Editor's Comment



NEWS that Warrington Borough Council and Peel Ports - owners of the Manchester Ship Canal – have reached agreement to minimise traffic disruption in the town when the bridges are swung, should on the face of it be welcomed.

Leader of the council Terry O'Neill and lead member for transport, Cllr Linda Dirir, have signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the company.

Disruption

The agreement should reduce traffic disruption by limiting the number of occasions on which the bridges are operated during peak

periods to less than 100 a year. In addition, Peel have agreed to allow free use of the Warburton Toll Bridge at times of serious traffic hold-ups on the M6 at Thelwall Viaduct.

But what is the definition of "serious traffic hold ups."

Hardly a day passes in Warrington when there isn't a serious traffic hold up caused by an accident on one of the motorways,

or road works.

The incident involving a lorry crashing, scattering 6,000 chickens across the M62 near Irlam, is a

classic example.

Also less than 100 bridge openings a year during peak periods, still means the bridges could be open up to twice a week - and again what exactly is "Peak time." times" - with many people working flexi hours and part time these

days, there isn't an exact peak time - from my own experience this can be from any time from 7.30am-10am or from 3.30pm to 6.30pm.

I sincerely hope the new agreement will improve travel times around Warrington, because as a growing successful town, we need a free flowing road system.

But I fear when we look back

will have noticed any difference.

The Memoradum Understanding also commits Peel Ports to support the introduction of an early warning system for motorists about swing bridge closures.

This will be introduced in July this year and will take the form of electronic signs on the town's key roads plus a system of web-based information and text message

Identifying with 'Labels'

Labels assist with communication in all arenas of our lives, identifying products and consumer services, and also help us to identify with each other personally and within work and social groups. In fact, people often live according to the labels they have been given or chosen to adopt, i.e. job role. Labels also help us to function within perceived societal norms, and highlight the expectations placed on nightight the expectations placed on us at work, school or college, and at home. We therefore tend to live within the confines of 'labelling', which impact on the way we go about our daily routines.

A young child recently remarked to me on how people spend so much time within boxes, meaning buildings of all shapes and sizes.

buildings of all shapes and sizes and various forms of vehicles. This then led us to discuss the subject of labels, which also identify the role of buildings, and the roles of the people

buildings, and the roles of the people living or working within them.

It is interesting that many people tend to live the labels they are given by the medical profession or other establishments. We often hear statements such as "I'm asthmatic"; or "I'm obese". We have become a pation of individuals that are a nation of individuals that are

identified because of conditions or behaviours, rather than the unique people that we are.

people that we are.

This is becoming more apparent with younger children who come to see us for Hypnotherapy and Counselling. We get informed about their problematic behaviour or their medical condition, which is causing problems at home or school, and are asked to find a solution to the are asked to find a solution to the problem. This is before we even get to meet the child and hear from them what it is like to be them. The child may have already been labelled as a' problem child'. However, the problem is most likely to do with their environment and the expectations placed upon them. The child will be left with this label unless something significantly changes.

It is important to identify the many

expectations placed on children, and how difficult it is for them to and how difficult it is for them to just be themselves, no matter how different that may be to what we expect as 'normal' behaviour. As babies and toddlers we think it is wonderful when we witness unique and creative behaviours, however, as the child commences school, the same behaviours we have encouraged, now start to be discouraged and may also become discouraged, and may also become

unacceptable or seem odd within the home. The child may then negatively react to people and situations, resulting in an increase in problematic behaviour, then poor health conditions may arise due to the stress they are under, and family relationships become fraught.

Problematic behaviour and resulting mental and physical health problems can then affect children as they grow into adulthood, and by this time, may be living with multi labelled identity.

Council unveils plans for £8.5 million business incubator

PLANS for a new £8.5 million business incubator in Warrington town centre's "Stadium Quarter" have been unveiled by the borough

council.
The new 50,000sq ft. business incubator will occupy the site of the former Dallam Centre in Dallam

The site sits at the heart of Warrington Borough Council's ambitious £190 million Stadium

Quarter project.

It follows the declaration made in January that a £10 million University Technical College will also be funded and built on the Stadium Quarter site. When constructed the two developments which sit adjacent to each other. which sit adjacent to each other.

The new Business Incubator will

provide a contemporary, high-quality workplace specifically aimed at providing prestigious accommodation for start-up

The five storey state-of-the-art building will feature a café at ground floor level and offices and research and development facilities on the upper floors. Its contemporary look will be enhanced by high quality stone and glass elevations and feature a double-height alazed entrance.

and glass elevations and feature a double-height glazed entrance lobby.

Funding has come from a £1.7 million European Regional Development Fund grant and £6.7 million investment from Warrington Regional Persuals. Council's

programme.
It is expected that the facility will in itself create 11 new jobs and approximately the same number during the construction period. When the facility is operational in Summer, it could house up to 100 small businesses.

small businesses. The Stadium Quarter project

was announced by Warrington Borough Council in March 2013. The scheme will connect the bus interchange with the Warrington Wolves' Halliwell Jones Stadium and create a new, vibrant mixeduse development comprising educational, business, leisure and housing uses.

phased programme A phased programme of development over the next decade will create up to 1,000 construction jobs and nearly 4000 new permanent jobs when fully completed in 2024.



LOCALLY based Reproductive Health Group are helping raise funds for the national fertility charity – Infertility Network UK.

Based at their new state of the art clinic at Daresbury Park, the Centre for Reproductive Health, Reproductive Health Group provide high quality, patient

Amongst the latest technologies available at the Centre is EEVA (early embryo viability assessment). Developed at Stanford University, this is a technique used in IVF treatment to help determine which fertilised embryos have the greatest potential for a successful outcome to the treatment.

Whilst there are many factors which affect the chances of pregnancy through whilst there are many factors which affect the chances of pregnancy through an IVF cycle, selecting the best embryos is an important one and EEVA provides additional information which makes it more likely that the embryo with the highest pregnancy potential is chosen. Until June 15, clinics in the UK which currently offer EEVA have been invited to help raise funds for the national fertility charity, Infertility Network UK, and Reproductive Health Group are proud to be a part of this campaign. 

Housing Trust Open New HQ in Warrington

WARRINGTON'S largest social housing landlord Golden Gates Housing Trust (GGHT) held a special celebration event to mark the official opening of its new head office, Bank Park House (BPH).

The event took place at the Trust's new building in Kendrick Street, which looks onto Bank Park.

Guests included the Mayor Cllr peter Carey, Board Members, staff, local Councillors and children from

local Councillors and children from local primary school St Barnabas.

Speeches were made by GGHT Chair Roy Smith, GGHT Chief Executive Peter Mercer and the Mayor ahead of an official "ribbon cutting" ceremony.

Guests at the event also witnessed the Trust placing a time capsule in

the Trust placing a time capsule in the floor of the reception of the new building. The capsule contained a number of contents themed around 'Warrington in 30 years' and was developed in conjunction with Year 5 and 6 pupils from St Barnabas Primary School.

Guests were given the chance to have a tour of the new building and were shown its 'green' features, such as a green roof forming a roof top garden, roof mounted photovoltaic panels which will generate up to 21,000 KVa of electricity, highly insulated and rendered external walls and a sophisticated heat recovery system which provides the building system which provides the building with hot water. They were also shown how GGHT's ICT Team has invested in upgrading and installing new technology.

GGHT is the largest Registered Provider of Social Housing in Warrington. The Trust own and manage over 8,600 properties and are committed to improving local communities and resident's lives. The new office accommodation will help the Trust to achieve these ambitions, while continuing to grow and improve the services that it provides. Prior to completion the Trust's staff were based at a number of office locations across Warrington. The office's central location will provide improved access for staff and more improved to the contract of the contract importantly for customers

The completion of the building also marks a key milestone in the wider regeneration of Bank Park, which is currently benefiting from a £1.3

is currently benefiting from a £1.3 million investment programme led by Warrington Borough Council.
Work on the 24,000 square foot building began in late March 2013. The building has been developed by Birchwood based contractor Globe Construction and was designed by The Fairhursts Desian Group. The new The Fairhursts Design Group. The new building has also helped to generate local employment opportunities and has provided work for local suppliers

and sub-contractors.

The open plan design will create an engaging space that will reflect the different type of work activity required across the Trust. The building has been designed to promote an inclusive and collaborative working dynamic, featuring a state of the art

IT training suite, Board Room and two community rooms. New technology within the building includes video conferencing and smart boards, which will make meetings more productive and training effective.

The building is set to achieve a BREEAM rating of 'Very Good', recognising the Trust's commitment to meeting the highest standards for environmental sustainability. As part of the moving in process the Trust has developed a constraint plan for developed a green travel plan for its staff and customers, encouraging those using the building to utilise green modes of travel wherever green modes of travel wherever practicable. CHANCELLOR of the Exchequer George Osborne visited Warrington to meet founders of the Tim Parry Johnathan Ball Peace Centre and talk with people receiving assistance as part of the Foundation for Peace's "Survivors

He also learned about the Foundation's work in the prevention, resolution and response to violent conflict. The visit finished with a tour of the Peace







Final curtain call for Wilderspool

WARRINGTON'S famous Wilderspool Stadium took it's final curtain call as a sell out crowd saw Warrington's Under 16s stars of the future defeat Cumbria Academy Under 16s 46-16 as local photographer Eddie Whitham captured the occasion, as he took a trip down memory lane, remembering the many legends he had photographed since 1958.

Eddie had a tear in his eye as he bid farewell to Wilderspool home of the Wires/Wolves, with the old stadium now showing it's age apart from the playing surface which in over 50 years of photographing games at the ground he have never seen better ... fit for Wembley!

The Wolves youngsters made sure that the last game at the stadium would be one to remember running out winners by 46 points to 16 over

Cumbria.

Although there were no Bevan's (Brian and John), Harry Baths, Alex Murphys or Alfie Langers, the stars of the tuture put on a show that fans of the future put on a show that tans will remember for a long while. There was no shortage of effort from the young Wolves Academy side as they steadily built up their lead over a very good Cumbrian Academy side. A full house of almost 800 (a full house because of restriction on the number allowed into the stadium fans cheered their hearts out to number allowed into the stadium) fans cheered their hearts out to create a typical old Wilderspool atmosphere. This was the final game before the Stadium is demolished in a few months time. At the final whistle the crowd gave the players a well deserved standing ovation.

Eddie recalled: "In 1946 my father and Uncle Jim took me to my first game of Rugby League at Wilderspool and in those days almost every one walked to the ground and

every one walked to the ground and

we were no exception.

"As we reached the old railway crossing and the gates closed to let the train through as we waited uncle Jim, who had been extolling the virtues of Wire's Australian winger Brian Bevan, said 'thats Bev'...! looked at the man in a rain coat and rooked at the man in a rain coat and trilby hat with a small parcel under his arm and thought he was pulling my leg...he looked less like a rugby league super star than any thing I could imagine. That man can 'catch pigeons' said uncle Jim.

The gates opened an the man in the rain coat went on his way and so did we...we got on the ground and soon the music Entry of the Gladiators rang out... "what numbers Bevan" I asked...number 2 was the reply... out came number 2...and I could not believe my eyes...a bald headed man with a stoop, no teeth and more bandages on his knees than were in a chamist shop came outs the field. a chemist shop came onto the field...I really could not believe my eyes ...could it be the man at the crossings gate in the rain coat and trilby hat.... after about ten minutes number 2 gat the ball and ran...it was like magic ...for me I had seen the WORLD'S



GREATEST WINGER EVER going on to break and still hold the try scoring

record.

"In 1958 I was working for the local paper as a photographer and was sent to Wilderspool to take some pictures. When I got there I was met by the grounds man Jack Hamblett (one of the nicest people you could ever meet) "come in son, would you like a cup tea" he said, "go and sit in the dressing room I won't be long"...now I had seen him play by then many times...but there he was sat in the corner smoking..Brian Bevan...."hello" he said and I think I just about managed a squeaky reply just about managed a squeaky reply and I was rescued from my trance by Jack bringing in my cup of tea which I could hardly hold. "This was the start of me taking

photographs of rugby and I reckon over the years I have seen and met the best players. Too many to mention but for me the greatest was 'BEV'. I met him and photographed him many times until his last game for the Wire in 1962 and it was still magic. Now we have a statue to immortalise him out side the Halliwellongs for fans to look up to

Ones for fans to look up to.

When the players go onto field at Wilderspool they go down several steps and up several steps on to the pitch...I think I have over the years gone up and down those steps more times than any player has and to this day it still makes me think of the famous names who have done the

Wilderspool with all it's memories brought a tear to my eyes as I went up and down those steps for the last

Tax avoidance schemes

No doubt you have all heard about Gary Barlow and the other members of Take That who are facing a tax bill of about £20m following HMRC's success in challenging a "tax avoidance" scheme that they entered into.

Basically, the scheme made use of perfectly legitimate tax reliefs that are available on investment in intellectual property. However, this scheme used bank borrowings to massively increase the amount "invested", and the tax returns were prepared on this basis. HMRC argued, and the Court agreed, that these borrowings were essentially used to repay the borrowings rather than to invest in the tax deductible assets. This in turn meant that the "investments" were circular in nature and as result were non allowable to tax purposes. The Court held, therefore, that the Basically, the scheme made use of The Court held, therefore, that the claim for tax relief on the amounts "invested" with the aid of bank borrowings should be disallowed.

The lesson to be learnt from this is simple. Do not indulge in fancy tax avoidance schemes unless you can afford to not only meet the substantial fees that the promoters of these schemes charge but also the tax, interest and penalties that will result if the schemes fail (rumour is that Take That will need to make another European Tour to meet their liabilities, an option probably not available to

you)!
WatkinsonBlack have never been in favour of these artificial schemes, and have always tried to dissuade clients from even considering them. As we have always said – if it seems too good to be true then it probably

This does not mean, of course, that we agree with HMRC's definition of the "right" amount of tax, which is that it means the maximum amount of tax that could be payable. 










Wolves legend launches new book
