

Where does it hurt? You can alleviate physical pain!

Storm over hospital 'merger' plan

MERGER between Warrington Hospital's management body and Whiston Hospital is one of a number of options being considered in a bid to "rescue" the struggling Merseyside hospital.

The possibility has come as a shock to hospital chiefs at Warrington. Another option is Whiston could be handed over to a private company, health minister Simon Burns has admitted.

Whiston Hospital was recently rebuilt under a £350 million Privaté Finance Initiative (PFI) but is now struggling to fund £20.3 million annual payments.

The hospital is run by St Helens and Knowsley Hospitals NHS Trust and Warrington and Halton General hospitals are run by North Cheshire Hospitals NHS Trust.A health service insider said: "Whiston is effectively broke and as such cannot get foundation status

Labour seize back control

LABOUR seized back control of Warrington Borough Council after five years of a of Lib-Dem Tory coalition, making a total of six gains all from the Lib Dems.

The margin of victory delighted Labour leader Terry O'Neill as the six gains gives his group a "workable majority

The Lib Dem vote collapsed across Warrington but they managed to hold off strong challenges from the Conservatives in Lymm, Stockton Heath and Appleton but with greatly reduced majorities.

The Conservatives successfully held on to Culcheth. The Labour gains Great Sankey North and Great Sankey South, Latchford West, Sankey South, Latchford V Poulton North and Whittle Hall. West,

A total of 67 candidates contested D seats, with Labour and the 20

Conservatives fighting all 20 seats and the Liberal Democrats 18. In addition there were five Green Party candidates, three UK Independence Party and one British National Party. One of the big casualties of the night was Liberal Democrat deputy mayor, Cllr Ted Finnegan at Latchford West. Meanwhile Warrington voted over whelmingly against the AV voting system as 40,442 voted No while 19,134 voted Yes.

Japanese cars in short supply

JAPAN's eight major vehicle manufacturers have reported that their combined domestic production facilities are only operating at about 50 per cent of the normal, as a result of disruption caused by the earthquake, tsunami and nuclear disaster.

Toyota - for a long while the world's biggest vehicle maker - appears to have been hit worst and expects to be overtaken by General Motors in the production stakes.

Mitsubishi has fared better than the

others and suffered a reduction of only 25.7 per cent. The Tohoku region hit by the disasters does not have many assembly facilities for car companies but it is a key area for making many

of the parts required to build cars. As a result, parts are in short supply and in some cases, entire assembly lines were halted because vehicles were missing just one or two parts

The impact has been felt globally as well, with overseas production plants, including those in the UK, also unable to secure sufficient parts to carry on.

Car manufacturers say continued shortages are inevitable and output figures are likely to remain low.

So for some time to come, Japanese cars seem likely to be in short supply on forecourts around the world - and could well lose out to makes from other parts of the world.





Roads continue to decline

A SURVEY of councils by the RAC has revealed that road conditions across the country are continuing to decline because Town Hall chiefs are being forced to undertake short-term repairs rather than permanent solutions.

Twelve out of 20 councils reported that government funding cuts' mean they are concentrating on short term repairs to fill potholes caused by the harsh winter

Eight councils have cut road maintenance budgets, two have dipped into reserves to make up for shortfalls, and two more have set up private finance initiatives to pay for road maintenance.

One council has axed £5.8 million from its road maintenance budget despite having a backlog of $\pounds160\text{m}$ in repairs.



Business record checks have arrived!

Last month we reported that some areas had already received "Business Record Check" letters from the tax office, and said that taxpayers in Warrington should take this as an early warning. How true! Since then we have been approached by one person who has received a letter, and one of our own lists there also received a letter. Putters

How true! Since then we have been approached by one person who has received a letter, and one of our own clients has also received a letter. Business Record Checks have arrived! We therefore apologize if this seems a bit of a repeat from last month. However, this is a very important development that could affect a large number of local traders. Business Record Checks are where smaller traders will be visited to check the quality of their records. Should the tax office discover that the records are not adequate then this could result in more than a slapped wrist or advice on improving them. This could also give rise to assessments being raised on the grounds that returns were inaccurate or unreliable, with the resultant increase in tax liabilities and penalties.

Last month, we touched on the records that should be kept by all businesses. In particular, we said that guidance issued by HMRC on their website states that the basic records to be kept by sole traders must include "a record of all your sales and takings" as well as "a record of all your purchases and expenses". However, they then go on to include a long list of more detailed records, such as bank statements and purchase and sales invoices, that "will be useful for completing your Self Assessment tax return and answering any questions that HMRC may have about it". Our experience suggests that the basic records alone will tail to convince HMRC that those records are complete and accurate.

convince HMRC that those records are complete and accurate. The tax officehave said that the cost to taxpayers of these Business Record Checks will be less than a couple of hundred pounds. This is, frankly, cloud cuckoo land if it is an honest estimate. The cost will be substantially more in all but a very few cases, and the tax office estimate could not include any professional representation.

Anti-drink project hailed a success

WARRINGTON'S Arcangel anti-alcohol project is being hailed as a huge success. Town Hall bosses say it has cut

crime, anti-social behaviour and serious violence and made the town centre feel far safer at night.

In the three years since the project was launched by the borough council, police and other partners, significant improvements have been achieved in the town centre.

Total crime is down by 12.3 per cent and violent crime by 15.7 per cent. Serious violence has been slashed by a staggering 25.8 per cent.

Alcohol-related anti-social behaviour has been reduced by $\overline{2}$ behaviour has been reduced by 7.3 per cent, although officers believe the decrease is actually much more when the impact of 800 Section 27 notices issued by police are taken into account. These notices allow police to remove people causing anti-social behaviour from the town centre.

During the three year period conditions have been imposed at 13 licensed premises. Cheshire Police have set up the

Cheshire Police have set up the Town Centre Neighbourhood Policing Unit, training has been given to club door staff, taxi marshals have been introduced and Lower Bridge Street has been closed to traffic at night Warrington's MPs visited the town centre at night to see police operations for themselves and this led to actional government chapping its

to national government changing its stance on alcohol sales in a similar way to that adopted in Warrington. As a result of the project's success,

it is now being formally closed and its task group disbanded. But the measures it introduced will continue and the situation will continue to be monitored.

LIBERAL Democrat Mike Biggin is to be the next Mayor of Warrington.

He will step into the job originally earmarked for his party colleague Ted Finnegan, who lost his seat in last week's council elections.

Cllr Biggin, (pictured), who is also a member of Grappenhall and Thelwall Parish Council, where he has been chairman for the last two years,

joked: "It is like a life in chains. "But it is a massive honour to become Mayor of Warrington and I am thrilled.

"I can't help but feel sorry for Ted Finnegan, however. He put in all the hard work of preparing to be Mayor, acting as deputy for the last 12 months, but has been deprived of the final honour. It is very sad for him."
