Bid to make town's roads safer

WARRINGTON'S award winning bus company has launched a new safety campaign aimed at making the town's roads safer.

Warrington Borough Transport has launched its "Making Warrington Move safely" campaign in association with Tail Guardian.

It is the first in a series of initiatives aimed at improving road safety across the borough and beyond and involves fitting the entire fleet of buses and ancillary vehicles with the special Tail Guardian warning device.

Involves triting the entire fleet of buses and ancillary vehicles with the special Tail Guardian warning device. David Squire, Managing Director at WBT explained the brightly coloured vinyl sticker is fitted to the rear of the bus and attracts the attention of any driver following the bus, the closer you get to the bus, the message changes to read "pull back".

He said: "The device is designed to reduce the number of accidents where a vehicle runs into the rear of the one in front and is a trigger to keep further back. As a responsible bus company, we play our part in helping to keep the roads of Warrington safe, and we are delighted to be fitting this proven concept to our vehicles." Inventor and owner of Tail Guardian, Kenny McMillan, added that the device uses a special printing technique designed to change the message when the following driver triggers the two-second rule recommended by the Highway Code as a safe distance to follow the vehicle in front.

Councillor Alan Litton, Lead Portfolio Member, added: "The Council is keen to work with its partners to ensure the safety of travellers in Warrington on their journeys. The council supports the Tail Guardian initiative by Warrington Borough Transport as it can make a significant contribution to improving road safety by educating drivers of a safe distance to travel behind other vehicles".

The Tail Guardian won the BRAKE Fleet Safety Product of the Year in 2009, and has been adopted by an increasing number of fleet operators, including Stagecoach Group's motorway coach fleet; Fife Police and the Bethell Group.

But after October, Forshaws Davies Ridgway (FDR) will be one of the few in the area to have retained the right to provide subsidised advice on divorce, separation, co-habitation or family finance. finance.

to continue to offer this essential service to families in crisis. She said: "Many families rely on legal aid to fund essential legal

legal aid to fund essential legal work to manage the fall-out from separation and divorce, particularly where children are involved." It involves both sides meeting face to face, with their collaborative lawyers, to agree a way forward. 

Andy said: "I would like to thank Andy said: "I would like to thank everyone from the Wolves for supporting this cause. They have been fantastic. "Beth has been our inspiration and hopefully all the money raised will help accelerate a cure for this dibilitating condition." Rett Syndrome is a debilitating disorder which most often strikes previously healthy little aids just after

previously healthy little girls just after they have learned to walk and say a few words and begins to drag their development backwards. They lose acquired skills, normal movement and speech. Girls are left

unable to communicate or use their hands to hold, carry or manipulate objects

Over time, girls who have learned

to walk often lose that ability as well. Loss of motor control sets in, essentially locking these girls into bodies that won't work, leaving them without the ability puroposeful movements. to make

Complications are many, including: Disordered breathing, severe digestive problems, difficulty eating, chewing and swallowing, orthopaedic abnormalities such as scoliosis and fragile bones, disrupted sleep patterns, extreme anxiety, seizures, impaired cardiac and circulatory function, Parkinson-like tremors and sudden and unexplained death

Most girls with Rett Syndrome survive into adulthood, becoming increasingly more disabled over time. Invariably, they need one to one, 24 hour a day care for the rest of their lives. For families living with Rett



Syndrome, the prognosis has always been poor, until the reversal experiments of 2007 catapulted the disorder into new realms of possibility, positioning Rett Syndrome to become the world's first curable brain disorder.



Glass researcher seeks help

A COLLECTOR of pressed glass is seeking the help of Warrington people in researching the history of the Orford Lane Glass Works which is believed to have closed some time between 1895 and 1900.

Thomas Joyce, aged 50, from Dublin has set up his own website on pressed glass and has gathered a great deal of information about the Orford Lane works, which became the Alliance Box Company work in 1900.

But he has run into a brick wall over the exact date of the glass works closing

Orford Lane Glass Works was founded by Thomas Glazebrook (1780-1829) who was an influential figure in the Lancashire Association of Flint Glass Manufacturers.

The works changed ownership several times over the years, first by Glazebrook going into partnership

with Thomas Robinson for the period 1829-1832.

Robinson continued on his own until 1855, although for a time he was in partnership with William Warburton. In 1855, he went into partnership with Edward Bolton.

It was Robinson who introduced the pressed glass process - invented in the united States in 1825 - at Orford Lane and the company has great success with a pattern called the

Empress Dish. Edward Bolton became sole owner

Edward Bolton became sole owner of the glassworks in 1869. But for two years from 1875 Bolton, his son George and George Wood ran the company as a partnership. Then until 1885, Edward Bolton appears again to have been sole owner. sole owner.

An engraving of the works in 1855 is said to have shown at least four furnaces working, which is an indication that it was a works of reasonable size. From 1885 to 1892 the company

was known as Edward Bolton and

There was a family connection in Australia and for a time glass made in Warrington was sold and exhibited "Down Under."

The history of the Orford Lane work becomes hazy after 1892. Edward Bolton died in 1899.

Mr Joyce started collecting pressed glass in 1999 but has only one example of a piece made at the Orford Lane works.

English pressed glass has become collectable since the last works in the country - Pyrex at Sunderland -closed in 2007.

Message from our Chief Executive

Welcome to the second edition of Peace Talks 2010. In this issue you can read about the international aspects of our work as well as some of the programmes we have run closer to home.

In July we hosted two international groups, one with an organisation called 'Combatants for Peace', which is an organisation that consists of former members of the Israeli army and Palestinian armed groups who have all

decided to renounce their weapons. The group use theatre to spread their message of peace, employing a technique known as 'forum theatre' that was first developed by the Brazilian theatre director Augusto Boal as part of the approach he named 'Theatre of the Oppressed'. The group re-enact actual scenes from their own lives. During their time at the Centre the group facilitated a workshop, in which some of our Survivors for Peace participants took part, followed by an open evening where they showcased their performance.

In the last week of July the Foundation ran an International Youth Programme which brought together young people from Israel, Palestine, the Basque region of Spain, South Africa, Ireland and England. The theme was 'living in divided communities' and enabled participants to examine and approach conflict in alternative ways rather than use violence. Guest speakers, including Professor Paul Rogers from Bradford University, Moazzam Begg, Camilla Carr and Jonathan James, enriched the week long residential programme with their experiences. You can read more about this on page 4 and 5.

Closer to home, we have successfully completed the delivery of our 'Full On' programme which is aimed at young people aged 14-16 who are at risk of disengaging from social and educational opportunities. The Foundation over-achieved its outcomes for this programme and you can read more about this on page six.

We also highlight the open evening held by our REACH participants to showcase their achievements and to recruit young people for next year's programme. The group worked really hard to put the open evening together and it was a great success. Read more about this on page 3.



Annual Peace Lecture 2010




The Foundation held its annual Peace Lecture in March and were delighted that Jack Straw, then Justice Minister in the previous government, accepted our invitation to be guest speaker. Having previously been Leader of the

House of Commons, Secretary of State for the Foreign and Commonwealth Office and Home Secretary, Jack Straw has significant experience of conflict at domestic and international level.

Under the heading "Using Power Properly", Mr Straw spoke about his experience of the rule of law, both in high level international negotiations and as Foreign Secretary, in establishing a legal framework in communities that support people who wish to go about their lives peacefully. Chairman of the Foundation, Colin Parry, said: "His speech gave an interesting insight into the issues facing politicians when making decisions on conflict and peace building at both national and international level. The evening was very interesting and we appreciated Jack Straw's honesty when answering questions".





The REACH Programme

REACH is a programme run in partnership with the Warrington Wolves Foundation and together we are working with young people throughout Warrington who are at risk of exclusion from education, employment or training. The first group of participants began working with the two Foundations in February and is now half way through the programme.

The project equips participants with a range of skills and knowledge to help them take positive steps towards improving their current situation and enhance their future prospects. Participants work towards an Open College Network Certificate and study areas such as conflict resolution; prejudice and discrimination; self awareness and identity; understanding young people, law and order; teamwork and communication skills; sport, art and media.

In September we begin working with our second group of young people as current participants move into the second phase of the project which will see them develop and participate in a number of community projects: some young people have already begun to offer valuable contributions through hosting guests at our recent open evening, producing art works for display at the Halliwell Jones Stadium, volunteering at the Wolves primary tag rugby tournament, representing the project at the Youth Carnival and assisting with summer activity camps and events. "I really enjoyed volunteering at the Youth Carnival and it was really good explaining and showing people what we have all accomplished on the REACH project."

REACH Open Evening

Reach project staff and participants hosted an open evening at the Halliwell Jones Stadium to highlight the achievements of the young people and provide further insight into the project. The evening was well attended by a wide selection of people varying from participants and their parents to local community organisations, Foundation trustees and local councillors. A film about the project was specially produced for the event and participants hosted interactive activities including problem solving activities, challenges and guided tours. All the young people involved in the event did an excellent job of promoting their project and impressed visitors with their knowledge, commitment and progression.



Youth Carnival

On Sunday 18th July the Foundation was involved in the Warrington Youth Carnival at Queens Garden. This event was designed to celebrate and showcase the positive activities and achievements of young people across the town and the Foundation was pleased to acknowledge the achievements and successes of the young people engaged in our programmes.

Participants from the REACH project volunteered their time to promote their learning, experiences and successes and worked to actively engage other young people in problem solving tasks and challenges to demonstrate simple conflict resolution skills.

REACH participant, Hannah Rustage, said, "I really enjoyed volunteering at the Youth Carnival and it was really good explaining and showing people what we have all accomplished on the REACH project. I'm glad I volunteered because it was a very good experience."







The International Programme - Exploring Pathways to Peace

A programme that began as a seed in the mind of the Parry's over 10 years ago, was finally realised as the International Youth Programme – 'Exploring Pathways to Peace. From 26th – 31st August, 24 participants and 7 leaders from across the world, joined together at the Peace Centre in Warrington to embark upon this intense and dynamic journey of learning. Participants from England, Ireland, South africa, the Basque region of Spain, Palestine and Israel met and took part in activities ranging from formal lectures to interactive team games.

The programme was designed to take things up a notch for these participants. There was a strong focus on recruiting people who already had a committment to peace building and who were interested in, or already working to, influence change in their communities. respective The programme was designed to enable participants to increase their own awareness and understanding, as well as providing tools, models and theories to assist them in analysing and transforming their own situations of conflict. Whilst the ingredients of the programme were carefully planned content was often changed and altered to adapt to the needs of the group,

something which is key to any successful programme.

Programme Manager Kelly Simcock said: 'The programme was a huge success. This is the first time that we brought young adults from so many different countries together at one time to explore peace building. There was of course conflict and opposition between participants at times – you don't invite people from some of the most volatile regions of the world and not expect there to be some conflict. This was anticipated, managed and useful in terms of developing a shared understanding and empathy of peoples' positions and situations'.

Everything was useful and relevant, because everything we did and were exposed to had valuable, important and inspirational lessons. Tumi, South Afica







Mohammed Saed aged 20 yrs from Palestine

In July 2010, I had the opportunity to represent Palestine and the Palestinian people and share the Palestinian experience, within the world of education, culture and traditions of the ongoing conflict between the Palestinian people and Israeli people through an International Youth Programme-"Exploring Pathways to Peace."

Before I arrived, I had no real knowledge of England, Ireland, South Africa and the Basque Region; but my opinion of the Israeli group was shaped by my past and present experience. I was expecting the Israeli participants to be exactly like those I had already been in contact with (check points, IDF) in my daily life.

Amongst the sessions were speakers and lectures. The lecturers were politicians, prisoners kidnapped in Chechnya, a soldier who was involved in Iraq, the mayor of Warrington, and Moazzam Begg who was held in Guantanamo Bay for three years. Every speaker said his/her point of view and how to live in peace. It was amazing to get an insight into their experience, especially the Palestinian group because we are still in conflict and should listen to them if we are to find a solution.

I listened to Moazzam Begg because his story was similar of the conflict in Palestine. His message was that we need to forgive in order to move on and thatprogress cannot take place if resentment always stays within you. I really appreciated his words. He couldn't move on until he learned to forgive through non-violent actions. He finished his speech by saying, "Never let your oppressor be your teacher."

Throughout the week, many activities were arranged; all of them having meaning as well as being fun. I really enjoyed them.

Another activity was our visit to the Picasso-Peace Freedom Exhibition in Liverpool. Picasso's history and works are amazing. Peace Freedom reveals Picasso as a politically, socially engaged artist, actively involved in politics and the peace movement during the Cold War. His paintings reflected the conflict; they have deep meaning as symbols e.g. "Dove of peace," which is a symbol of hope in the Cold War period; so Picasso was fighting for peace through his paintings.

In conclusion, I really got a lot from this programme; it was an informative week. Now, I know about traditions and the culture of each country. Hearing about the conflicts of others and sharing opinions and ideas with others, makes you aware of what is happening around you. I think what happened in the programme, whether it was a game, discussion or lecture, gave me a chance to participate in paving the peace road and planting the seed of hope again for my family, colleagues, friends and Jewish neighbours. It's difficult, but we must forgive to make our dreams become true. Something else that I took from the week is that human needs and rights should be an entitlement of every single human being. This needs to happen in a way that everyone can benefit - without the dehumanization of anyone. We all have a role to play in making this happen. Now, is the time to work for peace, and spread the message in every country – it will take a long time, but we should never give up!

Full On

The Foundation has come to the end of its Learning and Skills Council contract to deliver the Full On programme across Warrington and Wigan. Between January 2009 and August 2010, we have run 18 courses and worked with 152 young people who were at risk of disengaging from education.

The *Full On* programme is a series of Conflict Resolution and Citizenship courses aimed at young people in Key Stage 4 to enable them to develop the skills and understanding necessary to become more effective citizens, with the ability to approach conflict in a non-violent manner. This programme works with disaffected young people at risk of permanent disengagement from education and social exclusion to tackle areas of conflict in their lives, remove barriers to learning, and promote social and practical skills. The *Full On* courses offer intensive, individual support to 'hard to reach' groups and aim to maintain the engagement of young people by facilitating their access to learning, personal development, achievement and progression, and by assisting their transition to further education or training.

During this contract the Foundation has exceeded all targets and has made a long lasting contribution to the positive personal development of many of our learners.

The project also enabled participants to gain self confidence and improve their ability to achieve previously unachievable targets in behaviour, attitude and engagement in education. This has resulted in 87% of learners being retained in education after the completion of their programme.

Peer Mentoring & Community Work Placement



As part of the REACH programme, the Foundation is exploring various ways in which the young people can receive mentoring from people and organisations across Warrington. The aim of mentoring is to raise the aspirations of young people in order for them to achieve their potential and through this, raise their levels of engagement and employability.

Various mentoring options are being provided to ensure that all young people will be involved in positive activities and will develop positive working relationships in an environment which suits their individual needs.

The Foundation has linked into the Warrington Wide Mentoring Programme to develop a formal 'External Mentoring Programme' in which volunteers will

facilitate fortnightly one-to-one mentoring sessions with some of the REACH students. This form of mentoring will encourage students to set targets for personal development and achievement and will provide motivation and support for them to attain these targets.

Throughout this process, positive relationships will be developed based upon trust, honesty and mutual respect. The mentors will receive full training and will be supported throughout their involvement in the project.

In addition, community work placements and volunteering opportunities will be provided to enable the REACH students to gain valuable work experience, develop relevant workplace skills, and allow them to 'give back' to the community. Throughout the community work placements the students will receive informal mentoring and guidance from staff within the workplace to raise aspirations for their future careers. Work placements will initially take the form of one afternoon per week over a number of weeks to be decided in consultation with individual employers.




and Palestinian armed groups,

Exploring the War on Terror

In May, the Survivors for Peace programme held a day event to look at the global context of the 'War on Terror'. Building on the success and interest in similar events exploring the conflict in and about Northern Ireland, this day event was a chance for people to explore what we understand about the conflict and to gain a greater insight into the issues and who is involved. Professor Oliver Ramsbotham from the Centre for Conflict Resolution at the University of Bradford presented an impressive overview of what is a very complex and deep-rooted conflict. His insight helped participants to start to unravel the layers and think about the history behind the conflict and to look at the actors and issues involved.

The programme also heard from three people who had been impacted by the 'War on Terror'. They each spoke about their experiences and reflected on what they believed the conflict is about. The speakers included 7/7 Survivor Susan Verghese and Muhammed Ali Ghori, a former Trustee of the Foundation, who talked about the impact for him as a British Muslim. The final speaker was Warrant Officer Lutha Magloire, who talked about his experiences serving in Iraq and as an Army Community Liaison Officer in the North West of England.

Programme Worker Rosie Aubrey said: "This was a really important opportunity for people to look into the complexities and the impact of the global 'War on Terror, not only on those directly involved and affected but also how the ripple effect impacts on individuals and communities everywhere."



Self Assessment Tax Return deadline... count down 31st January 2011

As we approach the Inland Revenue countdown for the submission of the 2009 – 2010 Self Assessment Tax returns we make no apology for reminding our readers of the

following. There are a number of reasons why tax payers are requested to complete and submit a self assessment tax return. One of the main reasons is that of a receipt of income which has not been taxed at source, some examples of this type of income are shown below and if your source of income fall into any of the

your source of income fall into any of the categories they you will have to submit a 2009-2010 Self Assessment Tax Return
you have started a self employed business any time between 6th April 2009 and 5th April 2010, whether as a sole trader or as a partnership
you have continued with an existing self employed business that has an accounting year end between 6th April 2009 and 5th April 2010,

whether as a sole trader or as a partnership you have received rental income between 6th April 2009 and 5th April 2010

you have become a director/shareholder in a company and you are in the 40% tax paying VOU band

You have sold any assets in the yeartween 6th April 2009 – 5th April 2010 i.e., the proceeds from such transactions are liable to capital gains The most common assets falling tax. into this category are houses which have been rented out and the sale of shares

These are just a few of the reasons why tax payers should report on a tax return. If you are unsure of your own circumstances then you may wish to take

further advice. If you do have your own self employed business you will most likely

be aware that tax is payable on the profits of the business. Profits are arrived at by taking the sales turnover less the expenses of the business.

If you have rental income then you can offset any expenditure relating to the property against the rent received, the net proceeds is the amount which is taxable.

The Inland Revenue offer to assist tax players with the completion of their tax returns, however, please note they may not advise of all the allowable expenses which can be offset against the income from whichever source it has been received.WatkinsonBlack are pleased to advise on these matters
