



The dedicated sensory room allows users to interact with the bubble tube, fibre optics and light panel or to chill out on the water bed or in the ball pool.

The low-level soft play calm zone allows those that are less mobile to move around in safety and enjoy the interactive projector or watch a DVD and there is also a café.

Comments from visitors include: "Absolutely fantastic, we've had parties at commercial soft play, but this has been in a class of its own the staffs co-operation and enthusiasm has shone through. Warrington Disability Partnership (WDP)

WDP is a user led voluntary organisation which actively promotes independent living throughout life and work. Based in Warrington; our team consists of 15 trustees / directors, 220 volunteers and 40 paid staff who together deliver a range of services directly or in partnership with health and social care providers, education/employment services and a wide range of local support groups and services.

Chair of Trustees Report

Dave Thompson MBE DL MBA – Founder & Chairman of Trustees / Directors

On behalf of Team WDP I am delighted to invite you to read our 2012 Annual Report. A rollercoaster year is probably the best way to describe the past 12 months.

The unexpected death of Dave Connor, Assistant Operations Manager, affected not only everyone associated with Team WDP, but also hundreds of people who had been touched by Dave's work which spanned over twenty years. He was due to carry the Paralympics torch a few weeks after his death. In a fitting legacy to Dave, I supported his family to lobby the organisers to allow one of Dave's students to carry the torch in his honour.

The predicted loss of funding due to contract changes and the massive reduction in requests for access and training resulted in redundancies across a range of services. Those most badly affected included our Employment Team, Leisure Recreation and Sports Team and Young Ambassador Project, which we had sustained unfunded for the past two years.

At the start of the year the Griffiths Court Foundation closed down, after their Trustees accepted that the poor economic climate had removed the opportunity to build the planned respite care and rehabilitation unit in Birchwood. They agreed to use their remaining funds to support an extension to our Learning Centre and, in partnership with our Board of Trustees, the remaining funds have been used to establish a grant scheme for carers and disabled people who need respite care. Both projects will carry the name of the late Marjorie Griffiths, which is a fitting legacy to one of Warrington's greatest disability campaigners.

During the past year there have been occasions when these low points have cast huge shadows over the great work that was continuing across WDP, work that includes:

- Sir Bert Massie opened our latest retail service based at the Liverpool Disabled Living Centre, which is supported by Liverpool City Council and Liverpool Community Health NHS Trust.
- Our other retail services, operated under our trading arm Disability Trading Company (DTC), continue to grow. This was boosted last month when our partners at Lend Lease, operators of the Golden Square extended the contract on our store for another year.
- Another DTC success was our Mobility Workshop and Service Centre which grew so much we needed to extend the building. The extended facilities allowed us to take on our first apprentice.
- As our retail stores and workshop continued to expand we purchased two new vans which provide a vital collection and delivery service to DTC.
- This change of direction towards a commercial/social enterprise has shifted our focus away from our origins as a
 conventional charity. (This resulted in a review of our management structures at which point our Chief Officer decided
 to leave under voluntary redundancy).
- We were successful in bidding for funds from Children in Need, which will enable us to continue running sports and leisure projects for disabled children and young people.
- Disability Awareness Day, despite being the wettest on record, went ahead, unlike many other local, regional and national outside events, which fell foul to the bad weather.
- During the VIP Reception at DAD we received great news when this year's principle sponsor Your Housing Group signalled their long term support to the event.
- Days later our spirits were raised again with news that our partners at the MESSAGE Institute in India successfully held their second DAD.
- Last month, Aquarius Diving Centres, based in Egypt, confirmed that they will be exhibiting at next year's event and they will sponsor our next Going the Extra Mile Scuba Challenge.







Partnerships continue to be high on our agenda, and it's clear to see that 2012 was our most successful in terms of the breadth and depth of our work. During the year we contributed to over 120 different meetings and forums locally, regionally, nationally and internationally, ensuring that the voice of disabled people continues to influence policies and services. Other notable partnerships not already mentioned include:

Our staff continued to provide advice on disability related facilities for large and small projects including the Orford Park Jubilee Hub which was opened by the Queen in May. We also supported a successful bid that will result in major access improvements at Birchwood Railway Station.

Learners from our Learning Centre reaped success again at the Adult Learners Week Awards. Christine Newsham won The John Tickle Disabled Learners Award, with the Mayor of Warrington presenting certificates to two WDP projects, Supported Employment Group and Functional Skills in IT Group and Kim Howard received an individual award. We were also nominated in the National Adult Learners Awards.

Our staff and volunteer fundraisers had the busiest and best year ever, with monthly quiz nights, Easter and Christmas raffles and another successful "Going the Extra Mile, Scuba Challenge" (special thanks to Terry Wood and his team from Cheshire Scuba). It seemed that not a weekend went by when we weren't fundraising at the market, town centre, local carnivals and fetes, plus our own events. Plus our staff, volunteers and friends of WDP entered a variety of corporate events such as the Bupa Manchester 10k. As you read this report we will be busy with this year's Santa's Grotto and giant tombola.

Looking ahead we will no doubt face more challenges to maintaining the funding we need to operate our services. Several of our long standing contracts will be put out to open tender, and gaining public donations will get harder as the number of worthy causes grows. We will build on our current partnerships and we will explore ideas for new funding streams, just as we did last year when our Board of Trustees had the foresight to support my proposal to launch our trading arm.

On behalf of Team WDP I would like to thank all of our partners for their continuing support. I would like to thank my fellow Trustees/Directors, our staff and volunteers, the people who use our services and everyone who has supported us during the past year. Before finishing I would like to acknowledge fellow Trustee Ian Richardson, who retired this year due to family commitments.

Finally I would like to invite you to read the rest of our annual report. I hope you agree with me that Team WDP continues to make a difference to the lives of disabled people and their families.

Access and Training Self financed through income generation

Our Access and Training Teams provide advice and support to local businesses, developers, architects and individuals, this advice ranges from general telephone enquiries to site visits and audit reports. Our training programme offers training to both outside organisations and individuals and includes Disability and Equality training and Relationships, Sex and Disability training.

In addition to supporting our partners, we are committed to promoting the development of all of our team members and actively support them to progress further. During 2012, many of our team members have completed a variety of different training courses including 'Volunteering', 'Safeguarding', 'Mental Health Awareness', 'First Aid' and 'Customer Services'. This has helped with their continuing professional development, with many of our volunteers going into employment, both with WDP and elsewhere.

WDP have enabled me to enrol on a Level 3 NVQ Management course, this will help in continuing my personal development and the work I am undertaking. I will have theoretical knowledge to back up my practical experience. I will also be able to pass on my knowledge to volunteers to be able to run a more efficient service.

Accessible Caravans

Self financed from income generation and donations

Our two holiday homes in North Wales provide disabled people, their families or carers the opportunity to take an accessible and affordable holiday. Both of our caravan holiday homes have been designed to provide inclusive access for disabled people.

The 'Grenadier' caravan, based on the Harts "Little Fields" site in Pensarn has taken 17 bookings during 2012, with 'Guillemot', based on the Lyons Robin Hood site in Rhyl taking 15 bookings.

"We only recently found out about your accessible caravans, we thought why not give one a go. What a fantastic caravan to stay in. It was very spacious and clean, not what we have come to expect from rental caravans. We will be using your caravans again in the future."

Benefits Advice

Supported by the Advice Service Fund, on behalf of the OCS

Our Benefits Advice service is run by volunteers meeting clients who require support to complete benefit application forms. The team completes regular online research and attend training to keep their knowledge up to date. During the past year our volunteer benefit advisors have helped to secure over £1 million in benefits for local people, including Disability Living Allowance, Attendance Allowance, Carers Allowance, Employment Support Allowance, Income Support and Pension Credits. Benefits advisors also signpost people to other WDP services, support organisations and networks.

"I asked Chris to help me complete my forms for DLA as they are difficult and time consuming. Since being awarded higher rate mobility component I have passed my driving test and been able to get a car which has given me much more independence and has vastly improved my quality of life."

Centre for Independent Living

Equipment Showroom - Funded by NHS Warrington & supported by Warrington Borough Council Wheelchair Loan and Equipment Hire Service – Self financed through donations

Our Equipment Showroom has a range of independent living equipment on display including bathing, toileting, mobility, stair lifts, recliner chairs, and adjustable beds. Over the past year, the showroom has continued to expand the range of products available to purchase with the support of the Disability Trading Company, which include larger items of equipment (scooters, wheelchairs, recliner chairs and beds) as well as smaller daily living aids (walking sticks, kitchen equipment and bathing aids. Our staff and volunteers also offer information and advice on a wide range of other topics including sensory impairments; accessible holidays, days out and work closely with Housing and Care Call services.

During 2012, we have expanded many of our display areas, including our children's & mobility areas to showcase new and exciting products available.

During the year, 14,580 people have visited the Centre and we received 4,436 telephone enguiries to the showroom. We also loaned out over 700 wheelchairs and 92 pieces of equipment to local people. Our team of 7 volunteers dedicated over 2,000 voluntary hours.

Community Café Self financed from income generation Cafe tables and chairs funded by a West Area Neighbourhood Board Grant

Our Galleries Community Cafe is a pleasant place to stop for a rest and a bite to eat. You can have a tea, coffee, soft drink, snack or a meal after you have explored the wide range of equipment available in our showrooms. Over 4,000 meals have been served in the past year.

We also provide a catering service which can provide food and drink for our many visitors who attend meetings and community events. This included a BBQ for the Queens Jubilee Party, which was attended by over 200 local residents and children from the local school.

Disability Awareness Day 2012 – 21st Anniversary event

This year marked the 21st anniversary of the event, which has continued to grow in size and stature since the first event in 1992. Despite the wettest ground conditions that the team have ever encountered, the event attracted 257 exhibitors and over 25,000 visitors. It is credit to the large army of DAD volunteers who dedicated over 2,750 hours to ensure that the event went ahead, despite a number of last minute alterations.

Without the support from our sponsors, in particularly Your Housing Group (principal sponsors for the event), such a large scale event would not be possible. The team are extremely grateful for their continued support.

Disability Information Point - Warrington Retail Market

Suported by Warrington Borough Council and Warrington Market

Our team at the Disability Information Point provide a wide range of information and advice on local support groups and voluntary services. They also provide advice and assistance on national voluntary and statuary organisations and disability service providers, handling 4,028 enquiries over the past 12 months. The vast range of leaflets and booklets are regularly updated and the team regularly use the internet to keep up to date with new developments.

The team, predominately run by a team of 19 volunteers, also operate a satellite Shopmobility service, which offers scooters, electric wheelchairs and manual wheelchairs. This was hired out 849 items for a total of 1938 hours.

We use the point in front of the Disability Information Point for a range of disability related awareness events with support from local community groups. Our annual Santa's Grotto, as well as regular tombolas help to support the running of this service.

Mobility Workshop & Service Centre

Staffing is self-funded.

Workshop equipment funded by donations from Warrington, Birchwood & Stockton Heath Lions Groups and the Office for Disability Issues

Our Mobility Workshop provides a service and repair centre for any type of disability equipment at our purpose built workshop; this also includes maintaining the fleet of scooters in our shopmobility & equipment loan services. The team at the Workshop have completed over 200 repairs during the past 12 months.

Available services from our Workshop include:

- Servicing
- Repairs
- Battery testing
- Refurbishments
- Parts
- Collections and deliveries



We also accept any donations of mobility equipment for our recycling project and offer the chance to try out Mobility Training Test Track to improve confidence when using the equipment.

"We were told to come to the Mobility Workshop by a friend to see whether they could repair our scooter. When the man came to collect the scooter, he was very friendly and helpful. My batteries where swiftly replaced and my scooter was promptly returned to me in perfect working order."

Employment Team

Funded by: Work Programme sub-contracts from Avanta and Cheshire West and Chester Council funded through Department for Work and Pensions and European Social Fund, a sub-contract to deliver National Careers Service from Greater Merseyside Connexions Partnership funded through Skills Funding Agency, and a contract to deliver a specialist support service to Warrington residents aged 50 and over (Lavender Hill Project) funded through Warrington Borough Council.

The team provides a user led accredited Information, Advice and Guidance service to around 180 clients and supports volunteering, work placements, supported employment, work trials and routes towards part and full time employment. During the past year the team have supported 39 clients into employment.

We deliver the mainstream 'National Careers Service' and the government- led 'Work Programme' targeting 9 priority groups. We also provide targeted support for Warrington residents. Our Lavender Hill project, for people aged 50 and over, provides skills, financial and health checks to improve training and work opportunities. In total we have received almost 8,000 telephone enquiries for employment information and advice in the past 12 months.

The team supports community venues and children's services by offering support funded by our mainstream contracts. Our National Careers Service advisers support a 'Can-Do' club in Stockton Heath and also provide a co-location activity in Warrington Jobcentre one day per week. The team encourages local engagement activity that supports the Health and Wellbeing of residents. Employers are supported to sign up for the 'Two Ticks' disability symbol and to promote best practice in recruitment and retention alongside mental health and wellbeing in the workplace and also advises on 'Access to Work' applications.

"I hadn't worked for 6 years but my adviser was patient with me and helped me find my confidence again. I am now working 10 hours per week and hope to increase my hours in coming months."

Finance & Payroll Self financed through income generation

Our team offer a payroll service for Direct Payment users and small businesses. This includes registration of all employers/businesses with the Inland Revenue, processing payroll from time-sheets and producing payslips. Processing all year end records to the Inland Revenue and keeping updated with any changes made by HMRC. We also support our Treasurer in producing Management Account Reports for the Board of Trustees and Project Management Reports for Team Leaders to submit to funders.

The payroll team currently support 312 employers, with 510 new employees. Throughout the year the team have received 2,468 phone enquiries.

"Using Warrington Disability Partnership Payroll allows me to relax knowing that a professional and timely job will be done; with the assurance that there is always help at the end of the phone if needed.'

Fundraising, Promotions & Community Engagement Community Engagement financed through LSPA funding and Advice Service Fund, on behalf of the OCS.

All other areas self-financed through donations and fundraising.



Fundraising plays a vital role in supporting many of the self-financing or un-funded services offered by WDP. Our calendar over the last twelve months has been extremely busy with over 100 events attended throughout the year, with over 75,000 attendees. These included events such as carnivals, information days and the Bupa 10K run alongside our own events - Disability Awareness Day, Tombolas & Raffles and Santa's Grotto.

Our Community Engagement Officer liaises with local community groups to promote the services that WDP offer and raise awareness of disability. This is done by attending as guest speakers and taking information to other organisations. Overall, the team have engaged with approximately 36,000 people.

Fundraising activities for this year include a Country & Western night, the Spire 1/2 Marathon, Tough Mudder (an armystyle assault course), Going the Xtra Mile - Scuba Challenge, Doggy Fun Day and the BUPA 10K run.

None of the above could happen without the support of our volunteers, staff, sponsors and supporters who have all given up their time to help. A massive thank you to all that have been involved.

"I have enjoyed supporting the fundraising team as it has opened the door to other opportunities within WDP and built my self-confidence immensely, also it has been a great way to give back to the community whilst supporting a great charity."

Independent Living Team

Funded by Warrington Borough Council

The Independent Living Team supports clients throughout the whole process of setting up and running their 'Direct Payment' and 'Personal Budgets'. This supports them with their independence, whether it may be using an agency or employing their own Personal Assistant (PA). We also support clients who are in receipt of Independent Living Fund and those who are "full cost".

The support includes recruiting, advertising, interviewing, contracts of employment, Employer Liability Insurance and Criminal Records Bureau checks, along with any day to day problems. We also work closely with our Payroll Service to process wages, holidays, tax calculations and pay slips. The Independent Living Team have also been involved in a 'Support Brokerage' pilot project, ran by Warrington Borough Council, for clients receiving Personal Budgets. The team currently supports 464 clients, of which 153 are under 18. During the past 12 months, the team have received almost 100 referrals.

"Direct Payments has made us feel that we have got part of our lives back! Although you shouldn't.....you can feel resentful towards the "cared for" person when completely "snowed under" with the caring role! Direct Payments has changed all that for me as a recipient of a carers Direct Payment.'

"I get continuity from the Direct Payment service. Over the years they have got to know me so I don't have to keep repeating myself and explaining all my personal things to lots of different people. They are very very helpful to me.'

Learning Centre & Meeting Rooms

Funded by Warrington Borough Council's Life Long Learning and the Griffiths Court Foundation, supported by Leonard Cheshire and Warrington Collegiate

The Learning Centre boasts a fully equipped IT Suite, a classroom / meeting room with 3PCs and Interactive Whiteboard, a Multi-Sensory Room and fully equipped Meeting Room and has received 4,187 visitors in the past 12 months.

The New Discover IT Suite has 12 PCs and an interactive Smart Board. It runs a variety of classes for disabled people, their families, their carer and members of the local community. Specialist software along with adapted keyboards, mice, fully height adjustable desks aims to make this facility accessible to everyone.IT classes provided include: Computers for the Terrified-Basic IT for Learning Disabilities-Office Skills IT-OCR Functional Skills from Entry Level to Level 2. We also provide a variety of one off courses on: Movie Maker, Facebook, Shopping online and getting to know your Laptop. Our "IT Buddies" provide one to one tuition to people with a Visual Impairment. 87 members have used the suite for over 800 hours.

We run a variety of other classes including Meditation, Soap Making, and in partnership with Warrington Collegiate- Confidence, Floral Art and Jewellery Making. We have an active volunteer led Camera Club that meets once a week. In total, individual class attendees for Learning Centre activities have totalled over 2,350.

The Learning Centre & CIL have a number of meeting rooms, accommodating small groups of up to 6 people to larger groups of 30 people, all of which are available for hire. A number of these have full audio visual equipment and flip charts on request. Wi-Fi is available throughout.

Leisure Recreation and Sport

Funded by Children in Need. Working in partnership with the Sports Engagement team, Warrington Youth Club, Aiming High for Disabled Children and Warrington Wolves Foundation.



The team has been involved in a number of community based projects:

- Disability Inclusive Sports Club (DISC) for 11-19 year olds.
- Mini Disability Sports Club (Mini DISC) for 5-11 year olds.
- One Wednesday Can't Hurt (OWCH) A pain management support group – with around 10 attendees per week.
- Children's Inclusive Swimming Club for 5 – 18 year olds.
- Wheelchair Basketball Club averaging 7 people per session.
- This year's Disability Awareness Day 'Sports Zone' was dedicated to the memory of Dave Connor, with eleven participation sports and sport information stalls.

Mobility & Independent Living Service - Liverpool Funded by Liverpool Community Health NHS Trust & Liverpool City Council

Our new Mobility Independent Living Service opened its doors in April 2012. Our central location near Liverpool Town Centre and Liverpool One has become greatly popular as it offers disabled people, families and its carers fully accessible facilities, which are available daily with no appointments necessary. Our showroom offers a wide range of products from scooters, wheelchair and beds to smaller daily living aids to increase the independence of our clients.

Around 163 people visit the centre every week, Many of these visits have resulted in purchasing an item or product, although the team also offers independent advice around products to suit a person's needs / disability and also signpost to other local organisations, where appropriate. This partnership approach has led to many disabled people receiving better quality services in Liverpool, with links formed with a number of local organisations including Bradbury Fields, RNIB, Local Solutions and Liverpool Community Health (Wheelchair Service). We also provide additional support services to include wheelchair loans and work with our Mobility Workshop for repairs and servicing.

Mobility & Independent Living Store - Warrington

Developed in partnership with the Golden Square Management Team (Lend Lease) Staffing is self-funded

Our Mobility & Independent Living Store, recently reached its 1st year of trading and is now well established within the Golden Square Shopping Centre. The store offers an extensive range of high quality independent living products at affordable prices, which is backed up with a range of support services such as our mobility workshop, showroom and service centre.

MILS customers have demonstrated their appreciation of our service by voting in the Golden Square Smile Competition, which judged the best customer service providers in Golden Square. The team are pleased to have been voted in the final 12 out of 130 shops.



Relationships, Sex & Disability Matters Funded by NHS Warrington

This innovative service is nationally recognised for tackling this very sensitive subject. Enguiries are received via our Centre for Independent Living, Disability Information Point (Warrington Retail Market), website and telephone.

The wide range of information provided in our 'Relationships & Sex Matters' packs are used by professionals or individuals to offer support and advice on the issues concerning sex and disability. WDP also runs 'Relationships, Sex and Disability Awareness Training' sessions for professionals, and individuals who are interested in finding out more information about services and aids around sexual health. During 2012, WDP became a C - Card distribution centre, providing a service for young disabled adults to talk to staff about sexual health and obtain condoms free of charge. WDP is a member of the Sexual Health and Disability Alliance (SHADA) Group.

"The Relationships, Sex and Disability training has given me an insight into the issues faced by disabled people around relationships and has enabled me to be able to answer enquiries relating to these.

Shopmobility Warrington

Funded by Warrington Borough Council and supported by Golden Square Management Team (Lend Lease), Warrington Market and Warrington Bus Interchange

Our Warrington Shopmobility service provides a vital life line for those who require mobility support to shop in the Warrington Town Centre and Golden Square. We provide the means to allow people to get out and about and shop as independently as possible.

Satellite services are available at Warrington Bus Interchange and the Disability Information Point in Warrington Town Centre. During the past 12 months our team of 7 volunteers have given over 2,320 hours to support the service, assisting in the loan of 6,140 scooters for over 14,000 hours.

"We use shopmobility every week, without this service my mum would not be able to go out shopping and would lose her independence.'

Telephone Helpline

Funded by Warrington Borough Council

WDP run a Disability Helpline where disabled people, families, carers, support groups and health professionals can phone to ask for information, advice and guidance on all disability matters. A dedicated team of volunteers staff this Helpline then direct or signpost our callers through to the appropriate team or services. During the past 12 months, the switchboard has received 54,708 calls.

Our trained team, some of whom have given over 19 years service to WDP, have extensive knowledge of available services or have access to current information.

Volunteering Supported by Lloyds TSB and the Advice Service Fund, on behalf of the OCS

Warrington Disability Partnership currently has 141 Volunteers who regularly volunteer across all of our services. Alongside these volunteers we have many other volunteers who help out throughout the year at a wide range of events, including DAD. During the past year, our volunteers have given 60,464 hours to ensure that an effective service is delivered, an outstanding amount, which would cost the organisation £374,272 if paid at the National Minimum Wage.

This year volunteers have covered 19 departments across a wide range of services i.e. Admin Support, Switchboard, Benefits Advice, Fundraising and the Wizard Canal Boat. The volunteers are supported by dedicated support workers, as well as having the continuing support from the volunteer coordinators. Further volunteering opportunities have developed through the opening of MILS stores at Brunswick Dock, Liverpool and MILS Golden Square, Warrington.

Warrington Disability Forum (WDF)

Funded by Warrington Borough Council

The Warrington Disability Forum provides monthly meetings for consultation and information exchange with guest speakers ranging from the Warrington Health Consortium, Out & About Day Care Services and the Macintyre Shared Lives Project.

The Forum has a lively agenda for discussion with an average attendance of 20 members per meeting. In total, there are 134 active members, which include both individuals and organisations with an interest in disability matters.

Many local organisations have held consultations with members of the forum, taking their suggestions on board. Throughout the year forum members have been involved in discussions around the new Garven Place development, the Orford Jubilee Hub, Social Services reviews and Town Centre parking.

Over 800 people have enjoyed trips on the Wizard, during 2012, with WDP volunteers giving 2,577 to support 101 trips.



Festive season is upon us - leave your car at home

The festive season is upon us and many people will be out enjoying themselves and perhaps drinking more alcohol than they normally would. The sensible advice for anyone who is thinking of driving after having consumed alcohol is clear: don't do it, even if you think you are under the limit. However many people ignore this advice, especially at this time of year. It may be sobering then to consider what the consequences might be if you are arrested for drinking and driving.

If you are stopped by the police on suspicion of drinking and driving a police officer will normally breathalyse you at the roadside using a hand held device. Failure without reasonable excuse to comply with this request is an offence. If the test is positive you will be arrested and taken to a police station.

At the police station you will be required to take part in a further test so that the level of alcohol in

your breath, blood or urine can be measured. Normally this involves blowing into a machine which produces a reading of the amount of alcohol in your breath. Refusing or failing without reasonable excuse to provide a sample is an offence. Reasonable excuse normally only applies where there is a genuine medical reason not to comply with the test. The police will decide whether you are given a breath, blood or urine test, you cannot choose. You are entitled to speak to a solicitor during your time at the police station but the police will not delay the test procedure for this to happen. It is likely that during your time at the police station you will be placed in a locked cell, possibly for several hours.

If the test shows that you are over the limit you will be charged, which means that you will be required to attend a magistrates penalties The court. vary depending on the alcohol level, any

aggravating features such as a collision and any previous record. The court is obliged, except in very limited circumstances, to disqualify you from driving for a minimum of 12 months including for an offence of failing to provide a sample. You may also go to prison if the case is very serious, even for a first offence. The consequences for careers and family life can therefore be devastating.

Don't make the mistake of driving in the morning after drinking heavily the night before. There is always a chance that you will still be under the influence which will not only be dangerous for you and other road users but will put you at risk of a positive breath test if you are stopped by the police.



Revisiting the question of dividends

Having had a nice break over Christmas, we thought we might revisit the question of dividends paid to director/shareholders. Many one man companies use dividends as a means to provide tax and NI efficient payments to the director/shareholder. In many cases, the payments are simply transfers of cash with no specific purpose, and it is left to the accountant at the end of the year to sort out what goes where.

This treatment may have been sufficient in the past but it is now getting less acceptable for a number of reasons. Firstly, and without wishing to overstate this, there is a case where the

Court of Appeal has held that dividends are salary for both tax and NI purposes. The taxpayer has been given leave to take the case to the Supreme Court, and some people are wondering whether, the tax office wins again, there may be a general attack on the use of dividends. The general view is that this will not happen. However, the likelihood of an individual arrangement being challenged even now is increased if the

paperwork is not complete. Secondly, and more importantly,

many director/shareholders have invested money in the form of loans into their company. If this loan is sufficiently their company. If this loan is sufficiently large to cover all payments made by the company to the director then the payments could justifiably be regarded as repayments of that loan, with the loan being increased afterwards by the payment of a salary and dividend. However, two things are happening that may affect this interpretation

. With the downturn in the economy over the past few years, the profitability of many companies has fallen, with the result that the dividends and salary voted in the accounts have failed to fully cover the withdrawals made. An increasing number of director/shareholders are now finding that their loan to the company is insufficient to cover the withdrawals during the year, and this can create significant taxation repercussions.

2. With the forthcoming introduction of Real Time Information, failure to notity the tax office in advance of payments that are subject to PAYE deductions being made can lead to substantial penalties, and these penalties are for each occurrence of this heinous crime. If

payments are of a non-specific nature then it will be more difficult to refute any assertion by the tax office that they should be subjected to the Real Time Information rules.

Our advice is that it is more important now than ever to ensure that the exact nature of each and every payment to a director/shareholder is determined and that the correct paper trail to support that payment is created.

The aim of the roadshow was to raise awareness of equality, integrity and diversity, through music. Pupils were enthralled by his music and the message of his songs about


