Redundancy and cutbacks

Once upon a time, in a land much different than it is now, I worked for a company which no longer exists, becoming a casualty of the early 1980's recession. Back then, the technology we now take for granted did not exist, we had to make do with comptometers (unknown I suspect to those under 40 years old) to do calculations, computers were big bulky things filling a medium size room, ledgers and accounts were filed on paper, the very thought!

Yet I remember one aspect of that time vividly. Stress was prevalent, whether it was because the company was floundering, or that is how it was generally, I do not know, but at times you could cut the atmosphere with a knife. Directors seemed to totally lack any personality management skills, some of them lacked personality altogether.

I remember scowls and raised voices as the figures did not make good reading. As a youngish lad in those days I found it interesting why people reacted as they did. You may recall my tale mentioned in Hypnotes some years ago, of how one stressful event at that same company lead me to view life, in a totally different way.

The young Mahoney noticed that stress was contagious and it would build and tempers would fray, arguments were common place, especially as month end arrived and the accountants had to explain to the financial director why the figures achieved were not those projected.

In those days, or at least in the environment I worked in (though in fairness sheltered from many issues by protective, mindful colleagues) it was not uncommon for rude language to be slung about, levelled at those who had no impact on the statistics produced or the standing to answer back. Sometimes bullying was near scandalous, but in those days, that was the norm, whereas now something frowned upon, with some aspects now illegal in employment and common law.

I remember seeing grown adults cry due to stress. I worked in offices where some people smoked 40+ cigarettes a day, many people smoked as it was more acceptable then. I saw individuals still drunk from the night before after trying to drown their sorrows, dealing with stress in destructive ways. I knew then, that I didn't want to be in this environment.

Those days have helped to shape my life, I understand the effects of stressful environments, bullying and poor coping strategies. Little did I know then that I would go on to do occupational health, become a clinical hypnotherapist or develop self-help audio programs which help people around the world.

As our economy is destined for a much anticipated, and for some much feared government cutbacks and job losses, I am currently seeing many more people who are facing redundancy, through no fault of their own. Hand on heart, I know of no-one who has been made redundant and not gone on to better things. 

Major upgrades for 1,200 homes

MORE than 1,200 homes across Warrington are to receive major upgrades, including solar heating panels to cut energy bills, modern kitchens and contemporary wet-area style bathrooms.

The improvements will be carried out as part of a 15-year planned maintenance programme announced by Warrington Housing Association.

An annual budget of £650,000 has been allocated for the first five years.

Repairs will be carried out where

necessary but the programme has more ambitious aims, altering the design and layout of properties to create better living spaces.

The solar heating panels use energy from the sun to heat a home's water supply and slash energy bills for the tenants.

Combining new lighting, contemporary wet-area style bathrooms and modern, spacious kitchens, the programme will ensure residents enjoy quality affordable housing.

John Orrell, the association's property services director, said: "We have confirmed an annual budget of £650,000 to carry out necessary repairs across our properties over the next five years.

"We aim to provide quality housing and as such undertake regular maintenance works offering improved designs and layouts for the benefit of our residents. We ensure all work is carried out in a professional, prompt

manner with minimal disturbance to the tenants."

Repair work already carried out by the association has been praised by tenants, with 94 per cent saying they were "very satisfied" with the improvements.

The association operates exclusively in Warrington and has more than 1,200 high quality properties in the town.

It provides, manages and maintains housing for families, single people and retirement housing, as well as specialist accommodation designed for people with particular care and support needs.

Name change for boxing club

A WARRINGTON boxing club has changed its name after moving to a new state of the art gym.

The Phoenix Boxing Club has been renamed the Phoenix Fire ABC after moving to a gym funded by Cheshire Fire Brigade on Winwick Road.

The club recently held an awards night, and marked the help it has been given by Great Sankey Parish Council by launching The GSPC Shield (named after the council).

The shield goes to the Best Schoolboy aged 11 to 13. First winner was Grady James, of Whittle Hall, who previously attended boxing sessions at Whittle Hall Community Centre.

Unholy row over neglected cemetery

A POLITICAL war of words has broken out between two parish councils over improvement works at a neglected Warrington cemetery.

Great Sankey Lib Dem councillor Trudi Wood (right) has accused Penketh Parish Council of attempting to make political gain by claiming it got improvement works carried out at St Mary's Church cemetery.

She claims it was 'distasteful' to make political points scoring out of a sensitive issue.

But Penketh says the cemetery is in

its parish and that Great Sankey Parish Council refused to help financially – even though people from its parish are buried there.

Labour Penketh Parish Coun Linda Dirir criticised Coun Wood for using the improvements to boost her own image in a leaflet used during the May elections – under the headline "Respect Restored to St Mary's

Cemetery."

Meanwhile Coun Wood's complaints are directed at Penketh saying: "We have had a working party liaising closely with Warrington Council, the local church and organisations like the Royal British Legion and War Memorials Trust on various projects at St Mary's Cemetery since June 2009."

She said all work undertaken was instigated by the group which she led, and that Penketh declined to join in.

She refutes Penketh's claim that most of the work was done by Warrington's Look of the Borough Team. She said some work was done by them at her request, but the majority was done by Bereavement Services.

"If Penketh has planted wildflowers they may have placed them in areas cleared by us for other projects, wasting time and money invested. Common sense suggests it would have been appropriate to discuss any activities with the group already established," she said.

"It is distasteful that councillors from Penketh would take credit for work completed by others in such a sensitive public place. Possibly the 2011 elections motivate them?"

But Coun Dirir said the cemetery has been in a poor state for about five years, when it became full and was closed to new graves.



She said the borough council took over responsibility – but there were concerns that because of budget constraints it may be neglected. She said the project was too big to be done by volunteers.

She said Penketh agreed to put some money in to help, but Great Sankey refused. She said it fell into a "dreadful" state after effectively being left as the borough's responsibility.

Coun Dirir said that the Look of the Borough team agreed to work in Penketh, and local people were consulted. It was agreed the cemetery was a priority.

She suggested the future of the site's maintenance should involve four groups making financial contributions – the two parish councils, the borough and the church.




But we can't do that unless we have the people with the necessary skills to fill the jobs of the future."

"I will do all that I can in Westminster to make this point to the Government."

Town set to miss out on superfast broadband

A LARGE part of the borough of Warrington looks set to miss out on superfast broadband connections being rolled out across the UK by telecoms giant BT.

The whole of the town centre, important business areas like Birchwood and outlying areas like Culcheth, Glazebury, Croft, Padgate and Woolston seem likely to be at the back of the queue when BT introduces fibre optic cables enabling 40mb broadband.

Only leafy areas like Lymm, Appleton, Stockton Heath and Grappenhall, south of the Manchester Ship Canal, and Penketh to the west of the town, have so far been earmarked to get the upgrade in about two years' time.

BT has launched a competition,

The Race to Infinity, to decide who gets the faster broadband first. The five telephone exchanges with the highest percentage of votes on December 31 will win the chance to be included in the roll-out - and BT will donate computer equipment worth £5,000 to a local community project.

But Warrington has shown little enthusiasm for the competition - even though the number of people voting more than doubled after *Warrington-Worldwide's* online edition published details last month.

The Culcheth and Padgate exchanges, with much smaller numbers of subscribers, also doubled their vote after we published details.

But towns in the south of England were racing ahead in the poll.

One businessman is urging local people to vote.

Paul Taylor, managing director of the Taylor Business Park at Culcheth, said: "We need the help of local people to put Culcheth and Warrington on the map for high speed broadband."

Many local people said they had never heard of the competition and others dismissed it as a gimmick.

To vote, internet users must go to www.racetoinfinity.bt.com and fill in their postcode and a number of other details.

They will then see how many votes their local exchange has received.

Others at the ceremony included headteacher Martyn Froggett, Warrington North MP Helen Jones and Coun Sheila Woodyatt, the borough council's executive member for education.

Kath O'Dwyer, the council's director of children's services, told the gathering: "Building this school has been a huge team effort and unless you've been involved you won't know how huge."

"It has touched the lives of many people during the time from its inception to its successful completion. Looking at this fabulous community facility today it is easy to see how it will benefit not only current and future pupils but the whole community of Culcheth."

1,600 patients benefit from new clinics

MORE than 1,600 Warrington patients who take the blood thinning medication warfarin no longer need to go to hospital for treatment.

A highly successful pilot programme of community anti-coagulant clinics launched last year at Grappenhall and Westbrook, is being rolled out by NHS Warrington to other parts of the borough.

Patients who take long-term anti-coagulation drugs must be closely monitored, which means that their blood and medication must be checked regularly by a pharmacist

and for many patients this meant weekly trips to the hospital clinic.

More clinics have opened at Birchwood, Penketh and Stockton Heath and a further two are planned at Guardian Street and Orford.

Sarah Baker, director of commissioning for NHS Warrington said: "We're extremely pleased with how successful the clinics have been. We intend to keep listening to what patients want and working with the hospital and GPs to ensure that more people in Warrington are able to receive the care they need closer to home."

Dining Out with **warrington-worldwide**

at Villaggio

SOMETIMES wandering off the beaten track can lead to amazing discoveries.

It may be a bit of an exaggeration to describe Folly Lane, Warrington as "off the beaten track" but when dining out, most people probably head to the town centre or, even more likely, the more leafy suburbs.

In doing so, they are missing out on a little gem. The Villaggio Hotel and Restaurant.

Put simply, this is a quality restaurant offering an impressive range of dishes in spacious, tastefully furnished surroundings.

But it is a lot more than that as we discovered when we dropped in for dinner.

Helpful staff guided us through the intricacies of the huge, mainly Italian, menu and immediately made us feel at ease.

Delicious

We started our meal with soup - one minestrone and one vegetable - and both came steaming hot and delicious.

For our main courses we chose Petto di Pollo alla Grilla - marinated chargrilled chicken breast - and Costolette di Agnello - chargrilled lamb cutlets with roast - both with roast vegetables.

Both were beautifully cooked and presented and came in quantities that were generous but did not overload

the plate.

Tempting

A wide choice of tempting desserts were on offer and the meal represented very good value for money. We noted that for those who wanted even better value a three course set meal was available for £9.95 seven days a week between 12 noon and 7pm.

Villaggio offers a good range of wines - mostly but not all Italian - and also a good choice of beers and lagers.

Importantly there is a good car park - so there isn't really any reason not to visit Folly Lane.



Yanks for the memories!

MORE than 60 years after bidding a fond farewell to the giant Burtonwood airbase at Warrington, Verne Keats took a nostalgic trip down memory lane where he was reunited with toys he made from scrap metal for local children!

Verne Keats, who served at RAF Burtonwood from 1944 to 1945 working in the Signal Maintenance Repair, was also re-united with one of the youngsters who received one of his toy jeeps which is now a family heirloom!

Verne came face to face with John Possthaite for the first time in 65 years during a special reunion at the Burtonwood airbase Museum based at Gulliver's World, Westbrook -

which was once part of the giant RAF and US Army airbase.

Verne recalled how during his spare time he made some toys for the children of Warrington as gifts for Christmas, using pieces of scrap tin he found on the base to create US army trucks and jeeps.

At one Christmas Party a young John Possthaite was one of those lucky enough to receive one of Verne's toy jeeps - which he still treasures to this day after passing it on to his children and grand children!

Verne was able to take a trip down memory lane when he returned for a family wedding and was re-united with John and his toy jeep.

"Little did I know the toys I made more than 60 years ago would still be around today. They have aged better than me," said Verne.

Now examples of the toys and other memorabilia from yesteryear are on show at the Burtonwood Base Museum every Saturday and Sunday from 12.00noon to 4.00pm.

Burtonwood was the biggest US airbase in Europe during the Second World war, providing a base for thousands of American GI's and servicemen and attracted Hollywood legends including Cary Grant and Bob Hope, along with Glen Miller, to entertain the troops.

It is now part of the giant Omega development site.

Legal eagle flying high

She said: "I decided I wanted to progress my career within the legal profession and take on work at a more demanding level. I am extremely grateful to the firm for encouraging and



supporting me in this.

"The status of legal executives and the range of work they can do has increased dramatically in recent years. They are now even allowed to apply to be judges and partners in law firms, which would have been unheard of a few years ago.

Agency chief bids farewell

NORTH West Development Agency boss Steven Broomhead is set to retire as Chief Executive at the end of October 2010.

The decision was announced at the agency's AGM at Manchester's Whitworth Hall and has been taken following the coalition government's decision to disband the NWDA in March 2012.

Redundancies have already been implemented at the Warrington HQ,

with more planned over the coming months.

Chairman Robert Hough said: "Steven has worked tirelessly for the agency and the region. He has made an enormous contribution to the Northwest since his appointment in 2003.

"He is well known and respected across both the private and public sector and has been a fantastic ambassador for both the Agency and the wider Northwest.

"His strong partnership skills have set the foundation for the transition and closure of the Agency and I fully respect and understand his decision to retire at this point."

Mr Broomhead joined the agency seven years ago from Warrington Borough Council, where he worked as Chief Executive for five years, prior to that he worked as principal of Warrington Collegiate.

Commenting on his departure he said: "My departure news should not distract from our messages today. This year's Annual Conference and AGM has highlighted our results achieved for the region in the past 12 months."

"The Agency has remained focused, adapting quickly and efficiently in order to help regional businesses survive and grow. Indeed, the National Audit Office rated the NWDA's response to recession with the highest grade possible, following an independent review.

"The Agency has responded quickly to ever changing economic

climate, as well as acting quickly in the face of natural disasters. I am particularly proud of the Agency's £1 million support package in response to the Cumbrian floods, which could not have been provided by any other organisation. The Agency has built a powerful base for generating private investment in the region, including the Regional International Trade Programme, which has safeguarded 2,300 jobs in just 3 years and provided a return of over £22 for every £1 invested.

"I have enjoyed my time in this role immensely and it has been a privilege to work with so many committed partners and talented staff. The achievements of the Agency are there for all to see. However, I feel the time is now right for me to step down and get a better work/life balance after seven and a half years in a very busy and demanding role. The Agency has a strong executive team which will continue to ensure a smooth transition and closure, working closely with government and our many partners in the region."

He will retain his links with the town as Chairman of Warrington Wolves Rugby League Club.

Mr Broomhead says he has made no decisions about his future.

Meanwhile the agency is working with the UK Department for Business and Innovation and Skills (BIS) to agree future succession arrangements while future management arrangements are made to secure an orderly close down and transition of responsibilities.

Alexandria is ambassador

WARRINGTON'S Alexandria Bickerstaff-Kane is one of four IKEA employees who has flown out to Vietnam to witness first hand the great work funded by the store's Soft Toy campaign.

I feel over the moon to be selected to take part in such an exciting and forward thinking trip. I think I'll find it really insightful to see how the money raised by the campaign is spent and will enjoy sharing the experience with my fellow co-workers on my return."

For every soft toy an IKEA customer buys between October 25 and December 24, IKEA Social Initiative will donate €1 to UNICEF and Save the Children to support the education of the most disadvantaged children.

Since the start of the campaign the proceeds of which have helped improve the lives of more than eight million children in Asia, Africa and Central and Eastern Europe.

Golden Standard for Priestley students

Crest, (Creativity in Science and Technology) is a work based scheme for students aged 11-19. It promotes work related learning and encourages students to develop skills for use in the real world. Having completed the Engineering Education Scheme the students became eligible for the highest Crest award.

Commenting on their success, Tutor Adrian Birchenough said, "Our students put in many extra hours working on the Engineering Education Scheme so their success in relation to the Crest Award is very much deserved."

He added, "The group were set a very complex task from Sellafield Limited but took it all in their stride and were able to impress a string of industry professionals with a truly professional presentation and well written report."



'Cash is king'

One very true saying is 'Cash is King', and there are many businesses which appear to be profitable but which run into problems because of shortage of cash, and many businesses may survive the current recession only to succumb to cashflow problems during the recovery period.

One very common cause of cash shortage within a business is called 'overtrading'. Most companies must spend cash on stock, wages and overheads before they can make a sale and receive some cash back. The more sales that are made then the greater the expenditure required beforehand, and if this cash requirement exceeds the company's resources then the company will not be able to meet its liabilities as they become due.

Even if a business is making a profit, poor business practices can put your cashflow at risk. Look out for:

Poor credit controls – you should always run credit checks on your customers, and ensure that your debt collection strategy is efficient. Make sure that your terms are clearly stated on all orders and invoices, and do show too much hesitancy in enforcing them.

Failure to fulfil your orders - if you don't deliver on time, or to specification, you won't get paid. Implement systems to measure production efficiency and the quantity and quality of stock you hold and produce, and raise separate invoices for separate products. Do not let your customers delay payment for one item if there is a problem with another.

Ineffective marketing - if your sales are stagnating or falling, revisit your marketing plan and ensure that you are getting a return on all of your expenditure. When you acquire a new customer then you should always ask where they got your details.

Inefficient ordering service - make it easy for your customers to do business with you. Where possible, accept orders over the telephone, email or internet. Ensure catalogues and order forms are clear and easy to use.

Poor management accounting - monitor key accounting ratios that will alert you to a possible future cashflow problem or that will prevent you from taking orders you can't handle.

Inadequate supplier management – Always monitor your suppliers. Ensure that they are not overcharging for goods or


services, or taking too long to deliver. Poor control of gross profits or overhead costs - assess where you can cut costs. Consider outsourcing non-core activities such as payroll services. Review your utilities contracts to see whether it is possible to reduce costs by switching tariff or supplier.
