FORTUNATELY Warrington as a town escaped the riots which took place across the country and the 22-year-old local man who thought it would be a good idea to try and incite rioting on facebook has been jailed for FOUR years!

I would like to congratulate Cheshire police on the way they reacted to this potentially explosive situation - and the Judge who handed out a sentence to fit the crime.

Too often we hear about the police being criticised for failing to respond quickly or courts being too soft on offenders. But now it is important that they continue as they mean to go on to ensure we can all live in a safe environment.

As a society we need to accept that if people are to have human rights - they need to behave like civilised human beings and know the basics of right and wrong.

WARRINGTON Wolves are hungry for the Super League title following their Challenge Cup exit to arch rivals and fellow contenders Wigan Warriors.

Points machine and former man of steel Brett Hodgson, who recently broke his own record for points in a season, smashing through the 300 barrier in the 64-6 thrashing of Bradford Bulls, admits that the Challenge exit left him "shattered" for a week

Having tasted defeat at Wembley against the Wolves in 2009 when he was at Huddersfield, Hodgson admits he made the switch because he believed it would be a great chance to return to the cup final on the back



G&J Greenall sold for £7.5m

THE maker of Greenall's gin has been sold in a £7.5m deal involving the management team that saved the company from collapse three years ago.

G&J Greenall, which includes the second most popular gin brand in the UK and will next month celebrate its 250th birthday, has been sold by hotel group De Vere, which was formed from the Greenalls Group in the 1990s.

Warrington-based Greenalls, which employs more than 100 people, also makes more than 50 per cent of all the supermarket ownlabel gin and vodka in the UK.

The company is being bought by its management in a deal that is

backed by an unnamed private equity firm. It aims to build on its recent strong

sales by focusing on the Greenall's brand and taking advantage of a resurgence in demand for British gin

overseas. In 2008, the business made underlying losses of £2m but was turned around under the leadership of chief executive Christian Rose, who will continue to lead the company.

It is now profitable and recorded turnover of £46m last year after enjoying strong sales growth following a re-launch of the brand. Mr Rose said gin was "becoming cool again", especially overseas where Greenall's 250-year history

where Greenall's 250-year history adds to its allure. "For many years, gin has bumped along the bottom, it's been a mum and dads' drink and not really cool. "But now a lot of people's parents drink vodka, so gin is becoming different, while people overseas love the quintessentially British tradition of gin and tonic." The management team will focus

The management team will focus on growing the business' brands, which also include the recently launched premium Bloom and Berkeley Square labels. They believe there is an

opportunity to grow overseas sales,

opportunity to grow overseas sales, which are growing at 30 per cent after its recent relaunch in the US. They plan to launch in India. Greenalls will also continue to supply drinks for the big supermarkets and other gin companies, including Bacardi's Bombay Gins. De Vere, which owns 65 sites in the UK including Village Hotels, has been selling off some operations to focus on its core hotels and leisure business



One thing that stood out in my mind was how many of the criminals where actually wearing a full hood over their face to hide their identity, in particular the ones that where literally stealing and committing serious crime in full view of the cameras be they CCTV installed or media cameras. They were blatantly sticking two fingers up at them simply because they knew they could not be identified whilst wearing hoods, balaclavas, ski masks and such like.

masks and such like. No matter what footage of cameras the police may look at these people are unlikely to be identified. So is this one lesson to be learned? Is this something that our MPs should be considering? There was a time when if you were wearing a mask you were seen as a robber or bandit. Is history repeating itself? Maybe you have some thoughts on this? Many criminals are opportunists

some thoughts on this? Many criminals are opportunists either looking for opportunities of vulnerability to commit crime or using or creating diversions to give them a free hand. Group thugs like in the current situation gives the opportunity to all kinds of criminal elements to come out and do their nasty thing with much less risk of being caught. I have seen criminality like this put the victims out of business and I have seen the hurt and anguish it can cause. It is difficult to prepare for such events but you can limit the problem in some ways. You will

problem in some ways. You will almost certainly need a contingency plan whether your business, big or small, is hit by such a disaster such as your premises burning down with



Potential risks of using a will writing service

In a recent episode of the BBC's Panorama programme, the potential risks of using a will writing service were highlighted.

The programme reported on the case of Andrew Poole, whose wife Suzanne had used a will writer but the will had failed to include any provision for him leaving the entire estate in trust to his step-daughters.

Appearing on the programme was Caroline Bielanska, who is the Chief Executive of Solicitors for the Elderly and when interviewed she expressed concern that the will writers had failed to advise Mr Poole of his right to bring a claim against the estate for adequate provision.

Mrs Bielanska further commented that 'a specialist solicitor would have asked why a spouse was left out and kept a detailed record of the reasons why. Furthermore a solicitor would have advised of the tax implications and the risk that the will could be challenged.

STUDENTS in Warrington returning in September for their final A-level year will be the first to feel the impact of the new government tuition fee system

when applying for university places. With current university fees being a maximum of £3290 for a year, this could rise to £9,000 in 2012. With the added cost of accommodation and living costs this figure could be in excess of £45000 over a three year course - leaving students facing a huge debt.

If I was being made to pay the new fees a 2012 unguide delivity exercise was being made to pay the new fees in 2012, I would definitely consider more carefully whether it's worth going. In fact, I doubt I would be going at all."

David Mowat, MP for Warrington South, hopes the new fees won't put students off applying. He said: "What I hope will happen is the number of students going to university will continue to increase. There were similar concerns about students going to university under the Labour Government about six years ago but a decrease in numbers didn't happen then. A feature of the new fees is it's not like a mortgage, if the students are unable to pay the money back it will eventually be wiped." But Helen Jones, MP for

But Helen Jones, MP for Warrington North, said: "By trebling the cost of going to university, I believe that students from less affluent backgrounds will either be forced to choose courses based on affordability or simply be unable to attend any university. Here in Warrington we have also seen the impact of the Government's changes to higher education on the University of education on the University of Chester. The teaching budget of the university has been slashed by 85% and will force them to raise their fees for students."

Williams, Alex senior communications the officer at





University of Chester, said: "We are unable to predict student choices in advance of new tuition fee arrangements being introduced." However Alex did indicate that there has been a 20 per cent increase in applications for this academic year.

Whether this is students taking the final opportunity of the lower tuition fees or not is uncertain. What is for certain is the benefits of a degree are no longer guaranteed, with the possibility for many of a lifetime of debt.


Oldest chapel to open to public

of motorists would stop. He said: "Our poll shows that the 'Good Samaritan' is alive and well and driving along the highways and byways of Britain. On the other hand it is disappointing that almost 40 per cent don't feel able to stop. "It is interesting that older drivers seem much more likely to stop to help other drivers."

Tax saving ideas

There are a number of ways that may be considered if you want to save tax. These may not all be suitable for everyone, and we always advise clients that the tax tail should not wag the dog. Tax is, after all, simply an overhead that is incurred in reaching

your goal. Some ideas are as follows: 1. If your customers are generally VAT registered then it may be advantageous to register for VAT yourself even if you are below the limit for compulsory registration. You will be able to pass on VAT on your own sales, as your customers can reclaim it, whilst at the same time being able to reclaim VAT on your purchases.

your purchases. 2. For VAT registered businesses, it may be further advantageous to calculate your VAT using the flat rate scheme. In this case you pay VAT at a flat rate on your VAT inclusive turnover, whilst at the same time being precluded whilst at the same time being precluded from reclaiming VAT on the majority of your costs. This is only available if your turnover is below a certain limit, and may or may not result in a lower VAT liability than the normal method. Each case must be considered on it's merit.

If either of the above is to your advantage then your profits will increase. In turn, this will increase your income tax or corporation tax, but you will still end up with up to 80% of the gain made.

gain made. 3. Contributing into a pension scheme can be a very tax effective way of investing. To obtain an investment worth £100 then you need only pay £80, the pension company claiming the other £20 from the tax office. If you are a higher rate taxpayer then you can currently claim back even more tax relief. Also, if you are above the earnings limit for age allowance then making a pension contribution will reduce the income that is taken into account by the tax office in calculating the allowance available.

4. If the choice is available, then it may be tax effective to choose to receive a tax free mileage allowance for the use of your own car and fuel rather than to have the taxable "benefit" of a company car. Whichever is the best choice depends on the model of the car as well as the number of business miles driven, and must be checked on an

Advertiser's announcement Wasps – handle

with care THIS spring and summer have been quite dry - perfect for wasps! Over the next few weeks wasp activity will peak. A large nest resembles a huge intricate sculpture and may contain many thousands of workers along with the queen. Early in the spring it is possible to treat a small nest yourself as long as it can be accessed safely, but in later summer it is absolutely essential to have it destroyed professionally.

Adult wasps rely on the wasp larva (or grubs) to feed them a sugary excretion, when the queen stops laying eggs the food supply gets cut, and the wasps go foraging for anything containing sugary liquid -children's ice creams, soft fruit and even your pint! It's at this time that most stings occur and problem nests most stings occur and problem nests should be treated in advance.

Although they can occur almost anywhere, a great majority of wasp nests occur within roof spaces. A reputable pest controller MUST, BY LAW, inspect the loft space for open water tanks and bat roosts. This is in order to satisfy the legal requirements of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 and the Control of Pesticides regulations 1986. It is also good practice to determine the position of the nest. Just because wasps are seen going under the eaves, don't assume this is the nest, it may be anywhere within the loft. For this reason the householder must be present to allow access for inspection. A lot of failed treatment attempts are due to lack of professional procedure, and re treatment may be necessary at extra cost to the homeowner. Disturbing or poisoning bats could result in fines of thousands of pounds, a simple check is all that's required.
