

Some season ticket holders are so upset have asked for their money back for the forthcoming season. I would hope the Wolves can see the sense in agreeing to this.

Exciting year ahead

IT'S an exciting year ahead for Warrington. At the end of last year it was announced that the HUT Group who already have a base in Warrington are to expand their business from a new HQ base at

Omega. They anticipate creating 2,000 jobs across technology, engineering, digital, graduate and supply chain roles and work has already begun on the construction of their new £80 million Omega

Approval has also been granted at Omega to an as yet unnamed manufacturing business who will be creating a further 400 jobs. Work will be starting on site soon on that

Steelwork is emerging out of the ground at Stadium Quarter from the construction of the Business Incubator and this will be completed in June and open in September. Eleven jobs will be created at the Incubator itself and it could accommodate up to 100 businesses.

Late last year approval was also granted giving the go ahead to progress Warrington's ambitious multi-million pound plans to regenerate the Bridge Street/Time Square area. Hoardings are going up now and the demolition contract is about to be awarded. Demolition works will start in March and the first phase, which will be a temporary home to Warrington Market whilst their new £10 million facility is built, will open in 2017.

And there are lots more announcements to come. It's going to be a busy year!

Mr Mowat said: "As an MP, I receive monthly updates on the unemployment figures in Warrington and so I know that the unemployment

"But of course, if you're one of the unfortunate people who is out of a job, the unemployment rate might as well be 100 per cent!

"So we can't afford to be complacent. Last year

we had about 850 people through the door over the course of the day and over 30 exhibitors were on hand to offer information and over 300 job

"Bringing local employers and local people together in one place is a tried and tested approach to get people back into work. Very often we find that people arrive at the fair with a particular sort of job in mind, but end up having a conversation with a company in a completely different sector."

Mr Mowat has also been running a jobs club since 2009, with over two thirds of those attending subsequently finding work or attending further

training courses.

Happy Household initiative launched

A PROGRAMME of activities and services to help residents improve their home or garden has been launched by Golden Gates Housing Trust (GGHT) and its partners as part of The Delivering Wellbeing in Bewsey and Dallam project.

The Happy Household Initiative will work with partners including Priestley College and the YMCA to support approximately 40 tenants through a programme of training sessions allowing them to develop pride and ownership in their home and garden.





Nature reserve nominated for national award

WARRINGTON'S Woo Eyes Nature Reserve Woolston been nominated for the title
"Nature Reserve of the Year"
in the annual BBC Countryfile Magazine awards.

Now members of the public are being asked to vote for the reserve, which extends to more than 500 acres, was first established in 1979 and is managed solely by volunteers.

It is now recognised as a reserve of national importance where more than 240 species of bird have been recorder, including 15 species of raptor, more than 30 species of wader, all five grebes, the three woodpeckers and five special types of owl. The reserve is designated as a Site of Special Scientific Interest

Brian Ankers, chairman of the Woolston Eyes Conservation Group said: "Woolston is a very Group said: vyousion is a vol, special nature reserve. It is an oasis in an otherwise urban area and a prime example of conservation and commerce working together for the benefit of wildlife.

Volunteers Volunteers from the group manage the reserve with the agreement of Peel Holdings who from the own the land and still use parts of it to deposit dredgings from the

Manchester Ship Canal.

Many rare birds have been spotted at Woolston, including



Storm and Leach's Petrels, Spoonbill, Bittern, Little Egret, Night and Purple Herons, Ring-necked and Ferruginous Ducks, Quail, Red Kite, Great Grey Shrike and many

A small team of volunteers carry out ringing of birds, up to 7,000 annually and up to 100,000 birds have been ringed since 1980.

In addition to birds, many other animals have been recorded at

Woolston including fox, stoat, weasel, mink and Roe Deer, as well small mammals, four species bat, reptiles and amphibians including the rare Great Crested Newt. Butterflies, moths and other insects, many of them rare, are also present.

Permit holders can visit the Eyes and a public footpath from the end of Weir Lane, Woolston runs through part of the site. But access

1,000 sign new protest over Peel Hall

MORE than 1,000 people have signed a new petition opposing housing development at Peel Hall, in North Warrington.

The petition was launched by Warrington North MP Helen Jones after she learned that developers Satnam Millennium - who have long wanted to build homes on the site – were preparing for yet another planning application.

Ms Jones said the petition, had

quickly gathered support.
It was backed by local councillors including Steve Roberts, John Kerr-Brown and Brian Maher, from Poplars and Hulme, and Geoff Settle, Graham Friend and Billy Lines-Rowlands, from Poulton North.

She said: "It is clear that local people are overwhelmingly opposed to plans to develop this

"Our message to Satnam is However many times you come back, we will oppose you and we hope that the planning

committee takes the same view when an application is submitted."

In March 2013, Warrington Borough Council refused an application by Satnam for permission to build 150 homes at Peel Hall.

In July the same year, an appeal by the company was thrown out by a Government-appointed inspector.



As early as 2012, Ms Jones claimed to have discovered a "masterplan" for 1,400 homes to be built in three distinct phases – with the first phase consisting of the

Last October, the MP claimed Satnam were still considering plans for 1,400 homes with access from

for 1,400 homes with access from Blackbrook Avenue, Birch Avenue, Elm Road and Poplars Avenue.

Thousands of local people signed earlier petitions opposing development and more than 300 objections were made by residents.

All three political groups on the borough council have spoken out against the proposals.

Go to your GP - not A&E

HEALTH chiefs at Warrington are urging people not to turn up at A&E with problems that could be dealt with by a GP or other healthcare service.

NHS Warrington CCG says people can help by staying away from hospital at a time when local emergency services and A&E staff are facing one of the busiest starts to a year they have ever had.

CCG clinical chief officer and local GP Dr Andy Davies said: "Every year

A&E doctors and nurses see thousands of patients with problems that could be better dealt with by their GP or other health professional. We're asking people to use the NHS sensibly and consider the most appropriate option whenever possible".

whenever possible".

In winter the number of serious and life-threatening cases increases – with more people with breathing problems, strokes and heart-attacks caused by the cold weather. So people calling 999 or turning up at A&E when they could have been seen by their GP cause problems.

Dr Davies said: "There have been unprecedented levels of demand on emergency services across the entire country, with especially high numbers of frail, elderly patients who are extremely ill.

"Keep an eye on friends, family and neighbours often - seeking treatment sooner rather than later can avoid a hospital admission altogether. "There's much more to the NHS than A&E departments and ambulances

MP welcomes Sellafield jobs guarantee

WARRINGTON South MP David Mowat has welcomed news that the decision to renationalise the decommissioning of the Sellafield Nuclear Reprocessing Plant in Cumbria would not affect jobs in Warrington.

Decommissioning of the Sellafield site, which absorbs the vast majority of

waste produced by the civil nuclear industry, had been managed by Nuclear Management Partners (NMP). However this decision will now see that work being supervised directly by the Nuclear Decommissioning Authority (NDA).

In the Commons, Energy Secretary Ed Davey confirmed, in response to a question from Mr Mowat, that the move would not lead to redundancies, either in Warrington or at Sellafield.

David Mowat said: "I'm pleased that the Secretary of State has confirmed that there will be no redundancies as a result of this announcement.

"Outside of the Sellafield itself, Warrington has the biggest concentration of nuclear jobs anywhere in the country. What happens in the industry nationally will be magnified in the town.

The nuclear sector supports thousands of highly skilled jobs here already and I am determined to see that figure increase

Important changes in the near future

By the time you read this the January tax return deadline will have passed, we will hopefully have submitted all clients' returns on time, and I will have had my customary double scotch in celebration!

However, nothing stands still and

However, nothing stands still and so it is time to examine a couple of important changes that have occurred or which will be occurring in the near

Something that could affect everyone is the transferable allowance for married couples and civil partners that is being introduced in April. From that date, allowances of £1,050 can be transferred between partners provided that neither is a higher rate taxpayer. It is also not available if either partner was born before 6 April.

the Married Couples Allowance.

This will benefit those couples where one partner either does not work or only earns an amount below the personal allowance. The

lower earner can make the transfer, meaning that the main wage earner will save tax of £210. The relief will not be given automatically, but will need to be claimed online.

need to be claimed online.

Employers will be affected as new tax codes will be introduced. The partner making the transfer will be given a code ending in "N" and the receiving partner will be given a code ending in "M". This is instead of the normal "L" code.

Another change for some employers is more imprinant.

Another change for some employers is more imminent. Late filing penalties under RTI (Real Time Information) began in October for all those businesses with 50 or more employees. Affected businesses will incur a monthly penalty of up to £400, depending upon the number of employees. Those businesses will receive a written potice in Entrugrey. receive a written notice in February 2015 for any penalties incurred in the quarter to 5th January 2015.

One further change that is happening in April affects employment intermediaries that supply workers



without operating PAYE. These intermediaries will be required to make a quarterly return detailing all workers and payments on which PAYE was not operated. This is a complex area and if you think you may be affected then you should seek advice.

Wolves e-cigarette deal sparks storm of protest after stadium ban u-turn

WARRINGTON Wolves' decision to lift a ban on using e-cigarettes in the Halliwell Jones Stadium AFTER signing a lucrative sponsorship deal with a national electronic cigarette brand has sparked a storm of protest amongst fans.

Warrington Borough Council's public health team have also expressed disappointment about being not consulted.

A council spokesperson said:
"The Council's public health team
is disappointed it was not consulted
about Warrington Wolves' decision regarding its position on vaping.

The public health team will be taking national advice on the matter, including speaking to public health organisations in St Helen's where vaping has been allowed at their stadium, Langtree Park, for the last year". As part of the sponsorship deal, TRUVAPE will be producing Warrington Wolves-branded e-cigarettes – or 'vapourisers' – to be sold in the

Wolfware shop and online.
In addition, the South Stand is to be renamed the 'TRUVAPE South Stand' and TRUVAPE will work with the Wolves to help educate fans about the health impact of smoking, as well as the potential benefits of switching to an alternative like electronic cigarettes.

But the decision to lift the ban on using e-cigarettes has angered fans who took to social media plarforms to register their protests.

Comments posted on the warrington worldwide facebook page include: "Shocking example for children. They will see this and

think it's ok."

Another fan posted: "Very, very bad. Poor judgement by the club." Another posted: "Is it April the 1st already? Is this for real?"

But the club have defended their position highlighting that in recent years the e-cigarette industry had become more involved in a variety of sports partnerships, including Doncaster Cup horse racing, Burnley, Celtic and Birmingham City football clubs, St Helens rugby league team and motor sports including the British Superbike Championship and British Touring Car teams.

Wolves' decision to reverse the vaping ban follows a similar decision by the O2 Arena in 2013, when they teamed up with another e-cigarette brand and reversed their own vaping ban, allowing their guests the ability to vape without having to leave the O2 grounds.

Although electronic cigarette use, or 'vaping', has sometimes been a controversial topic in the press, recent UK figures from the Office of National Statistics have shown that fears that they may flure' from smokers into emploing non-smokers into smoking are unfounded, as the latest data indicates those who use e-cigarettes are almost entirely current or former smokers. Not only had fewer people taken up smoking, but more smokers had quit.

And experts such as Professor West of UCL and John Britton, director of the UK Centre for Tobacco Control Studies (UKCTCS), have joined their voices to the debate in favour of electronic cigarettes, stating that they "offer

a huge potential benefit to public health by helping smokers to shift to an alternative source of nicotine".

Alex Wilson, Wolve

Wolves' commercial manager, said: "We are firmly committed to helping our fans make informed choices, particularly when it comes to health and fitness. Obviously the best option is to never smoke at all, but as a percentage of our fans are already smokers, we are pleased to be able to encourage them to consider switching to alternatives by allowing vaping in certain areas of the stadium, as well as providing a branded vapouriser that can be purchased on site.
"We initially introduced the

vaping ban as a 'just in case' measure, but are now happy to reverse this as more news on the

industry comes to light.
"We believe this partnership,
with a reputable brand like
TRUVAPE – known for their attention to safety and adherence to regulations - will help our fans enjoy a better matchday experience, and provide those who smoke with an alternative that experts believe has the potential to hugely reduce harm.'
