Urban art comes to town

UNDERGROUND urban artist Banksy is among the controversial contributors to an exhibition at and Art Museum Warrington Gallery.

Dismissed at 'crime' by some and 'masterpieces' by others, Warrington residents can now have a chance to make up there own mind, at the '(R)Evolution of Urban Art' exhibition.

The show also features work from Adam Neate, Antony Micallef, Candice Tripp and Jose Parla as well as artist Blek le Rat, one of Banksys early influences.

The exhibition reveals the origins of one of the worlds most controversial art-forms, interviewing the contributors about their inspirations and dispelling the myth that they are simply 'glorified graffiti artists'

The exhibit, which runs until March 2010, is keen to point out that most 'Urban Art' has a strong political or social message, and is not simply spray paint and offensive slogans.

Banksy's work has been displayed in (and sometimes on) the world's most prominent art galleries and in some cases without them knowing anything about it.

His guerrilla tactics and the social commentary made by his pieces means there is never a shortage of surrounding controversy surrounderground maestro.

President for around six years. She is a great supporter and her presence has added a touch of magic to what was a very special occasion for us.



Warrington Disability Partnership (WDP)

WDP is a user led voluntary organisation which actively promotes independent living throughout life and work. Based in Warrington; our team consists of 11 trustees / directors, 110 volunteers and 40 paid staff who together deliver a range of services directly or in partnership with health and social care providers, education/employment services and a wide range of local support groups and services.

Chair of Trustees & Chief Officer Report Dave Thompson MBE DL (Chair) & Jayne Horton (Chief Officer)

On behalf of our team we are delighted to welcome you to the Annual Report for 2008 to 2009.

It is with great regret that we start this report with the news that Annette Clemo, one of our longest serving volunteers and ex member of staff, sadly passed away earlier this year. Annette was a true community champion who was responsible for helping to develop WDP and worked tirelessly with a variety of other local and regional voluntary organisations.

The title of this years report "Building a Better Future" was chosen because we believe that it symbolises what we have achieved throughout the year and something Annette continued to strive for.

Last year we reported that together with our partners at Warrington Borough Council we had secured nearly £1million from the National Community Assets Fund for WBC to refurbish our Centre for Independent Living in Beaufort Street off Liverpool Road. In April

we relocated our services to the Orford Day Centre in Festival Avenue; a task that involved staff, volunteers and support from various partners.



During the three weeks that saw dozens of trips with an 18 ton truck, 7 ton van and several cars, it was very evident how much office furniture, equipment and information we have amassed during the past few years whilst developing our services. It certainly wouldn't have fitted in the 3m by 3m office where we started at the Dallam Centre in 1990. The refurbishment includes a new roof, doors, windows, boundary fencing, toilets, heating, lighting, extensions and the new community café.

During the refurbishment work we have identified four more opportunities to extend our services including a new workshop which will be used to deliver a mobility refurbishment project, new conservatory style meeting room, an additional extension to the caretakers house to add another community meeting room and a mobility track, which will offer training to users of scooters and other mobility aides. We have launched a Capital Appeal to raise the £175,000 to cover the building work that is scheduled to be completed by late spring next year.

April also saw us extend our services to Runcorn when we opened the doors on the Halton Lea Shopmobility service. We also aim to work with Halton Borough Council to reopen a service in Widnes.

Although the team has been stretched by the relocated, they have continued to deliver, and further develop services and partnerships aimed at ensuring disabled people have a "choice of opportunity". We have expanded our Discover IT Suite and recruited two new post holders including a Mental Health Retention Worker and Business Development Officer. Our Disability Access Auditors have undertaken work with NorthWest Prisons and Warrington Polling Stations, as well as delivering Disability Awareness Training to health and social care staff.

Our services reach out to a wide audience including disabled people, their carers and families, managers and staff from the statutory and voluntary organisations, local businesses, schools, and the public.

Other highlights from the past year include:

- Receiving the Best Independent Living Initiative Award from Breakthrough UK
- Receiving a Cheshire Positive Business Award from Cheshire County Council in recognition for our employment services
- · Receiving the highest honor in the NorthWest Cash for Kids Award
- Several of our volunteers received recognition for their work including Doreen Menzies Safeway Pensioners Award Matthew James, Ros Schofield, Phillippa Cannon, Karen Beaton, Christine Hollowell, Eilish Yates and Sandra Maxwell - Adult Learners & NVQ Awards
- · Most recently our employment team received the National Avanta Best Partner Award
- During the year Buckingham Palace announced that our Queens Award for Voluntary Services which we received in 2006 has been given the status of an MBE for the organisation.

During the year we have extended our community engagement. Ollie, the WDP mascot, has had great success in various

mascot races and he has made guest appearances at local schools and community events.

We also extended our methods of communication onto Facebook, Twitter, E-Newsletter and Chairman's Blog on our website.

In keeping with our ambition to operate as a "Social Enterprise", nearly a third of our services were "self funded" through a programme of fundraising activities; baby Chloe Thompson got in on the act before she was born as staff ran a sweep to "guess the baby's weight".

In line with our commitment to operate as a community partner we procured services from local sources including printing, advertising, IT support, telecommunications, surveillance equipment, security, office supplies, repairs and maintenance to our premises, van, narrow boat and other facilities.

As you can see it has been another action packed year at WDP. We know that the coming years will bring new challenges as our funders face the financial challenges that have resulted from the economic crisis. Our aim will be to ensure the least disruption to our services and to support our staff, volunteers and service users through the anxiety and frustrations that this

On behalf of the team we would like to thank all of our partners for their continuing support. We would also like to thank fellow Trustees/Directors, our staff and volunteers, the people who use our services and everyone who has supported us during the past year.

We would like to acknowledge the work of Phil Edwards – a Trustee/Director who retired this year, Phil played a vital role in developing the services we offer today.

Finally we would like to invite you to read the following pages and consider if actions really do speak louder than words!

We look forward to working with you all next year.

Our benefits advice service is run predominantly by volunteers meeting clients who require support to complete benefit application forms. The team completes regular online research and attend training to keep their knowledge up-to-date.

Leisure, Recreation and Sport Funded by Warrington Borough Council and Sport Cheshire

Overview

The team have been involved in the delivery of the following projects:

- Planet Blue supporting young disabled people to take part in sport and other activities within a youth club setting. Held fortnightly for 11 - 25 year olds.
- Disability Inclusive Sports Club (DISC) short multi sport sessions allow attendees to adopt a wide range of skills from a variety of sports, including Boccia, Curling, wheelchair basketball, football, judo, and bowling. Weekly sessions for children and young people from 7-18 years.
- Sporting Chances weekly at Ryland's Recreation Centre for young people and adults with a wide range of disabilities. These sessions, which are well attended, offer multi sport for people of different ages and abilities.
- One Wednesday Can't Hurt (OWCH) Pain Management Group meets every Wednesday at Fearnhead Community Centre where they offer a range of activities including Basic Yoga, Relaxation Techniques and Breathing Exercises.
- Kids Inclusive Swimming Club started in June 2009; meets fortnightly to give disabled children and young people aged 5 to 18 an opportunity to try inclusive swimming sessions.
- Wheelchair Inclusive Sports Club commencing in 2010; this will allow disabled children and young people the opportunity to explore wheelchair skills and sports.
- Kids Inclusive Cricket Club commencing in 2010; this will allow disabled young people an opportunity to engage in cricket activities.
- 5 Hour Offer re-commencing in 2010; developing an 8 week initiative highlighting inclusive activities for young
- Leisure, Recreation & Sports Forum meets quarterly and looks at ongoing provision in the area and aims to avoid duplication of services.







Fuel scale charge

We recently looked at the advantages certain instances director/shareholder can obtain from having a company car. Generally, company cars are an expensive perk but they can be tax effective in certain

very specific cercumstances.

One benefit that is almost always punitive is, however, the car fuel scale charge. As with most other benefit charges this is an 'all or nothing' charge charges this is an 'all or nothing' charge to tax. If a company pays for any private fuel whatsoever, however little, then the full benefit scale charge will apply. The argument that you only claim a certain percentage of your fuel bills (ie every other bill) is unlikely to succeed as a defense against the scale charge. The pally safe way to avoid a scale charge. only safe way to avoid a scale charge is to keep meticulous records of all journeys and to reimburse the company in full for the cost of all fuel used for private journeys.

The only certain way to do this to the satisfaction of the tax office is to ensure that you record all necessary journeys accurately. If the company pays for fuel then this will require you to keep records of all journeys, both private and

business, to ensure that you repay exactly the correct proportion of all fuel purchased to the company for any private miles. However, if you pay for fuel personally, then you need only keep a log of journeys made on company business, and for which reimbursement is claimed. You can then claim the fuel costs on the basis of a rate per mile. The rate is for the employer and employee to agree, but the tax office have issued a maximum 'tax free' rate per mile, above which any reimbursement received would be a reimbursement received would be a taxable benefit.

These rates are reviewed twice a year by the tax office. As of 1st December 2009 the maximum rates are as follows:

These rates are also accepted for the purpose of reclaiming VAT on fuel. However, it is always necessary to comply with the other record-keeping requirements in order to justify including these costs as recoverable input VAT on your VAT return. These rules have been covered in previous columns.
