£42 million spent locally

WARRINGTON Borough Council spends £42 million with businesses in the town -38 per cent of its discretionary spend.

This was revealed by council leader Ian Marks in response to a question by Conservative councillor Paul Kennedy, at a meeting of the council.

More than half the money is spent with smaller to medium sized businesses.

The council spends £11.2 million with firms employing up to 49 people, £6.7 million with firms employing between 50-99 people and £6.2 million with firms employing between 100-250 people.

privilege. Geoff added: "I would like to thank Warrington Borough Council for providing the litter picker sticks and rubbish bags and also for the facilities to collect all the rubbish found around the lake after the event.



### Council ready for a hard winter

WARRINGTON Borough Council has doubled its stock of grit in case the severe weather conditions experienced last winter are repeated.

severe weather conditions experienced last winter are repeated. Officers say that in a typical winter season [November to February] approximately 1,200 tonnes of grit would be used on the town's roads. Last year almost double that was used in just three weeks. Now a stockpile 2,000 tonnes of grit is now waiting at the highways depot to be dispatched at the first sign of frost. More is also on order. Coun Alan Litton, the council's executive member for environment and transport, said: "The council's highways team is constantly monitoring the weather situation and we feel we are better prepared than ever before. "The wintry conditions we experienced both locally and nationally last year were unprecedented. We haven't seen a prolonged period of cold weather like that in a very long time. Hopefully we won't again this year, but if we do we are ready for the worst and our team of gritters can be out on the roads within an hour." hour

MORE than 7,000 families private sector homes in Warrington are living in 'fuel poverty' it is believed - and it will take more than 200 years to deal with the problem.

This is the conclusion of a report to the borough council's environment and housing overview and scrutiny committee. A household is in fuel poverty if it has to spend more than 10 per cent of its income on heating the home to an adequate level.

The main causes of cold homes are poor insulation or inefficient heating systems, low income, fuel prices and under-occupation.

Climate change forecasts indicate that Warrington can expect more flooding, more unpredictable or violent weather, average temperature increase of two per cent by 2050, along with drier symmers and wetter winters.

Fuel poverty, poor housing and providing affordable warmth are associated problems.

An average house emits 11 tonnes of carbon dioxide a year which means in Warrington, housing is responsible for emitting 550,000 tonnes a year. One way of improving the situation is to bring houses up to the "decent homes standard."

The council's housing stock was brought up to this standard in 2008, the report claims, and the transfer of property to the Golden Gates Housing Trust should ensure it is maintained to this standard in future. But 24,000 do not meet the decent homes standard - mainly due to heating problems.

borough council has The implemented a wide range of initiatives to educate households, provide advice and financial assistance to tackle

energy efficiency and fuel poverty. Last year, 1,434 households were given energy efficiency advice and 344 were provided with grants for loft and cavity wall insulation until the programme had to be stopped to prevent an overspend.

It is estimated the cost of bringing private sector homes up to the decent homes standard would be £80.2 million - and that with the current level of resources available it would take more than 200 years.



UNNECESSARY visits to the Accident and Emergency department at Warrington Hospital are costing the NHS around £9.25 million a year - and the figure is rising.

Seven out of every 10 people who go to the department are not admitted to a hospital bed and almost half are classed as a minor injury or illness.

Every day, the highly specialist A&E teams are faced with having to deal with minor illnesses such as coughs and colds, backache and upset stomachs.

New research NHS Warrington has revealed the true extent of the problem.

In the last 12 months, there were 85 patients who attended A&E departments 1,123 times, averaging one visit per month between them. The same patients were also responsible for 664 ambulance call outs in the same period.

Now a new campaign is reminding local people to stop and think and "Choose Well" before they set off for hospital.

Dr Rita Robertson, director of public health for Warrington said: "These figures are alarming. It seems that people are forgetting the purpose of A&E departments.

"I think that we need to get back to the message that A&E departments

are for life-threatening and emergency conditions, such as heart attacks, strokes, breathing problems and serious accidents.

"We need to make sure that our hospital A&E teams are caring for people with serious or life threatening conditions.

Through our Choose Well campaign we want to re-educate people about using the right service to get the right treatment."

She is an inspiration to the whole group and I'm sure many readers would love to hear about her story!


We held our group 'Woman of The Year' this week and Julie totally blew us all away and was

more appropriate than a sponsored


beard shave which all his family, friends and neighbours could not believe as they had never seen him

Delme has joined the Warrington Wolves Charitable Foundation through Big Storage Sportsmatch project.


The project will focus on the top flight basketball star delivering coaching sessions to schools while developing a grassroots Division 4 team which will play out of Birchwood Leisure Centre.

# Christmas is upon us

Once again Christmas is upon us, and as usual Christmas is quickly followed by the tax return deadline of 31st January. We are currently working hard to ensure that all of our clients' returns are submitted on time provided that the

information to do so is available to us. Meeting the deadline is important for two reasons.

Two reasons. 1. Any tax return submitted late will incur an automatic penalty of up to  $\pounds 100$ , followed by a further  $\pounds 100$  if the return remains outstanding six months later. Currently, the penalty cannot exceed the amount of any tax due, but there is a proposal to remove this limitation in the future.

2. If you are in business then failure to meet the deadline will both increase the risk of your return being selected for further inspection by the tax office and also invalidate any insurance that you have against the additional professional costs

that you will incur if you are selected. So do you need to complete a return? The short answer is, again, in two parts. 1. If you are issued with a return then,

whatever your personal circumstances are, you must complete and submit it. Failure to do so will incur the above penalty. It will

also lead to the tax office at some point

also lead to the tax office at some point issuing a determination of your tax liability, which can then only be overturned by submitting the outstanding return. 2. If you have any income that is not taxed at source, or your circumstances alter in such a way that you may not be paying the correct amount of tax, it is your responsibility to inform the tax office so that they can issue you with a return. This is the they can issue you with a return. This is the meaning of self assessment, and if you fail to do so by the relevant deadline then a

to do so by the relevant deadline then a further penalty will be incurred. But enough talk of penalties. This year, if you are in business and VAT registered, there is the further complication of the increase in the standard VAT rate on 1st January from 17.5% to 20%. There is detailed guidance on how to deal with this between an under a detailed guidance on change, as well as detailed guidance on the anti-avoidance provisions covering the period of the change, on the tax office's website.

website. We do not have space to deal with these provision here, but we are pleased to advise further if required. One important provision, however, that will affect many small traders is that if you operate the flat rate scheme then the percentage to be used in calculating your liability will
