Inadequate restoration from water damage

So you had one or more burst pipes in your home/business premises during the recent freezing during the recent freezing temperatures, and you reported the subsequent damage, caused when the thaw occurred and water leaked from your pipes, to your

Your insurers will have appointed their loss adjusters to come to visit you to assess the damage and they may also have contacted their preferred restoration company to come and

commence drying out procedures.

On the other hand, many policyholders are still, two months after the damage occurred, still waiting to see a loss adjuster due to excessive volumes of work and inadequate numbers of loss adjusters.

This, however, is possibly the beginning of the problems.

The secret now is to make sure that the premises are dried properly, and that the damage is reinstated

We have come across, over the years, many cases of restoration "experts" installing dehumidifiers, heaters, etc. and drying out only the surfaces and internal finishes

(ceilings, partition walls) to premises.

Adapy restoration "experts" instructed by insurers and their loss adjusters are franchise operations and in some cases the franchisees do not have a great deal of experience, coupled with, sometimes, a lack of adequate education.

We have been involved in many cases where water has leaked upstairs, and penetrated the lower storey. It is not rocket science that this water has passed through the intermediate floor which, in the upstairs room, would be made of timber floorboards or water resistant chipboard laid on top of timber floor joists, to which the downstairs ceiling is attached.

Similarly partition walls are, in modern buildings, constructed of a layer of plasterboard attached to each side of a timber frame.

When water passes through the vhen water passes through the intermediate floor or runs down a partition wall, it is absolutely necessary to remove the ceiling to dry the intermediate timber floor joists, and to remove a least one side of the partition wall to ensure that the timber frame work is dried out. timber frame work is dried out properly.

Similarly when water penetrates a suspended timber floor at ground level, it is necessary to ensure that the sub-floor void is dried out properly and the timber is treated.

If this work is not carried out, there is every possibility that dry rot may develop in the concealed areas which should have been exposed and dried properly, and this will create a bigger problem in the future. The insurers' contractor networks

do not always provide the policyholder with a copy of the specification for work which has been agreed, and sometimes the

necessary work is not specified properly thus potentially creating tuture problems. The policyholder should insist upon seeing what work is to be carried out before allowing the insurance company's contractor to do any work

It is absolutely necessary to ensure that concealed areas are exposed by removal of finishings, and that you received a drying out certificate from the restoration company employed by your insurers.

These problems will not occur on

Dave takes the plunge

DAVE Thompson - founder and co-ordinator of the internationally acclaimed Disability Awareness Day at Warrington - took the plunge to raise money to avert a funding crisis threatening the 20th anniversary of the event.

Warrington Disability Partnership organisers of DAD - have launched the "Go the Extra Mile" challenge to raise £10,000 to fill a funding gap caused by the impending demise of its main sponsor, the North West Development Agency.

Dave, who received the MBE for services to disabled people in 2001, decided to kick-start the challenge himself - with an ambitious one mile

scuba dive.

The feat - 66 lengths of a standard swimming pool - would be an ordeal for most people, but is more so for who has been a full-time wheelchair user since breaking his neck playing American football in 1989.

This left him with only limited use in his left arm and none in his right arm or legs.

Dave completed his Professional Association of Diving Instructors (PADI) Open Water qualification in May last year and then, last October, achieved Advanced Open qualification. He is now one of only a relatively small number of disabled divers across the world.

His dive buddy is his brother-in-law

and DAD stewards controller Graham Horton.

The DAD team has already restructured the event to minimise the impact of the loss of NWDA funding.

But Dave said: "Even after complete restructure we are still £10,000 short.



Was radioactive waste dumped on tip?

WAS radioactive waste ever dumped on the former Gatewarth landfill site at Warrington?


Local environmental campaigner John Mulhall (below) claims to have knowledge of radioactive materials from UKAEA, Risley and from the Capenhurst uranium enrichment plant near Chester being dumped at Gatewarth years ago.

near Chester being dumped at Gatewarth years ago.

The 132-acre site was run by the former Cheshire County Council between 1971 and 1988. It is known to have received a variety of domestic, commercial and industrial waste from a wide area.

Now a major study, involving the borough council and the Environment Agency is being carried out over a period of three months, to find out exactly what is there.

Cllr Mike Biggin, the council's executive member for climate change



and public protection said: "This joint undertaking with the Environment Agency is good news for Warrington.

"Once the study has been completed we hope to be able to use the findings to improve the way that the site is managed."

Environment Agency environment manager Claire Bunter said: "By working together, we are able to use the expertise of both organisations to get the best understanding possible of the former landfill site".

Specialist contractors are drilling boreholes into and around the site. Soil, vapour, gas and water samples will be taken from some of the boreholes and water samples will also be taken from the St Helens Canal and other watercourses around the site.

Parts of the site are of special biological interest and because of this, the work is being carried out during the winter months to minimise any disruption to natural habitats and the local people that use the area for recreation.

The findings of the investigation will be made known in due course.

If the council decides the land meets the legal definition of 'contaminated land' they will have to decide whether any clean up is necessary.



£30 million project on schedule

DESPITE the recession and the bad weather Warrington's £30m Orford Park Project is well on schedule and set to open early in 2012, providing a lasting Olympic legacy for the town.

Delighted local councillor, "Orford Champion" Mike Hannon (below) says the facility will provide a major boost to the town and an area of social deprivation.

"Despite the bad weather and the difficult economy the project is moving ahead according to plan," he

Cllr Hannon said it was hoped to

announce a major new retail partner in the near future and because local consultation had been maximised he was anticipating that the whole community would buy into the project.
"Despite the huge building project which has obviously caused some

disruption in the neighbourhood, there

have been very few complaints."

Fifty acres of land are being transformed into a valuable community asset providing a wide variety of leisure, health and education facilities on one site. There will be football pitches, library, health centre and numerous other facilities.



Is 20 plenty for you?

MOST drivers believe their cars use more fuel and create more pollution at lower speeds - a view perpetuated by car manufacturers who claim that the optimum speed for fuel efficiency is between 50mph and 60mph.

But a number of recent surveys indicate that the reverse is the case and that for some models the highest mileage is achieved at speeds as low

This has been seized upon by the

"20s Plenty for Us" campaign, founded by Lymm resident Rod King but now a national organisation, as further justification for their initiative to make the roads safer for all users particularly cyclists and pedestrians.

So what is the truth of the situation? One study, involving five different vehicles ranging from a 1 litre Toyota to a 2.2 litre Landrover Freelander, show that the most efficient speed for all five was below 40mph and, in the case of two, was 20mph

Another study found that fuel consumption increases sharply above

40mph and by 90mph has halved. When 30 km/h (18.6 mph) zones were introduced in Germany, it was found drivers changed gear 12 per cent less often, braked 14 per cent less often and required 12 per cent less fuel. At the same time, cycling increased by 23 per cent.

Department for Transport guidance is that, generally, driving more slowly at a steady pace saves fuel and carbon dioxide emissions, unless an unnecessarily low gear is used.

MPVs are getting sportier

THE popularity of the MPV remains unabated and manufacturers towards sportier looking models to counter claims that multi-purpose vehicles are necessarily rather dull.

A range of new or re-vamped models are offered for 2011 including the first ever diesel hybrid,

the Peugeot 3008 HYbrid4.
This is really a crossover car, combining SUV feature such as four wheel drive with the practicality of a people carrier.

people carrier.

It's stylish, with plenty of load space, flexible seating and CO2 emissions as low as 99g/km, making it exempt from both road tax and the London congestion charge.

By contrast the restyled Chrysler

Grand Voyager is bigger than most other MPVs with almost mini-bus proportions, seating for seven and a reputation for reliability.

The Mazda5 was introduced last year, but the New Year has brought a 1.6-litre diesel model in addition to the petrol options. It is a better drive than most, boasts practical sliding doors and has a dramatic style that will impress the kids and also improve the aerodynamics to help reduce CO2 emissions to just 138g/km - and a yearly road tax charge of £110. Vauxhall's seven-seat Zafira

remains a popular choice due to its flexible and versatile seating system and is being given a facelift this

New engines seem likely to be introduced, possibly including a low-CO2 ecoFLEX version.

Chevrolet are entering the MPV market with the Orlando, a seven-seater with a high roof and a massive 1,487 litres of boot space with the rear seats folded.

It's a large, distinctive looking



vehicle with a 2.0-litre engine and will be available in diesel and petrol versions.

The Toyota Verso S is a stylish, supermini-size MPV with a high roofline to make more space for rear seat passengers. It will come with 1.0 and 1.33-litre engines producing law strategies. producing low running costs and little environmental impact which is probably why there is no hybrid version on the horizon.

Honda, however, has added hybrid technology to its supermini-MPV, aiming it at younger buyers with distinctive colours and fresh design. Low running costs will give it more practicality and space than most similar sized cars.

Evidence

So there is plenty of evidence to support the argument that lower speeds result in lower fuel bills, as well as reduced pollution and improved road safety.

Despite this, the issue is plagued by controversy, with many motorists refusing to accept arguments based on either cost, the environment or road safety.

Locally, the borough council is to introduce 20mph limits in many residential areas after experiments which are claimed to have reduced the accident rate, so drivers are going to have to show some restraint whether they like it or not.





Changes to the tax return for 2011

Once again we have passed the tax return deadline, and we are pleased to say that every client who provided us with their information had their returns submitted on time, even the one who gave us the necessary information at seven in the evening of alst January. However, I am certain that our firm is not alone in having clients who are late because they have not provided us with that information. These people will suffer automatic penalties, but from next year they will that ignoring their tax responsibilities will get even more expensive. expensive.

Currently, no late filing penalty can exceed the tax due on 31st January. Therefore, penalties can be avoided by ensuring that the tax due is paid before this date. From the 2011 tax return, however, the following penalties will apply to late returns irrespective of the tax due:

1. all returns submitted after the due date will suffer an automatic penalty of £100, the due date being 31st October 2011 for paper returns and 31st January 2012 for electronic any return still not submitted after 3 months will receive daily penalties.
 any return still not submitted after 6

months will receive a further penalty of the higher of £300 or 5% of the tax

4. any return still not submitted after 12 months will receive a further penalty of the higher of £300 or 5% of the tax

This will result in some clearly inequitable results, to the extent that some people may suspect that this will be used as a hidden tax rise. For instance, a pensioner who is due a tax refund on bank interest received but to whom the tax office decide to issue a tax return will find themselves facing automatic penalties in excess of £700 if

automatic penalties in excess of £700 if they fail to complete and send in their paper return by 31st October 2012.

But if you think that is inequitable then look at the recent case of "Steed v Regina". In this case the taxpayer, Steed, pleaded guilty to moonlighting and evading tax of £3,558. However, following his conviction the tax office pursued confiscation proceedings under pursued confiscation proceedings under the Proceeds of Crime Act. The tax office argued that he had lead a



criminal lifestyle for at least 6 months, resulting in criminal proceeds of at least £5,000 as the taxpayer would have needed to pay a further £3,558 on account of the following year's tax. The taxpayer recently lost his appeal against the Crown Court's confiscation order. And how much was the confiscation order for? It was the not inconsiderable sum of \$707,200. For the sake of everyone's sanity let us hope that there is more to this case then the headline facts!
