Once again, Warrington market is hosting a classic transport show across Warrington town centre on Saturday 7 July.


This is the fifth time the event has taken place in the town centre and this year proves to be even bigger and better than ever with all types of transport being exhibited on the day.

Opinion

THE Diamond Jubilee weekend proved two things: Firstly, most people still regard the Royal Family, and the Queen in particular, with considerable affection and, secondly, they don't let a bit of rain spoil their fun.

It would be hard to imagine worse weather for street parties than that which arrived - particularly on the Sunday. But street parties had been arranged - and, for the most part, they went ahead. Most organisers had prepared for the worst and arranged suitable shelter in the shape of marquees or gazeboes. Mums, Dads, Grandmas and Granddads produced food and entertainment and, perhaps more importantly, got to know their neighbours better.

Time and time again we have been told of people talking to neighbours they had known by sight for years but never spoken to.

A few events were badly hit by the weather. Some were

forced to move indoors. A tiny minority were cancelled. But we rather liked the style of the folk at Appleton Thorn, who although soaked to the skin, enjoyed themselves so much they are planning another party to celebrate the Coronation next year.

WE can only assume that Cheshire East Council is, legally, within its rights to spend more than £78,000 on various surveys in connection with the controversial plan for an adventure playground within Tatton Park.

If it isn't, heads should roll among the senior officers who advise the authority.

But let's forget the legalities of the issue for a moment

and concentrate instead on perceptions. Should an authority which is to determine a planning application be putting up money for work which will assist the applicant's case?

It is not unusual for developers to be granted planning consent for projects subject to them funding necessary infrastructure works, such as access roads or measures to address noise, smells, pollution, etc.

But here we have a planning authority funding surveys and appraisals before even considering the application.

At the very least it gives the impression that the planners have already made up their minds.

THE A556 Lobby Group - made up of residents from the High Legh, Millington and Mere areas, has come up with an alternative to the controversial £174 million Highways Agency plan for a link road between the M56 and the M6 in Cheshire.

It would cost less, take up less land, would be less intrusive and would be acceptable to hundreds of people strongly opposed to the Highways Agency scheme.

What's more, it is not a plan scribbled on the back of an envelope by residents. It has been produced by professional traffic consultants.

Importantly, it would also find favour with motorists.

It seems to us to offer a great solution to a problem that has existed for 50 years.

But we fear it may have one, fatal flaw. The Highways Agency didn't think of it first.

Lucas blows up a storm

Lucas Boylan, from Walton, is a budding tuba player already attending the prestigious Junior Royal Northern College of Music for lessons with tuba world-renowned player Les Neish.

The youngster, who is a pupil at Broomfields Junior School, Appleton, plays for the multi-award winning Lions Youth Brass and has been selected for the National Children's Brass Band of Great Britain and the National Children's Orchestra.

To cap matters, he will soon hit the big screen in the Manchester United feature movie "Theatre of Dreams"

playing the tuba in a brass band. Lucas is one of 123 outstanding young musicians to win a bursary from Awards for Young Musicians (AYM).

The charity's annual awards programme gives grants of up to £2,000 to exceptionally talented young musicians, aged 5-17.

The funding can be used to support music making in any genre, helping with costs such as buying an instrument, music lessons, course fees and travel.



AYM director Hester Cockcroft said: "Once more we've had a very high number of applications for support from young musicians from across the UK, so Lucas should be very proud of his achievement in gaining an award.

"Music is what defines these young people: it's central to their life. We're here to help them progress on their musical journey and give them the best possible chance of fulfilling their potential."

Jubilee celebrations will live long in the memory

THE Diamond Jubilee celebrations across Cheshire will live in many people's memories as an occasion when people threw off worries about the recession and decided to have a good time - whatever the weather.

And for those who chose the actual Jubilee weekend for their revels, the weather was a major consideration.

At Stockton Heath, there was a special ceremony to rename the Mill Lane Field, with, Joyce Woods, a former reception teacher at Stockton Heath Primary School cutting the ribbon. Many

of the events moved inside the nearby scout headquarters to escape the rain. The field - now a Queen Elizabeth II Community Field and known as Mill Lane Diamond Jubilee Field - will be a recreation field in perpetuity.

A shop window competition in Stockton Heath was won by Living Colour on Walton Road, closely followed by Donna Marie, London Road and Broadbents of the Forge Precinct.

The judges - parish councillors from Stockton Heath, Appleton and Walton - commented on the high standard of all the window displays in the competition.

Appleton's beacon, at High Warren Reservoir, burned brightly and was followed by a firework display that could be seen over a wide area.

There was also a beacon on the roof of Lymm Water Tower.

There were numerous other special Jubilee events and projects.

The newly refurbished war memorial at Appleton Thorn was rededicated by the Rev Elaine Chegwin Hall, vicar of Stretton and Appleton, and a new memorial in memory of former parish councillor Mike Stansfield, in recognition of more than 30 years' service, was unveiled.

Appleton Independent Methodist Church staged a "Last night of the Proms" at Appleton Parish Hall.

Stockton Heath Tennis Club (pictured below) staged a special tournament, with Jubilee cake and a demonstration match with 60-year-old, wooden framed racquets.

Six schools in the Appleton and Stockton Heath area linked up in an innovative project to mark the occasion, with a wood carving at each school depicting a decade of the Queen's reign.

Not all the carvings could be completed in time for the Jubilee, but they will be in place later this year.





Numerous street parties were held in towns and villages across the county and most schools staged special events.

There was a giant street party, attended by more than 100 people in Glebelands Road, Knutsford while at Parklands Close, Appleton Thorn, residents enjoyed their party in the rain so much they are planning another next year to mark the 60th anniversary of the Coronation!

Bexton Primary at Knutsford planted a special tree to mark the occasion, and a band played on the roof at the Falcon Bearer pub at Longridge, Knutsford.

Mobberley Cricket Club staged a Jubilee beer festival - and rain didn't stop play - while the village's popular Victory Hall sensibly put on an "indoor street party as well as a "Mobberley's Got Talent"

show.

Meanwhile the annual Rose Oueen Festival at Thelwall had a real Royal flavour as villagers paraded through the area displaying red, white and blue.

Larissa Melia (pictured right) aged 12, a pupil`at Lymm High School was crowned Thelwall Rose Queen 2012. Retiring Queen was Claire Berry.

Many of the floats celebrated

the Queen's Diamond Jubilee. Hundreds of people turned out to cheer on the procession as it made its way to the Thelwall Parish Hall fields for the crowning ceremony.

Chill Out with Summer Red's

So, why can't reds be as refreshing as whites? Well it can if you choose the right grape variety or wine. Therefore, here are just a few of my favourite deckchair reds that can be slightly chilled and have a refreshing palate to keep you cool during the summer.

First on my list has to be Pinot Noir, it's a very light grape and has a lovely perfumed floral & strawberry character. A difficult grape to grow that likes a cooler climate; therefore, the Casablanca Valley Explorer Pinot Noir from Chile is perfect and represents excellent value.

On to the 'Old World' and the famous Italian Valpolicella..... I know this wine can be so variable but good producers show how this wine should really taste and they don't come much better than Allegrini, he is respected all over Italy for his quality and individuality and his Valpolicella wine is a perfect example.

How about the traditional Beaujolais! Fleurie tends to be the most popular of the 10 Cru wines and is made from the fruity Gamay grape. It's perfect for summer drinking with its flowery character, elegant and full of strawberry fruit. Why not try our Chateau de Fleurie, I can assure you, you won't be disappointed.

All of these wines can be lightly chilled and are perfect for accompanying grilled fish, barbecued halloumi cheese, char-grilled or roasted vegetables, pork steaks, chicken and pasta.

Here is hoping for a better July than June!

An art exhibition will showcase the work of local artists and other attractions include poetry reading, a comedy night, fun wine tasting, vintage tea party, a dog show, etc.


Festival founder and co-ordinating director Tudor Pole said: "Last year we had over 12,000 visitors coming to some 35 events. It is a true community

them rather than the needs of the business. One had a three stage appeal process in the disciplinary procedure and was probably written by someone who had a gripe against a previous employer, as it said that until the appeal process was completed no action could be taken against an employee. This meant that it would take two months to dismiss someone who was stealing from you! The other contract committed the employer to paying for counselling for any employee who was suffering from stress even if it was not work related. In both these cases the employer had fewer than 10 staff. fewer than 10 staff. The trouble is that if you are

unfortunate enough to find yourself being taken to an employment tribunal, the first document the tribunal will want to see is the

contract of employment (or "written statement of main terms of employment" as it is called in the legislation). As an employer you are obliged to issue one of these to all staff. If you have not you have failed the first test, not a good start. Even if you have got a contact, if it hasn't been written specifically for your company it may contain all sorts of unnecessary conditions. If you haven't complied with these in your dealings with employees then look out for a big award against you!

New head for troubled school

A NEW head teacher has been appointed at a troubled Cheshire primary school which has twice been placed in special measures over the last four years and was said to still be making inadequate progress as recently as January.

Governors at Stockton Heath Primary School have appointed Dan Harding, formerly acting head at Plantation Primary School, Halewood in Liverpool.

Rachel Brougham, chairman of governors at Stockton Heath said: "Mr Harding impressed the panel with his passion and vision and we believe he has the right qualities to take Stockton Heath Primary School into the next stage of its development and beyond. "He is also a keen advocate of involving staff, governors, pupils and families in the improvement journey."

It was in June 2008 that Ofsted inspectors stunned the school team by placing it in special measures.

Education chiefs appealed against the ruling - but Ofsted reaffirmed its decision in September the same year. Former head Lynda Carnes left after

a lengthy period of sick leave. Last summer, Ofsted ruled that the school remain in special measures and in January this year, a further inspection revealed it was still making "inadequate progress"

A temporary acting head was brought in from another school.




