boiler in a building in the school grounds.

The slim-line boiler flue, together with existing and proposed planting, will mean there will be no visual harm. Planning chiefs approved the scheme after hearing it would remove the need to use oil to heat the school, replacing it with biomass, a renewable resource that would also be more energy efficient.

The school would reduce less carbon dioxide and benefit from reduced energy bills.

Opinion

THERE appears to some chance of an agreement in the long-running saga of shoppers' car parking at Stockton Heath and Lymm. However, we feel we should stress the words "some chance" as it is by no means certain.

Talks have been taking place between shopkeepers and borough council officers to try and resolve the concerns of traders convinced that the existing parking regime is driving customers away from both villages. Footfall is down and the reason, the shopkeepers believe, is that shoppers consider a one hour free period is not long enough.

More to the point, they fear being caught by over-zealous parking wardens who think nothing of slapping a penalty ticket on a car even if the driver is only a couple of minutes late returning. This costs the motorist £30 at least.

Most favoured solution at the moment seems to be a "pay as you leave" system, with the first hour free. Access would be controlled by an automatic barrier - which of course would mean the wardens would not need to visit car parks and could concentrate on what should be their main job, patrolling the streets.

Ideally, of course, a two hour free period should be restored, but the borough is unwilling to yield on this as this would not produce enough revenue to cover the cost of running the parking service. But we wonder if it might with the

be required?

We also wonder why Stockton Heath and Lymm are different to, say, Sandbach and Congleton where free parking can be provided with no restrictions other than advisory signs limiting the stay to two hours?

ELSEWHERE in this issue, we report the ongoing saga of the controversial proposal to create an adventure playground/theme park in Tatton Park.

Given that the developers first submitted their proposals two years ago and have twice been asked to supply additional information, we can quite understand why STAG, the action group opposed to the scheme, are asking whether the applicants are

fit to run the operation. But of course the issue will be settled on planning grounds rather than the efficiency of the operators who, in any case, seem to be doing a pretty good job of running a similar playground in Norfolk.

It might be thought that Cheshire East Council, who will decide the fate of the application, are scrutinising it pretty closely by twice seeking more information. But we can't help but wonder if the planners are simply going through the motions.

After all, the council has already offered the applicants a £5.5 million loan, is ready to spend another £1.5 on infrastructure and has already spent £239,000 on planning surveys, project management, etc. All of

which suggests they have already made up their minds.

We remain convinced that Tatton Park, which already has 750,000 visitors a year, is not the place to establish another attraction aiming to bring in another 250,000 people.

Natural England has designated part of the proposed site as Ancient Semi Natural Woodland and although the applicants say this will be untouched other than by "minimal access routes" we wonder how "minimal" a route can be if it is to cater for 250,000 people a vear.

In the winter of floods, a eureka moment for engineer Paul

A CHESHIRE engineer has unveiled a water proof door hinge which, he believes, could have saved many homes and businesses from the disastrous flooding which has hit many parts of the country in recent months.

Paul Price has watched with horror and considerable frustration as the drama has unfolded on his television screen.

"I just sat there wishing I had come up with the design sooner," he said. "It's quite a simple solution and it

is not expensive. I am convinced that many homes could be protected by doors fitted with my hinge.

Paul's "Eureka Moment" came when a submersible pump arrived for repair at his workshop at Grappenhall.

He was amazed by the small seal which prevented water ingression and electrical failure and after examining the system realised how a similar n could be used on a flood door.

"The design of conventional door hinges leaves a small gap between the door itself and the frame, which prevents a seal from being formed,' he said.

'Having water-tight doors would enable homeowners to keep floodwater out of their home entirely or at least to contain it within a single room.

'It would obviously have to be a substantial door or it would not withstand the weight of the floodwater.

"My design assumes an aluminium door, but it would work with any substantial door."

Paul has produced a prototype,

patented the design and set up his own company, Contego Design Solutions Ltd.

Now he is planning to meet with Environment Agency experts and insurance companies to try and win their endorsement.

He has already heard from local MP David Mowat who believes the idea has potential.

The Warrington South MP said: "We've all seen on our TV screens recently what a devastating impact flooding can have on homes and properties. Those whose homes have been flooded often have to wait months before they can live there again.

"Paul's solution looks simple to fit and is comparatively cheap when compared to the huge financial and emotional costs of having your home flooded.

Paul added: "Flooding costs the economy around £1bn per year. While we cannot hold back nature, we can at least help families and small businesses protect what is most important to them.

'I am getting quite a lot of enquiries about my design - mainly from industry. But I originally had the private house in mind when I came up with the design.

"It would not solve everybody's problem, but the door is the main point of ingress so if we can make it flood proof it will make a big difference.

"And I have some other solutions for flood proofing properties as well.

Villages brace themselves for traffic chaos

VILLAGES south of the Manchester Ship Canal are bracing themselves for traffic chaos arising from increased opening and closing of swing bridges as a result of an increase in shipping.

Stockton Heath is likely to be most seriously hit, but Grappenhall, Thelwall, Appleton and Walton are also likely to be affected.

Peel Ports, who own the canal, plan to increase shipping as part of its Mersey Ports Master Plan.

Talks have taken place between the company, borough councils and local MPs over efforts to minimise the impact on road traffic.

But parish councils have had little opportunity for input.

The A49, A50, the A56 are all carried over the canal by swing bridges in the Warrington area and it is claimed that traffic conditions can take several hours to get back to normal after a ship has passed along the canal.

Over the last 12-18 months, the number of ships using the canal at peak periods has increased by 40 per - despite Peel Ports claiming it would do all it could to minimise canal traffic at peak periods.

Cllr Celia Jordan (pictured right) expressed concern at a meeting of Stockton Heath Parish Council.

She suggested setting up a joint committee with other parish councils to deal with the issue

Cllr Tudor Pole said it only logical that the more successful Peel Ports were in shipping containers up the canal, the more the bridges would open and close. He said: "The Parish Council may

not have a powerful voice at present but it soon would have if life in the village was affected and the media became involved."

The council is to call for updates from Peel Ports and Warrington Borough Council.

Warrington Borough Council is urging the canal company to limit the number of peak hour sailings to

100-a-year or below. They also want the swing bridges modernised so they can swing faster and cause less disruption.

Action group pledges against adventure playground

STAG – the action group campaigning against the development of an adventure playground in Knutsford's Tatton Park – has pledged to carry on its fight against the controversial proposals to be put to planners for a third time later this month.

They say the amended proposals add further weight to their fears that the Green Belt, ancient woodland, wildlife, prime agricultural land and flora and fauna are being "sacrificed" for purely financial reasons.

The group, which has raised more than £6,000 to pay for professional advice to enable them to oppose the planning application, says it will continue to put money, time and effort into fighting the scheme on planning grounds.

planning grounds. Norfolk-based Bure Valley Adventures say their playground would attract 250,000 visitors to Tatton, on top of the 750,000 people who already visit the park. It will provide 200 jobs – mostly part time – and give the local economy a £7.6m boost.

The development will be hidden from public view in woodland, although the Witchcote Wood area – designated as Ancient Semi-Natural Woodland by Natural England – would not be affected other than by "minimal access routes."

More than 22 acres of farmland would be converted to parkland, opening up areas of Tatton Park which have not previously been available to the public. All the structures involved in the playground would be of a temporary nature so that the whole development would be "reversible".

The proposals, which have twice been amended to provide more information requested by planners, are due to go before Cheshire East Council's strategic planning board on March 5.

CHESHIRE based Simon Byrne, a senior officer in the Metropolitan Police has been revealed as the preferred candidate to take up the mantle of Cheshire's Chief Constable.

Following a rigorous selection process, which included a grilling by senior officers across the criminal justice agencies and a panel which included an independent advisor, Police & Crime Commissioner for Cheshire, John Dwyer has selected Simon Byrne as the preferred

candidate. Mr Dwyer said, "All of the candidates demonstrated exceptional qualities and they should all be proud of themselves but Simon was an outstanding candidate who was unanimously supported by the Appointment Panel.

"Simon's appointment is subject to a confirmatory hearing by the Police & Crime Panel. Subject to their approval, Simon will take his oath of office and become Cheshire's Chief Constable on 25 June 2014 and I am sure you will join me in congratulating

sure you will join me in congratulating him on his appointment." Simon said, "I am really excited and privileged to be given the opportunity to lead the Constabulary at a critical time in its 157 year history. My pledge is to relentlessly fight crime and antisocial behaviour." Simon will replace this Constable

Simon will replace Chief Constable, Dave Whatton who has chosen to retire from policing. Simon has lived in Cheshire since

the early 1970s. After leaving a local comprehensive school in 1981, he joined the Metropolitan Police in 1982 where he pounded the beat at Paddington Green Police Station.

A transfer to Merseyside Police in

What if a customer doesn't pay you for goods or services on which you have charged VAT, and you have paid that VAT to HM Revenue & Customs (HMRC), you can get the VAT back by claiming 'Bad Debt Relief'. This is very straightforward

Reclaiming VAT when your customer doesn't pay you

If you sell VAT taxable goods or services to a customer, you have to pay the VAT element to HMRC. If your customer does not pay some or all of the amount due you can reclaim the VAT you charged and paid to HMRC but did not receive. HMRC calls this 'Bad Debt Relief'.

When you can reclaim VAT on bad debts

You can reclaim VAT that you paid to HMRC and which you have not yet received from the customer. The conditions are that:

- the debt is more than six months old and less than four years and six months old
- you have written off the debt in your VAT accounts and transferred it to a separate bad debt account
- the debt has not been sold or handed to a factoring company
- you did not charge more than the normal selling price for the item(s)

How to claim 'Bad Debt Relief'

If you are entitled to claim 'Bad Debt Relief, you add the amount of VAT you are reclaiming to the



amount of VAT you are reclaiming on your purchases (input tax) and put the total figure in Box 4 of your VAT Return. To work out how much 'Bad Debt Relief' you can claim on a VAT inclusive balance, you need to apply the VAT fraction to the unpaid amount.

allegation.

Lib Dem councillor Judith Walker said: "We certainly did not threaten to co-opt a Tory. Why should we, when we have a candidate of our own? The by-election will take place on

March 13. Candidates are: Paul Carter

(Labour), Jonathan Levy (Conservative) and Judith Wheeler Jonathan (Liberal Democrat).

The election was called after a vacancy arose on the parish council when Liberal Democrat member Lauren Bailey resigned after being unable to attend meetings for some time

Labour say they approached the Liberal Democrats about co-opting Mr Carter, the runner-up at the last election, to avoid the cost of a byelection.

They claimed the Liberal Democrats threatened to co-opt Mr Levy, a Conservative, who came third at the last election.

Labour spokesman Nick Bent said: "We felt that was an abuse of power by the Lib Dems and that Cobbs residents should have their say about who they want to represent them. "In the middle of a serious cost-of-

living crisis for many families on the Cobbs estate, we were not prepared to let another grubby deal between the

Tories and Lib Demy go unchallenged." Cllr Walker said: "We did not say we would co-opt a Tory. Why should we? We have our own candidate. At the time, we had not yet decided whether to co-opt someone or call an election.

"The last time a vacancy occurred we co-opted a Conservative because the vacancy arose through the death

of a Conservative councillor." Conservative spokesman Cllr Paul Kennedy said: "To my knowledge there were no conversations between the Lib Dems and the Conservatives regarding the vacancy.

'We decided not to call an election but to wait and see how things panned out.Parish councils now have to pay for by-elections and I understand the election for the Cobbs Ward will cost in the region of £5,500.

Paul Carter, a retired police officer, has lived in the Cobbs area for more

than 30 years and is a volunteer with Warrington Disability Partnership. Jonathan Levy is a local campaigner who lives in Cobbs and regularly attends parish council meetings. He is a former chairman of Warrington Conservative Future - the party's youth branch.

Judith Wheeler is a former member of the borough council who represented the Whittle Hall area but has now moved back to the Cobbs area where she formerly lived.


