'faces of the future' Tom and Naomi are

TWO young people who have their lives have been heralded as the "faces of the future" at Warrington Disability Partnership (WDP).

Former soldier Tom Coleridge, 22, who was seriously injured in Afghanistan in July 2010 and Naomi Cheetham, 24, who graduated last year with a degree in socail work despite battling discrimination due to cerebral palsy, are now both employed by the charity after previously taking on voluntary roles. Tom, who works as a Disability Information Officer, helping update the Warrington Access Guide and Naomi, who works as an administrator, both won awards at the charities annual general meeting.

attacked and he was shot through his

Despite being seriously injured Tom continued to return fire ensuring the safety of his colleagues.

Although he was lucky to survive, his life changed forever.

He underwent a series of life saving surgeries to repair the damage to his vital organs but lost his right kidney, his spleen, and suffered severe liver damage. The bullet also caused irreversible damage to his spinal cord.

He said: "Getting a job at WDP has changed my life and given me a reason for getting up every day. I feel really honoured and overwhelmed to that I am a face for the future of such a great organisation.

Meanwhile Naomi, who first started as a volunteer with WDP in 2006, is keen to raise awareness about the help and support on offer after suffering discrimination because of her condition.

"Working for WDP gives me a great deal of satisfaction. I faced a lot of barriers while going through university because of my cerebral palsy but I was determined to pass, even though I had to study for an extra year.

"I want to make sure people with disabilities are not discriminated against when they have so much to give back to society.'

As the winter months roll on, if As the winter months roll on, it we are observant, we will start to notice the signs of new life emerging in the undergrowth and on the trees. There may be snow and frosts but underneath that, life is ready to burst forth. No matter how difficult the winter matter and the same than difficult the winter months may seem, there is hope of spring and all it brings is right around the corner.

the corner.

People find being optimistic more and more difficult with the stresses and strains of life, and they look for quick fixes to help them cope with life. However, this only serves as a sticking plaster on a small wound, when the bigger wounds and hurts are deep within, causing emotions to be blocked.

Expressing emotion is facely for

Expressing emotion is fearful for most people, however, what we fear is usually a lot more painful than actually expressing it, if it is released under 'safe conditions', i.e. with a supportive and understanding person. This is still difficult to achieve for many people, as they may feel they cannot trust people enough to even allow themselves to start the process of letting go of any emotion with another person, or they may worry about what someone else thinks of them. If they were to get angry or upset in

front of another person, they imagine the other person may think they are 'going mad' or 'losing the plot'.

As human beings we naturally feel emotion, a whole range of different emotions, and this is normal. However, it is how our expression of emotion has been viewed by our parents and other caregivers as children, and how we have observed the adults around us managing their behaviour and emotions, that has influenced the way we cope with life.

It is important to encourage children to express themselves, with safe boundaries in place. Encouraging self respect and respect for others, doesn't mean they cannot express their feelings openly. The great thing is that adults can learn to do this too, if they have a safe, supportive partner or friend, or they learn to do this on their own within a safe environment.

As therapists, we encourage people of all ages to express themselves openly with safe boundaries in place. By offering time, comfortable surroundings, and being accepting of the person, and the thoughts, feelings and behaviours they present with, allows them to gradually release repressed and inappropriate feelings they often hold deep inside. 

The time capsule will contain drawings by pupils at St Barnabas Primary School and will be placed in the new head office being built for Golden Gates Housing Trust overlooking Bank Park.

Mum's 'Divvy' brings Lotto happiness



A WARRINGTON couple have won £585,956 on the national lottery Lotto

draw with their luck coming from a dividend number – more commonly known as 'divvy' – used to choose the winning line.

Michael and Margaret Sampson are still in shock since discovering they matched five numbers plus the bonus ball in the Lotto Quadruple Rollover

matched five numbers plus the bonus ball in the Lotto Quadruple Kollover draw and can't wait to start planning their future, with a house move to a bungalow and a holiday top of their list.

Michael (55), a Plant Operator with PQ Corporation said: "I can't believe the membership number the Co-op gave to my mum years ago, to help her save money off her shopping, has also brought us this good fortune – not only that, we bought the winning lottery ticket from the Co-op as well!

When I buy a ticket I always use a selection of digits from her number –

44,11,8 – to make up my six.

"We decided to have a Chinese for dinner so I went to get a take-away. There was quite a long queue, so I decided to go to the Co-op first to get a lottery ticket before returning. At the till, I stood at the side of someone and watched them fill in the playslip and buy the ticket before I did mine – looking back I'm not sure why I did this as there was no queue and I could have gone straight to the till – maybe my whole visit to buy the ticket was

"On Saturday night, I went to check my numbers on the computer upstairs as Margaret was watching 'Take Me Out' on TV and I didn't want to watch it. I couldn't believe it when they were our numbers and I thought I had got the wrong date, so I shouted to Margaret to come upstairs – I made her sit in the chair and check the numbers too. We are still in shock – it just doesn't

The couple have two grown up children and three grandchildren and excitedly told them their good news first. "They are made up for us", said Margaret (55), who is a part-time domestic at an NHS clinic. A holiday could be on the cards but they have both decided they will continue to work for the time being – "I'm not ready to be a lady of leisure just yet", said

Margaret.
When Lotto reaches a Quadruple Rollover then the jackpot has to be won. If no one matches all six numbers in the draw then the jackpot prize will be shared between the winners in the next winning prize level. No ticketholder matched all six main numbers in the draw on 4 January, so each of the 23 winners who matched five main numbers and the bonus ball banked a stunning £585,956.

In addition a quadruple rollover sees the number of winners in the Lotto Raffle boosted to 250. For every Lotto line bought the player will receive a unique code - match the code and £20,000 is won instantly.

The ticket was bought from Co-op, Padgate Lane, Orford and the Lotto numbers from the draw on 4 January 2014 were 4, 11, 18, 28, 41, 44 and the Bonus Ball was 8.

Super head has positive impact

THE appointment of a 'super head' with an outstanding track record of turning round problem schools is having a 'positive impact' in all areas at Lymm High School according to the latest Ofsted report.

Executive principal Tarun Kapur CBE was drafted in following the suspension of controversial Principal Angela Walsh last September.
Previously an outste

an outstanding school there were fears in the local community that it could be put in special measures following a large turnover of staff and poor morale.

But the latest Ofsted says the school But the latest Ofsted says the school is good with the recently appointed executive principal's vision for success and determination to drive the academy forward "having a positive impact in all areas."

The school converted to become an academy from September 2012.

The report says the school is a good school where the quality of teaching is good overall and much is outstanding, leading to students making good and outstanding

progress in the majority of lessons.

Students' attainment is consistently well above the national average and achievement in mathematics is consistently outstanding.

The sixth form is good. The diverse curriculum and high-quality enrichment experiences in the sixth form results in students' good success rates. Students with specific needs

are also supported extremely well.
Students also behave well in
lessons and around the school. They have a positive attitude to learning and make the most of their experiences in the classroom and in the wide range of extra-curricular activities. This contributes well to their good spiritual, moral, social and cultural development.

Attendance is above the national verage and improving whilst

exclusions are in line with or below the national average, and declining. But the report highlights that staff turnover has been very high in recent months with 48 new teaching staff appointed to the academy in September 2013.

The academy also works closely with the Dean Trust which is a multi-academy trust and, although Lymm High School is a separate entity, it is part of the Dean Trust Teaching

School Alliance.

The school is not yet considered outstanding because although much of the teaching is good or better, a significant minority requires improvement because the activities in lessons do not match the students' needs and abilities sufficiently well.

The marking of books is inconsistent. Not all teachers give

inconsistent. Not all teachers give students enough information about how they can improve their work.

The gap in achievement between pupils eligible for the pupil premium and their peers in English is not closing rapidly enough.

Inspectors observed 46 teachers in 48 part-lessons including three joint observations with members of the academy's senior team. of the academy's senior team. Inspectors also held meetings with approximately 50 students from all

approximately 30 students from all year groups.

Meetings were held with the executive principal, the chair of the Governing Body, a local authority representative, senior and middle leaders, teachers and other academy staff. Informal discussions also took place with staff and students.

Inspectors took account of the 343



responses to the on-line questionnaire (Parent View) and the 97 responses to the staff questionnaire.

Mr Kapur said: "It is five years since the school was inspected and the educational landscape has changed significantly during that time and to achieve a good outcome is a real credit to the school community, particularly the staff and students"

"We can return to the task of

ensuring that we are consistently good as we look to further improve examination results and progress of students, as well as developing even greater opportunities for students and staff."

Chair of Governors Kieran Walshe added: "This report is really a tribute to the hard work and professionalism of the school staff, the whole leadership team, and of course the students. The school has made great progress under Mr Kapur's leadership over recent months, as OFSTED observed, though we all recognise there is still more to do."





Sydney's recipes for winning World War One

WOUNDED First World War soldier Sydney Upton was sent to Warrington to convalesce – and spent the time working at Orford's Peninsula Barracks creating recipes suitable for feeding frontline

Kingsman Upton helped create surprisingly wholesome for feeding troops in the trenches, including baked meat and potatoes, roast beef and Yorkshire pudding, rissoles, sausages and a variety of stews and fish dishes, including eel.

He recorded it all in a special

book, kept in immaculate copperplate

handwriting.

His reward was to be sent two white feathers - the traditional symbol of cowardice - by some misguided women who wondered why he was at home instead of at war.

The story has been pieced together through Kingsman Upton's possessions given to the Cheshire Record Office by members his family.

It shows that Sydney Upton – a lance corporal - was anything but a coward. He was wounded in action, sent home to recover and later returned to the front to fight in the Battle of Cambrai and twice escaped

lt was in 1916, while convalescing from his wounds, that he was sent to the Army's School of Cookery at

His immaculate record book shows just how much the Army believed in Napoleon's old maxim that an army marches on its stomach.

Apart from the main courses, it gives details of puddings - from treacle sponge and jam roll to bread and lemon biscuit - together with cakes, caraway seed, currant and coconut, and a variety of gravies, soups and sauces, with brandy and parsley perhaps the most surprising. Lance Corporal Upton had even compared the cost of baking caraway seed cake for 100 men

caraway seed cake for 100 men from ingredients at two shillings, eight pence and three farthings, as opposed to buying the cake readymade at 8 shillings and four

His scrupulously kept notes also detailed water purification and cooking stove-building methods – accompanied by diagrams – and photographs of primitive field cookery in the trenches.

After the war, Sydney later work with the Inland Revenue.

During the Second World War he

again answered his country's call by serving as an Air Raid Warden and Special Constable.

His possessions and notes will form part of the exhibitions and events staged by Cheshire Archives and Local Studies to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the Great

She needs to use her electric wheelchair at all times and recently underwent surgery to help improve her pain but unfortunately it didn't go to plan and she is still suffering and requires morphine every

The money will be spent on a holiday so Georgia can experience something many of us take for granted. With the funds raised granted. With the funds raised she will go to Florida and visit Discovery Cove where she could swim with dolphins, this would be

Wolves bid farewell to Ockher

WARRINGTON Wolves have bid a fond farewell to their legendary former kitman and groundsman Roy "Ockher" Aspinall who died in Warrington General Hospital aged

Roy was known by everybody as Ockher and was one of life's most colourful characters. Although he hailed from St Helens he had been connected with Warrington Rugby League Club for 42 years. Ockher tells the tale of his early

teenage years: "Me and Alex Murphy grew up together in Thatto Heath in the 1950s. He went to the Catholic School and I went to the C of E School. We used to wait for them after school and knock the stuffing out of them. Alex came to see me about it and we have been friends ever since.

He left school at 15, and being a tough kid led a wild lifestyle. He got involved at Mac Moran's boxing booths that used to travel round with Silcocks Fairground

He became friends with the "Big Four" Silcock brothers, Ted, Arthur, Laurence and Herbert and travelled around with the fairground.

Ockher became head doorman

at Wigan Casino, before being brought to Wilderspool in 1971 by his good friend Alex Murphy.

As well as head doorman at the Wilderspool Leisure Centre he used to help Jackie Hamblett with ground maintenance.

He took over as groundsman in 1979 and also was responsible for the kit. He carried on with these duties for the next 20 years.

Ockher was also the kitman on England's World Cup tour of Australia and New Zealand in

1975 when Murphy was the coach. He held a weekly card school at his house on a Saturday night with Les Boyd, Brian Johnson, Bob Jackson and Kevin Tamati, and he never lost. Ockher was a great friend to all the players and staff at Warrington,

One of the highlights of his life was travelling over to Australia and New Zealand in 1997 with the Warrington team that played in the World Club Championship. He came back with shirts from all the Australian clubs to boost his massive collection of rugby league memorabilia

Rugby league was always close to Ockher; his sister was mother to the Cunningham brothers Eddie, Tommy and Kieron.

He'was well known throughout the rugby league world. Former players visiting Warrington would often pop into Ockher's house, next to Wilderspool Stadium to talk about old times.

He always said that Silcocks and Warrington Rugby League Club were the saving of him. He did not like to think what would have happened to him without them.

In later life Ockher was a eat reader, he devoured great reader, he devoured autobiographies. He also travelled a great deal with his family and friends around Europe and visited America. He was regularly seen whizzing around Warrington on his mobility scooter OCK1, which

gave him the freedom to get about. Ockher was a family man, who leaves a wife Sue, sons and grandchildren who he adored. He was one of those colourful characters who could always tell a good story and will be fondly remembered.

Law decisions on employment

A number of case law decisions on employment law may have an effect on you.

The first concerned a salesman whose salary was made up of a basic salary and a commission calculated on sales. When he went on holiday his employer calculated his holiday his employer calculated his holiday pay based only on his basic salary. The European Court of Justice has decided that holiday pay should put employees in the same position during their holiday as during their normal working week. Therefore, they said that commission should be taken into account when calculating holiday pay, although exactly how this should be done is up to the courts of each individual country.

The second concerns redundancy.
An employer was required to make one of two employees redundant. They carried out an exercise to decide which employee should be made redundant. It was designed so that the higher scorer should be made redundant and one scored made redundant and one scored very slightly higher than the other. The lower scoring employee then offered to take voluntary redundancy but the employer decided that the

redundancy should be made in accordance with the exercise. An Employment Tribunal decided that this was not a reasonable course of action and upheld a claim for unfair dismissal.

dismissal.

The third decision concerned sleeping on the job. A carer was paid a fixed fee of £40 per week for sleeping over for eight hours, when required, and she was invariably required to sleep over on at least two nights per week. This was in addition to her other pay. The Employment Appeal Tribunal ruled that it was irrelevant whether or not she had to do anything during these sleepovers. The job was simply being there and not the level of activity. Therefore, she was being paid below the minimum wage.

Finally, the Home Office has issued new guidelines on preventing illegal workings. The details is beyond the scope of this article but can be found
