AT risk of being dubbed kill joys, we must again express our astonishment that those in authority - the far distant Halton Borough Council – apparently continue to believe open fields at Daresbury are a suitable location for the Creamfields music festival.

Another has been and gone and yet again the event has been surrounded by controversy.

by controversy. We will not dwell upon the deaths of two young men because, at the time of writing, it has not been shown that there was any direct link between them and the festival. We will not say too much, either, about the deaths of two dogs apparently locked in the back of a security van, although it is difficult to see how such a needless tragedy was through anything other than gross carelessness on someone's part.

But again the weather intervened. It was not so severe as two years ago, when the festival had to be cut short for health and safety reasons due to waterlogged fields. But it was bad and if it had not been for significant earthmoving operations could easily have resulted in the A56 being blocked.

As it was, this busy road was plastered with mud for days afterwards and at times must have presented a very real skid risk for passing motorists. If some local farmer has caused such a mess he would almost certainly have had action taken against him.

Then there was the noise. The music could be heard inside a house, above the sound of the television, as far away as Penketh! In the Stockton Heath area, some houses were literally shaken by the beat of the music. The profanities of a foul-mouthed DJ could be clearly heard.

What must it have been like for people living only a matter of yards from the festival site? The noise, the lights, the mud, the eyesore metal fencing in front of their homes – the 60,000 revellers who descended on what is normally a peaceful village.

We hear a lot about Human Rights these days, but it would seem the



residents of Daresbury don't have any. Some years ago, two of them had the audacity to go to court to try and stop Creamfields. Not only did they fail, but the judge ordered them to pay hefty costs. The lunatics have taken over the

The lunatics have taken over the asylum.

Meanwhile it is refreshing to see that people power appears to have won the day regarding the Sandly lane recycling Centre at Stockton Heath, with the council approving a u-turn on the closure decision.

Fingers crossed they can find a way to make it sustainable!

# **Council** was 'not open and transparent' over tip closure plan

WARRINGTON Borough Council's decision to complete a u-turn on the decision to close the Sandy Lane Recycling Centre at Stockton Heath has been welcomed by opposition councillors who have accused the controlling Labour group of not being 'open and transparent'.

Cllr Bob Barr, deputy leader of the Lib Dems said: "The Liberal Democrat Group can only welcome the "u-turn" and believe that the Council should heed the feeling of people in South Warrington that this administration is not working on their behalf."

"The bottom line is that the decision close Stockton Heath Recycling to Centre was wrongly made, was not open or transparent and was not based on an appropriate public consultation."

The decision, which has now been rubber stamped by the council's executive Board followed a four week public consultation about the council's waste and recycling services and means that the opening hours for the three Community Recycling Centres (CRC) are:

- Gatewarth will be 8am to 6pm all week
- Woolston will be 10am to 4pm weekdays with weekend openings of 8am to 6pm.
- Stockton Heath will be 10am to 4pm weekdays with weekend openings of 8am to 6pm during the summer and 10am to 4pm weekdays with weekend openings of 8am to 4pm during the winter.

This is part of an overall decision to award a new contract for the management of the town's three CRCs which can now be put in place from late autumn.

This follows a tender exercise reduce expenditure and provide efficiencies within the waste service for 2014/15. Cllr David Keane, executive board

member for environment and public protection, said: "I want to thank everyone who took the time to take part in the waste and recycling consultation and we have taken on board all the comments and feedback.

"We have listened to what people have said and have addressed specific concerns raised about the future of the Stockton Heath CRC. This decision to keep the site open also means that we can maintain current services while we progress with a new waste strategy.

'Our aim is still to continue with our excellent recycling rates and support residents and the consultation has been a very fruitful exercise in terms

of helping us to do this. For example it is clear from the results that residents would like to see the development and expansion of kerbside recycling services to help boost recycling levels.

"The council will look into ways of expanding the current services as part of the development of the new waste strategy during the next 12 months, including improving localised recycling facilities and also progress the proposal

of a single CRC site for the town." Cllr Barr added: "One can't help but sympathise with Cllr David Keane on the twists and turns he is having to make to justify the "u-turn" on recycling centres forced on him by the public, assisted by the Liberal Democrat Group on the Council.

"First a decision, apparently against Cllr Keane's wishes and the advice of the one Labour Councillor representing Warrington south of the Ship Canal and their Warrington South PPC, was forced through by the Leaders of the Council.

"Then he had to argue, at the callin meeting, that the Liberal Democrats had not queried the agenda item at the Executive Board which purported to be about the award of a new recycling contract but actually turned out to be about the closure of recycling centres. And then, in desperation, he argued that it was always the intention to consult about recycling centres after the closure decision had been made.

# Stretton scuba diver visits WW1 wreck

A SCUBA diver from Stretton was part of a team who laid a wreath and raised a flag on the wreck of a First World War ship to remember the 250 crewmen who lost their lives.

Sophie Heptonstall, 34, a marketing manager and a member of Hartford Sub Aqua Club, was one of team of 10 British Sub-Aqua Club (BSAC) divers who took part in the commemorative dive on the wreck of HMS Pathfinder - the first ever ship to be sunk by a submarine-launched torpedo.

HMS Pathfinder was steaming off the east coast of Scotland, near St Abbs Head, on September 5, 1914, when the locomotive torpedo from German U-boat 21 slammed into her side and the ship went down.

the ship went down. The flash ignited the ship's magazine, destroying the fore section of the ship and causing the foremast and number one funnel to collapse.

The majority of crew below decks had neither the time nor opportunity to escape and went down with the ship.

The aim of the dive was to take more photos and video footage of the wreck to ensure her story is recorded in more detail for future generations. Sophie, a qualified First Class BSAC

Sophie, a qualified First Class BSAC diver and National Instructor who has been diving for 22 years, says the technical dive proved to be a sombre and poignant occasion. She said: "The weather was perfect,

She said: "The weather was perfect, it really couldn't have been kinder to us with the sea flat calm. Visibility was also good and it just proved to be a wonderful occasion. We were so glad to welcome John Magee, whose grandfather was the Master at Arms of the Pathfinder, and died in the disaster.

"John's presence really drove it home to me that this was a human

disaster, as all war is, and 250 men died when this one ship was sunk. We laid a wreath on the wreck and raised the Union flag above her. However, as per the terms of our Ministry of Defence license, we removed the Union flag at the end of the dive and brought it back to the surface where we presented it to John Magee.

"We held a simple service when we got back on the dive boat at the conclusion of the dive and Mr Magee gave a wonderful, touching eulogy to those that lost their lives on the Pathfinder. He then cast a wreath onto the surface of the sea as we BSAC divers did in memory of all those that died." She added: "The dive itself went

She added: "The dive itself went so well and the wreck is still in very good condition. There are still guns, shells, magazines and torpedo tubes clearly visible. We even saw toilets still in place on the deck and quite a few smaller artefacts like crockery dinner plates. I think they bore the GR emblem.

"However, we would never disturb what is a war grave and everything was left exactly as we found it, nothing was removed or disturbed.

"Our task was to record the wreck, video and photograph her for future generations. I'm really pleased that we did that and were able to tell the families of relatives who died what we saw. There were a number of families on the quayside desperate to hear all we could tell them of the condition of the wreck and what it looks like now."

BSAC is the national governing body

for scuba diving and is made up of 120 dive centres and 1,000 plus family friendly and sociable clubs, run by volunteers, up and down the country and abroad.

It represents more than 30,000 scuba divers and snorkellers and welcomes new members from complete beginners upwards including those who have trained with other agencies.

BSAC National Diving Committee member and group leader for diving and coaching, Dave Lock, 63, of Felixstowe, Suffolk, led the HMS Pathfinder dive team.

He said: "The dive went really well and the conditions could not have been better. Visibility was excellent too. The day started so well as we were escorted from the harbour by a pod of dolphins which was just wonderful.

"The team worked together and supported each other both in the water and out for what was a fairly technical dive. We had just 25 minutes on the wreck of the Pathfinder and while the ascent, with decompression stops, took more than an hour.

"The wreck is in good condition although much of the superstructure is missing. There are still guns visible and shell cases. We laid a wreath on the wreck and raised the Union flag which we removed, as per our license, before we surfaced."

Records show that the Cammel Laird Birkenhead-built HMS Pathfinder was struck by a single torpedo fired from U-21 as it patrolled the Scottish coast south of the Isle of May.

Launched on 16th July 1904, HMS Pathfinder was the lead ship of the Pathfinder class of cruisers.

Armed with nine 4-inch guns, she initially saw service with the Atlantic and channel fleet while at the start of the First World War she was part of the 8th destroyer flotilla based at Rosyth in the Firth of Forth.



This course has views of the sea where the green meets the blue! There is The River, The Mediterranean and the Forest Courses so you can have a choice of playing ie The Mediterranean front nine and The Forest back nine holes. The back nine is quite a tough one to play especially for those who do not have particularly a long drive and quite a bit of water to get over or not! Here it is better to hire buggies as they do not have electric trolleys especially if it is very hot.

Golf carriage can be included at time of booking and depending on which airline as to how much weight you can have ranging between 13kgs to 23kgs Transfers to the golf courses are either provided by the hotels if the courses are part of their complex or can be booked prior to departure as tee times will also need to be booked.

# Glimmer of hope travellers will have to move

A GLIMMER of hope exists that a controversial gypsy encampment on Green Belt land at Grappenhall will eventually be closed, a councillor believes. Cllr Mike Biggin says he is "cautiously optimistic" about a successful result in the long-running battle over the site in Cartridge Lane, Grappenhall.

A public inquiry into an appeal by traveller Tom Smith and his family held in June last year has resulted in stalemate.

Mr Smith had appealed against Warrington Borough Council's decision to refuse permission to increase the size of the site to enable two mobile homes and 10 touring caravans to be sited there.

The inspector who held the inquiry

communities and local government Eric Pickles disagreed and only partially allowed the appeal.

He has granted planning permission on a personal basis to Mr Smith and two other named families to remain on the site for two years but refused permission for two other residential pitches and a transit pitch. Cllr Biggin said: "I am cautiously

optimistic that eventually the situation

will reach a satisfactory conclusion.

"The two years should give time for the borough council to come up with sufficient authorised sites for travellers.

"I believe progress has been made in locating suitable sites and I would hope and expect that one of them will not be Cartridge Lane."

More than 200 local people sent letters of objection to the inquiry and 600 signed a protest petition. Cllr Biggin said: "Although we have

no prejudice against the travellers or their lifestyle choice it is plainly unfair that they should be allowed to continually flout planning law."



### Action group fights housing scheme

A NEW action group is urging villagers to unite to fight a proposed housing development on "green" land at Appleton Thorn

CARE – Campaign Against Ruining Our Environment - has been set up at Appleton Thorn to oppose proposals for up to 90 homes on farm land in Stretton Road, opposite the village hall.

In a statement, the group stress that the housing scheme is "not a done deal." No planning application has been submitted as yet.

They say there are various technical aspects to the proposals which can be challenged, in connection with traffic, child safety, timing, etc.

Bloor Homes say 30 per cent of the

houses will be allocated as "affordable homes" but CARE says these will not be available to the children of villagers but for rented and social housing.

This means the whole character of the village would be changed for generations to come.

They also warn that land at the rear

of Thorn Cross Prison has been sold for development - meaning that it is vital to preserve the Stretton Road site as a green space.
