantly in recent years. These proposed developments are simply too large for the local infrastructure and will permanently destroy the character and identity of the village.

Heritage spectacular could be repeated

THE spectacular success of the Knutsford Promenades –the two-day event celebrating the town's unique heritage – could result in it becoming an annual event.

Thousands of people turned out to watch performances by local groups and schools illustrating key events in the town's past – and many called for it to be repeated next year.

Among those present were Chancellor of the Exchequer and Tatton MP George Osborne and former Tatton MP Martin Bell.

Local businesses entered into the spirit of things and many acknowledged they had benefitted from increased trade. But a minority complained that King Street – focal point for the event – should not have been closed to traffic.

A number of issues could make organisers think twice about making the Promenades an annual event – not least the fact that the inaugural event received a grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund, which could not be guaranteed in future

Among organisations taking part in the event were the Knutsford Musical Theatre Company, Brook Street Unitarian Chapel, Knutsford Heritage Centre and various local schools.

attractions.


The show – established more than 30 years ago – also had numerous other family fun attractions, trade stands, food and drink and a fairground.

But Appleton Parish Council said Dingle Farm was on a blind bend, Dingle Lane was too narrow and the development would worsen traffic conditions adversely affecting road safety.

Planning officers recommended the change of use be approved, however.

They said the continued use of the farm as a workshop, studio/gallery, tea room and beauty treatment room was acceptable and provided a sustainable and appropriate form of development in the Green Belt which would not lead to significant harm to the amenity of nearby residents nor lead to any significant harm to highway safety.

Steve added: "Wasp season

is upon us once again and the

colonies of this rather unpopular insect are growing daily. Wasps nests can be treated with insecticide and once destroyed, the nest can be left in place as it's never used be left in place as it's never used again. Have you ever noticed grooves in wooden garden furniture and fencing? Wasps remove very fine layers of wood and mix it with saliva to make their paper nests."

Joanne McGrath, principal planning policy and strategy officer with the borough council, made the statement at the parish council's monthly meeting.

She said: "This conclusion is drawn from the Warrington Retail Centre Report which surveys all defined centres in the borough.

"Stockton Heath has the lowest vacancy rate and the most diverse offer of all the centres.'

A number of councillors expressed

Cllr Tudor Pole said: "I think this came as a shock to most of us. There are plenty of empty shops in the village.

Chairman Cllr Graham Roughsedge said: "It does not say much for the others.

"We have a lot more empty shops than we used to have and whenever we get a new business it is nearly always a café or a restaurant.

"People who remember the village as it used to be are very disappointed at how the number and variety of shops

has dwindled.
"There is little we, as a parish council, can do about it. We do object when plans come in for a business we think is not appropriate and sometimes we are successful.

"But more often than not, we are unsuccessful."

Ms McGrath's visit to Stockton Heath came in the wake of complaints from local traders that footfall in the shopping centre is falling - particularly since the free period on the local pay-and-display car park was reduced from two hours to one.

A survey of shopkeepers in London Road found they were 100 per cent opposed to the reduced free parking period.
