Editor's Comment

IF you have any concerns about Warrington's bin collection service going fortnightly – you have until February 1 to raise your concerns with the borough

But it would appear whether you have any concerns or not – the fortnightly collections will become a reality sooner rather than later.

The council's executive board has already approved the fortnightly collections (subject to public consultation) and with savings of around £1 million a year at times of such austerity, the new collections will

be upon us soon.

www.warrington.gov.uk Meanwhile I am pleased to report that the council has scrapped its controversial charging policy for replacements bins if you are unfortunate enough to have one stolen or vandalised.

It would appear the council were reluctant to promote this good news message even offer coming under fire from Warrington North MP Helen Jones, who publicly condemned the charging policy – after it had already been scrapped.

Better communications within the Labour party in Warrington may

prove helpful for our town.

As I have said before and I will say it again, our politicians should spend their time and energy working for the good of the town!

Meanwhile rumours that a Super Prison was once again being considered for the Omega site at Burtonwood have been ruled out.

An annoucement by Justice Secretary Chris Grayling that sites were being looked at in the North West sparked widespread fear that the Warrington site was back on the agenda. But urgent talks between Warrington South MP David Mowat and Mr Grayling cleared up the issue and thankfully put the rumour to bed.

It is good to see that the site, armarked for economic earmarked regeneration, is now starting to bear fruit at long last after many years of inactivity, following the announcement that food distributors Brakes are opening a facility on Omega, which can only be good for the future of our town. The last thing we need is the idea of a prison putting people off relocating to Warrington!

to know Pam, she is an inspiration to us all and very worthy of her new title







Pledge to tackle business crime

A PLEDGE to tackle crimes that affect

A PLEDGE to tackle crimes that affect businesses such as robbery, people not paying and staff stealing, has been made by Cheshire's Police and Crime Commissioner John Dwyer.

He says that although figures for business crime in Cheshire and Warrington are "very low" he wants to work with the community to reduce it further.

it turther.

He met business people from across the county to hear about their concerns, discuss their priorities and ask for their views on the budget and council tax for policing.

Business organisations such as chambers of commerce, the Federation of Small Businesses and the Institute of Directors also talked about their concerns.

the Institute of Directors also talked about their concerns.

Mr Dwyer said: "A vitally important part of my role is to represent the views of the business community when holding the Chief Constable to account.

"I have made sure that my first police and crime plan reflects this area of policing and I intend to make it my business to ensure that the police work hard to further reduce crimes such as robbery from businesses, theft by employees, shoplifting and making off without payment."



He said business leaders raised issues such as how to prevent on-line credit card fraud, metal theft and how to assist the policing of hauliers. They also discussed the need for businesses to report crime to the police and not simply accept losses from crime as inevitable.

Mr Dwyer said: "The figures for business crime in Cheshire are very low. Last year just 91 business robberies were reported, a 14 per cent decrease on the previous year. Commercial burglary fell by 16 per cent. He said business leaders raised

commercial burgion y len's y cent.

"In this economic climate, the police and businesses need to work together to ensure that we are doing all we can. I have seen some great work being done by the police at ground level; for example, in helping to prevent people making off from fuel stations without paying."





Network Warrington will be changing the times of a number of its services from Monday 28 January 2013

A number of routes will see revised timetables, particularly during off-peak periods in order to improve reliability, some services will be changing their routes and some new links will be created.



- Service 13 will cease to serve Whittle Hall (which is served by 17/17A & 29) and will form a new link to Sainsburys at Chapelford.
- Service 29 will no longer serve Collins Green and Burtonwood, these areas will be served by a new route 33 which will be provided by another operator funded by Warrington Borough Council.
- 48 Service 48 to Dudlows Green is withdrawn, however, Longwood Road will continue to have a peak service to/from Warrington (10A) and the 7A will provide the off peak link including a new link to Grappenhall Heys (7C)
- 10C New off peak service 10C will provide a link from Gainsborough Road to the shopping area at Latchford then on to Stockton Heath.

New leaflets for all services are available from our Travel Centre at Warrington Bus Interchange from Monday 14 January, they can also be accessed through our website, and we will also be delivering copies to outlets such as libraries and post offices across the Borough.

Charity turns old bikes into cash

A GARDEN centre charity has branched out to recycle old bikes making more than $\pounds10,000$ during their first year in business.

The Long Lane Garden Centre, part of the Walton Lea project which supports adults with special needs, realised it had to diversify to provide more placement opportunities, while also work towards becoming more self sufficient.

Now the cycle project has become a fantastic success raising a grand total of £10,163.00.

Long Lane Garden Centre Project Co-ordinator

Kath Jones explained: "The cycles are made available to the public at a very reduced rate. With petrol and obesity on the increase it can only be a good idea. Our lads and lasses who attend Long Lane Garden Centre were only too pleased to help out. They are supported by our dedicated staff and volunteers, who are repairing, swapping good for bad and making bikes available from as little as $\mathfrak L10$.

"We have now been granted some funding by Stronger Together to enable our mechanics to achieve

a qualification in cycle maintenance. Then we can pass our knowledge on to the general public by providing workshops.

Long Lane will also become a site where people can have their cycles etched and registered for





Health check your organisation

ANGRY campaigners are stepping up a campaign to improve Warrington's

Peel Hall Park.

The Friends of Peel Hall Park are vigorously opposed to proposals to build houses in the area and want the land designated as a Queen Elizabeth II Field as part of the legacy for the Queen's Diamond Jubilee...

Campaigner Cllr Bob Haskew-Jones said: "We are presenting a petition to Warrington Council because we want the park protected so that our children and grandchildren will have access to all kinds of spaces including woodlands, play

grandchildren will have access to all kinds of spaces including woodlands, play areas, bicycle trails and sports pitches.

"We are calling for the park to be designated as a 'Queen Elizabeth II Field' as getting this status would help us gain access to funding to improve the park."

Nearly 1,000 people have signed a petition and children at nearby St Bridget's School have been involved.

A number of them have also written letters of support. The children and the Friends' group have worked together on a number of activities like basket making using materials from the park and bulb planting.

Said Cllr Haskew-Jones: "This is great because it means our young people have ownership of the park too."

have ownership of the park too."

The Friends Group has raised funds for play area totalling £112,000 which has been signed over to the borough council, as the park is its responsibility.

The Friends' next project is a memorial garden, and they have already raised

Remembering the Bridge Street bombing

THE borough council and the Tim Parry Johnathan Ball Foundation are working together on a special commemorative event to mark this year's 20th anniversary of the IRA

bombing of Warrington.

It will be held in Bridge Street on
Saturday, March 16 from 11.30 am

saturday March 16 from 11.30 am and will be followed by a community reflection event at the Foundation's Peace Centre in the afternoon.

Deputy leader of the council Mike Hannon, said: "As part of the planning for this special event, the council and The Tim Parry Johnathan Ball Foundation for Peace are working together with people and organisations who were affected at the time in 1993 and who have played a part in helping Warrington to move forward during the past 20

"There were 56 people injured on the day of the bombing and many more people affected. We would like to hear from them, including those who may have moved home or out of the area, so that we can invite them to the Bridge Street Commemoration

and to the community reflection event at the Peace Centre.

Council leader Terry O'Neill said: "It is important to us that everyone in the town has the opportunity to come together in commemoration on Bridge Street or at the Peace Centre.

"It means a lot to us to reach out to residents and those directly affected to invite them to join us. If you know family or friends who have moved away over the years, do let them know about the event. We will never forget what happened but we must also come together to celebrate how we as community have remained united and moved forward together."

The Foundation's chief executive, Nick Taylor said: "The Peace Centre is a living memorial to Tim and Johnathan and a positive legacy for Warrington following the bombing. "We would like to invite people

who were affected by the bombing to come together to reflect not only on the events of that day, but also how it has shaped our lives in the years following.
"The legacy of the bombing has



extended to reach out to help others, such as people affected by the London bombings in 2005 and people affected by other conflicts and wars, and this will also be an opportunity for the people of Warrington to find out about the remarkable work that happens at the Peace Centre and beyond

Rise of the Jedi! THE number of people in Warrington

calling themselves Christians has dropped by more than 10 per cent according to the latest census figures for the town - with more than 500 people listing being a Jedi Knight as their religion!

There has also been an increase in people following other religions such as spiritualists or wiccans, which draw on the traditions of witchcraft, with more than 20 per cent saying they have no religion, an increase of more than 10 per cent from the previous census. The new information comes as more detailed reports from the 2011 census are released showing changes to the town.

showing changes to the town.

It shows an 11 per cent drop to 144,405 (71.4 per cent) of people saying they are Christians. The survey showed that 41,923 (20.4 per cent) of people said they have "no religion" which is an increase of 10 per cent on 2001. Warrington also has 1800 pagans, 120 spiritualists, 545 (0.3 per cent) Jedi Knights, 52 "heavy metal" and 39 wiccans. Jedi Knights feature in the Star Wars movies - with the most famous being Yoda.

Food bank success is cause for concern

LABOUR councillors are fully backing Warrington's successful foodbank scheme - hut concerned that so many people are in desperate need.

They say its success is not a cause for celébration but of concern that it is needed at all in modern times.

Cllr Maureen McLaughlin (pictured right) said: "People turn to foodbanks at times of desperation, when their financial plight means that they have to choose between heating their homes and clothing their children." She said that in these cases people

are often left prey to unscrupulous lenders and illegal loan sharks.

"The setting up of a foodbank in our town is hardly a case for celebration. It demonstrates the problem that many of our residents face day-to-day," she said. She said volunteers have worked

hard to establish a oodbank, and their efforts would help those facing hardship.

Cllr McLaughlin said: "We know that the worst of the Coalition Government's cuts are still yet to come. The welfare reform agenda will only add to the pressure on vulnerable residents, as support for low-earning working families is attacked and benefits are cut."

She said Labour was supporting the scheme, even though it should not become a permanent feature of the town. Her motion to back the project was recently passed unanimously at a full council meeting.

Cllr McLaughlin was also pleased to note the practical support that the council is now providing to the foodbank.

She said: "We asked the volunteers what the council could do to help. We have now agreed to provide much needed storage space for food in premises that are currently vacant, in order to help them with their work.



Housing Trust gets into moviemaking

A SERIES of short films have been created by Golden Gates Housing Trust (GGHT) to tell tenants how they can benefit from home improvements.

The films, "Getting Ready for Your Home Improvements," were all shot on location in Warrington and been produced to help tenants understand more about its investment programme.

They include information on why They include information on why the work is being carried out and the benefits it will provide, including upgrades to fixtures and fittings and creating warmer homes to reduce heating bills. Using a mixture of interviews with GGHT staff and tenants, the films set out what tenants can expect from the trust and what it

expects from them in return.

The films also highlight the importance to tenants of letting the trust into their homes to carry out essential gas safety checks. Copies have been loaded onto the trust's YouTube site www.youtube.com/ GGHTrust and a series of DVD's have been produced for loan to tenants.

Rising stars of the theatre - who turned down university

TWO young men who turned down the chance of going to university and set up their own theatre group instead believe they made the right

decision.

Luke Gilfedder, 19, from Padgate and Angus McAlister, 18, from Wilmslow hit on the idea after meeting at school.

They teamed up with a group of other like-minded youngsters from the Warrington and Cheshire area to form Finn Youth Productions - and already, after little more than a year are looking back on a string of successes.

successes.

Luke — the nephew of former Warrington RL player Laurie Gilfedder — directs the group's productions and writes his own original material.

He met another leading member of

the group, Greg O'Hara, 19, when they were both pupils at St Peter's RC Primary School, Woolston.

Later he met up with Angus when

they were both at Manchester Grammar School – and it was then that the idea for Finn Youth Productions was born.

But Luke (pictured right) and Greg laid the foundations even earlier.


raid the toundations even earlier. While still at primary school they were making video productions around the Warrington area.

The group was created after Luke and Angus decided against offers of going to drama school and University College Landon ollege, London

Their first show was "Billy Liar" at Wilmslow Parish Hall but since then they have secured a base at Pownall Hall Theatre, Wilmslow where their second play - Graham Greene's "The Living Room" was staged.

But perhaps their biggest success was to be invited to perform at Manchester's Royal Exchange Theotre, where they staged Luke's striction acrist "Thet's late" original script "That's Jam."

Words of encouragement and



advice have come from Sir Nicholas Hytner, director of the National Theatre and of acclaimed films such as "The Crucible" and "The Madness of King George" who Luke met in

Luke has also had a landmark solo success with his original play "Trash" being performed at the Tristan Bates Theatre at Covent Garden shortly before Christmas - earning him a place among the youngest-ever playwrights to earn a production in the West End.

Currently Finn Youth Productions are rehearsing for a production of George Bernard Shaw's "Man of Destiny" at Manchester Grammar School in April - a play they have already presented once at Stockport's Garrick Theatre.

So far, the group's activities in Warrington have been confined to rehearsals at the Thames Board Mills club at Alford Hall.

Continuous insurance enforcement

by Jonathan Conder

Car usage in the UK has been falling for the last 15 years. This is unsurprising given about concerns environment and increases in the cost of fuel, car insurance and road tax in recent years. Although many of us still rely on our cars to get to work and for other more pleasurable uses, it is clear that more and more people are turning to public transport and the bicycle as a means of getting from A to B.

If you decide you no longer wish to use your car you may well decide to sell it. However if its an older vehicle it may have a low resale value and it might be tempting to leave the car in the garage, on the driveway or on private land whilst you decide what to do with it. You won't have to renew

your costly insurance policy as long as you do not drive your vehicle on a public road or in a public place. However if you do decide to keep your vehicle off the road and uninsured you need to be aware of a change in the law introduced by the Road Safety Act 2006, which came into force in 2011. The law now expects registered owners to make a Statutory Off Road Notification (SORN) to the DVLA if the vehicle is uninsured. This known as continuous insurance enforcement. Failure to observe this requirement is an offence and can result in a fixed penalty of £100 or a summons to attend court and a fine of up to £1000. Your vehicle might also be wheel-clamped, impounded or destroyed.

A letter will be sent to those suspected of keeping an

uninsured vehicle where no SORN is in place. If the letter is ignored or no remedial action is taken (ie the car is insured or a SORN is made) then prosecution will follow.

Remember also that a SORN has to be renewed annually.

Exemptions apply if you are a vehicle trader and the vehicle is registered as 'in trade' with the DVLA or where ownership is in the process of being transferred between private owners and in other very limited circumstances. Different rules apply in Northern Ireland.



End of the tax year is near

After the end of the 'tax return season' our minds are now turning towards the end of the tax year on 5th April and it is time, therefore, to remind ourselves of some of the 'tax avoidance schemes' that are available to us all.

1. If you have made a large Capital
Gain during the year, and are sitting on a potential loss making asset, then you should consider realising that loss so that it can be used to reduce your taxable gain. You must, however, always consider any other costs involved.

 Similarly, if you are sitting on gains on shares that are within the annual shares 'that' are within the annual exemption then you could 'bed and spouse' or 'bed and ISA' that asset. This means that you sell the shares which are then bought by your spouse or an ISA, thus avoiding the 'Bed and Breakfasting' rules.

3. Which brings us to ISAs. This year each individual can invest up to £11,280 into an ISA. Of this, up to £5,640 can be invested in a 'Cash ISA' the balance of the investment

ISA', the balance of the investment being into a 'Stocks and Shares ISA'. Whilst there is no tax relief on the actual investment, unlike contributions into a pension scheme, and income of capital gain made within the ISA is

4. Contributing into a Personal Pension attracts immediate tax relief. The amount that can attract tax relief is the higher of £3,600 or your total income subject to an annual limit of £50,000. Basic Rate taxpayers receive immediate tax relief at source, receive immediate tax relief at source, ie they will pay exactly the same amount of tax but instead will receive an investment of £100 at a cost of only £80 so the tax relief is, to an extent, 'hidden'. Higher Rate taxpayers will receive the additional tax ralief by magns of a reduction in tax relief by means of a reduction in their tax bill.

5. Partners within a marriage or civil partnership can transfer assets between themselves to ensure that income is split between them in the most tax advantageous manner. For instance, advantageous manner. For instance, they could transfer savings accounts, shares and property between themselves to ensure that interest dividends and rental income is received by the partner paying tax at the lowest marginal rate. As always, however, you should always accided to the control of the control consider any additional costs involved


