# Opinion

IT is not unusual to find many places laying claim to famous people and Charles Lutwidge Dodgson, better known as Lewis Carroll, author of "Alice in Wonderland", is no exception.

Daresbury, where he was born, Croft on Tees in North Yorkshire, where he lived for 20 years, Rugby, where he studied, Oxford, were he taught, Guildford, where he died and even Llandudno, where he might or might not have visited, all stake their claim.

But we think Daresbury, where he was born in 1832, has the most legitimate claim.

So it is good to see an £800,000 Lewis Carroll Centre being built as an extension to All Saints Church, where his father was Rector and where there are unique stained-glass windows depicting characters from his most famous work.

For too long, Daresbury has had too little to commemorate the great man, who was not just an author and poet but also a gifted mathematician and pioneer photographer.

This new centre, due to open in the autumn, with free admission, should put things right and, in doing so, become another major tourist attraction for Cheshire, with a themed shop, displays illustrating Carroll's life and his stories, specially recorded by comedian Ken Dodd and actress Dillie Keane.

It will not be just a visitor centre, however, important though that aspect will be. It will also be an education centre, working with local schools and providing adult literacy and numeracy programmes.

A worthy memorial to a true genius.

### ALL over the country, market traders are facing the possibility of massive increases in business rates and stall rentals. Some fear the sort of increases being talked about would be the last straw.

In Warrington, stallholders believe they could have to pay a 79 rise in rates. In Knutsford, traders have organised a petition signed by more than 700 shoppers opposing a 25 per cent rent rise.

other specials and neighbourhood policing units can learn, as part of Cheshire Police's drive to deliver better and safer neighbourhoods across our policing area."

The Brian Kennedy Trust was set up three years ago by the North West-based businessman and owner of Sale Sharks rugby club.

# 'We are the champions!'

A TEAM of youngsters from a village school are celebrating after being crowned national junior basketball champions at their age level.

The team from Thelwall Junior School attribute their success to intensive training throughout the year - and expert help with coaching from the Cheshire Jets Basketball Club.

They triumphed over six other teams, winning 12-8 in the final of the British Basketball Hoops 4 Health competition at Birmingham,

Headteacher Susan Robinson said the school enjoyed basketball training during the year. She said: "Following this they

entered a team into a local Warrington Primary School competition and then the regional finals in Chester. After winning both these competitions they were then selected to represent our region in the national finals.

School staff, parents and Cheshire Jets coach Jamie Vermiglio travelled with the team to offer support. They received a cup and gold medals for each team members and the school will also receive a golden basketball as a memento.

Mrs Robinson said: "This has been a marvellous experience for the children. Many people have been into school to help and support the pupils in developing their basketball skills.

Complicated the situation may be, but we would rather see the council taking a more assertive stance and lodging an objection instead of contemplating a rent rise.

# Mixed emotions for new mayor

IT was with mixed emotions that Mike Biggin and his wife, Trisha, of Grappenhall, learned they were to be the next Mayor and Mayoress of Warrington.

May is a difficult month for the couple, for the first day of the month is the birthday of their daughter, Gemma, who would have been 24 this year.

She died in a tragic accident in November 2004, when the car in which she was a passenger, plunged into the Bridgewater Canal.

Mike was - and still is - a member of Grappenhall and Thelwall Parish Council.

After the tragedy, he joined the successful campaign to get the dangerous canal-side Stockton Lane closed to through traffic.

He was elected to the borough council in 2006 - but would not have been Mayor this year but for the deputy mayor, fellow Liberal Democrat Ted Finnegan, losing his seat in the elections.

Mike said: "It is a tremendous honour and privilege to take the role but I feel very sorry for Ted who put in so much work as deputy mayor and as a ward councillor. It is obviously an emotional time - it has been quite a few weeks for us."

Mike comfortably retained his seat at Grappenhall and Thelwall while fellow Liberal Democrats Ian Marks,

Celia Jordan and Peter Walker were reelected in Lymm, Stockton Heath and Appleton respective.

The Conservatives swept the board in the Cheshire East Borough Council elections at Knutsford.

Elected were Stewart Gardiner, Peter Raynes and Olivia Hunter while Steve Wilkinson, Cons, was elected unopposed at High Legh.

There were also Town Council contests in two of Knutsford's four wards and the resulting elections resulted in a council comprised of 14 Conservatives and one Independent.

Shock casualty of the elections was Liberal Democrat Barbara Austin, a councillor for 25 years.

The new line up is: Over ward: Barbara Coan, Peter Coan, Bernadette Emmett, Neil Forbes and Julian Goodrich (all Cons) and Andrew Malloy (Ind). # Residents face eight months of chaos

RESIDENTS of Stockton Heath face up to eight months of noise, traffic jams and other disruption arising from a major project to renew old water mains 60ft below the Manchester Ship Canal.

United Utilities will replace four mains in a tunnel dating from the time the canal was built in the 1890s on the Ellesmere Road side of London Road swing bridge. The tunnel is almost permanently flooded as a result of water seeping through from the canal.

It will have to be pumped out during the operation and although night work is not envisaged, pumps may have to run through the night to prevent the tunnel flooding again.The tunnel continually flooding is one of the reasons the mains have corroded.

The project will involve work along the A49 from the traffic lights at Gainsborough Road to the swing bridge.

It will also involve closing half the width of Ellesmere Road from the swing bridge to St Thomas' Church Hall, with hoarding placed along the centre of the road.For a period of 6-8 weeks, Ellesmere Road will be completely closed to traffic.

Work will start at the end of August and there will be widespread consultation.

# Celia is chairman again!

The plan is to provide book exchange services at the old library in Albert Road and at Grappenhall Community Centre in Bellhouse Lane.

Cllr Biggin said: "We have a group of volunteers who offer a range of skills and are very enthusiastic. This is an ideal opportunity for residents of the villages to work together and we would welcome anyone who is interested either as a potential user or an organiser to join us."

The volunteer group includes a number of former librarians.

# **Money Column** By Margaret Black

Budget Breakdown - Spring 2011

The personal allowance has increased by  $\pounds1,000$  to  $\pounds7,475$ , as promised in the Budget last June. It will, however, continue to be phased out if total income exceeds £100,000. If total income exceeds £114,950 in 2011-2012, there will not be any personal allowance.

For anyone earning lower than that the personal allowance will increase on 6th April 2012 by a further £630 to £8,105.

#### Reduction

The  $\pounds1,000$  increase to the personal allowance will be offset by a reduction of  $\pounds2,400$  in the level of the basic rate tax band. If you are only entitled to a personal allowance, the starting point at which you begin to pay higher rate tax will fall from  $\pounds 43,875$  in 2010-2011 to  $\pounds 42,475$  in 2011-2012. It has been reported that as a result the number of people falling into the higher rate tax band will rise by 750,000.

Other income tax allowances have risen by about 4.7% this is generally held to be in line with September 2010 retail price index inflation, e.g. the basic age allowance for those aged between 65 and 74 has increased from £9,490 to  $\pounds9,940$ . For those over 74 the personal allowance has risen from £9,640 to £10,090.

The 10% income tax band only available to a few also rose by just under 5% and the starting point for the 50% income tax rate remains at \$150,000 – the legislation which introduced this top rate did not include automatic indexation.

The annual exemption for capital gains tax was increased for 2011-2012 by £500 to £10,600 and up to £5,300 for most trusts this is in line with normal indexation rules. From 6 April 2012 the annual Capital Gains Tax exemption will be raised in line with the consumer prices index rather than the

retail price index as it is currently. The annual ISA investment limit rose by £480 to £10,680, up to £5,340 of this may be in cash

#### Beneficial

The £30,000 annual charge for 'nondomiciled' is proposed to increase to \$50,000 from 6 April 2012 for those who have been UK resident for 12 or more years, and who wish to retain

access to the beneficial tax regime. It will remain at £30,000 for those resident for at least seven of the past nine years and fewer than twelve years. The inheritance tax nil rate band is unchanged at £325,000. It was fixed at that level on 6 April 2009 and it was said at that time that it would be frozen until 5 April 2015. # Japanese cars in short supply

JAPAN's eight major vehicle manufacturers have reported that their combined domestic production facilities are only operating at about 50 per cent of the normal, as a result of disruption caused by the earthquake, tsunami and nuclear disaster.

Toyota - for a long while the world's biggest vehicle maker - appears to have been hit worst and expects to be overtaken by General Motors in the production stakes.

Mitsubishi has fared better than the others and suffered a reduction of only 25.7 per cent.

The Tohoku region hit by the disasters does not have many assembly facilities for car companies but it is a key area for making many of the parts required to build cars. As a result, parts are in short supply and in some cases, entire assembly lines were halted because vehicles were missing just one or two parts.

The impact has been felt globally as well, with overseas production plants, including those in the UK, also unable to secure sufficient parts to carry on.

Car manufacturers say continued shortages are inevitable and output figures are likely to remain low.

So for some time to come, Japanese cars seem likely to be in short supply on forecourts around the world - and could well lose out to makes from other parts of the world.

# Roads continue

A SURVEY of councils by the RAC has revealed that road conditions across the country are continuing to decline because Town Hall chiefs are being forced to undertake short-term repairs rather than permanent solutions.

Twelve out of 20 councils reported that government funding cuts mean they are concentrating on short term repairs to fill potholes caused by the harsh winter.

Eight councils have cut road maintenance budgets, two have dipped into reserves to make up for shortfalls, and two more have set up private finance initiatives to pay for road maintenance. One council has axed £5.8 million from its road maintenance budget despite having a backlog of £160m in repairs.

# Why historic wall collapsed

A VARIETY of causes led to the collapse of an old wall at the historic Grappenhall Heys Walled Garden, structural engineers have decided.

of These included a lack foundations, the close proximity of some mature pine trees, an existing acute lean and the probability that youths have climbed over to gain unauthorised access to the gardens. Structural calculations also showed

the wall exceeded its maximum height for the type of construction involved. The area of collapsed wall has been made safe and stonework

salvaged and set aside on pallets for re-use

Consultants recommend 1,5m of wall on either side of the collapsed area be demolished and the stone salvaged, a concrete footing be excavated and prepared and that the wall be re-built with buttress detailing. A survey of the rest of the wall has

revealed some additional areas of bowing, although not as serious as in the collapsed section. It is recommended they be inspected regularly over the next few years.
