ift off for **Orford Park**

WORK has kicked off on Warrington's £30 million Orford Park community sports village more than 17 years after it was first proposed.

Scheduled to open in November 2011, key partners in the ground breaking project, including members of Warrington Town FC and their star striker, Orford born Chris Gahgan, attended a special turf cutting ceremony on land off Winwick Road. Thanks to major cash injections from national and regional sponsors work on the public, private and

work on the public, private and voluntary sector development is now underwáy.

The project was first thought of in 1994 by councillor Mike Hannon, who was on hand to see the project

get under way with residents, community groups and key partners. Council leader lan Marks said he was delighted and proud Warrington Council had played a "key role" in

bringing the various partners together.
Warrington North MP Helen Jones said she would like to thank those who had the vision for the project and all the funders and those who had put work into the project.

Group (OPEG) and local tootballer Chris Gahgan from Warrington Town FC, one of the many organisations to benefit from the new facility.

Fifty acres of land will be transformed into a valuable community asset providing a wide variety of leisure, health and education facilities on one site.

There will be football pitches, library health centre and numerous

library, health centre and numerous other facilities.

The village is designed to promote

healthy lifestyles and independence increase the number of people participating in physical activity and improve lifelong learning, the local skill base and employability of local

people.

The sports village will not only provide a focal point for the local community and boost local pride and identity, it will also represent a London, 2012 Olympic Games and Paralympic Games legacy for the North West. The North West Development Agency is funding

£3.6million towards the scheme.

FOUR members of Warrington Borough Council are seeking to become MPs at the General Election – probably a unique occurrence.

Conservative Fiona Bruce has been selected to contest Congleton and Labour's Yvonne Fovargue has been chosen to fight the Makerfield

Liberal Democrat Jo Crotty will be contesting the Warrington South seat while Conservative Paul Campbell is

taking on Warrington North.
Two of the four, Coun Bruce and
Coun Fovargue, are almost certain to

Coun Fovargue, are almost certain to be elected.

The Congleton seat is regarded as a safe Tory seat. At the last election, Conservative Ann Winterton had a majority of 8,246 over Labour.

At Makerfield, former cabinet minister lan McCartney had a massive 18,149 majority over the Conservatives, making it one of the safest Labour seats in the country.

Coun Bruce, a local solicitor and Coun Fovargue, wife of borough

councillor Paul Kenny, both continue to serve as councillors, although Coun Bruce has stepped down from her role as executive member for tinance.

coun Crotty will have a difficult task to take the Warrington South seat, currently held for Labour by Helen Southworth with a majority of 3,515. At the last election, the Liberal Democrats came third, trailing 4,346 votes behind the second placed. Tories ironically then

4,340 votes behind the second placed Tories, ironically then represented by Coun Bruce.

The seat is regarded as key to the Conservatives forming the next Government and their candidate, David Mowat, has been working hard in the constituency for some time while Labour's Nick Bent has only recently arrived on the scene recently arrived on the scene following Mrs Southworth's decision not to seek re-election.

Coun Campbell's chances of wresting the Warrington North seat from Labour's Helen Jones, can perhaps best be summed up by noting that he has taken over the role of the council's finance chief from Coun Russes But the adds are he Coun Bruce. But the odds are he should keep the Lib Dem's David Eccles in third place.

Ms Jones' majority over the Tories in 2005 was 12,204, making the seat another of the safest Labour strongholds in the country.

Business chief slams highway **improvements**



A BUSINESS leader has slammed proposed highway "improvements" on the busy A49 at Warrington which are set to cost an estimated £3 million.

The work involves removing a roundabout on Long Lane which is used by an average of 4,500 vehicles and hour and replacing it with a traffic light controlled junction.

with a traffic light controlled junction.

Warrington Chamber of Commerce Chief Executive Colin Daniels said: "Yet again the Borough Council's transport/traffic experts are proposing "improvements" to this junction by removing the traffic island and creating a junction controlled by traffic lights only.

Déjà vu

"They claim 'that this work will help to reduce congestion in the area'. I wonder where the evidence is for this claim? Or more likely is this a case of déjà vu especially when you remember the same claim for the removal of the traffic island at the Asda Junction on Cromwell Avenue which has left us with a problem that previously didn't exist and our transport/traffic experts were found wanting for failure to do the proper research.

Worsening

"The Chamber of Commerce makes no apology for our campaign to reduce the cost to business and the residents of the worsening traffic congestion in the worsening traffic congestion in the town where the only answer our transport and traffic experts have is more traffic lights, which in themselves it is universally acknowledged, cause both delays and congestion!"

The scheme aims to improve the A49 Winwick Road, A50 Long lane and Hawley's Lane junction.

It is expected site works will take about six months, although a date has not yet been fixed, but the earliest possible is July/August because of other works scheduled for the town centre during the summer.

Charity celebrates its next 10 years!

FAMILY support charity Home-Start Warrington, which celebrated its 10th birthday last year, launched its next 10 years with another party.

The event, at the Gateway, was attended by the Mayor, Brian Axcell, leader of the borough council lan Marks, other members of the council, Warrington Primary are Trust and representatives of the local business community.

community.

Home-Start has existed in Warrington since 1999 and recruits and train volunteers to befriend and support families with children under five. The scheme currently has 36 trained volunteers who provide a minimum of three hours support to a family each week.



The number of volunteers is due to rise to over 50 by the summer, therefore delivering over 150 hours of support per week, totaling more than 6000 hours a year.

Family support co-coordinator Kate Griffiths said:" "Since the economic downturn the demand for our support has increased, but we have been very fortunate that we have had plenty of Warrington people looking to volunteer to support families in need. When I joined Home-Start three years ago, we only had around 15 volunteers. By this summer we will have over 50. That is a credit to the people of Warrington".

Make the most of your financial position

AS we approach the end of the tax year, 5th April, then it is perhaps time to make a few simple checks to ensure that we are making the most of our financial position.

Personal Pensions

There is one major change that will be taking place at the end of this tax year, and that is the minimum age at which you can take your tax free lump sum and start drawing on your pension. Currently, you can do this at any time from the age of 50. However, on 5th April, the minimum age increases to 55.

As always, you should also review your contributions into your pension. Basic rate tax relief is received at source. However, any relief at the higher rate needs to be claimed in the year

rate needs to be claimed in the year during which the contribution was made. Therefore, you will receive the tax relief twelve months earlier by making any additional contributions before 5th April. This effect is magnified if you are under self-assessment as they will also decrease your payments on will also decrease your payments on account of the following year.

ISA's

ISAs can be a useful tax planning tool, especially for higher rate taxpayers or those with substantial investments. Once an investment is made through an ISA then all income received from that investment is tax free, and any Capital Gain on the sale of the investments is free of Capital Gains Tax. However, the amount that any one individual can contribute into an ISA each tax year is limited. For the current tax year, the most that can be contributed into an ISA is $\pounds 7,200$ if you are aged below 50. Of this, a maximum of $\pounds 3,600$ can be invested in a cash ISA, ie basically a bank or building society account rather than stocks and shares. If you are 50 or above then this limit has recently been increased to 10,200 of which £5,100 can be a cash ISA.

Spouses Personal Allowances

Transfers of assets between spouses are ignored for all tax purposes. Therefore, if there is one spouse with surplus personal allowances, or indeed one spouse pays tax at a higher rate, then there may be scope for transferring income from the tax payer or higher rate



However, always remember that for this to be effective the wage must be commercially justifiable, and must also be paid separately from any housekeeping or other transfers.

Honey Roast Duck with Mustard Mash and Caramelised Onion & Red Wine Sauce Recipe for 4

Ingredients:

4 x 8oz Duck Breasts, skin on Mustard Mash

- 900 gm Maris Piper Potatoes
 55 gm butter
- 55 ml milk
- 25 gm whole grain mustard
- salt to taste
- ground nutmeg
 ground white pepper to taste
 Caramelised onion & red wine sauce
- 2 large Spanish onions thinly sliced 220 ml red wine
- 11 chicken/veal stock
- spring fresh thym
- 55 gm buttersalt to taste
- ground black pepper to taste

Method:
Score Duck breast with sharp knife and season, add to hot oil skin down for 2 minutes and turn, remove from pan after further 2 minutes on other side, add to baking tray in oven for 20 minutes on 200c, ensure skin is crisp and remove from oven and rest for 5 minutes before search

Mustard Mash

Wash and peel potatoes and boil in salted water till they are just cooked. Drain the potatoes and return to the pan with the butter, milk and seasonings. Mash together and add mustard.

Caramelised onion and red wine sauce

Latinumensea onion and red wine sauce
Heat the oil in a saucepan over a moderate heat. When the oil is hot
add the thinly sliced onions and stir every few minutes to allow them

Bridge chaos goes on - and on!

TEMPORARY driving restrictions on Warrington's Cantilever Bridge, which should already have ended, are to continue until the middle of May.

already have ended, are to continue until the middle of May. Work on repainting the bridge structure is seriously behind schedule - mainly because of adverse weather conditions, including the heavy snow early in January. As a result, the borough council has extended the temporary order to enable the restrictions to continue until May 17.

The Latchford bridge is Warrington's only high level crossing of the Manchester Ship Canal and has been controlled by temporary traffic lights since the canal company started painting in October. The restrictions have caused traffic chaos for people travelling in and out of the town from the south at peak periods. Alternative routes are signposted and involve Wash Lane, Knutsford Road, Kingsway South, Hunts Lane, Wilderspool Causeway, Grappenhall Road, London Road and Ackers Road.




