



## Editor's Comment

WHILE I welcome any road safety initiatives, especially ones aimed at reducing speed and saving lives I do wonder about the 20's plenty campaign which is now going to be rolled out across the town over the next three years – at a cost of £740,000.

We have already seen various highways improvements taking place over the years around Warrington, which have included traffic lights being added to roundabouts and then being switched on and off to aid traffic flow and roundabouts being removed totally to be replaced with new junctions, which increase traffic congestion - all at considerable cost.

We even had to endure seeing one set of road improvements on Cromwell Avenue being redone at considerable cost to the local tax

Ás we have a national speed limit of 60mph, which isn't normally sign posted - why can't we campaign for

posted - why can't we campaign for a national speed limit of 20mph on housing estates - thereby saving the costs associated with making and erecting all the signs? Or this that too much like common sense?

If we are going to press ahead with the 20's plenty campaign, which it would appear we are after the council agreed to speed up the implementation, I do hope the signs are introduced with common sense and that money isn't wasted on any and that money isn't wasted on any inappropriate signage on roads which are not even long enough to accelerate up to 20mph.

I have already witnessed some 20

mph signs going up in Great Sankey on roads which are no more than culde-sacs containing three or four properties and only half a dozen vehicle lengths long - erecting signage on roads like this is a complete waste of public money.

There is certainly a need to control

the speed of motorists in some residential areas - but there is also a need for common sense - which does not always prevail when it comes to council's and highway departments.

If I remember rightly Warrington can also boast the uneviable record of having one of the shortest cycle ways in the country! So much for

common sense!

Even cyclists pointed out these cycle ways, which probably cost thousands of pounds to create, were a complete waste of time!

#### Survivor giving victims a voice

A WOMAN who survived years of domestic violence is helping others who have experienced similar problems by giving them a VOICE.

Nicola Holland launched her support group VOICE five years ago at the Longford neighbourhood centre but has now relocated to a new location at Great Sankey.

She suffered five years of domestic violence from the father of her young son before escaping from Liverpool to Warrington eleven years ago.

The support group provides one to one support, sharing of experiences, training and learning opportunities, mentoring and advocacy and a social network with regular events, to name but a few.

Nicola walked out of her home with only a change of clothes for herself and her son who was almost three at the time.

"I left all of my belongings and did not return to the property. The situation had become too dangerous and after planning our escape we fled to a women's refuge. I had tried to escape the night before but my ex partner chased me all around the neighbourhood, I was knocking on peoples doors and screaming for help

but no one came to my aid.

"Eventually he cornered me and said if I didn't come back he would jump all over my head. As soon as we got back to the house he kicked me in the ribcage, which caused severe bruising. I had pain when breathing for months after. He had also head butted me in the face several months previous and I believe my cheek bone may have been

fractured as I had an egg sized lump on it and I could feel hard sharp bits in it and I also had a black eye. He also threatened me with a gun! The violence usually started if I didn't want do what he said or if I had a difference of opinion. I was basically

"I had never been to Warrington before I moved here but I knew I had to leave Liverpool for mine and my son's safety. My ex partner also said he would slit my throat if I ever left him. I went to ground for many years and severed contact with Liverpool informing no one of my whereabouts

except a few close family members.

"I didn't know a single person
when I first moved to Warrington and
felt a great sense of isolation. I also
experienced prejudice from certain people in authoritive positions who seem to think that woman are in some way to blame for suffering domestic violence. During my journey I experienced some posițive and also negative experiences from service providers.

Nicola says it was a very distressing and dangerous time for herself and her young son and believes organisations like VOICE are needed to help those in similar circumstances.

She decided she wanted to use her experiences to help others, doing voluntary work advice training at the citizens advice bureau to get a good basic understanding of the system. She then went on to achieve level 2 in community development work community qualification through the open college network. She learnt how to set up a community organisation on the course and used her skills to set up VOICE. She is currently doing a degree in youth and community work studies.

"Funding is very difficult to sustain

for grass roots organisations and I am not paid for my work, "added Nicola. " Although Kings community centre offer a fair rate for community (III). groups I am constantly filling in tunding applications which are often rejected but I believe there is a need for independent grass roots organisations and I will be undeterred in my plight for social justice against doméstic violence.

"VOICE operates a self help approach, survivors supporting one another, sharing experiences and information. The survivors are the real experts of domestic violence some woman say to me "I don't want to be woman say to me I don't want to be that person the domestic violence victim" they feel the stigma but we don't have to, we can stand together and re-claim our power.

"Domestic violence destroys peoples confidence and self esteem.

suffered panic attacks and depression over the years but I was determined to make a difference. I know a lot of people are still going through domestic violence. When I was in that situation I didn't even know about refuges or how to get in one till someone told me. Obviously there are organisations like woman's aid and refuge that can put you in



touch with the right people if refuge is

an option you are looking at.
"VOICE is also here for any body who wants support or wants to use which wants support of wants to use their voice to make a difference and more voices make a bigger sound. The ultimate goal is for VOICE to have its own centre - like a half way



## 20mph roll-out to be speeded-up!

THE controversial £740,000 plan to roll-out of 20mph speed limits on residential roads across Warrington - originally expected to take 10 years - could be completed in half that time.

Town Hall officers always said that 10 years was a "worst case" estimate and the 20's Plenty for Us group, founded by Lymm resident Rod King, always said such a timescale was unacceptable. But the borough council has decided to double its annual spend on the project to £150,000 to speed up implementation.

The scheme will be prioritised on a population density basis, radiating outwards

from existing 20mph areas in the town centre, Orford and Great Sankey South.

Roads to be considered must be "residential" - there must be 21 or more dwellings on them - and must not be key link roads, primary emergency services routes or primary bus routes.

Officers say a key principal of the project is that greater coverage will encourage respect of the 20mph limit by road users. A motorist who resides in a 20mph area

is more likely to respect and comply with other 20mph speed limits.

Warrington Borough Transport believes it can help improve road safety by persuading more car users to use buses and is concerned that key routes should not become 20mph if this means existing timetables cannot be maintained or improved.

They say routes with four or more buses per hour should be excluded from the

scheme. There is also concern that the optimum speed for the company's fleet of buses is 30mph. Police chiefs say a 20mph limit on some routes would not be logical and could lead to confusion and driver frustration, with more incidents of aggressive overtaking and tailgating. They could not justify enforcement on these roads.

Mr King's 20 for Plenty for Us group is promoting its campaign and encouraging motorists to slow down before the restriction becomes law, by asking residents to display 20mph stickers on their wheelie bins.

The proposed roll out will start in the Bewsey and Whitecross, Orford, Fairfield and Howley and Great Sankey South areas, moving on to Westbrook, Whittle Hall

and other parts of Great Sankey South.

Next in line will be further parts of Great Sankey and Whittle Hall, Lymm, Penketh and Cuerdley, followed by more work in Orford, Poplars, Poulton North, Hulme and Poulton South

Birchwood, Fairfield and Howley, Poulton South, Rixton and Woolston, other parts of Great Sankey, Penketh and Cuerdley and Bewsey and Whitecross will be dealt with next, followed by more work in Birchwood, Rixton and Woolston, Poulton South, Westy, Latchford, Penketh and Cuerdley, Stockton Heath, Hatton, Stretton and

Walton.

Work will then move to remaining parts of Stockton Heath, Grappenhall, Thelwall and Appleton, as well as Lymm, Hatton and Walton.

Culcheth, Glazebury and Croft, Burtonwood, Winwick and more parts of Birchwood, Rixton, Woolston, Westbrook, Whittle Hall, will be dealt with next and finally remaining areas of Culcheth, Glazebury and Croft, Burtonwood, Winwick, Westy, Rixton, Woolston, Lymm, Grappenhall and Thelwall, Appleton, Hatton, Stretton, and Walton will be completed. Stretton and Walton will be completed.





## **Lucky Warrington!**

WARRINGTON is one of the luckiest places to live in the UK for winning on the National Lottery producing 82 jackpot winners over the past 17 years.

With a further 26 residents banking a prize of £50K or more, Warrington features in the top ten luckiest postcodes based on 17 years

of lottery windfalls.
For the first time, the stats have been calculated to include all National Lottery prizes over £50K – not just jackpot wins - and show that it's not just famous Warringtonians Chris Evans and record producer Pete Waterman who have had a lucky break over the years. Amazingly one in 1,428 of adults in Warrington have now pocketed a prize over £50,000 since The National Lottery began in 1994 and residents have taken home over £150. William in prize to date £159 million in big prizes to date.

Liverpool also features in the top ten luckiest postcodes helping to make the North West region one of the luckiest in the U.K. One in 1,425 adults in Liverpool have banked a lottery prize of over £50,000, amounting to more than £266 million in major prizes for the

Romford in Essex tops the poll of

luckiest postcodes in the UK, where one in 1,238 residents have taken home a major prize. The town is followed by the London Borough of Enfield and Dartford in Kent.

The statistics, which include both publicity and non-publicity winners, maps out the top 20 lucky hotspots based on the highest number of major prizes (over £50K) won per adult playing population since the National

Lottery began in November 1994.
A National Lottery spokesperson said: "This is the first time we have included prizes of £50,000 upwards, giving a true snapshot of where the luckiest players are based. Warrington hasn't previously featured in the top ten lucky lottery league table however it's now clear that its residents have been quietly scooping major prizes all round!"

'In truth, with over 2,800 National Lottery millionaires now in the UK and an average of 24 lottery millionaires in each postcode, every part of the UK should consider themselves lucky.





## Collegiate scoops top green award

A WARRINGTON college has scooped a top national green award after reducing its carbon footprint while also saving

Warrington Collegiate has won the Best Sustainability Initiative award at the UK Public Sector Digital Awards 2011, for their work in reducing their carbon footprint, beating stiff competition from NHS, Surrey and Cambridgeshire Libraries

Learning Services.

The Facilities and IT Services departments reduced CO2 in a variety of ways including installing solar panels to harness the power of renewable energy sources." metering systems were also installed which can shut down gas, electricity, water and air conditioning units automatically and recycle energy

wherever possible.

The college also addressed its ICT infrastructure by virtualising over 60 servers replacing 42 old computers. The IT team also completed a desktop virtualisation system which allows the re-use of existing infrastructure for longer, reducing the need to annually replace computers saving energy and smoney. Printers were replaced by lower energy models amounting to a staggering 40% reduction in energy usage. Further savings were also made by the use of software that shuts machines down after 30 minutes of inactivity and removes the restart and logoff options, forcing users to shut down machines at the end of their

Overall the college made a massive reduction in carbon footprint equivalent to reducing CO2 emissions per year by 327 tons, taking 71 cars off the road or planting over 14,000 trees.

The UK Public Sector Digital Awards, held at the Guildhall in London is the UK's most closely withheld subtlice sector to be planting.

watched public sector technology awards, supported by the Prime minister, David Cameron, and recognises excellence and innovation in digital initiatives in national and local government, the NHS, education and the third sector. Locally the college's sustainability programme was recognised at the Warrington Business Awards sponsored by Warrington Guardian by a commendation for Team of the Year 2011.

In a video on video link from Downing Street, the Deputy Prime Minister, Nick Clegg said: "These awards are highly important in celebrating ICT successes across the public sector.



## Late filing penalty... Or so we all thought

Once again, January 31st has come and gone. This has always been a stressful time for accountants and their stresstul time for accountants and their clients, but even more so this year. Previously, no late filing penalty would be charged if there was no tax due. However, this year was different! One major difference this year has been that anyone who fails to send in their tax return on time will be penalised even if there is no tax loss.

Or so we all thought! However, it looks like someone has had second

looks like someone has had second thoughts on this, but decided not to tell anyone until after the deadline had passed. If you have received a tax return and failed to send it back by the due date, and if you feel that you should not have received it, then you can telephone the tax office and if they agree then they will cancel both the tax return and the

penalty.

This is not the same as the normal appeal procedure which requires that you have a "reasonable excuse" for not returning it on time. A reasonable excuse under the normal appeal procedures would include serious illness or death of the taxpayer or a close family member, unexpected postal delays, or a delay on

the part of the tax office to provide required authorisation codes, etc. It would not include the individual considering that a tax return is not required in their particular circumstances.

It is not that we feel that state pensioners whose only other income is all taxed at source, or people receiving no income other than non-taxable state benefits, should be penalised for not sending in an on-line tax return. It is that the old rules would have worked to preclude them from paying a penalty in

any event.

It is, instead, that people should know where they stand and what their obligations are. The current position suggests that the regulation changes were not thought through before they were enacted. It was obvious to anyone closely involved in the system that these relative draconian penalties would affect a considerable number of taxpayers, currently estimated at about 900,000, and that many of these will be similar. cases to those given above. However, if these people can now avoid the penalties by simply telephoning the tax office then this begs two questions:

1. Should not those people in similar

circumstances who have incurred professional fees in submitting their returns on time now be recompensed,

2. What effect will this have on the 2. What effect will this have on the number of late returns in future years if people think that this will be repeated. Would it not have been better to have legislated for these circumstances arising by allowing this process during the tax year, rather than introducing it as a kneejerk reaction once the deadline has

### Town to be a hub for music

WARRINGTON is taking the lead in a bid for £1.2 million funding to create a music education hub - a partnership dedicated to providing young people with opportunities to advance their musical education.

Town Hall bosses have agreed to seek the funding from the government in partnership with the neighbouring borough of Halton.

The creation of music hubs is central to the national plan for music education and if the bid is successful the funding would be provided over the next three years.

Various music organisations would also be involved and would plan and provide opportunities for 5-19 yearolds in the area, including learning to sing or play a musical instrument.

All the partners would share equipment, staff and training to provide learning opportunities at reduced cost.

Warrington and Halton both have a very good track record for music education and have delivered many successful events, including the massed choral events, Children of Halton Sing.

Warrington is well placed to bid for future funding as the Schools' Arts and Culture Service was judged as "Outstanding" through the Federation of Music Services Moderation Programme last year. Halton's success was also validated last year.

Partnerships with local, regional and national music providers are strong and the service has been approached by outside providers wishing to be part of a potential Warrington and Halton Hub.

## Blue bins have just got better

MORE items than ever can now be recycled in Warrington's blue bins.

New materials that can be recycled include shredded paper, aerosols, clean tin foil, Tetra Pak drinks cartons and more types of plastic.

In the past residents could only recycle plastic bottles, but now plastic yoghurt pots, margarine tubs and clean plastic food trays can also be recycled.

The improvements to the blue bin scheme follow a new two year contract between the borough council and recycling firmUPM which could see the council earn £800,000 to reinvest in services for the town.

Cllr David Keane, the council's executive member for environment and public protection, said: "The improved blue bin scheme will enhance the service provided to residents by allowing them to recycle more items than ever before.

"We would like to thank local people for their support of the recycling scheme and urge everyone to make sure all their family, friends and neighbours know about the changes so we can recycle even more in the year ahead.'


