Opinion

SOMETHING good often comes out of adversity. In the case of the closure of Grappenhall Library, and the axing of the mobile library service across the whole of the borough of Warrington, it is the discovery that, among library users at any rate, community spirit is not dead.

At Grappenhall and Thelwall, volunteers - some of them former librarians - have come forward offering to run book exchange schemes based not only in the former library building but also at Grappenhall Youth and Community Centre.

Just down the road in Appleton, members of two Womens' Institutes - Stretton and Park - have offered to run similar schemes at Appleton Parish Hall.

At Hatton, a book exchange scheme is already up and running in an old-style red 'phone box, helping to ensure it is retained in the village centre even though there is no 'phone in it.

We do not for one moment suggest that schemes like these replace a properly funded public library service. In fact we campaigned vigorously against the closures.

But when volunteers come forward to help fill the gap we cannot help but feel the world is not such a bad place after all - even at a time of spending cuts.

A less desirable human trait is displayed by a minority of dog owners who let their animals foul footpaths, parks, playgrounds, etc.

Usually they get away with it because, despite the potentially serious consequences, no-one - including our local councils - is prepared to do anything about it. So it is good to see that Cheshire East Council has

decided to act. Community wardens are going undercover, looking for irresponsible people who fail to clean up after their dog. Those caught will face an on-the-spot £50 penalty - and those that refuse to pay will face prosecution with fines of up to $\pm 1,000$.

The plain clothes officers will ensure the waste is removed and put in a litter bin or dog-waste bin. All undercover officers will carry Cheshire East Council identification cards. We think this is a great idea and one that should be taken

up by other councils. Cheshire East say they will be concentrating on "hot spots" without actually identifying where they are. Most people, we are sure, will be able to make suggestions.

We would like to see the idea extended across the whole of Cheshire - and possibly widened to include litterbugs too.

Should the church provide a public loo?

WHEN a busy shopping centre has no public toilets, should the church open up its loo for passers-by?

Reluctantly, the answer must be no, says the Rev Michael Ridley, vicar of St Thomas' Church, Stockton Heath.

It would mean volunteers from the church "cleaning up for the community" for free.

The vicar was responding to a request from a working party set up by the parish council to try and solve problems caused by the lack of public toilets in Stockton Heath shopping centre.

He said: "There is a concern because vulnerable people come into the church. We have carers' groups and children's groups. Opening the toilets to anyone could be risky.

"If we had a caretaker for just one hour a day, it would cost £2,500 a year. We do not have a caretaker - the work is done of a voluntary basis.


"We have never advertised this as a public loo. It is not that, it is a place of worship."

Mr Ridley said the church toilets were 70-years-old, were quite small there were no disabled toilets nor access.

The church had spent money on roof repairs and re-vamping the church hall and further improvements were still needed, so there was no money available currently to improve the toilets.

He added: "The church would never say no to anyone wanting access - but we have got to look after the parishioners at the church - we are not funded by the Government."

Cllr Tudor Pole said the banks had been "bailed out" with public funds. "There are four banks in Stockton Heath - we should tell them its payback time and ask them to fund public toilets," he said.

Police should share to save

POLICE in Cheshire should share costly facilities such as helicopters and firearms units with other neighbouring forces.

These were the main findings of a survey carried out across the country involving more than 1,100 people.

A police road show visited more than a dozen communities, including Stockton Heath, Middlewich, Tarporley, Frodsham, Wilmslow and Holmes Chapel and the survey could also be accessed online.

People were asked how they thought the police should make financial savings while at the same time protecting front line services

Most popular options were sharing the Force helicopter, specialist units such as firearms and forensics with other forces and charging licensed venues who open late a levy to pay for late-night policing.

Chief Constable Dave Whatton said: "The Police Authority have set the budget for policing in Cheshire and we have to save £35.4 million over the next four years. We have plans in place to do this and still keep local neighbourhood policing at the heart of how we serve and protect the public.

"It is really important to take the views of people into account as we consider what to prioritise and where we will have to make cuts. Over 1,000 people have given me their views, which help us to make the tough decisions ahead. I am confident that we can make the savings and still deliver a first class police service for our public."

'Cathedral of Canals' a major tourist attraction

THE historic Anderton Boat Lift has reopened after its winter "rest" and is again attracting visitors into the rural heart of Cheshire.

It offers a mix of heritage, history and retail relaxation - plus leisurely trips back in time abord the elegant trip boat Edwin Clark.



The service and facilities on this airline are excellent with good leg room. From here I took another Singapore Airline flight on the 380 airbus - so quiet and what a lovely way to fly down to Sydney. On arrival in Sydney airport - transfers to the hotel with a harbour view. Whilst I was here I had the opportunity to take a sea plane trip up to Newcastle (not in the UK!!) and back, quite scary if you are not keen on heights like I am not! Did a harbour dinner cruise and a visit to the famous Opera House. Decided not to climb the Bridge again as I did that last time. Again visited Bondi and Manley beach watching the surfers practising their skills. The ferry terminal in Sydney is similar to the bus stations in the UK, very busy and people using the ferries like we would the buses. I had many trips out including Sydney Tower and had a meal in the revolving restaurant at the top of this. I had to remember not to put my handbag on the window ledge as I would have been chasing it round the restaurant.

The open top bus tour is a perfect way to get your bearings in this city and I would recommend a visit to Argyle Street to the Market there at the weekend. The restaurants round the Harbour are a lovely way to finish your day and watch the sunset.

After 5 days I was off again to take another flight from Sydney to Perth, here the hotel was in Freemantle which is alot calmer and relaxed than Sydney, again lots of things to do or just take the opportunity of relaxing. The weather in Perth is alot hotter and windier compared to Sydney. Again take the tram which is a hop on hop off service to see the sights of Freemantle or the bus if you are in Perth. The wine tasting cruise up the Swan Valley River was a lovely experience and there are some fantastic houses sitting on the edge of the river. The beaches around Perth are where locals go for picnics at the weekend.



Cheshire Challenge raises £20,000

NEARLY 70 walkers, backed by more than 30 volunteer supporters, raised more than £20,000 for the Children's Adventure Farm Trust by taking part in the gruelling 40-mile Cheshire Challenge Walk.

Among them were two teams of four from the Knutsford offices of auctioneers and estate agency Frank Marshall and Co., who raised £3,500 by completing the 15 hours ordeal.

Nick Tomlinson, Associate at the Knutsford estate agency said the walk started at 4am in total darkness and continued throughout the day in baking heat.


He said: "Without exception, our eight team members gave everything they had on the day, to the point of total and utter exhaustion.

Festival organiser Tudor Pole said: "Using the park will allow us to control the crowds better.


"Last year we had far more people than expected. The park will just have one entrance, so we will be able to control the numbers coming in."

'Time To Pay' - HMRC

HM Revenue & Customs (HMRC) launched 'The Business Payment Support Service' (BPSS) on 24 November 2008. The primary purpose of this service was to help businesses with their cash flow during the worst of the accompanie credit the worst of the economic credit crunch, by allowing 'Time To Pay' (TTP).

Despite HMRC stating that the criteria for agreeing such a contract is unaffected and that the BPSS will remain available for as long as it is needed, it appears that HMRC's own statistics show that the chance of reaching a successful TTP deal is a lot less now than it was a year ago.

The Statistics

HMRC is keen to make the point that demand for TTP requests has declined over this period, their own statistical analysis on a like-with-like comparison for 2009/2010 confirms that the requests received but rejected across all the tax regimes has increased from 2.7% to 5.8%. The TTP arrangements Which were granted across all tax regimes for the same comparative period des show a

same comparative period also show a decline from 240,700, worth £4.18bn

in 2009 to 138,700, worth £2.34bn in 2010. This represents a 42% drop in numbers and a reduction of 44% in value. The overall demand for TTP fell by a similar 40% across this time. In short, the decline in arrangements is not inconsistent with the overall decline in demand whereas a higher proportion of TTP request are being rejected.

Conclusion

HMRC has an obligation to Government and taxpayers in general to discharge its duty of collecting the right amount of tax at the right time. However, the pattern reported seems to be a clear sign that the pressure is on HMRC to draw back the hand of assistance that was so publicly extended such a short time ago.

Small businesses particularly are still meeting significant cash flow problems and with third party financial support hard to secure, they find proof of the reported economic turnaround elusive. The rise in the standard rate of VAT coupled with HMRC's apparent increased rate of rejection of deferred payment plans can only make matters worse. Businesses and their advisers

should be alive to this trend and act accordingly. Where it is clear that a business will find it difficult to meet its full VAT or tax liabilities by the relevant due dates, it is essential to contact HMRC at the earliest opportunity. Although HMRC appears to be allowing less breathing space on deferred payments, being pro-active rather than re-active to such situations will only strengthen the case a business may have to negotiate a TTP arrangement
