June 5 this year was the day the financial market backdrop changed for the income investor in Europe.

It was on this day that Mario Draghi, president of the European Central Bank (ECB), announced it had cut its deposit rate to -0.1 per cent. In other words, the ECB has become the first big central bank to charge banks for parking their money with it.

There is a school of thought which says you should not get paid 'interest' for having your cash in a UK bank. Why? Because you are not taking any risk. Think about it, if you have £85,000 sat in the bank, and the government is guaranteeing your investment if the bank fails, then why should you get interest as well. One day in the future, the banks will 'cotton on' to this and stop paying interest on deposits.

In the short term I don't expect rates to do anything. Here in the UK the Bank of England has inflation under control, unemployment is hardly out of control. And if you also look around the world most of the developed economies have similar interest rates to us in the UK, and some lower. So expect much of the same. Great news for borrowers though!

The tiny village of Hatton, population less than 400 is embroiled in such a controversy at the moment with a majority of the population opposing an innovative plan for a sustainable, low energy house and a lesser number supporting it.

But the applicants have brought in some "big guns" to help promote their cause. Internationally renowned architects say the house is a rare example of how low impact living is possible without sacrificing our culture, history, comfort and local landscape.

It is, in fact, a proposal that Hatton should be proud of and inspired by – an example for others to follow.

In fact, it is the fear that others may follow that worries local residents

most of all. Few, if any of them would argue against a new dwelling which set new standards of sustainability, low energy use, etc. It is just the appearance of the proposed dwelling that bothers them – particularly in the Green Belt.

It has to be admitted the illustrations the applicant has produced show a dwelling that would look more at home in a Scandinavian setting than a Cheshire village.

The developer argues that such levels of sustainability cannot be achieved without a radical approach to design.

But surely a compromise could be worked out that would produce an "eco house" a little more traditional in appearance?

# Husband and wife get on their bikes for charity

A HUSBAND and wife from Appleton are getting on their bikes to help raise money for a local hospice.

Martin and Karen Evans, along with their friend Fiona Buckley from Hale, are cycling a challenging 400 kilometres from Vietnam to Cambodia in just five days.

Pedal power will see the trio ride from Saigon all the way to Siem Reap in intense heat and humid conditions – all in the name of charity.

Their route sees them riding from the bustle of Ho Chi Minh City through numerous river communities within the heart of the Mekong Delta to the finish line at stunning Angkor Wat.

The trio are taking on the gruelling challenge to raise money for the

Hospice of the Good Shepherd in Backford which cares for 1,500 people from Chester, Deeside and Cheshire every year.

They have never completed a challenge on this scale ever before and see the ride as a once-in-a-lifetime challenge.

Martin (pictured), aged 48, finance director with a restaurant group, said: "To say we've never done anything on this scale before is an understatement. Not only is it by far the furthest distance I've ever ridden but Karen and Fiona have had to buy bikes just to be able to do this.

"As part of our training we all recently took part in The Christie Foundation's bike ride from Manchester to Blackpool which was tough but less than a quarter of the distance we need to ride this time. We know our Vietnam challenge will be a huge ask – but it will be a fantastic experience and will raise money for a wonderful charity."

The Hospice of the Good Shepherd helps to improve the quality of life for those living with any incurable illness and gives support to families, friends and carers but needs to raise an astounding £6,800 every day to provide free care.

Martin and his team have chosen to support them after the hospice

cared for his mother late last year. He added: "The hospice work very hard to look after families during some very difficult times, as we found out first hand. The care they gave was amazing. Their team were very kind and compassionate through a very hard time and this is our way of thanking them as well as helping to support their work going forward."

# 295 homes planned for village

PLANS have been submitted for 295 homes in the "Alice in Wonderland" village of Daresbury.

Developers Redrow Homes (NW) say further planning applications for land at Delph Lane, Daresbury will involve about 505 new homes, with a local shopping centre, 20 acres of employment land and a new marina alongside the Bridgewater Canal.

The plans have been submitted to Halton Borough Council and the initial application is expected to be dealt with early in the New Year.

Redrow say the proposals have won the support of local residents, following an exhibition held in the village earlier this year. The new houses will be in a range of sizes and styles, from two to four bedrooms and including detached, semi-detached and mews houses.

This planning application complements a previously submitted hybrid planning application, originally submitted in March last year, for 300 new homes to the south of Delph Lane, and outlines how the vision for the site would be delivered as a whole.

As part of the proposals, significant junction improvements on surrounding roads will be delivered to manage traffic flow, provide greater accessibility for local residents and improve road safety.

David O'Reilly, senior planning manager at Redrow, said: "We've been really encouraged by the positive response we've received from local residents as part of the consultation on these plans. We've worked hard to ensure that any concerns have been addressed and we believe that the plans submitted represent the best option for the delivery of the strategic vision for this site.

"As well as much-needed new homes, the scheme as a whole would also provide a boost for the local economy through investment, job creation and the delivery of employment land. A focal point of the community would be created through

the new local centre and residents would benefit from new recreational amenities, including a linear park along the Bridgewater Canal, children's play areas and a marina."

The proposed development is in line with Halton Council's vision for the site according to Redrow

"The worrying thing is that they might come back. The horses' manes and tails will grow back, but it will take a long time."

The two horses, Billy, aged 21 and Holly, aged eight – coincidentally the same name and age as her owner! – have been kept in the field for nearly three years without any previous incident.

Caroline said: "Everybody in the area knows them and everyone is upset at what has happened. I hope everyone will keep an eye on them now, in case the attackers come back.

"I'm just hoping that the more people hear about this, the more likely the culprits will get caught."

# House of the future divides a village

IT has been described as one of the most advanced eco-houses in the country and one which the local authority, the parish council and villagers should be proud of and inspired by.

The plans won the support of internationally known environmental architects.

But the innovative proposals for a house to be known as Orchard House, to be built on Green Belt land off Warrington Road, Hatton, divided opinion in the village.

Residents were widely consulted and while some supported the principle of an advanced "Passivhaus" others opposed it fiercely.

Hatton Parish Council decided the

Hatton Parish Council decided the proposal could have implications for future development in the village and supported opponents of the scheme.

Planning officers at Warrington Borough Council recommended the scheme be thrown out - and councillors agreed.

But environmental architect and author Sofie Pelsmakers, founder of Architecture for Change, a not-for-profit environmental build organisation which aims to challenge current design and build methods, backed the scheme enthusiastically She wrote to the council: "The

She wrote to the council: "The environmental merits of this project are too many to mention, but its performance to a near Passivhaus standard indicates its light footprint on the site and the planet, acting as an exemplar scheme for the parish and its residents to be inspired by and be proud of."

Ms Pelsmakers, author of the Royal Institute of British Architects's "Environmental Design Pocket Book", added: "Designs of the quality and architectural and environmental merit of Orchard House are unfortunately rare.

rare.
"We need more of them to inspire

our neighbourhoods that low impact living is possible without sacrificing our culture, history, comfort and local landscape

landscape.

"I believe Orchard House is exemplar in setting that pace of change and a scheme the local authority and the parish council will be proud of and will be upholding in the future as exemplar for other buildings and renovations to aspire to."

She pointed out it had recently been announced that global greenhouse gases were at their highest level ever recorded and that the current pace of change was nowhere near fast enough to avoid dangerous levels of climate change.

"Using basic environmental principles, Orchard House will be one of the lowest impact builds in the country, paving the way for truly environmental designs of the future."

environmental designs of the future."
Objectors said the house would not blend with the general environment or the individual look of houses in the village.

With its unusual appearance, it would dominate the street scene and nearby properties.

Planning officers said while the house could be described as interesting and unusual, it could equally be viewed as a "jarring and inconsistent feature."

It would represent inappropriate development in the Green Belt and that there are insufficient "very special circumstances" to outweigh this.

# Priestley opens £1.5m technology centre

A £1.5 million technology centre that will improve the education of thousands of young people has opened at Warrington's Priestley College.

The development – known as the Lewis Carroll Building – will house more than 200 computers and be home to Priestley's computing and ICT courses.

Speaking at the opening ceremony, principal Mike Southworth said the new facility was befitting of the education Priestley provided.

He said: "I think it's great news

He said: "I think it's great news for Warrington that our town's young people now have access to cutting edge facilities that will enhance their learning and acquisition of skills including those in science, technology, engineering and mathematics.

"Not only does this improve their own life chances, but it will also contribute to the economic and social prosperity of our town and indeed beyond."

The opening ceremony was attended by councillors, representatives from the University of Salford and Barclays Bank as well as governors, tutors and students.

Guest of honour Dr David Whan.

a trustee of the New Engineering Foundation, spoke of the significance of opening such a building at a college named after renowned scientist Joseph Priestley.

After meeting students and having a tour of the college he said the centre would be a great asset.

"Joseph Priestley was a remarkable man and this is a college that is fit to bear his name," he said.

Overall, £14 million has been spent over the past eight years to create an environment that brings out the best in students at Priestley.

Last year the college became the UK's first dedicated sixth form to receive STEM assured status – making it one of the country's top providers of science, technology, engineering and mathematics education.

Mr Southworth said the Lewis Carroll Building would provide a great environment in which to learn.
