

THE CORRIDORS of power at Warrington Town Hall are once again reverberating around an alleged split in the controlling Labour group.

While the leadership are adament that the split is nothing more than rumour and gossip, a series of leaked emails would suggest otherwise.

Labour had been in the shadows Labour had been in the shadows for five years following a serious split within its own ranks which triggered a reaction from the national and regional offices, resulting in a cull of some senior political figures within the group - and ultimately loss of control. The last thing our town needs during these tough economic times is disharmony amongst those who are

disharmony amongst those who are running our town hall - which despite various cut backs and redundancies is still the largest single employer in the area, pumping millions of pounds into the local economy.

Whatever differences there are within the Labour group and indeed with the opposition councillors, it is time to put them to one side and all work together for the benefit of Warrington.

Local people don't want to see political fall outs and bickering within the corridors of power - they want to see positive action

On the other side of the fence the council has a workforce fearing for its future, with some facing job losses, with others changes in their terms and

conditions of employment. Once again the unions (who only represent a third of the work force) are doing their best to rock the boat, at a time when we we need a steady ship.

While it is indeed an unfortunate consequence that people are losing their jobs and facing pay cuts, it is a sign of the times, not just in Warrington but across the whole

world. Yes the Unions must look after their members and ensure no one is unfairly treated - but they must also realise that we are in difficult times and endeavour to work closely with

those making the tough decisions instead of publicly bashing them.

How do you know if your employees are ripping you off?

PART of Uniqwin services is to employ all the service personnel on a site for our clients starting from the Site Manager, administors, mainten-ance people, security personnel or cleaners. Recently when taking over the employment of personnel on two separate sites we over the employment of personnel on two separate sites we discovered that some highly paid senior employees have been 'Creaming off' cash takings for themselves from their employer, for several years. It was clear that the change in the overall employment and management of the site employees and the review and reassessments that took place, created a situation that 'disturbed' the existing systems. Actions being the existing systems. Actions being used to deceive the employer enabled the criminal activity to take place. Both matters have now been handled appropriately and I have no doubt that justice will provide an appropriate outcome particularly for the two offenders.

The danger for owners, asset and The danger for owners, asset and facility managers are 'complacency'. The assumption that long term employees are totally loyal and honest is usually born out of the fact that they apparently keep things running smoothly without a hitch. This being the case they may feel that such employees do not have to be monitored or audited and sign offs are not taken with due diligence. Allowing people to and sign one are not taken with due diligence. Allowing people to work financial activity without any double checking can be asking for long term problems and losses. Never take anything for granted. Some offenders never like to take lengthy periods of time off for fear that sceneono may uncover their

lengthy periods of time off for fear that someone may uncover their misdeeds. Making employees take two weeks holiday together can save companies from fraud and theft. The summer holiday season is the peak time for detecting fraud as staff take a long break. Alarm bells can start to ring from suspicious bosses and co workers after cheats are obliged to leave their desk. When offenders are away they are not able to cover their tracks so easily. Those thefts and frauds such as accounts manipulation that have been covered over during the course of time can be spotted when their colleagues or new their colleagues or new management take over and notice management take over and nonce that things don't seem quite right or systems are neglected or distorted. There will be times when colleagues, supervisors or managers have suspicions but are afraid to speak up for one reason or another.

or another. Typically the profile of an accounts fraudster would be a long accounts traudster would be a long serving trusted employee who regularly works long hours and does not want to take long periods of any kind of leave of absence even when they are sick. The same person may be reluctant to accept change in the systems being used and will raise all kinds of excuses to keep the status guo. Some keep the status quo. Some fraudsters and thieves would also ensure that would be whistle

blowers are taken care of by reward, bullying, deceit or implied threats. However the clever offender does not involve everyone, working alone reduces the risks. Watch out for those employees who are apparently spending beyond their means, or may have a high debt rate, habitual gamblers, heavy drinkers or with drug addictions, habits that have high cost maintenance. However do not assume that these indications need assume that these indications need

assume that these indications need be apparent in a fraudster. Hiding their weaknesses is part of their skill. So this highlights the ways of identifying signs of fraud or criminal activity and simple anti fraud measures that employers can take. Apart from consecutive two week holidays you should ensure that impromptu and unannounced, in depth audits/checks are carried out occasionally particularly where there are cash transactions involved involved.

Be sure that every detected fraud is reported to the police as this will deter others from being tempted. Give other employees every opportunity to whistle blow and follow their suspicions carefully. Where it seems to be a minor infringement there could be an

underlying major one so don't let people off the hook too easily. Investigate thoroughly any complaint or report of suspicious circumstances. Take time out to speak to employees on a one to one private conversation private conversation, allowing employees the opportunity to voice suspicions in confidence. If need be suspicions in confidence. If need be promise anonymity. Even if you feel there is a bit of character destruction going on, check it out. Sometimes employees only want a good opportunity to whistle blow without repercussions from others. Be wice and aine there there Be wise and give them that opportunity.

Flood relief scheme at park

THE main entrance to Victoria Park Warrington, is to be given a facelift as part of an Environment Agency scheme to reduce the risk of flooding to more than 2,000 homes in the borough.

Experts from the agency organised a consultation meeting with local residents and more than 50 turned up - many with strong views.

As a result, a number of changes were made to the proposals. Among the concerns expressed by

residents were fears that a proposed flood wall could attract graffiti and that too many trees along Knutsford Road would have to be felled.

As a result, the agency improved



the design of the park entrance, with flower beds, grassed areas and additional trees.

The agency is also running a competition for pupils at Latchford St James CE Primary School to design

art work which may be incorporated into the wall

A RESIDENTS' group campaigning to keep a community flat open has been

overwhelmed by public support. The Victoria Park Residents Association (VIPRA) was delighted with the response to their campaign stall to support the local Community Flat on Knutsford Road.

More than 170 people signed the petition to support community facilities in the area, following the announcement by Golden Gates Housing Trust that they are to close theflat. Several people also came forward to volunteer to help support the activities going on in the flat. At the present time there are very

few community facilities in the area, which makes community activity difficult. The flat is the nerve centre of the Victoria Park Residents Association, and as well as the various activities on offer - including computer training, arts and crafts, the credit union, police drop-ins and councillor surgeries - it is a place where people can turn for information and advice.

At an emergency meeting held at the flat Golden Gates remained firm about their decision, citing costs, housing need, the limited space available and a lack of participation as the reasons for their decision. as the reasons for their decision. However, they promised to work with VIPRA officers to find viable alternatives in the area, and support a move to a new different venue. Cllr Maureen McLaughlin (Labour, Latchford West) who helped to

organise the stall, along with local residents and Labour supporters, said: 'What we are most concerned about GGHT have now promised that the little support residents have in the area may be taken away. GGHT have now promised that they will give financial and advisory support to help identify a suitable alternative, and I welcome this approach. However, we need to be approach. However, we need to be sure that any alternative will be acceptable to the local residents. I am currently working with Council Officers to explore all possible alternatives and I am seeking a meeting with Roy Smith, Chair of GGHT Board and Peter Mercer Chief

Executive of GGHT to discuss the decision further

Members of the Kent Street Mission attended the emergency meeting and pledged to support local residents when the new building is open to the public early next year. St Hilda's Mission

have also offered assistance to VIPRA and there may be other alternatives.

Ken Wormald Vice Chair of VIPRA said: "The turn-out and interest was far greater than we had anticipated and it only goes to show that when local people are made fully aware of what they may lose they come forward and show they are still interested".



TOWN Hall chiefs at Warrington are to be asked to mount a full public consultation over the future of more than 840 garages and garage plots which could realise more than £2 million if sold.

The borough council currently receives an income of around £27,000-a-year from the properties but this barely covers the cost of repairs and management.

Officers have put forward a number of options for the future of the properties, including selling them, retaining them as garage sites, using them for affordable housing developments, allotments gypsy/travellers sites.

A report to be considered by the council's executive board states there are 709 garage plots across Warrington but only 272 are currently

In addition, there are 143 garages of which only 52 are let.

At the end of March, there were rent arrears of about £14,000 relating to the properties.

The report indicates that some residents, whose homes overlook garage sites, have extended their gardens into the garage site without permission. Some garage sites are subject to fly-tipping.

Many garages are used for storing property rather than cars - and some may be being used for business purposes.

The executive board will be asked to authorise a full community consultation and request a report, with recommendations on the future of the garages and garage plots following the consultation.

When town was famed for its printing

IT might seem surprising today, that when John Howard, the legendary prison reformer published his iconic book "The State of the Prisons in England and Wales" in 1777, he should have chosen a printer from Warrington.

Wales' in 1/2/, he should have chosen a printer from Warrington. But in fact, at that time, Eyres' Press - publishers of the first newspaper in Lancashire, The Warrington Advertiser - were renowned as quality printers. Major London publishers chose to have their books printed by William Eyres. So Warrington was an ideal place for Howard to settle and he lived in lodgings in Bridge Street while the book was being prepared. The story is told in a new book, "The Curious Mr Howard" by Tessa West

(Waterside Press).

John Howard was indeed "curious." He became a self-appointed inspector of prisons, travelling the country, mostly alone, and arriving unannounced at prisons and making notes of the conditions he found.

His period in Warrington probably offered him some respite from his frequently dangerous travels which were often completed on foot.

He was able to mix with the circle of intellectuals centred on Warrington Academy, which at that time had become known as "the Athens of the North."

His friends included the writers John Aikin and his sister Anna Laetitia Barbauld both who were later honoured by having Warrington streets named after them.

The book details how Howard would spend long days at Eyres' printing room, "with the exception of the dinner hour when he took his usual daily walk into the suburbs of the town, eating as he walked his frugal dinner of bread and dried fruit.

William Eyres chose one of his staff, Daniel Grimshaw, as Howard's compositor and the two became friends, so much so that later, when the prison reformer was compiling a second edition of "The State of the Prisons" Grimshaw, having left Eyres' employment, was called back from London to do the work.

Howard, of course, gave his name to the UK's oldest penal reform charity, The Howard League

Tessa West's book paints a fascinating picture of his life, in Warrington and elsewhere, and as a former head of a prison education department who has worked for the United Nations Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice Department, she brings a wealth of knowledge to the subject.

Sporty - but 'sensible'



EARLIER this year, the 100,000th Audi A1 rolled off the assembly line - a considerable achievement for a model only introduced in the middle of last year. The A1 is Audi's most compact model at 3.95 metres (just under 13ft) in length but it packs a lot into the space and with its powerful engines and agile chassis is one of the sportiest cars in its sector. Yet, at the same time, among a clutch of awards it has won are two for "the most sensible car"

Yet, at the same time, among a clutch of awards it has won are two for "the most sensible car." There's a choice of six four-cylinder engines, three TFSI engines and three TDI units. All impress with exemplary fuel economy, ranging from 39.87 to 61.90mpg.

Out of the blue – a new colour for a new car!

BLUE is the colour most drivers would choose for their car if they had a choice, closely followed by silver and black, according to a poll of nearly 16,000 AA members.

Brown, gold and yellow were the least popular colours – but these days, quite a few drivers end up with a colour that would not have been their first choice anyway.

their first choice anyway. Perhaps surprisingly, younger drivers seem to have a preference for black. One in three 18-34 year olds would pick a black car if they had a choice but only one in six actually has a black car.

Just 13 per cent of 18-34 year olds would pick a silver car, yet 22 per cent have one.

Overall, a desire for silver can be satisfied, with 22 per cent of the entire sample wanting a silver car and 25 per cent having one. The same goes for red, blue and white, although the 208 brown car owners [1 per cent] must be the most frustrated as almost no-one wants one (0.27 per cent].

(0.27 per cent). Silver is the favourite of the greyhaired driver, being the number one choice of AA members aged 55-64 (23 per cent) and 65 and over (30 per cent). It is a desire they satisfy, with the highest proportion of 55-64 year olds having one [25 per cent] and also those aged 65 or more (31 per cent).

One of the attractions of silver is the

feeling that it is by far the easiest to keep clean. Some 27 per cent of survey respondents believe it is the colour that shows dirt the least. Gold, yellow, green and white cars were voted the least easy to keep clean

voted the least easy to keep clean. When it comes to selling a car, AA members consider that there are only two clear contenders for most saleable colours: silver (28 per cent) and black (15 per cent). Once again, the youngest drivers favour black (21 per cent) but AA members aged 25 or more increasingly bet on silver to sell first.

AA president Edmund King said: "Brighter coloured cars, which have been popular in the past when the economy was more buoyant, seem to have slipped way down the league. The results show a discrepancy between desired colour of choice and actual colour of car as often the owner may not have a choice.

"For younger drivers that hanker after black cars but end up with lighter-coloured ones, there is a silver lining in that if they hang on to them they will grow to prefer them.

they will grow to prefer them. "Whilst blue was the colour more drivers wanted to own, silver clearly tops the league when it comes to the car colour most likely to sell quickly, most fashionable and easiest to keep clean."



WARRINGTON Wolves' legend Mark Forster is set to pull on the GB jersey again to face the Pakistan national team in their first ever international. New rules for late submission of tax returns

The first penalties under the new rules for late submission of tax returns will come into effect at the end of October.

Under these new rules, paper tax returns must be submitted to the tax office by 31st October in each year. Any paper return submitted after that date will receive an automatic penalty of £100. Unlike previous years, this penalty does not depend on any tax being due. It can, however, be avoided by ensuring that any return submitted on or after 1st November is submitted electronically, in which case the former deadline of 31st January still applies. There is even worse news if the return

is still not submitted within 3 months of the deadline. If you file a paper return after 31st January, or an electronic return after 30th April, then this fine of £100 will increase by £10 per day up to about £1,000.

Remember, these are automatic penalties and apply to anyone submitting a tax return after 31st October if they submit it on paper, or 31st January if they do so electronically.

The next question, of course, is - Who must submit a tax return. The short answer is – Anyone who has received a notice from the tax office requiring them to do so. The tax office have issued a list of those people to whom this should apply. It includes the obvious people like people in self employment and directors, as well as people receiving investment income. One other category, however, are pensioners receiving total income in excess of a certain limit, currently £24,000.

Besides these, however, are those who may once have been within the self assessment categories but no longer, ie because they have retired. Whilst the tax office has attempted to remove these people from the self assessment system they have not always been successful in

doing so. Our advice is that unless you are certain that a "notice to complete a tax return" has not been issued either to you or your elderly relative then you should contact the tax office on 0845 900 0444 to find out. If you are calling on



behalf of someone else then do so in their presence and they should be prepared to answer some security questions.

Remember, if the tax office have issued a return to someone then it is the responsibility of that person to complete that return and send it back, otherwise they will face substantial penalties if it is not sent back within the time limits.

Briers said: 'Having played Rugby League all my life, I can't imagine what it must be like to have a body that doesn't work properly and have to watch from the sidelines which is why I want to do all I can to help girls with Rett Syndrome. Andy is not only a great friend but is an absolute inspiration to me and to everybody who knows him. With his drive and determination I'm sure the charity will go from strength to strength and if I can do my little bit, hopefully we can get awareness about Rett Syndrome out there.
