£30m sports village plan delayed

THE planning application for the £30 million Orford Park Project at Warrington - originally to have been heard on August 27 - has been put back three weeks because of its size and complexity.

It will now be considered by the borough council's development

control committee on either September 16 or 17.

But the delay should not have any impact on delivery of the project, which should still be ready to open in November 2011, according to project Richardson. manager

Construction work is expected to start in the spring next year. Mr Richardson said postpone-

ment of the application was due to its size and complexity, which meant the statutory agencies needed more time to finalise their responses..

Rushing

HAVE you ever stopped to think how much rushing about you do in your life? Have you even considered what it would be like to simply stop and be still and quite? Everything is needed yesterday; we have less and less time for our children and loved ones, less time to build relation-ships, less time for ourselves, less time to enjoy nature and the world around us. And it is not about society and life demands, it is more about allowing ourselves to be sucked into the rush and demand which society expects! Dashing and rushing without giving ourselves a second thought.

There is an answer to all this, in fact two answers. Either we learn to slow down and treat ourselves more gently and take time for us, or mother nature will do it for us in the form of some stress related condition or a sudden fatal stop, and then it will be too late. 

Ex-high school pupil killed in Afghanistan

A FORMER Warrington schoolboy is among the latest British soldiers to be killed in Afghanistan.

Fusilier Simon Annis, aged 22, was a pupil at Culcheth High School and was married only six months

He died along with two others

while trying to stretcher his section commander, Lance Corporal James Fullarton, to safety. Both men were killed, along with Fusilier Louis Carter who dived onto the stretcher in a desperate attempt to save L/Cpl Fullarton.

The soldiers were killed on patrol in Helmand.

Fusilier Annis, who grew up in Warrington, only married his wife, Caroline, in February.

She said: "He was a true hero who made all of us proud. He was a perfect husband. We will love and miss him always.

Fusilier Annis joined The Royal Regiment of Fusiliers, when he was just 19. His death has saddened former teachers at Culcheth High School.

Head teacher Martyn Froggett said in a statement: "It is with great sadness that we have been informed of the untimely death of Fusilier Simon
Annis on Sunday 16 August 2009
whilst serving for the 2nd Battalion
The Royal Regiment of Fusiliers in
Afghanistan.

His Commanding Officer, Lieutenant Colonel Charlie Calder, said: "Fusilier Simon Annis was a larger than life character, and a dedicated soldier. Always at the heart of whatever was going on, it was no surprise to me that he died whilst trying to save his mortally wounded Section Commander. He should be seen as a shining example to the nation of what selfless commitment really means. The heartfelt condolences of every Fusilier in Afghanistan go to Caroline, his wife of only a few months."



A huge man, I used to encounter him on my way to breakfast on an almost daily basis and he used to stop me and ask me if I was OK. He had an ever-present grin and used to carry far more than his normal share on patrol. He was always laughing and used to lighten the mood in the darkest of times, often by breaking into particularly tuneles's

200-space car park plan


PLANS for a 200-space car park for Warrington's Bank Quay railway station have



Wolves back new community venture

WARRINGTON Wolves stars Chris Riley and Lee Mitchell joined the Mayor and Mayoress of Warrington for the recent grand opening of a new Community Outreach Centre in Orford Park.

The Wolves Foundation, working in conjunction with Cheshire Police and The Princes Trust, has helped to organise and refurbish an old park ranger's cabin into a Community Outreach Centre in a bid to reduce anti-social behaviour.

The cabin is the result of hard work by Police Liason Officer for Golden Gates Estate AlisonYoung, PCSO Catherine Harkin and Wolves Foundation Community Sport Officer John Wilkinson. The trio of community activists wanted to provide the area with a contact point for concerned

residents, as well as providing the young people with a safe place to meet up at the weekends.

The park is a popular hangout spot for young people, many of whom are being unfairly labelled by concerned activates. residents. Alison Young spent four weeks talking with young people on

Friday and Saturday nights around the Orford Park area. She came to the conclusion that residents were often

conclusion that residents were often too quick to label young people as 'thugs' looking to cause trouble.

She said: "People have a bad perception of youths in general. When we asked the kids hanging round on the streets, most just said that wasted somewhere safe to meet they wanted somewhere safe to meet and spend time together". Catherine Harkin sees the cabin

carretine markin sees the cabin as something that will benefit the community as a whole, not just the children. She said: "Its a community contact point. It's here to build relationships and work positively with young people."

young people."

The Princes Trust was keen to help with the project, immediately stepping in to carry out the refurbishments. Nine youth volunteers spent a week packing shopping bags at Tesco in

order to raise the £800 needed for repairs and supplies. Over the following weeks the volunteers painted walls, ceilings and even built a small garden which has transformed

the look of the cabin.

Wolves full-back Chris Riley, who
lives next to the park, wishes it had been as well equipped when he was a young lad. He said: "It's an excellent opportunity for youngsters. We never had anything like this when I was growing up. All I saw were kids drinking and stuff, and it's very easy to go down that road. I'm lucký I had the right support.

The Outreach Centre will continue to operate on Friday evenings having already made a positive impact on

the area.

workshops, story telling and more.


It boasts a daredevil zip wire, climbing wall and outdoor gym for both young people and adults and a wheelchair friendly roundabout as



Partnership gets Lottery go-ahead

A partnership project between the Foundation for Peace and Warrington Wolves Foundation has been given the go ahead by the Big Lottery Fund.

The project will offer 60 young people from Warrington the opportunity to learn skills and knowledge to help make a positive impact within their local community.

Aimed at young people aged 13-18 years of age from disadvantaged backgrounds or those with potential to get involved in anti-social behaviour, it incorporates elements of conflict resolution, leadership, mediation and self awareness and identity, as well as practical skills in the areas of arts and



culture, sport leadership and health and education.

The project offers a response to the negative publicity young people have received in the Town by enabling them to positively and publicly demonstrate their achievements. This will be done through community volunteering, public events and an annual conference.

And local businesses will be offered the opportunity to help mentor the young people through the planning and development of their community event.

The project will be led by the young people who will be able to use their newly acquired skills to develop and deliver community events. At the end of the two-year programme there will be a cohort of 60 young peer mentors and leaders, active within their community.

Speaking about the Big Lottery Fund announcement, Foundation for Peace Chief Executive, Clare White, said: "We are delighted that we have received funding for a longer-term project



within our home town. Over the last few years there has been a greater demand for our work nationally. It's great to finally get some funding to back our work locally. By joining forces with the Wolves Foundation we can deliver a really interesting and appealing project for young people to sign up to and make their own."

Warrington Wolves Foundation Chief Executive, Neil Kelly, said: ""The Wolves Foundation is delighted to be working in partnership with the Foundation for Peace. By combining the expertise and strengths of the two charities, we will make a real difference to the lives of a group of young people that will ultimately benefit the town of Warrington."

Gemma's story



My journey with the Foundation started in March 2007 when I was asked to participate in the Tim Parry Leadership Development programme. As a young gymnastics coach and member of the school rugby team, I had experience of working with young people and looked forwards to an opportunity to develop my skills through this programme. I am a people person and have always been interested in things that affect people...so the chance to learn more about the Anglo Irish conflict was something I was keen to do.

After three long weekends of living, working and learning alongside our peers from the north and south of Ireland, I was determined to continue being involved in the work of the Foundation. From my involvement in the Foundation's youth group to a year as a young trustee, I continued my involvement in the Foundation's work. My passion and enthusiasm (and

pestering!) eventually got me the opportunity to do some volunteering for the Foundation. Working alongside facilitators Jon and Kerry gave me the opportunity to learn more about how we educate our young people here at the Foundation, and reminded me of my own experiences – and how what we do truly does make a difference to the lives of young people!

I am pleased to report that after four months of volunteering, I will be starting an apprenticeship with the foundation in September 09. I am so pleased that I will also get the chance to earn, learn and develop whilst involved in something that I am passionate about! First stop is to work with the Foundation's youth group to look at how we can organise a reunion event with our past participants!!

Working in Serbia

In April of this year the Foundation facilitated a week long seminar for Generator, a peace building charity based in Vranje, South Serbia.

The participants came from Kosovo, Serbia, Macedonia, Greece, Albania, Estonia, Romania and Germany. With the use of Theatre, the workshop shared interactive methods for preventing and solving conflicts in the lives of young people. The event gave people from outside the region a chance to visit an area which has recently experienced armed conflict. Some of the young people taking part were from countries currently experiencing political tensions (Greece and Macedonia, Kosovo and Serbia,) so, in addition to developing new skills, some of those taking part had the chance to meet people they would not otherwise encounter.

The idea behind using the medium of Theatre to help manage conflict lies in the fact that, in order to play theatre games and make presentations, groups and individuals need to develop trust. The week was spent doing problemsolving challenges, sharing stories and engaging in creative work based on the challenges experienced by the students



in their home countries. Difficult scenarios were set and alternative strategies were experimented with. As often happens with expressive work such as this, the participants were frequently surprised and amused by the similarity of their lives and those of other participants. New relationships were being made, and common experiences beyond borders and boundaries were shared.

The work was very similar to projects we are delivering in the UK. In South Serbia there are communities separated by dividing lines which don't appear on maps: the town of Bujanovac, for example, has Roma, Albanian and Serb areas. Clear associations can be made with Bradford and Leeds where we have been working with a variety of mixed ethnicity groups. There too, people are rarely encouraged to go to different areas and often fear builds barriers. However, these barriers can be brought down with well managed, fun and challenging activities no matter where they are. The group in Vranje was taken on a trip to Bujanovac, where we visited a Mosque and a nearby Orthodox Monastery: a group we have worked with from South Leeds has had similar trips to complement their work on divided communities.

The Generator group was very keen to demonstrate their co-operation and communication to a wider audience, and took the opportunity to present a short selection of improvised sketches at a local theatre. The evening produced many possibilities for interaction and allowed the group to prove, in public, that it is possible to make some unexpected friends and to produce with them, very quickly, something of good quality.



Victoria Road Primary School

Following on from our work with teenagers from the Rudheath area with Cheshire Police, we were asked to undertake some work in Victoria Road Primary school at the heart of Rudheath. There were some concerns expressed about some of the children reportedly becoming involved in some anti social behaviour and low level criminality. The head teacher was particularly concerned by the children's association with a group of older young people who were believed to be 'leading' the younger children into increased negative behaviour and activities.

Using learning from our Johnathan Ball Tiny Steps for Peace project and the successful Leadership Development Programme model, the Foundation



worked with the school to identify need and tailored a programme of conflict resolution, communication and leadership which would be delivered to a staff and children. The aim was to help develop a sustainable approach to conflict management and leadership within the school. This key stage 2 project provided us with the opportunity to try and test a programme that we knew could lead to real change with this age group.



Kerry Gibson who is leading on the project commented that: "We have been working with teenagers on this type of training for many years. For time now, organisation has been keen to work with this age group. The earlier that children and young people are able to develop skills in conflict management – the more likely they are to develop inclusive and positive mindsets and to talk, rather than using violence to resolve conflict."

Between April and July the Foundation delivered an intensive ten-week programme of peer mediation to a class of 18 year 5 pupils which gave the

children a greater understanding of the causes and consequences of conflict before training them to take on a role as peer mediators for the school. Through activities such as discussions, role plays, communication games and problem solving challenges the children learned the skills, strategies and processes needed to facilitate a conversation between two people to help them to resolve a conflict. Aspects of leadership and citizenship were also incorporated to build confidence and to encourage the children to

have the courage and self belief to be able to say 'No' to some of their negative influences.

"I used to fight but I don't fight as much anymore. To sort it out I say sorry now or make friends with them."

Within the school the peer mediators are now successfully helping children who have had disagreements, arguments or fights to come together to talk through their problems and to find a shared solution which is agreed

on by both sides. This has given all children in Victoria Road Primary School an opportunity to talk through their problems and to take responsibility for resolving them non-violently.

"It made me quite happy because I didn't really think this mediation thing would actually be any good because I just thought nobody would want to do it but I've been surprised at



how many people have come in."

Towards the latter stages of the programme the peer mediators visited the Peace Centre to create a DVD resource which will be used to train future peer mediators within Victoria Road Primary School. Through the making of this DVD the children were able to share their knowledge with others and also to recognise and celebrate their own achievements.

"It helps me because when I'm in conflict with someone, I know how to mediate other people . . . and it's much easier because I know what to do"



Over the coming months the Foundation will continue to support the school staff and children in the future development of their peer mediation service and the training of new peer mediators to ensure the sustainability of the programme.

"I know that if you solve people's problems it can stop them having a fight and it just makes it all fair for everybody else."

Priesthorpe School take part in a Leadership Develpoment Course

In March and June two residential courses were held for 44 students from Priesthorpe School, which is situated between Leeds and Bradford and receives young people from both of those cities. We were asked to design and deliver the courses in response to some actual and perceived tensions

between different groups at the school. The students were taken through a number of exciting interactive games and challenges; they also viewed and discussed a range of stimulating films which addressed issues of race, conflict and leadership.

A key function of the Leadership Development Course is to directly link experiences with issues in the everyday lives of those taking part. We also looked at specific conflicts that may have occurred and use activities to develop prevention and reduction techniques for future use. Difficult topics are discussed and worked through in the safe and friendly environment of The Peace Centre. The young participants were encouraged to identify and develop leadership skills to help them deal with conflict and support their peers.



Both groups from the school fully engaged in the process which, before and after the residential courses, included preparation and follow-up work at school. Many of the themes and issues explored during the course have been re-visited in Assemblies and lessons on all subjects. The Foundation has been invited to do further work with the school and we are in the process of planning more events and activities for the students and staff.

European Students visit the Peace Centre

In July, Students who were taking part a Summer Camp organised by the Rotary Club Warrington, took part in the Foundation's Leadership Development Programme. The aim of this programme is to give young people a greater understanding of the nature, causes and resolution of conflict. The students, and members of the Rotary Club, took part in activities such as role play, discussion and debate.

Malcolm Ross, Rotary Club President said: 'We had some reservations due to the students being from several countries across Europe and any potential cultural & language difficulties, but Jon, Kerry and Gemma dispelled any of these reservations



within the first half an hour of the course. The facilities made an impact on the group and by the end of the day the students had a good understanding of conflict resolution and how they would be in position to positively deal with live situations.

"We also commend the team for providing the memory cards in the students own language – it shows that at the Foundation go that extra mile in putting themselves out for people – Service above self which is the Rotary motto - thanks to all who made the day special for our students and for providing a unique experience.

"The facilities are excellent and well balanced – the Peace Centre caters for learning and leisure activities with areas to relax and unwind. Our Summer Camp students took time to chill out in the gym and also on the various high-tech games as well as playing table tennis."

The Foundation's first Survivors For Peace conference

On 30th May, Survivors for Peace participants held their first 'Leadership for Peace' event.

The event celebrated and explored the contributions made by people who have been impacted by conflict and acts of political violence, and heard how others have found a positive outlet for their experience and made a positive contribution to peace in their communities.

A resonating theme from the day was that of 'choices'. Many of the presenters spoke of reaching a turning point where they made the 'choice' that their experience would not hold them back; that their life should count for something and that they felt a responsibility to make their experience and life matter in the name of their loss or trauma.

The speakers included Colin Parry, who spoke of how he had felt after losing Tim in the IRA bombing of Warrington in 1993 and of the process that led him, along with his wife Wendy, to make the choice to dedicate his life to

the promotion of peace and reconciliation, through the creation of The Tim Parry Johnathan Ball Foundation for Peace. Mo Norton, who lost her brother Terence in the M62 Coach Bombing, spoke of how her participation in the work of the Foundation had led her on a journey in an attempt to gain a better understanding about the Northern Ireland 'Troubles'.

Lisa French spoke of her experience as a survivor of the London bombings on July 7, 2005 and of the humanity she experienced on that day from strangers, colleagues, friends and family who all rallied round to support and help her. She talked about how, in her attempt to overcome her experience, she got involved in supporting the work of the Mines Advisory Group in Cambodia.

'I was privileged to be asked to speak at the 'Leadership for Peace' event on 30th May, representing the Miriam Hyman Memorial Trust. It struck me that there were common themes throughout the day, with five speakers bringing diverse experiences to the audience. The most powerful theme, I felt, was the concept of making positive and constructive choices in the face of adversity, and indeed in day-to-day life. As a newcomer to the Peace Centre, I appreciated the opportunity to visit and the warm welcome received there.'

Europe gives a voice to victims



VNET is an Association set up to assist victims of the 2004 train bombs in Madrid. In 2008, funding was secured from the European Union to create VNET II, The Voice of the Victims. In late 2008, a year-long project started with the first of four conferences taking place in the Peace Centre.



VNET Madrid: To commemorate the fifth anniversary of the Madrid train bombing, the VNET founders held the second event. This also marked the 4th European Day in Memory of the Victims of Terrorism and a memorial service was held in Madrid's El Retiro Park. Victims from across Europe came together to lay flowers beneath the 191 cypress trees planted in memory of those killed in the Madrid attacks.

VNET Turin: In May, the Italian Association of Victims of Terrorism hosted the third of the year's events in Turin. The conference focused on the theme of 'National, European and International Rights of Victims of Terrorism'. The event heard from victims and survivors from across Europe about their experiences as well as from legal experts. The delegation reflected on the varying support and legislation provided for victims of terrorism in their respective countries. It revealed the vast disparity in legislation between the UK and other European countries. Trevor Lakin, whose



son Jeremy was killed in the Sharm el Sheikh bombing in 2005, joined the Foundation's delegation at the Turin event and shared his experiences with the conference.

VNET Amsterdam: The closing event of VNET II was held in Amsterdam on 30th June. The theme for the event was 'European Values and Social Cohesion'. The event explored how the bonds that bind communities together are affected by acts of terrorism and the role victims can play in healing communities. The conference heard from six victims who spoke of the challenges they had experienced in dealing with their experiences. A common theme shared by all the speakers was the lack of understanding and acknowledgement received from the general public around their experience, which compounded feelings of isolation. The conference highlighted the important role victims could play in educating wider society about the human impact of traumatic events.

"I told the truth about how the British Government abandons victims of overseas terrorist attacks once they are back in the UK, and that the Government does not help with any financial compensation. This left the conference delegates amazed that the country that leads Europe in the fight against terrorism does not compensate its own citizens when the incident occurs overseas. The support offered by the delegates was amazing and now much work is needed. Attending conferences can sometimes be wasteful but not on this occasion. Every presentation was relevant to UK victims of terrorism and I, alon



presentation was relevant to UK victims of terrorism and I, along with others, will try and replicate what other European countries have in place for their citizens. It is a sad reflection on the UK that we are so far behind Europe in the support for the victims of such atrocious acts of terrorism."

Personal statement by Trevor Lakin

Critical Incident Response Advisory Group (CIRAG)

The Foundation set up CIRAG in 2005. The Group is made up of different agencies from the Voluntary and Statutory sectors. Membership includes Brent Bereavement Services (who provided the response for those affected by 7/7), ASSIST Trauma Care, Cruse Bereavement Services, Combat Stress, Victim Support, the Emergency Planning Society, the British Red Cross, the Ministry of Defence and the Department for Culture, Media and Sport.

The Group originally met in May 2005, just before the London bombs on 7th July and the organisations in the room were aware that a major attack was expected and discussed what gaps there were likely to be in the provision of services. At this point the group members agreed that in the immediate aftermath of a critical incident, emergency plans come into place and appropriate services are provided to address the needs of those affected. In the months and years following the incident, the medium term needs of the bereaved, survivors and responders is not as well planned, and people are often unsure of where to turn for help and assistance, well into the long term.

The Foundation provides the Chair and Secretary for the Group which meets 3 times a year. They are in the process of putting together a guide for responders to help deliver an improved service to the bereaved, survivors and families following incidents. It will pull together all the learning from each member organisation about what constitutes a good response and how best to support people in the short, medium and long term. It is hoped that this quide will be used by emergency planners, crisis support workers and any responder after an emergency. It is also hoped that it will be a useful guide to what should be delivered in the medium and longer term, helping agencies to know what to expect months and years after an event. The guide is being written to complement existing resources and will be a practical 'hands on' booklet.

Storytelling residential

A soldier's tale

Each and every one of us has a story that is waiting and needs to be told.

For some the past is like a thorn in the side of one's flesh, which if not treated, spreads poison maliciously throughout the body until the pain screams out from the head. The facts of the incident or incidents, may not be easily demonstrated or have a proven existence and for fear of being misunderstood reprisal, or storyteller remains silent. The poison that spreads throughout the body is suffered and the pain used as a punishment for the increasing familiarity of guilt; silence results in the disintegration of self and alienation from others.

Nothing is more difficult than speaking of things that are neither demonstrable nor verifiable but The Tim Parry Johnathan Ball Foundation for Peace offers a safe environment where it is possible to speak-out.

The Storytelling Residential I attended helped me to take a step closer to making real the incidents and the memories that are the cause of my selfinflicted guilt.

Throughout the weekend all participants have space to tell their story without the fear and shame. There was no judgment by the other participants and by listening and sharing each other's story, however humbling one's own story is; the effect was one of individual and group strength. The desire to belong is possibly the common thread that had brought us together as a group; the need to share without recrimination.

For every one who fears to speak their story, there is at least one person who on hearing this will be strengthened and begin taking steps to tell their own story.

My story can be traced to events some thirty years ago and over this time my wound has festered making me unable to fulfil my responsibilities to myself and others. It took a work colleague to point out my abnormal behaviour before I admitted to having a problem: previously noticed and commented on over a couple of years by my wife, but dismissed by me.

With help from my NHS GP and the fortunate introduction to the surgery's personal counsellor, I started to 'comeout' and speak-out the events of the past that were destroying my character.

I first heard about the work of the Tim Parry Johnathan Ball Foundation for Peace some years before my problem surfaced, but was then reminded by contact with the Northern Ireland Veteran's Association shortly after embarking on my journey to understand 'who I am'.

I contacted the Foundation and needed little persuasion to join the 'Storytelling Residential'. However as I was and to a large extent still am unable to tell my story to my wife, as with partners or close family – this is not abnormal, as the fear of telling one's story may impact a sense of guilt, grief or misunderstanding on those who care for us – it took a little time before my wife would agree to accompany me. My argument to persuade her was that maybe by sharing my story at the residential I might begin to open the closed doors of my memory to her, I cannot say they are open but the doors are ajar.

I believe that her presence at the residential was of great benefit to others as well as me; in some ways perhaps her presence enabled others who were to speak in public for the first time to address themselves to her as a substitute carer.

I hope this course of action can be repeated by others because the carer's story is significant in the healing process and they themselves despite being removed from the event take-on a role as a victim.

We both have a tremendous respect for the professional running of the residential and all those who organised and supervised. Perhaps their care, compassion and discipline resulted in the bonding of those taking part and even though individuals may have represented opposite sides of the divide of conflict the love or closeness among us was very evident.

The need for total anonymity of each other's story was especially significant in individuals telling their story; this sense of security must be without compromise.

For myself I gained self-respect and a tremendous rush of energy after attending, for my wife she was exhausted but welcomed the experience and understood a greater sense of the difficulties of speaking-out to those in her role. Together we both felt great compassion and humility for everyone else and a rewarding sense of privilege to be a listener to others who are troubled as a result of conflict.

Once more I would like to express our thanks for the organisation and the dedicated team who administer the programme. If anyone should read this then I urge those who are similarly troubled by conflict to put their trust in the Tim Parry Johnathan Ball Foundation for Peace.

No one's story is less significant than anyone else's and the effects of guilt, the feeling of uselessness or the debilitating illness that afflicts us who directly or indirectly experience conflict need to be listened too.

Storytelling by itself cannot mend an individual but the process and the respect gained by the individuals' account helps make concrete and balance what the memory might recall as unarquable.




has been a fan since he was three and he and dad lan are season ticket holders.


