#### ANOTHER Creamfields festival has come and gone, with an estimated 40,000 people attending on both Bank Holiday Saturday and Sunday – many staying for both days.

Police say they are extremely pleased with the policing operation, particularly as the number attending was some 10,000 more than last yea

They say there were no reports of any serious incidents and that, as a result of meticulous planning, a highprofile police presence and a proactive approach by police and the organisers, a good natured crowd was able to enjoy the event safely.

Of course, the police and, indeed, all the emergency services, become rather blasé about the things they deal with on a regular basis.

there were "no serious incidents" should be treated with some caution.

What we do know is that 32 people were arrested for offences such as possessing drugs with intent to supply, possessing Class A drugs, theft, assault, robbery, public order, drunk and disorderly, police obstruction, drink driving and driving while disqualified

There were also 122 cautions, mostly for possessing drugs and 15 street warnings for possessing cannabis.

There were also 44 thefts, six assaults and four robberies for which no arrests were made.

All despite the high-profile police presence and security guards outside most, if not all, the houses along the A56 – and in a rural area which would normally in 12 months be able to count the number of incidents,

## Church hall grant

A £22,000 grant will help Stockton Heath Methodist Church improve its community hall in Walton Road.

The money from The Veolia Environmental Trust, via the Landfill Communities Fund, will help the continued development of the hall into a more comfortable, energy efficient and flexible venue.

This stage of the project will see the construction of a new access ramp and porch for the hall and will take approximately five weeks to com-



plete. The new, safer ramp will guide pedestrians away from the car park. The new porch will have two sets of doors giving the venue

advantages Kit Heald, from the church, said: "Users with pushchairs, wheelchairs or carrying bulky items will be shielded from bad weather while they unlock or open the doors and it will help retain heat. The locking system will prevent the doors being accidentally opened from the inside by toddlers.

"And the posters and leaflets inside

the building will not now be blown all over the place by gusts of wind!" A variety of fundraising events have been held for the project during the past three years. Kit said: "There have been many

creative ideas such as an Open Gardens Day, a wedding event, various concerts and a talents event where church members have been given sums of money as seed corn to start a venture

"Over £1,000 has already been raised with much more still to come in through the sale of dolls' clothes, bags and holdalls, bird boxes, lemon cheese, paintings to name just a few of the wide variety of talents. Trips on the Llangollen railway have contributed and over the winter we are having a season of Tea Dances." From the proceeds of its fundraising

the church gives 10 per cent to other charitable causes.

Plans are for the hall to be developed during the next two years as a major community resource in the village.

Well the weather is fantastic, the countryside is incredibly beautiful and the people are just about the friendliest I have every met anywhere in the world.



## Dogs banned from playground

GRAPPENHALL and Thelwall Parish Council has moved swiftly to ban dogs from a children's playground following complaints of "uncontrollable" dogs terrorising youngsters and their parents.

A sign stating "No Dogs except Guide Dogs" is to be erected at the play area in the park at the top of Euclid Avenue, Grappenhall. The council took action after

receiving a letter from a local woman who has taken her daughter and her friends to the park for years but has recently faced problem's because of

dogs. Jennifer Wright told the council she had complained to a woman who had let her dog off its lead in the enclosed play area after the animal had jumped at her daughter, aged right and two nigres, goed one and eight and two nieces, aged one and three.

The woman had responded by shouting that the dog was causing no

problem and to "leave it alone.

In fact, the dog ran away from its owner and was climbing all over the children's play equipment, when two toddlers were trying to use it. In the end, all the children were forced to leave the park to get away from the animal.

Coun Mike Biggin, chairman of the parish council said: "We took this matter very seriously and decided to have the sign erected as soon as possible. Whether it will be enough remains to be seen."

He said the council had particularly had in mind the recent case of a two-year-old girl from



Manchester who was at risk of losing the sight of one eye as a result of catching texocariasis, a potentially lethal diseased cause by dog faeces which could also cause blindness.

## Green Belt building can go ahead

PLANS to demolish a house on Green Belt land and replace it with a

Iarger house have - unusually - been given the go-ahead. Members of the borough's planning sub-committee approved the scheme at Orsett Cottage, Half Acre Lane, Thelwall after hearing of "special circumstances" - the fact that if they refused consent, permitted development rights would allow the applicant to extend the existing house to an even larger size.

#### Over-development

Grappenhall and Thelwall Parish Council had objected to the scheme on the grounds it represented over-development in the Green Belt and that a similar scheme in Broad Lane, Grappenhall, had been refused at appeal. The case in Broad Lane was entirely different, they said. No objection had been received from the immediate neighbours.

Do you have a Limited Company?

WatkinsonBlack have noted a degree of confusion in the minds of some Limited Company clients of the documents to be submitted to Companies House, and so we take this opportunity to remind people of these. All companies need to file two annual documents at Companies House. Companies House send reminders for all documents that are due or are even overdue to the company's

registered office. The two documents are: 1. The Annual Return. This is a return reporting the names of the company's officers, as details of the share capital and shareholders. Unless a return is made up to an shareholders. Unless a return is made up to an earlier date, a return is made up to each anniversary of the company's formation, and needs to be submitted within one month. There is a filing fee of £15 if submitted electronically. There are no automatic financial penalties for filing these returns late. With regard to the Annual Return we rely on the Companies House reminders to prompt us to request the necessary information. Unless

us to request the necessary information. Unless the company's registered office is at our office, all reminders from Companies House office, all reminders from Companies House will be sent to the company directly, and it is then up to themselves to either submit the return or to contact us. If the registered office is at our address then we receive those reminders, and we will write to clients with details of how to pay the filing fee as well as enclosing a form authorising us to submit the return on their behalf. In both cases we are happy, with proper authorisation, to submit the return electronically.

2.The Annual Accounts. Each company 2.1he Annual Accounts. Each company has an Accounting Reference Date which, unless changed, is the last day of the calendar month during which the company was formed. Accounts need to be completed up to each Accounting Reference Date and, generally, need to be submitted to Companies House within nine months of that date. Failure to submit the accounts by the due date attract a financial penalty increasing from \$125\$ if a financial penalty increasing from  $\pounds 175$  if less than one month late to several thousand pounds for longer failures. To not do so by the due date is a criminal offence which can lead

to imprisonment. With regard to the accounts, as the company's Accounting Reference Date, or year end, approaches we do write to our Limited Company clients to remind them of the records that we require to prepare the accounts, and if these records are not received then we send two further reminders. Whilst we will always do our best to ensure that accounts are delivered on time, we cannot guarantee to do so unless we receive cannot guarantee to do so unless we receive the records within four months of the company's year end and also receive a reply to information requests within a reasonable time. Please also note that we cannot submit any accounts until they have been authorised


