like to lose a child in such tragic and

chilling circumstances.

To bounce back from something like that shows an enormous amount of courage - to go on and help create something as ground-breaking as the peace centre is an outstanding achievement.

l applaud Colin and Wendy Parry and their dedicated team at the peace centre for their achievements and dealing with their grief with such dignity. This has helped put Warrington on the world map as a place we can all be truly proud of helped through their ambassadorial work. That fateful day on March 20

1993 took two precious lives and scarred many others - but the outcome of that day is a living memorial we should all be proud of.

# Giving peace a chance 10 years on!

WARRINGTON'S pioneering Peace Centre is celebrating its 10th anniversary of helping those affected by political violence and racial tensions.

Opened by former Northern Ireland Secretary Mo Mowlam in March 2000, a special peace lecture by Justice Mionister Jack Straw marked the 17th anniversary of the IRA bomb attack which claimed the lives of three-year-old Johnathan Ball and 12-year-old Tim Parry following the Bridge Street bombing the day before Mother's Day – seen by many as the major turning point in the peace process.

Having previously been Leader of the House of Commons, Secretary of State for the Foreign and Commonwealth Office and Home Secretary, Jack has significant knowledge of conflict management at international level.

Under the heading "Using Power Properly" Jack spoke about his experience of the rule of law, both in high level international negotiations as Foreign Secretary and in establishing a legal framework in communities which supports people who wish to go about their lives peacefully.

The Lecture is an annual event which is hosted by the Tim Parry Johnathan Ball Foundation, the educational peace charity set up after the death of two young boys.

Foundation Chairman Colin Parry
said: "His speech gave an interesting
insight into the issues facing
politicians when making decisions on
conflict and peace at both national

and global level."

The Tim Parry Johnathan Ball Foundation for Peace was set up by Colin and Wendy Parry following the death of their son Tim and 3-year-old Johnathan.

The Peace Centre is a unique legacy and memorial to Tim and Johnathan and was built with local, national and international support. It is a £3m state of the art, fully equipped learning centre where people develop a passion for peace through participating in learning programmes.

The Foundation is now a national charity providing conflict transformation programmes to young people aged 5-25, as well opportunities for self development to victims and survivors of conflict and terrorism.

The charity aims to inspire people to lead more peaceful lives by participating in educational programmes. This enables them to better understand conflict and by doing so to reduce or eliminate violence from conflict situations affecting them.

Through these innovative educational programmes they are reaching young people who are on the fringes of society, excluded or at risk of social exclusion and helping them to re-engage in learning and social opportunities. They are tackling grass-roots problems in communities which are suffering from racial tension and violence borne out of intercommunity prejudice.

They are the only organisation in the UK working with victims and survivors of political violence such as those affected by the Northern Ireland 'Troubles', 7/7 bombings, Bali or

# The Vikings have landed - and are doing good business

ONE year on from arriving in Warrington, Swedish bank Handelsbanken is going from strength to strength.

Handelsbanken would make its Viking ancestors proud and now has more than 70 branches in Britain.

What makes it unique is that unlike the big high-street banks, which refer all lending decisions to a credit-checking department at head office, each Handelsbanken branch is run by its branch manager, who has the power to make loans - local decisions made by a local manager-helping cut through the red tape.

"Our bank doesn't pay staff bonuses and hasn't had to turn to anybody for help during the current economic downturn either by way of rights issue or asset sale," added Dennis.

# How to get more (and better) business referrals

THERE are lots of things we can all do to get more referrals - and better ones too. Here are just a couple of sure-fire tips to get you thinking . . .

### 1. Business is great!

What's the first thing most of us say when we meet other business people? "How's business?" You've probably already done it today, maybe several times! And what do most of us reply? "Business is great!" – or something along those lines. As BNI members, we commit to display a positive and supportive attitude with BNI members. So we say business is great. Well, maybe you're having the best business year or month ever. And after all, many people do like to deal with winners.

But hold on a moment: what might

"Business is great!" mean to others?
I know what I think when someone
tells me that business is great. Either:
\* Well done, you're a BNI member
and I am thrilled to bits for you. Or
\* I wish I was as busy as you, you

\* I wish I was as busy as you, you lucky [person]!

But what I am definitely NOT thinking is "Terrific. Now how can I find you more business?"

Of course, I'm not suggesting you plead for more-business-right-now-or-the-family-will-be-forced-to-eathe-dog. But you DO need to be adding some very important guidance that will help sustain your success. Something like, "Business is great thanks, but an introduction to Joe Black at OneStar would really be

good for me." Or "Business is great but we always welcome new clients. Do you know any solicitors or accountants I could talk to?" Saying ONLY that business is great could actually close down a valuable referral opportunity. Don't let that happen. Stay positive - and go the extra step that'll keep bringing you the referrals you really want.

### 2. How much?

Have you ever bought anything without knowing how much it cost? Probably only rarely (or only if very drunk... but that might just be me). However we often expect people to refer us to clients, friends and family without knowing the charges for our products or services. It's not WHAT you charge that stops you getting more referrals. It's that people don't KNOW what you charge.

A BNI member who's a software developer told me he wasn't getting many referrals. I suggested that it was because people thought he was expensive. When I asked how much it would cost to do a simple programme, he said "About £500". I then asked five people at the meeting how much they'd expect to pay for such a programme. The LOWEST guess was £10,000. The developer had given the false

impression that his services were very costly. Do you think it was easy for his chapter colleagues to find referrals for someone who they thought would cost 20 times his actual price? It's not what you charge that stops you getting referrals; it's that people form their own perceptions about what you charge and it's up to you to make sure their perceptions match reality!

### Inland port to go ahead

INNOVATIVE plans for a £20 million inland port on the Manchester Ship Canal near Warrington have been given the go-ahead - despite fears of an invasion of heavy lorries during the construction period.

Port Warrington will be built on land alongside the canal near Moore Nature Reserve and Acton Grange Viaduct.

But planning chiefs have imposed conditions - including one that a rail link connecting the site to the West Coast Main Line be constructed before the port comes into use

Port Warrington will be built by the Manchester Ship Canal Company as part of the ambitious, £50 million Ocean Gateway project, which will link Manchester and Liverpool along the canal corridor.



# Council cutbacks condemned by unions

TRADE Union chiefs have slammed Warrington council's cutbacks and wholesale redundancies across all

wholesale redundancies across all services.

A 30 day consultation period set by the council for a first phase of cuts has left both UNISON and GMB "bewildered" at the proposals and procedures being followed.

In a joint statement UNISON & GMB have written formally to all elected councillors highlighting and challenging the integrity of the consultation which has left many outstanding issues.

outstanding issues.

Bob Pinnock, GMB branch secretary said: "It is critical that council members are fully aware of all the facts and understand that the trade unions are challenging for all the right reasons

### Restructures

Ian Marks, leader of WBC formed full council that informed full council that approximately £28 million had been spent over the previous three years on agency staff and consultancy fees. The trade unions have been informed that savings of £30 million have to be made over the coming three years resulting in restructures and proposals which prematurely assume the need to make redundancies and cut services.

Jason Horan, UNISON Joint branch secretary said: "The Trade Unions cannot stand by and watch our members face redundancy when substantial amounts of money are being wasted in agency staff and consultancy fees. We will challenge robustly at the highest level any proposals that are presented to us." "The decisions the council are

facing are difficult in the present climate, councillors should be asking the questions we are and keeping everyone involved and leading the council through this difficult time.

"Members of the public, which include council employees, will demand answers at the next election and it isn't helpful when squabbling or towing party lines overshadows the human issues.
"Ignoring the trade unions has in

the past cost the council substantial

sums in compensation through tribunal proceedings. Should present circumstances continue the Trade Unions will take any necessary

### Listened

Council leader lan Marks said: "The budget consultation process has been both detailed and extensive and we have listened very carefully to the views of our staff and the trade unions. Their feedback has resulted in a number of changes to our initial

proposals.

"Like many organisations regardless of the sector or size, the borough workforce with temporary agency staff from time to time in order to maintain front line services.

"The cost of agency staff is funded within available resources and we keep our agency staffing levels under constant review. In addition like any large organisation there is need to acquire professional advice and input to ensure that the council is meeting all of its legal obligations.

"Warrington is not alone in facing budget challenges - all councils now find themselves in the same position.'

### Chairman's Report



This year will mark the 15th anniversary that Wendy and I founded the charity with the active support of our fellow Founder Trustees - John Gartside, Mike Sanders and Denis Cooper, it is also the 10th anniversary of the year we opened the Peace Centre.

Looking back all those years ago, it is barely credible that we could have achieved so much from such modest beginnings and frankly, back then I measured our survival in weeks or months rather than years.

And yet even now, despite reaching significant anniversaries and achieving so many successes, I still worry about the Foundation's survival... and I always will. So when I reflect on how we enhance our odds of survival, success and growth, I conclude, just as I did in 1995, that there are KEY factors which must be in place:

First, we need a skilled and committed team with a focused, strong leader . . . and we have that team with Clare White as its

Second, we need a strong and well balanced Board of Trustee Directors and I am pleased that long term continuity of service to the Foundation is provided by several trustees, like John Gartside, Dave Thompson, Charles Agar and Nick Taylor, who are very ably complemented by new and active members, namely Carol Nuttall, Jonathan Ford, Pat Taylor, Diana Terris and Jennifer McDermott.

Third, we've always known that we must identify and build strategic partnerships with like-minded organisations and we've pursued this objective from the very beginning – internally with our Peace Centre partners, the NSPCC and Warrington Youth Club, and externally with organisations that work for peace and reconciliation regionally, nationally and in other European countries which have experienced politically motivated violence, just as we have.

Partner organisations don't have to mirror our work or indeed our working methods, and in some cases they may not even match our philosophy or agenda for change . . . but nonetheless, we accommodate these differences for the greater good and benefit of those with whom we work . . . because we're serious about the business of peace and reconciliation building. Consequently, cooperating with, and learning from, partner organisations in meeting the multi faceted needs of our participants . . . be they from Britain, Ireland, the rest of Europe or beyond, is crucial.

I want to place on record how delighted and proud I am that the Foundation's boundaries now stretch much further than Warrington and Ireland. We're helping communities and schools in other towns, cities and regions across the UK, and in doing so, we're engaging in conflicts that present 21st century threats to this country. Notwithstanding this extension of

our reach however, I look forward, as I say every year at this time, to welcoming overseas participants to the Peace Centre and building on the Foundation's credentials as an international and unique contributor to peace building.





### **New Promotional DVD**

The Foundation has been rather reticent about shouting about its achievements. However this year, which marks the 10th anniversary of the Peace Centre opening, we have decided to do just that. Using the skills of TV presenter Nicky Campbell and Ken Horn from Horn Productions Ltd, who generously donated their time, the Foundation has been able to make a new DVD to showcase its work, achievements and hopes for the future.

The Foundation was set up in April 1995 and moved into the Peace Centre after it was officially opened by HRH the Duchess of Kent on 20th March 2000. Ten years later, we have grown from being a local charity to a charity working with both young people and adults regionally, nationally and internationally. We have been nominated for National Awards and posted on Government websites as an example of best practice, and although we are proud of what we have achieved, helping young people and victims of political violence to turn their lives around has given us the greatest satisfaction.

### **Priesthorpe High School**

February saw 14 more students from Priesthorpe High School take part in the Leadership Development course at the Peace Centre. This work forms part of the continued commitment between the Foundation and the School to work with pupils from a diverse range of backgrounds become more skilled in leadership and conflict transformation. The pupils are then encouraged to take these new skills back into school to help challenge ideas, beliefs and behaviours which have become sources of tension and conflict between groups within the school.

The 44 students who attended last year's course are already busy at work within the School. They are currently meeting on a weekly basis and are working toward delivering a 'whole school' event based around conflict transformation later on this year. Alongside this they are working with their peers and have been using the skills learnt during their time with the Foundation as a source of inspiration to not only change aspects of their behavior but also that of others.

The new intake of students has just finished an extremely challenging and rewarding week of intense work. This incredibly valuable experience has revealed not only a diversity of attitude and beliefs within the school but also within the communities the students come from. During this time they have explored approaches to challenging and transforming the reasons for conflict and addressing this at it roots.

Our School is indebted to the Foundation for its support over the past year. In particular to the hard work and dedication of Kelly and Jon. We are already seeing the fruits of their work now, and in the future we will see the impact it makes within the school. The next step is to bring other staff up to date with what we are trying to achieve via a staff training day, in which we hope some of our student 'leaders' will take an active role. They are a shining example of what can be achieved and we hope that their good work will flourish and grow over time.

### **Inspire and empower**

'REACH' is a brand new project that aims to inspire and empower its participants to make a positive impact within their own community and tackle the negative stereotyping of young people in the town.

Delivered in partnership with The Warrington Wolves Foundation and funded by a grant from the Big Lottery Fund, the programme is accredited by the Open College Network and incorporates subjects such as conflict transformation, leadership, self awareness and identity, prejudice and discrimination, alongside a number of practical skills in areas such as art,

sport, music and media.
Participants will be actively involved in planning, developing and delivering community projects.

Through the community volunteering element of programme, the young people will be able to work with different generations within the town to deliver events that will unite the community. They will be trained and supported throughout by project workers Phil McClure and Lawrence Ann-Marie manager programme Kellv Simcock. Mentors from the local business community will assist in

the planning and development of the community projects.

The young people will be actively engaged in evaluating the REACH programme and will report their findings, experiences and learning through a best practice annual conference, where they will share examples and stories of how they have used the skills they have acquired.

# International Victims of Terrorism meet in Salamanca, Spain

Jo Dover, Pam White and Susan Verghese travelled to the old university city of Salamanca in Western Spain in February to attend the 6th International Congress for Victims of Terrorism.

Victims from all over the world congregated for three days in the medieval city to listen to the stories of people affected by terrorist incidents such as 9/11, bomb attacks in Madrid, Omagh and Israel, ETA attacks, hostage-taking by FARC of a Columbian congressman and the French airliner that was blown up over the Tenere desert.

Pam White spoke of the impact of being affected by the IRA bombing of Harrods in 1983, where she was sent in as a police officer to evacuate the area and was caught up in the explosion. The Congress was attended by many high ranking officials from national, regional and local government and was formally opened by the Prince and Princess of Asturia. On the second day, an event was held in Salamanca's Plaza Mayor (Main Square) to pay tribute to victims of terrorism all over the world.





Over 3000 members of the public attended the event to show their respect for and solidarity with the victims. On the final day, the Foundation delegates travelled back to Madrid and were able to visit the memorials to the 2004 Madrid train bomb attacks at Retiro Park and Atocha train station. The next Congress will be held in New York after the 10th anniversary of 9/11.



### Network of Associations of Victims of Terrorism Conference, Paris

On 18th and 19th September 2009, the Network of Associations of Victims of Terrorism (formerly VNET) held a European Congress at the French National Assembly in Paris. The event was organised to mark the 20th anniversary of the UTA DC-10 aircraft bombing and as a forum for the voices of European victims of terrorism to be heard and acknowledged.

Rosie Aubrey, programme worker for Survivors for Peace Programme, was invited to join the delegation along with Pam White, one of our participants who spoke about her experiences. The theme for the event was "Terrorism and Society". The event explored how communities respond to and are affected by conflict and acts of terrorism. The congress heard from twelve victims who shared their stories and spoke of the challenges they had experienced in dealing with their experiences. The conference heard from victims from Columbia, France, Spain, Italy and Northern Ireland and was a poignant reminder of the impact of such devastating events.

The event was held over two days and included a series of round table discussions about terrorism and society which was an opportunity for victims to share their experiences. A common theme shared by all the speakers was the lack of understanding and acknowledgement received from the general public, which compounded feelings of isolation. The conference highlighted the important role victims could play in educating wider society about the human impact of traumatic events.

To mark the 20th anniversary of the UTA DC-10 Aircraft Bombing, a series of memorial events were held across Paris to commemorate the many lives lost and affected by the UTA incident and in remembrance of all victims of terrorism.

### Congratulations!

Congratulations to John Kabia who became a British Citizen at a Ceremony held at the Warrington Town Hall on 1st February 2010. John joined the Foundation two years ago and works on the Survivors for Peace Programme. Originally from Sierra Leone, he came to the UK eight years ago to study Peace and Conflict Resolution at the University of Bradford. This recognition means he can continue to do the positive work with victims and survivors of conflict and terrorism. John said 'I feel honoured and humbled for this opportunity to play a full part in society as a British Citizen. I have always been a great admirer of the democratic values and principles of fairness and freedom on which this country is based. My naturalisation gives me the opportunity to contribute towards building a just, inclusive and peaceful society'.



### Jo's swim for peace

All of our staff 'go the extra mile' for the Foundation but Jo had to go even further and make it TWO. It was a big challenge and everyone thought she was insane but she did it and had enough energy and enthusiasm to keep going.

Jo said: "Wendy approached me one day to tell me that several team members were taking part in the English Half Marathon and asked if I would like to join them. After I stopped laughing I thought that, while I was definitely not a runner, I could do something to raise money as well and started to think

about what challenge I could give myself. I decided that I would swim two miles (129 lengths of the pool at the David Lloyd Centre) as this seemed like a good challenging distance. My aim was to raise £200 if possible and in the first week of fundraising I hit that target. Wendy joked with me that I would raise £1000 at that rate and I laughed it off, saying I would be happy to raise £500 if I got lucky. I was so surprised and delighted when the final total came to £2000. It was lovely to receive such support from everyone and it certainly helped me to focus on my training. I managed to complete the 2



miles in 1 hour 33 minutes and 3 seconds which was almost half an hour faster than I had expected! Thank you to everyone who sponsored me and helped the Foundation."



£1.2m revamp for hall

THE £1.2 million re-development of Warrington's Parr Hall will start around the middle of the month and will take more than six months to complete.

An earlier phase of improvement was completed last year, with improvements to lighting and sound facilities and this has already made the hall more suitable for larger shows.

With more than 160 first-class goals to his credit, this former striker/left winger starred with Wolves - where he earned the nickname "The Tank" for his bustling style - Burnley and Huddersfield in the 70's and 80's and he also won caps for England in the youth team, the under-23's and England B.

For seven years running, he gained the title of the fastest footballer in Britain at the annual competition at the Meadowbank Stadium

It will be some time before it is known exactly how much was raised on the night but organiser Vic Charlesworth is confident that it will be more than £3,000 which will be presented to Help for Heroes.

### Approaching the budget and the new tax year

As we approach the budget and the start of the new tax year we already know much of what is in store for us

Inflation erodes the value of money. Therefore, the value of personal allowances falls unless they are increased in line with inflation. This was

increased in line with inflation. This was recognised by Parliament many years ago when they said that unless the Chancellor says otherwise then all allowances will automatically increase in line with retail prices.

This year, Alistair Darling says 'No'. Alistair says that you are stuck with what you have! He also says that, generally, tax bands and tax rates will all remain the same. This means, of course, that most of you will not notice much most of you will not notice much difference in your take-home pay, other than you can buy that bit less with it.

High earners will, however, notice a difference.

Firstly, people earning over £100,000 will have their personal allowance progressively withdrawn as their earnings increase. Secondly, an additional rate of tax of 50% will apply to earnings above £150,000. Some

may welcome the return of this real progression in tax, whilst others may remember with dread those pre Margaret Thatcher days of 80% and above taxation. You will all have a chance to express your views on this very soon!

you operate through a Limited It you operate through a Limited Company, then the proposed increase in the small companies rate of Corporation Tax has been postponed again, which means that the small companies rate will remain at 21% for a further year. The main rate of Corporation tax also remains the same

Taxation on spending, however, has recently increased and will continue to increase in some cases in the new tax year. On 31st December, the standard rate of VAT reverted from the temporary rate of 15% to the former rate of 17.5%. This represents an increase in retail prices of over 2%, which will make the treezing of personal allowances hurt

However, there are even bigger changes, and they are generally all upwards. One is the rate of road fund





licence payable. Any vehicle with an emission of 151g/km will have to pay more next year, some by as much as 7%. Additionally, there is a new tax on new vehicles (the 'showroom' tax) which will increase the price of new vehicles by up to \$2950! by up to £950!

by up to £950! This budget is, of course, just before a General Election. Many people are suggesting that whoever wins that election will have to have another budget later in the year. 




"It was an absolute lifeline for me, especially when I fell pregnant again and was so scared.
