"I am feeling pretty good at the moment and looking forward to next season already. Winning the

He also revealed that if he feels the same next year he would consider extending his playing career with the Wolves.

In presenting Morley with his Player of the Year Award Head of Coaching Tony Smith heaped praise on his skipper describing him as a true professional and a good leader.

"He has been a credit to the club both on and off the field and seems to be getting younger ever year!" said Smith. TL.

Motivation

EACH morning come rain or shine I take a walk of about a mile and a half, it helps me plan and prepare for the day, the exercise does me good, I feel better after it, and yet sometimes there is a search for a reason not to do it, especially if it is a cold, dark, wet and windy morning, or if I have a really busy day in front of me. But I found the solution to this, and it was quite simple. I merely break the walk down into chunks in my mind. For example, on those reluctant mornings, I don't think about the total journey, think about getting to the pedestrian crossing just 300 yards away from my home. I know by the time I reach that pedestrian crossing I will be warm, in my stride and the welcome effects of natures own feel good chemicals will be pumping through me.

This approach of breaking tasks down and new learning into chunks works well for me, and for others I work with too. However we have to make sure our motivation is not sabotaged by impatience. Motivation is about making change, achieving different things in our life, but if we don't structure our motivation, very soon our desire for change will ebb away, and then we can fall into regret, guilt, despondency and other negative thoughts, and simply return back to the old thought patterns of ' can't change and this is my lot'.

I have to say, those thoughts are flawed. It doesn't have to be like that. Because each and every one of us can make changes to our lives, we decide what we want to achieve, we decide how much effort we are going and how much effort we put into building our motivation too. We simply cannot blame others, or circumstances for how things are, because we know deep down, if we want them enough, really, really enough we can find a way to achieve them.

First we have to have a clear goal; we then have to structure our journey to be able to achieve that goal. Some steps in that journey may be bigger than others, and if they are, we can break them down further into even smaller steps.

Bus company worthy winner!

AN independent survey of bus users in Warrington has shown the town's bus company was a 'worthy winner' on a national award.

Bus Users UK's, the independent bus passenger representation organisation, carried out a bus users' surgery at

Warrington Interchange recently. The feedback confirmed that Network Warrington was a worthy winner of the Bus Company of the Year award in last year's UK Bus Awards.

Bus surgeries are organised around Bus surgenes are organised around the country giving bus users the chance to tell the people responsible for running their services what they think. A spokesperson for Bus Users UK said: "It's not unusual for some people to give compliments, but as our

surgeries are seen as a chance to air grievances we hardly expected that more than 30% of the comments would be compliments: which was indeed the case at Warrington!

"In particular people commented on the efforts made to ensure bus interiors are kept clean, and many thought drivers were polite and helpful too. One disabled lady described the easy access buses now on virtually all Network Warrington services as a 'lifeline' and one couple who had always gone everywhere by car until they got their free bus passes recently were delighted with the bus service."

By far the largest thing most people wanted to see changed was the level of service in the evenings. While services on most main routes are frequent during the day, they drop down to much lower frequencies from about 6pm onwards, which people felt limited their opportunities to go out in the evening. This change to the pattern of services is not peculiar to Warrington, and is something that affects bus users throughout the country.

Around 100 local people came by to give their views and there were no issues to give any overriding concern about the bus service in Warrington. They were able to talk to managers from Network Warrington, Halton Transport, Arriva and Warrington Borough Council. Charlie Shannon, Operations



Search for family of war hero

DESCENDANTS of a Warrington serviceman who was killed during the First World War are being sought.

Jonathan Burrows, of Heworth, York, is trying to contact any descendants of George Brough, son of Walter and Sarah, late of The Grange, Fearnhead,

Warrington. Private George Brough died in action in Belgium in August 1917. Mr Burrows said: "I have a newspaper report of my Great Uncle, William Burrows' death, which states he was killed by shell fire with four other men, one of them being George Brough. The men are buried side by side in Derry House Cemetery No.2 just outside Wytschaete, Belgium and were all members of the 18th Battalion, The Kings Liverpool Regiment


Masons provide gift to school

VICTIMS of trauma supported by the charity formed after the IRA bombing on Warrington which claimed the lives of two young children commemorated One World Peace Day with their own personal views on life after tragedy.

The group, named Steps Towards Empowerment and Positive Survival (STEPS), is made up of former soldiers, victims of bombings, bereaved families, emergency service workers and others still suffering the effects of trauma as a result of terrorism and conflict in the UK and abroad.

Supported by the Tim Parry Johnathan Ball Foundation for Peace, launched following the terrorist attack on Warrington in March 1993, STEPS launched a self help booklet titled Life after Trauma on One World Peace Day onSeptember 21. STEPS was formed by the

STEPS was formed by the Foundation in 2006 and the Foundation supports its efforts to raise awareness about the effects of trauma.

The booklet aims to assist people affected by trauma, bereavement and physical and psychological injury to take a positive approach to their journey of recovery.

We also wanted people to know that there is 'life after trauma'.

A former paramedic who was medically retired from his local Ambulance Service due to ongoing Post Traumatic Stress Disorder said of the booklet; "I wish I'd had this four years ago, it would have made such a difference to my life". John Kabia, from the Foundation said: "We've supported STEPS to create this booklet and make sure it create this booklet and make sure it att out to those who need it. We feel

We feel the booklet is unique as it is written by victims for other victims and so provides a different perspective to other literature available. Our work with STEPS is part of a wider programme called "Survivors for Peace" which encourages those affected by conflict and terrorism to transform their experiences and use them in a positive way."

Offenders help create baby garden

TEAMS of offenders are helping to make a dream come true for a Warrington woman who has campaigned to help ease the minds of others like herself who have suffered a miscarriage.

Julie Walsh's determination, plus the backing of council staff and volunteers and the probation service, has led to the creation of a special garden of remembrance at Walton Leg crematorium in Warrington.

The offenders, supervised by Cheshire Probation Area, are currently preparing the ground at the councilowned crematorium where the Baby Garden will be opened later this year. When completed, the garden will provide parents who have lost babies and young children with somewhere to sit in peace and tranquility.

The project is close to Julie's heart as she suffered three miscarriages at different stages of pregnancy, the last being in July, 2007. It was then that she realised that the

It was then that she realised that the crematorium, unlike Warrington Borough Council's two other cemeteries, had nowhere set aside for such a remembrance garden.

With support from nurses and

bereavement officers at Warrington Hospital, Karen Dalton, co-ordinator of the Miscarriage Association in Chester, and others Julie pursued the matter with vigour, and her campaign rapidly gathered momentum.

"The hospital acknowledged that something needed to be done when losses occurred in less than 20 weeks, and have been very supportive," she said. "I am not religious but I felt there bauld be

"I am not religious but I felt there should be somewhere to acknowledge the loss of my baby. I decided I would not rest until my little boy's name was put on a plaque." Julie approached Neil Simpson,

Julie approached Neil Simpson, the council's bereavement services manager, who revealed that he had been considering the provision of such a facility and so backed her plans to the hilt.

Julie had the idea of enlisting the help of Cheshire Probation Area, and Unpaid Work Placement Manager

Elaine Hamlett i m m e d i a t e l y concurred that it would be an ideal project for offenders sentenced by the courts to carry out unpaid work.

Plans were drawn up, and a £12,500 bequest from a local woman to improve the crematorium in any way was used to help meet the cost. The groundwork was overseen by Bob Sutcliffe, the council's cemeteries officer, who had carried out similar work at the two cemeteries, and the rest of the preparatory work is now underway.

The footpaths have been marked out and in the coming weeks they will be surfaced, benches provided and a stone feature placed in the centre of the garden.

"I have worked with the probation service in the other cemeteries and know what a good job they do," said Neil.

"I am really proud of all that has happened and I am so grateful to everyone who has played a part," said Julie.

A group called Friends of the Baby Garden has been formed, with Julie at the helm, and also comprising representatives of all the interested parties. The group will advise bereaved parents on what can be placed in the garden. As she watched the garden taking

As she watched the garden taking shape Julie, who gave birth to a daughter, Eleanor, in July, 2008, said she hoped that it would be ready for use in about three months' time.

"My son David was cremated here in October, 2007, and it would be nice to think that the garden would be ready for the second anniversary of that."

Assessment of IR35

In the current economic climate more people are moving in and out of contracting, so we are looking again at the issue of IR35. This antiavoidance legislation applies where
personal services are being

- personal services are coming supplied, and
 there is a third party between the contractor and the supplier, and
- without that third party the supplier would be an employee of the contractor

The financial effect of falling inside the IR35 legislation is massive. It is estimated that a contractor caught by IR35 will typically receive 20% less in their take-home pay. There are three major factors which, although not exhaustive, must be considered during an assessment of IR35:

Control & independence

How much control is exercised by the contractor over how the project is run? Can they, for instance, make decisions about the timing of particular tasks or what equipment is to be used? If the contractor exercises this form of control then IR35 may apply. However, if these controls do not exist then IR35 cannot apply.

Subsititution

IR35 applies to the provision of personal services. The right of substitution, ie could another person be sent in your place to provide the service, means that the supply is not personal services, and IR 35 cannot apply. It is the right of substitution that is important, not whether substitution actually occurs. However, recent cases have emphasised that the right must be real.

Mutuality of obligation

Is there an obligation that the individual will be paid whether there is work or not? If you are self-employed and there is no work available then you would be sent home and would not be paid. An employee, however, can expect that he will be provided with work and will be paid, ie there is



a mutual obligation between the two parties. Absence of a sufficient mutual obligation means that IR35 cannot apply.

Failure to account for tax under IR35 can lead to penalties and interest if it later transpires that IR35 applies. However, if it doesn't then you may be paying too much tax and it would be very unwise to rely on being told this
