STOCKTON Heath is seen as a 'cash cow' by Warrington Borough Council according to a parish councillor.

Coun Stephen Taylor told the parish council: "Traders think the borough council see Stockton Heath as a cash cow, and not a place to invest."


shopping precinct. There were also a lot of children around because of the nearby school.

Japanese restaurant approved

BOROUGH planning chiefs have given the go-ahead for a new Japanese restaurant.

The eatery - which will involve the change of use of a vacant shop - will be in West Avenue, Stockton Heath and will have capacity for about 40 diners

Local councillors Celia Jordan and Sue Dodd had objected to the proposal on the grounds of possible noise, smells and impact on residents' amenity.

They also feared traffic problems caused by delivery vehicles.

Three neighbours also objected on similar grounds - but planning chiefs decided there would be no significant harm caused to the amenity of nearby houses.

redevelopment work will provide a more comfortable, energy efficient and flexible community hall.

A \$50,000 grant from the Waste

Recycling Group, administered by WREN through the Landfill Communities Fund has enabled the metal-framed, single glazed windows to be replaced with double glazed units and a much-needed new toilet block and baby changing facility to be constructed

The church's own fundraising over a period of two years has provided loft insulation, alterations to meeting rooms to allow greater flexibility of use, replacement rear and front access doors and heating and power modifications.

While raising the money with a wide variety of events, the church has also given 10 per cent to charitable causes so as to benefit the wider community

Kit Heald, fundraising co-ordinator at the church said: "Further work will be carried out over the next year to complete the vision for the use of this hall as a major community resource in the village."







History book provides images from the past

A FASCINATING collection of pictures from the past are featured in a new book on the history of Grappenhall and district.

The book is the third produced by Grappenhall Local History Group and among the more interesting images it contains are ones showing a horse drawn van in Church Lane in Edwardian days, the Old Dog and Dart decorated for the Jubilee of King George V in 1935 and the warship HMS Bristol pictured at Latchford Locks in 1912.

Motorists may be interested to see pictures of pedestrians given the freedom to walk over Thelwall Viaduct before it was opened to



traffic on July 29 1963.
Local life from the past, including school pictures, a 1914 wedding and old transport including antique motorcycles and lorries are also featured.

The history group was formed in 2002. It meets monthly and now has about 80 members. In 2007 and 2008 it published separate booklets called 'Anthologies of Local Memories' – the second one is still

viemories – the second one is still available at a cost of £3.50.

The new booklet, 'A Selection of Local Images,' at £4.50 is available from Grappenhall Library or by telephoning Carole Whibley on 0.1925.263712.

Money Column

How to be self-employed

MOST people believe that, in general terms, it is better to be self-employed than employed - or, rather, slightly less terrible. While the rates of income tax are the same, your ability to claim expenses against that income is much enhanced it you're self-employed, and the National Insurance contribution (NIC) regime is much friendlier. Instead of two layers of contributions, one at 11% and one at 12.8%, the self-employed person only effectively has one layer of liability based on earnings, at 8%.

In most cases, it's easy to work out that a person is self-employed or not. The person who runs your corner shop and person who runs your corner shop and delivers your newspapers in the mornings is obviously self-employed. So is your accountant, lawyer, surveyor ete. The grey area is in the case of individuals who provide no more than their own time, and to only one or perhaps two 'clients' or 'employers'.

The criteria

We do not think that the number of users of a person's services is a particularly relevant criterion. This is only of peripheral relevance, despite all the mythology there is out there on this point.

the degree of control that your client or employer (as the case may be) has over the way you work. So here's our 'cut out the way you work. So here's our 'cut out and keep' guide to establishing self-employment. Don't worry if you don't meet all of the criteria; if you meet most of them, or the more important ones, you will be treated as self-employed:

• You work at the hours you decide rather than when your client decides.

• You work on your own initiative, rather than being given set tasks and closely supervised.

- supervised.

 You are free, within any inevitable
- practical constraints, to do your work
- wherever you choose.

 You charge for your services based on results rather than merely on a fixed '9 to 5' basis.
- You are liable to put right anything that is defective in your work in your own time and at your own expense.

 You are able to use others to do the
- without requiring the client's permission.
- You have no entitlements to holiday pay,
- sick pay, maternity or paternity pay.

 You provide your own equipment (where appropriate). This could be simply your own computer.





- You have your own liability insurance.
- You have your own letterhead and are generally 'open for business'. This means that, at least in theory, you could, work for others as well as your main

There are other criteria, mostly of less There are other criteria, mostly of less relevance than the above, but you get the general idea. The key thing is that you are an independent contracting party rather than one under the supervision, direction and control of the person who is paying you, and you are not part and parcel of their organisation in the way that their employee's are.
