Planners to visit tea room

PLANNING chiefs are to visit an unauthorised tea room in a former farmhouse before deciding whether locals can carry on enjoying a cuppa there.

More than 600 people have signed a petition supporting the tea room, art gallery, studio and beauty treatment room operating without planning permission at Dingle Farm, Dingle Lane, Appleton - and Warrington planners want to see for themselves.

Appleton Parish Council opposes the development but the petitioners claim it is providing employment for four people and providing a leisure and tourist destination of benefit to the local community. Robert Bilton Estates Ltd are seeking retrospective planning permission for a change of use from a dwelling to a workshop/artist's studio and gallery, separate beauty treatment room and tea room with associated parking and a timber pergola to provide cover for an outdoor seating area.

The parish council says Dingle Farm is on a blind bend, Dingle Lane is too narrow and the development will worsen traffic conditions adversely affecting road safety. Planning officers are recommending the change of use be approved, however. They say the continued use of the farm as a workshop, studio/gallery, tea room and beauty treatment room is acceptable and is providing a sustainable and appropriate form of development in the Green Belt.

Opinion

WE go to considerable lengths to try and avoid taking sides in party political arguments - but what are we to do when political parties take up issues we have already raised?

Elsewhere in this issue, the reader will see that Labour and the Liberal Democrats are at each other's throats over charges at village car parks in Stockton Heath and Lymm - an issue we have repeatedly raised in this column.

We cannot change our stance because, apparently, one party agrees with us while the other does not. We simply believe our few remaining village shopping centres need all the help they can get if they are to prosper and that even a modest parking charge will deter some shoppers from visiting.

At the same time, we do understand that it costs money to maintain a car park and even more to operate a parking service. One answer would be to scrap the parking service, but this has been tried elsewhere and resulted in chaos as motorists totally ignored all parking restrictions and shoppers' car parks were taken over by all-day parkers.

A compromise is surely the answer, and the two-hour free period which until recently was available in

Stockton Heath and Lymm seemed to us to be a reasonable compromise. The one hour free period which now exists does not give shoppers adequate time for anything other than a hurried visit.

Warrington Borough Council has been honest enough to admit that part of the reason for reducing the free parking period is to reduce the losses it incurs on its parking service and achieve a break-even situation.

In fact the evidence so far suggests the aspiration to break even is unlikely to be achieved because additional revenue from the village car parks has been "less than predicted" - a phrase which in council-speak, usually means "non-existent" in our experience.

This being the case we believe we can maintain our stance on village parking without being tainted by party politics.

WE are tempted to say "It's just not cricket."

Proposals for housing at Knutsford from the Bruntwood property group involve the historic Booth's Hall site, which includes Toft Cricket Club's ground - one of the most attractive in Cheshire - a picturesque lake and acres of woodland.

We would hope, of course, that Cheshire East Council would have no truck with such a proposal, but as their own draft plan for the town last year suggested moving the 100-year-old Knutsford Cricket Club from its ground in Mere Heath Lane and Knutsford Football Club from its ground in Manchester Road, we cannot be too sure.

Sports clubs do not seem to be taken into consideration by the planners.

But, cricket ground or not, the Booth's Hall site is a special case. Development of the site was originally permitted as "a developed site for employment in the Green Belt."

If it is no longer required for employment purposes, surely it should revert to Green Belt.

Bridgewater are national champions

BRIDGEWATER High School's under 14s have been crowned the new National Schools Basketball Champions.

They defeated Weavers School from Wellingborough 100-48 in the final, held at the Nottingham Wildcats Arena.

Team manager and KS3 PE co-ordinator Paul Mackay said: "I am so proud of the effort and commitment shown by the pupils. This has been a long competition and to come out top

is a real credit to the pupils."

Joe Cummins was named as Most Valuable Player of the competition, and has since been picked to play for England's under 14s squad.

Head Coach Delme Herriman said: "The boys stuck with the system and the plays we have practised all year and the nature of the win shows their

potential. This is a really talented team that will go far."

Eight of the squad also helped Cheshire Jets under 14s to victory in the National League Championships in Sheffield.

4,000 sign parking petition

ALMOST 4,000 people signed a petition protesting about parking charges in Stockton Heath and Lymm.

The petition called for the reinstatement of a two-hour free parking period on borough council-owned car parks in the two villages.

It was organised by local Liberal Democrats who claim the charges are being used to subsidise free resident-only parking in other parts of Warrington.

The free parking period is now only one hour – and the Lib Dems say this is causing more on-street parking, damaging local businesses and has caused unacceptable anxiety to users of local medical and professional services.

“It is also spoiling the relaxed ‘village atmosphere’ of a visit to the shops and cafes in Stockton Heath and Lymm.”

According to the Lib Dems, the council reduced the free period from two hours to one to raise £200,000 to help cover the loss they make subsidising free resident-only parking in other parts of the town.

This was despite the fact that the Forge car park at Stockton Heath and the Pepper Street car park at Lymm were already generating a surplus.

It is only in Stockton Heath and Lymm that people are charged to use the council’s district car parks.

Cllr Brian Axcell, the Lib Dem transportation spokesman on

the borough council, said: “The objective of generating income seems to be pursued energetically in Stockton Heath and Lymm but hardly at all elsewhere.

“It really is outrageous that only the car parks in Stockton Heath and Lymm are being used as cash cows to fill the hole in the parking services budget. Local residents, businesses and visitors to Stockton Heath and Lymm have given their overwhelming support to our petition because of this gross unfairness.”

The draft strategy to be presented to the council has been revised to put less emphasis on breaking even on parking and more focus on supporting the economy of the town and district centres.

A borough council report admits that the aim of “breaking even” on parking is proving more difficult to achieve than originally envisaged.

This is because additional revenue at Stockton Heath and Lymm arising from the reduced free parking time has been less than predicted.

In addition, revenue from the issue of penalty charge notices has unexpectedly fallen.

But council leader Terry O’Neill dismissed the petition as “politically motivated.”

He said: “Who wouldn’t sign



a petition to save the cost of a second class stamp to get a second hour of free car parking?

“If the Lib Dems truly cared about local services for local people they should have been doing a petition to Nick Clegg demanding some of our central government grant gets reinstated so we wouldn’t have to make these tough decisions.

“The people of Stockton Heath

and Lymm are still getting one hour free car parking and the feedback we have had is that residents want us to prioritise safeguarding as much as possible of other local services, like looking after older people and disabled children, filling in potholes and maintaining parks.”

Beatle piano keys prove a hit

KEYS from the piano on which Beatle John Lennon learned to play proved a big hit at the Cheshire Show – thanks to Lymm piano tuner David Finegan.

Visitors to the show at Tabley, near Knutsford were able to run their fingers over the ivories.

David, who runs Cheshire Pianos, explained how the ivories came into his possession.

Four years ago he was asked to refurbish an old Bluthner Grand at Calderstones School, in Liverpool.

He said: “It was in a pretty poor state of repair with around 40 per cent of the keys damaged but we were successful in refurbishing it and it is now still on the school stage where it was in John Lennon’s day.”

David was exhibiting a stylish modern grand piano and a 100-year-old Bluthner upright at the show, but the big attraction for many was his unique bag of Beatles memorabilia.

He has framed the keys, individually, for posterity, together with a picture of John Lennon

The Beatle attended Calderstones – then known as Quarry Bank School – between 1952 and 1957 – teaching himself how to play the piano and forming his first group, The Quarry Men.

David said: “I was lucky enough to have grown up in Liverpool at the time of the Merseybeat and the Beatles have always meant something very special to me.

“Music has always been in my family, too – my father sang with the Swinging Blue Jeans”.

International award for student

AN 18-year-old student has received a top award for helping to provide a voice for young people around the world.

Niamh Costello, from Thelwall, who studies the International Baccalaureate at Warrington's Priestley College, has received the International Award from the Sixth Form Colleges' Association.

She said: "I have gained a lot from many of the things I have done, but at the same time it has benefitted other people.

"I have always enjoyed what I have done and have met some amazing people."

Niamh, a former pupil at Lymm High School, started on Warrington Youth Council aged 13 and is now a trustee with the North West Youth Work Unit.

Among her achievements with the regional body has been to develop a policy for stricter confidentiality to protect pupils who consult school nurses and doctors.

This was recently launched by the government and has been rolled out to schools across the country.

Niamh dealt with representatives from the NHS as she led the development of the policy.

She said: "This is one of the things

I am most pleased about.

"It was a personal goal, but also a group achievement and an area where we have really made a difference."

The Sixth Form Colleges' Association also rewarded Niamh after she travelled to Brussels for a four-day event designed to help young people from across the world to share best practice.

Niamh offered other teenagers advice on how she was giving a voice to young people in Britain and also brought home some tips of her own including how to access European funding for youth projects.

She also took part in The Tall Ships Race, which involves young people from across the world in a sailing challenge.

They have to work together to complete the race - last year it was Dublin to Spain - and Niamh's team won both times she entered.

Now she hopes to study English at Oxford and eventually work in social research or policy guidance on an international level.

"Studying the International Baccalaureate has really given me a



global perspective and broadened my horizons," she said.

Senior tutor Mark Salmon said: "I nominated Niamh for the International Award because of her outstanding commitment to her work for Warrington Borough Council and

also her excellent work each year at the Model United Nations Conference.

"She has been an outstanding member of the Graduate programme and we wish her every success in realising her goal to study English at Mansfield College, Oxford."

Bawming the Thorn tur

THE unique "Bawming the Thorn" festival at Appleton Thorn, Warrington celebrated the 40th anniversary of the revival of the ancient ceremony.

Original "Bawmers" - children who dance around the thorn tree in the middle of the village - joined this year's event as VIP guests.

Originally part of a "walking day" event, the bawming ceremony died out in the 1930s.

It was revived by Mr Bob Jones, then headmaster at Appleton Thorn Primary School, in 1973 and is now a hugely popular annual event.

To mark the occasion a Spitfire fly-past was arranged and a "flight" themed fancy dress parade took place - marking the area's links with the former Stretton airfield, which closed

after the end of World War 2.

Keeping with tradition the thorn tree was decorated as usual and school children sang the "Bawming" song as classmates danced around the tree.

According to legend, the hawthorn at Appleton Thorn grew from a cutting of the Holy Thorn at Glastonbury, which was said to have sprung from the staff of Joseph of Arimathea.

The current tree was planted in the late 1960s by the local Women's Institute after the previous one blew down in a storm.

Warm welcome awaits at community centre

Driver was well and truly 'booked'

PARISH councillors at Stockton Heath have expressed concern after no less than nine penalty charge notices were stuck on a van left on the village's Forge car park.

The owner of the vehicle had left a notice on the windscreen stating that it had broken down, apologising and promising to move the vehicle "on Saturday."

Chairman Cllr Graham Roughsedge commented: "In my view, this was overkill. I am not sure how long it was left on the car park and it may be that it was not moved when the owner said it would be.

"But it was ridiculous to put nine tickets on it. Two or three would surely have been enough and it should have been obvious to the parking wardens that the owner was in some difficulty.

"It looked as if there could have been four more penalty notices inside the vehicle."

A spokesperson for Warrington Borough Council said the vehicle was eventually moved by the owner.

But he would be liable to pay a penalty charge for each ticket issued.

Money Column

Revenue for the Revenue

We are increasingly alarmed at the tactics used by the Inland Revenue to divert funds which do not belong to them, (stealing)? i.e 'proceeds of crime', thus classified as money laundering.

We have submitted claims for overpayment of PAYE/NIC, on behalf of a small number clients. The shocking response from an officer of HMRC is as follows:

"before I can agree to either a refund or a credit, please let me know the reason the overpayment has arisen. Please complete enclosed P35D giving a full explanation as to how the overpayment occurred. Providing your reply gives a full explanation as to how the overpayment arose, I will arrange for the overpayment to be either transferred to the current year or to be repaid by cheque".

HMRC have received the money, it can be seen as an overpayment on their records and yet they feel at liberty to retain it in their own coffers until they receive a satisfactory reply i.e the employer has to jump through their invisible hoops. To say that a mistake has been made is not sufficient any more.

We recently read an article: HMRC threatened bailiffs on one of its customers re an underpayment of PAYE/NIC for a particular year. His agent investigated the matter and found that for a number of earlier

years HMRC were showing overpayments of PAYE/NIC on their records which had not been repaid. The end result for the period with the underpayment taken off was an overpayment of nearly £10,000.

A further story - A client of ours recently visited believing that he has overpaid tax for the 2012 - 2013 tax year.

Our authorisation will not yet have been processed by HMRC. We telephoned them and we were advised that provided the client was with us to answer any security questions the overpayment of tax and the release of those funds could be dealt with over the telephone. The next day we made the phone call, the client passes the security questions and hands the phone over for us to disclose the relevant details of income, i.e. salary, pension etc and tax suffered (taken from P60,s, and or/P45's) The information specified clearly resulted in an overpayment of tax of over £9,500.

The response we received, "we do not have all the corresponding information on our system, which means we are unable to release any refund of overpaid tax".

The information not on their system is that of a P45 raised by the Job Seekers Allowance Office, which our client holds a copy of and on which shows that nothing has been paid to him.

Employers have to submit end of year returns by no later than 19th May, but it



appears that the government body who issues P45's for 'job seekers allowance' do not have to file until October and refunds will not be released until then unless we write to HMRC enclosing the proof before then.

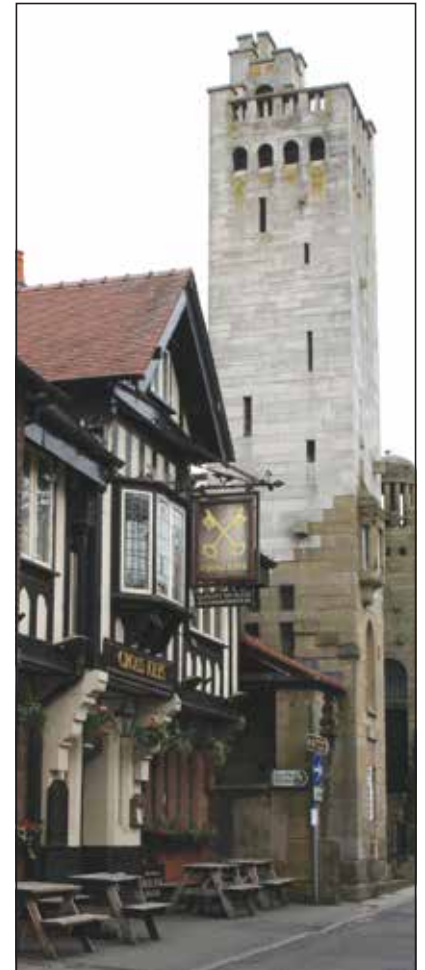

Tennis club celebrates 100 years

YOU have to go back 100 years to find out why Stockton Heath Tennis Club is actually in Appleton.

The answer is, of course, that when the club was founded in 1913 it occupied land leased from the Daresbury Estate, at the rear of Walton Road, Stockton Heath.

Tennis was played on three grass courts - and the club prospered enough to make a move over the parish boundary 19-years later to its present home in Delphfields Road, Appleton, leasing land from the Lyons Estate.

They took their original wooden pavilion with them, reassembling it alongside three grass courts and two hard courts.

Over the years, the need to provide a car park led to more land being leased and the original courts were replaced with four shale courts.

In 1956 the club was able to purchase the site, along with additional land, from Appleton Estates, although the following year some land was sold for housing in Burfield Drive.

In 1981 the club suffered a major setback when the timber pavilion was severely damaged by fire - shortly after it had undergone extensive refurbishment.

The following year, the present clubhouse was built and the grounds were improved by landscaping and the

planting of trees and shrubs.

Two macadam courts were laid in 1983 and later replaced with three artificial grass courts.

More recently, two further artificial grass courts were added, together with a junior mini-court.

A partnership was agreed with Bridgewater High School to share the use of floodlit, all-weather courts just across the road in the school grounds.
