WARRINGTON Borough Council's announcement of 42 compulsory redundancies and 181 jobs losses in the coming year, in reality, is only the tip of the iceberg.

In anticiptation of the required budget cut backs the council has been making posts redundant for some time

More worringly they do not take into account possible job losses in the education sector, with some schools looking at cutting teaching and admin

We are re-assured by the controlling Lib-Dem/Conservation coalition that they have prepared carefully over the last four years and, as a result, Warrington is much better placed to deal with the national economic recession than many other councils.

While that may be the case, it will be of little comfort to those unfortunate to be losing their jobs, while many others feel they still face an uncertain

The job losses on top of those already gone or going at the North West Development Agency is bound to have an impact on the local economy and I am sure there will be a lot more belt tightening over the coming 12

But on a positive note Warrington is still considered a highly successful town with major private investors still wanting

to invest in its continuing development.
We must hope that these private investors and developments like the £30m Orford Park sports village can help us ride the storm!

Too many cooks spoiling your insurance claim?

Twenty years ago, when a policyholder had a fire, he/she rang their insurer, a loss adjuster came round to see them, ultimately told the insurer how much money to pay the policyholder and they sent out a cheque. Things have since changed, unfortunately for the

Geoff Williams, Director at Cherry and Griffiths reports "I was recently asked to go to help a relative of a business associate, an elderly gentleman who had had a fire in his house.

There was severe fire damage, with the entire upstairs requiring refurbishment, including a new roof, and virtually everything downstairs being ruined by extinguishment

When I went into the house I noticed in my peripheral vision, on a sideboard, many pieces of yellow A4 size paper with very large numbers written on them in black marker pen. At the time I did not think of nor therefore realise the significance of these.

During discussion with our client I indicated that I would speak to one of the loss adjusters involved, at which point my client said that he had the adjuster's mobile telephone number available. He then brought out a folder with many of these pieces of paper in them, including one with the mobile number of the particular adjuster. At this point I realised that my client had difficulty

with his vision and that the papers which I had seen downstairs constituted his personal telephone

directory.

The fire had occurred about a week earlier. In his folder he had the phone numbers for the buildings insurers, the contents insurers, the office of the adjusting firm acting on behalf of the building insurers, the office of the adjusting firm acting on behalf of the contents insurers, the actual adjuster initially sent round by the building Insurers, the more senior adjuster now dealing with the matter on behalf of the building Insurers, the adjuster dealing with the contents claim, the head office of the restoration contractors appointed by the contents insurers, the local franchisee from that organisation who would be coming to see him eventually, the accommodation

bureau appointed by the insurers to find alternative accommodation, and a local letting agent recommended by the accommodation bureau. The poor old gentleman gentleman was entirely confused by all these different people being involved.

Quite simply I told him to write my name and telephone number down, which he did in his usual manner, and then explained that he could forget all the other numbers in his folder, and that my number was the only one which he would need from this point onwards."





Irritable Bowel Syndrome woes

He met and married a girl from Warrington and although now divorced, made it is home town.


After setting up several chip shops and the Bella Roma Italian Restaurant he is always looking for his next mountain to climb and is currently working on an invention which he hopes to launch next year!



Bid to unlock answer to multimillion pound problem

AN ingenious way to stop wheelie bins going missing – and save local authorities hundreds of thousands of pounds a year - has been devised.

The Oasis Bin-Loc is simple to install and operate, making the bin

impossible to remove, and has an attachment that prevents anyone accessing the contents.

Some local authorities are spending up to £0.25 million a year replacing stolen or damaged wheelie bins and Merseyside Fire Brigade reckons the cost of putting

out wheelie bin blazes costs taxpayers around £1.3million a

The system comes in two forms: A simple bracket fixed to a wall and a free-standing node that locks bins together in a waste station for communal areas in social housing areas. The bins can be unlocked by

a caretaker.

Recyclable and residual waste
will be kept in separate stations,
thus encouraging residents to

recycle more.

• Controls the spread of waste from damaged or upturned bins.

 The Oasis Bin-Loc, which has been invented and patented by Social enterprise company Prescot Oasis, replaces old, heavy and cumbersome bin shuts.

Prescot Oasis, a social enterprise

business that uses its profits to transform deprived communities through jobs, training and business

development, came across the idea after asking residents at a communal block where they had been doing landscape gardening if they could suggest improvements to the area where they live.

The residents complained about missing or vandalised wheelie bins and Oasis Project Director Colin Hill set about finding a solution. After extensive enquiries he discovered there was no product available and began the process of inventing the

Mr Hill said: "We believe our Bin-Loc system provides a cost-effective answer to wheelie bin theft, fires and identity theft, as well as providing a cost-saving and environmental solution to communal waste disposal."

The Bin-Locs are made in Prescot and Prescot Oasis hopes to set up a factory in the area to manufacture and tailor the product for individual local authorities.

£10 million 'solar farm' plan

A £10 million 'solar farm' is on a list of high tech projects being considered by Warrington Borough Council.

No site has yet been identified and there would have to be consultation with nearby residents before the project could go ahead. But the facility would save an estimated £375,000 annually and cut emissions of greenhouse gases by some 2,040 tonnes.

It would help the council achieve its aim of reducing the size of its carbon footprint by 40 per cent by 2015.

A schools solar project would cost another £4,000,000 to produce annual savings of £145,728 and cut emissions by 793 tonnes. The council would have to borrow money to fund these major capital schemes.

Town Hall chiefs have approved a five year carbon management plan that would save the borough council £10 million and enable the target of a 40 per cent cut in emissions.

The programme gathers pace this year, building on two years in which Warrington - which realised the need to reduce emissions several years ago - cut its carbon footprint by a total of 1,398 tonnes and achieved annual savings totalling £243,190.

The aim in the coming year is to cut CO2 emissions by 4,828 tonnes and

CO2 emissions by 4,828 tonnes and make annual savings of £945,879. In 2012-13, the target would be to cut emissions by 7,804 tonnes and save £1,484,885 while the following year the target would be 10,370 tonnes and £1,903,248. In 2014-15, the aim would be 11,250 tonnes and £2,044,169.

Youngsters give peace a chance

YOUNGSTERS from Warrington and Ireland took part in a special exchange programme based at Warrington Peace Centre to help spread the message of peace through their respective communities.

The third and final phase of the Tim Parry Leadership Development Programme took place at the Peace Centre involving a four day residential programme which saw a group of 20 young people from England, Northern Ireland and the Republic come together for the final leg of their learning programme.

learning programme.

The programme, funded by the DFA in the Republic of Ireland is the longest running programme of the Foundation and is targeted at working with young people to develop their skills and understanding in relation to conflict ad the nonviolent resolution of conflict.

Exploring themes and topics ranging from International conflicts and sectarianism and contemporary challenges such as racism and

Exploring themes and topics ranging from International conflicts and sectarianism and contemporary challenges such as racism and Islamophobia that exist in all communities the programme works to increase young peoples' understanding of those issues that divide and threaten to divide our communities. Crucially, the young people also look at issues in their own communities and how their own individual actions can effect change.

communities and how their own individual actions can effect change. The residential programmes are highly participatory with participants engaged in activities ranging from games to formal lectures/speakers.

Programme Manager Kelly Simcock said: "The aim is to equip the young people with the skills and understanding to go back into their communities and effect positive change. Whether that be that they challenge discriminatory comments and prejudice; or that they take on a formal leadership role in their communities with their peers- it's all about doing things differently'.

During the final residential, the group were visited by Colin and Wendy Parry who reinforced the importance of trust and understanding in peace building. Colin encouraged the group to 'keep in touch' and remember the experiences that they had shared - and to use these in whatever way they can to contribute to the achievement of peaceful communities.

Programme worker Gemma Benns said 'It was great to see how the young people developed over the course of the three residentials - by the end of the programme, you could see how much people's attitudes and mindsets had shifted and that the new skills that they had learnt were being put into practice'.

The 20 youngsters previously took part in leadership programmes in Northern and Southern Ireland.

WENDY Parry, the mother of 12-year-old IRA bomb victim Tim Parry, is embarking on the biggest challenge of her life by climbing Mount Kilimanjaro to mark the 18th anniversary of the Warrington bombing and the year of her son's 30th birthday.

Wendy, co-founder of The Tim Parry Johnathan Ball Foundation for Peace, along with her husband Colin, will be joined by their daughter Abbi as part of a team of four to tackle Kilimanjaro, which at 5,895 metres [1934] ft.] is Africa's highest mountain.



Other members of the team are Kelly Simcock, a Foundation Programme Manager and Alan McKie, one of the charity's many supporters.

This fund raising event aims to raise £20,000 for the charity based at Warrington Peace Centre.

Commenting on the venture Wendy said: "On March 20th 1,993, family life for the Parry's

changed forever.

"We had to adjust to life without Tim. Creating the Foundation and building the Peace Centre as a living tribute to both Tim and Johnathan became our focus, and helping other people who had suffered from personal, community or national conflict became our future. It is 18 years since the bombings, and this fund raising climb up Kilimanjaro marks that anniversary. But it also celebrates the lives of Tim and Johnathan, and serves to highlight the continuing need for support for victims of conflict both in the UK and throughout the world."

Wendy added: "This year would have been Tim's 30th birthday. There are certain milestones in everybody's life, whether it's celebrating important

birthdays, getting married or the excitement of starting a family.

Tim missed out on all these events through no fault of his own so Abbi and I will be doing this for him and lehathan who become part of our Johnathan, who became part of our extended family in 1993".
Kelly added: "One of our flagship

prográmmes is the Leadership Development programme which has



transformed the lives of so many. The money we raise will go towards providing young people with alternatives to violence and helping them to make a difference in their communities....I can't wait for the challenge of Kilimanjaro and help to raise those vital funds to give more young people the chance to make a difference in their communities".

The Tim Parry Johnathan Ball Foundation for Peace was set up by Colin and Wendy Parry following the death of their 12-year-old son Tim and 3-year-old Johnathan Ball after the IRA bombed Warrington in 1993. Wilf and Marie, Johnathan's parents, gave their full support to the organisation.

The Peace Centre (Warrington) is a unique LIVING legacy and memorial to Tim and Johnathan. It was built with local, national and

international support.

Electric car scores well on safety

THE first ever crash test on an electric car carried out by Euro NCAP - the European New Car Assessment Programme' - has allayed safety fears about the new vehicles.

A Mitsubishi I-MiEV supermini was awarded an overall score of four out of a possible five stars.

As a result, crash test experts believe five star protection is attainable for future electric cars.

Edmund King, the AA's president,

welcomed the test result.

He said: "This i-MiEV sets a benchmark in safety that other electric vehicles will have to achieve. From the point of view of future buyers, the

success of this crash test will dispel much of the worry about what happens when an electric car is involved in a significant crash."

Three-in-one car unveiled

VOLVO have unveiled the V60 plug-in hybrid - which they claim features the best properties of three different car types in one, single attractive sports wagon.

Three buttons on the centre console give the driver access to either an electric car with a range of up to 50km, a high-efficiency hybrid with carbon dioxide emissions averaging just 49g/km or a muscular, fun-to-drive car with acceleration from 0-100km in just 6.9 seconds.

The same 4-star rating applies to the Citroen C-Zero and the Peugeot iOn, both of which are structurally identical to the Mitsubishi i-MiEV and have the same interior fittings and

levels of safety equipment.
Crash testers' chief worry was how
well the car's batteries stood up to the impact and the effectiveness of cut-off switches in insolating the high-voltage battery. Euro NÇAP observed that no electrical or fire hazards were detected during the testing of the i-

Euro NCAP has recently crash tested four other new cars and awarded stars as follows: Dacia Duster (small off-road 4x4) 3 stars; Mitsubishi ASX (small family) 5 stars; Nissan Juke (supermini) 5 stars; Hyundai ix20 (small MPV) 5 stars.

at Bury General Hospital.


Dr Jones regaled the diners with extremely amusing stories based on his medical experiences and had his audience in fits of laughter.

Good record keeping

Keeping adequate business records has always been important. Not only do good records help you to manage your business and provide you with the information to help it grow, but they will also help your accountants to provide you with a cost-effective

Good record keeping will become even more important later this year. The tax office have announced a program of visiting small businesses to ensure that visiting small businesses to ensure that their records are sufficiently accurate to enable the business to accurately complete their tax return. We are told that they will visit up to 50,000 businesses each year for a period of 4 years. Typically, penalties will be charged if inadequate records are found during the visit during the visit.

during the visit.

Each visit is estimated to last for half a day, and the tax office estimates that this will cost the business about £50. However, business organisations estimate that the true cost to a business of each visit will be in excess of £500 in lost production and professional representation. And then, of course, there will be the penalties! there will be the penalties!

Generously, the tax office has

produced a new leaflet on how to keep records, and this is published on HMRC's website. This states quite categorically that putting together your records once a year is not satisfactory. They must be képt throughout the year on a regular basis. However, the leaflet

does not state the precise nature of records to be kept.

As a firm, we look at the individual requirements of each client. For some clients, a manual cashbook will be sufficient, with entries being supported by invoices and other evidence. Other clients may need or prefer to keep their records on a spreadsheet, and this can be very inexpensively done using the free "Open Office" program as well as in "Google Docs". 

The Warrington and Widnes Blind Society, which operates from the Rex Furness Centre in Museum Street plans to move to the former Fairfield Primary School, in Fairfield Street - now

operating as a community hub.
It will also change its name to The
VIP Centre - for Visually Impaired

People.

Chairman John Taylor said: "We feel the word 'blind' is less appropriate now.
"We have more than 1,000
members and the majority of them are
visually impaired rather than blind."

The move, which has been discussed for some years, is because the Museum Street premises are no longer considered suitable. There are problems with disabled access and some of the

rooms are cramped.

It is hoped the VIP Centre will be upand-running before the end of the year.

Mr Taylor, a former Mayor and onorary Alderman, said the Honorary['] organisation would continue to operate three days a week, providing breakfast, social activities, armchair exercises, hot meals and entertainment. They hoped to occupy three former classrooms at the

old school.

Some adaptations in the building will be necessary and the society has applied for grant aid.

"We will be joining a larger community and we think that will be good for our members," said Mr Taylor.

The society also organises home visits, trips out, holidays, etc and is currently negotiating to establish links with a society for the visually impaired in Warrington's twin town, Hilden, in Germany.
