two sides now seem to understand each other's positions and efforts are being made to keep discussions moving forward.

But the main impasse – the club's reluctance to surrender its lease on the Bridge Lane ground without first obtaining additional pitches elsewhere – appears to remain.

The council now understands the clubs need for more additional pitches close to its Walton Lea headquarters. The club appears to appreciate that the overflow car park at Walton Hall will not be made available for these pitches

So what, other than the fact that the two sides seem to be talking to each other, has changed?

One possibility, which does not appear to have been given much consideration in the recent past, is that the club may return to Bridge Lane, if no other site can be found. This would require new changing rooms and could mean some partner involvement, but with a lease of some 50 years to run, such a development is clearly a possibility.

It is not a solution which anyone appears to favour at the moment, but as time passes it must become more and more likely to be the eventual outcome

As we said two months ago, we hope that the "constructive" talks continue and will soon result in a solution. But we are not holding our breath
