#### The light at the end of the tunnel



By continuing to grow on our journey through life, we can make our journey more fulfilling, rewarding, enjoyable and fun, regardless of what other people try to tell us.



#### Mountaineer meets his match

WARRINGTON mountaineer Stuart Peacock, who has climbed the world's highest peaks including Everest, was married in a ceremony in the Lake

Stuart, son of Mrs Mavis Peacock, of Penketh, and the late Mr Allan Peacock, married Miss Kelly Weston, formerly of Sankey, daughter of Mr Barry Weston and Mrs Alex Bicker.

When Stuart lost his job as an electronics technician, he decided to sell his house to fund his first ascent of Mount Everest.

After tackling some of the world's highest mountains, he obtained a job as a mountain expedition leader.

In 2006 he climbed Everest for the second time, leading a team which included two 19-year-olds, the youngest British climbers to scale the world's highest mountain.

By then he had climbed three of the world's highest 14 peaks - Everest

world's highest 14 peaks — Everesi (29,035ft), Kanchenjunga (28,169ft) and Cho Oyu.

He said: "I had dreamed of getting a job in climbing," he said, "but I never really expected the dream to come true - getting paid for doing what I love most. It opens up all sorts of possibilities

The wedding took place at Leighton all, Carnforth, with an evening



reception at the Castle Green Hotel in Kendal. The couple honeymooned in Sharm, Egypt.

Best man was Craig Peacock, bridegroom's brother and Matron of Honour was Mrs Lucy Weston-Small, bride's sister. Bridesmaid's were Louisa Bellis and Laura Bennett, and flower girl was Isla Peacock, bridegroom's niede.

## Make sure you are energy efficient!

AS anyone who has been trying to sell a property since December last year will know, all residential properties being marketed for sale since the 14th December 2007 require a Home Information Pack.

Home Information Packs were introduced last Summer and were intended to speed up the conveyancing process. A Home Information Pack (HIP) includes important legal searches and an Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) providing information relating to the energy efficiency of a building. The Certificate includes an energy rating, similar to the ratings that you would expect to see on the front of a fridge or washing machine. The Certificate, which can only be provided by an accredited Energy Assessor, will also include a recommendation report which includes advice and suggestions on improvements that could be made to save money and

energy.

The Regulations have now been extended to include the rental and commercial property sectors. From the 1st October, anyone who wants to sell, lease, construct or modify a property will have to supply an Energy Performance Certificate (EPC). This will include sub-letting. An EPC must be made available to any prospective buyer or tenant at the earliest opportunity and no later than when a viewing is conducted or when written information is provided about the building.

about the building.

Where commercial properties are concerned, the type of information

that the assessor will need in order to prepare the EPC will be a lot more detailed than for a residential property. The assessor will need detailed information on the dimensions and construction of the building, plus details of heating and ventilation services.

Unlike residential transactions, the EPC may well be used by tenants as

a negotiating tool – perhaps to reduce the rent payable if the property is not energy efficient. There could also be scope for some landlord to try to increase the rent or the service charge for providing a 'greener' property!

The penalty for not providing an EPC is fixed, in most cases, at 12.5% of the ratable value of the building, subject to a minimum penalty of \$500 and a maximum of \$5,000. And remember — even if a fine is

imposed, the EPC will still be required! It is important to remember that it is the responsibility of the Seller or Landlord to provide the EPC – even if an estate agent or letting agent has been appointed – so be sure to double check that any agents acting on your behalf are complying with the Regulations.

## Pie-lovers mourn death o **Bessie Ardern**

PIE-LOVERS are mourning the loss of Bessie Ardern, the founder of Warrington's world-famous Arden's pies.

Bessie, whose granddaughter Joanne still runs the Willis Street based bakery with her husband John Hull, passed away quietly in her sleep aged 101.

She started the business in 1932 supported by her late husband Jack Wood, converting a terraced property in Willis Street during an era when being a businesswoman with your own shop was relatively unheard

In the 1980's Bessie passed the bakery over to her son Geoff Wood

but still played a major part in the business, getting up at 4am to turn on the ovens

It was only in her 90's that she was forced to give up her role due to failing eyesight.

In 2001 the bakery was passed to

Joanne.

Bessie was solely responsible for creating the famous meat and potato pies and the recipe is still exactly the

way she would have liked it.

Joanne said: "My grand-mother was a unique woman and we are sure she would be delighted to know that so many people still love her pies.
"We are all extremely proud of

what she has achieved.

In recent years the business has expanded with outlets around the



town - but the pies are still baked where it all began in Willis Street.

## James has the Midas touch!

A WARRINGTON based archaeologist who has been carrying out research into an ancient settlement for the past 10 years is celebrating in style after strike gold at the double!

Using his trusty metal delector James Balme struck gold twice in local fields, unearthing rare gold sovereign coins

Well known in the region for his discovery of ancient treasures left behind from the Bronze Age, Iron age and Roman periods of history at Warburton near Lymm, James has now uncovered two gold finds from a different ora different era.

James from Woolston, explained: "I have been carrying out intensive historical and archaeological research for a decade which is a landmark in itself. The ten years has flown by and during that time my research has unearthed countless

treasures from ancient times proving that the area was populated from the prehistoric period right through until the present day. My work has attracted a lot of media and TV coverage during

that time culminating in a Time Team programme filmed in the village in

"My latest discoveries are just as exciting as many of the ancient treasures I have made. Whilst searching a new area of land recently I recovered two gold coins in pristine condition within just a few days of

each other.
"The first coin is a rare gold sovereign of William IV dated 1832 and is in excellent condition. The second coin is a half sovereign of George V dated 1915.

"To find one gold sovereign is quite rare but to find two gold sovereigns in close proximity is a great achievement."

James said: "Following this latest discovery I will be continuing my research for the foreseeable future to uncover more evidence of our ancient past.

## Welcome to the Autumn edition of Peace Talks



So far, the year has been exceptionally busy with no summer slow down as we normally encounter. Instead we have been receiving requests for our work from across the country.

As well as continuing our traditional 'Full On' programme with 13-16 year olds who are at risk of exclusion from mainstream education, we have developed the programme further so we can now offer progression points towards GCSEs through the Open College Network accreditation process: this adds value to what is already an exceptionally well received programme. The first two of these programmes began in September.

Demand for tailored programmes has increased and we are now delivering programmes to tackle specific conflicts in Leeds, Wiltshire, and Liverpool and will shortly begin in West Cheshire.

We have welcomed two new members of staff on our Youth and

Communities team and you can read more about them below.

September was a busy month with two key events held at the Centre: At the beginning of the month we launched our '100 Club' with the first fifteen members. Chris Daffy, a consultant in service strategy, was guest speaker to an audience of business people and supporters. See page 7 for further information about the 100 Club and its benefits to members.

Francis Maude has the brief of developing party policy in respect of Charities and the Voluntary Sector and was impressed by the efforts of the Foundation to build on its successes despite the difficulties small charities face in raising the vital funds needed, not only to survive but also to expand and reach more people than ever before.

#### The President of Ireland visits the Peace Centre

President Mary McAleese visited the Peace Centre to learn more about the Foundation's work with young people and the 'Survivors for Peace' programme, which works with adults affected by terrorism or politically motivated violence across Europe.

After a tour of the Centre, President McAleese said that she came to Warrington "to pay tribute to the spirit of the people, including the Parrys, who have worked tirelessly towards peace and reconciliation and fashioned a new sense of hope. It is the debt we owe to children like Tim and Johnathan."

She recalled the bombing 15 years ago and said: "... That dreadful Saturday, when two gorgeous little lives, lovely innocent human beings, were extinguished, two routes were open to the families in their despair and sorrow - the route of anger, hatred and vengeance, or the courageous one taken by Colin and Wendy Parry."

Mr Parry said: "For a Head of State to find the time to visit the Centre and learn more about our work is fantastic. It is great recognition for those who work for the Foundation."

The Irish Government has committed 75,000 euros (approx £59,000) over the next three years to help the Foundation to continue its Leadership Development Programme.







#### Steve Parry inspires young people at presentation evening

In July, the Foundation held its biannual presentation evening which was supported by Olympic bronze medal winning swimmer, Steve Parry. Steve spoke about his own



experiences during the Sydney Olympics and the commitment, motivation and determination that he had to fulfil his lifetime's ambition. This proved to be an extremely

powerful message to the young people who attended the event to celebrate their achievements in our 'Full On' programmes.

The 'Full On' programmes are focused on young people aged 13-16 years who are at risk of exclusion from school or who are disengaging from

education. The event recognised the individual accomplishments of students from 18 programmes held since January who had successfully completed their course. The hard work and commitment demonstrated by the students was evident in the enviable success rate of 87% of the students achieving formal accreditation from the Open College Network.

The 'Full On' programme continues to be delivered to young people across the country, including Warrington, and will also shortly be introduced to schools in Wigan through funding from the Learning + Skills Council.

#### Sir John raises awareness of the Foundation's work

#### **Voice of the Victims**

On 30 September, the Foundation hosted the 'Voice of the Victims' Conference in conjunction with the European Network of Victims of Terrorism (VNET – see below).

The conference heard testimonies of people from across Europe who have been affected by acts of terrorism, including the London (7/7) bombings, the Madrid train bombings, Omagh and victims of terrorist attacks across the world.

Speaking at the event, the Foundation's Jo Dover said: "The Conference gives victims an opportunity to speak out and challenge the common misunderstanding that being a victim means you are powerless. They told

their fellow victims of the ways in which they have changed their lives for the better, and by doing so they showed solidarity with each other and were less isolated in their experience".

The keynote speaker was Dame Helen Reeves, founder and former Chief Executive of Victim Support, and also a Founder Member and Chair of Victim Support Europe. Dame Helen spoke of the role that victims can play in improving policy and services for other victims, and the moral authority they hold to effect change.

The Conference was the first of four to be held across Europe. It focused on victims and how they have transformed their lives in a positive way.

## **European Network of Victims of Terrorism (VNET)**

The European Network of Victims of Terrorism (VNET) was initiated by the Asociación de Ayuda a las Víctimas del 11M (AAV11M), formed after the Madrid train bombings in March 2004. In 2008, funding was secured from the EU to create VNET II, The Voice of the Victims.

The year long project enables victims' voices to be heard and for them to contribute to National and pan European debate, policy and practice across the EU.

The first event was held in Warrington, and is being followed by

events in Amsterdam, Madrid and Turin.

As part of the year's events, a survey is being undertaken to better understand the needs of people affected by Terrorism.

VNET II partners are: AAV11M - Spain; Impact – The Netherlands; Tim Parry Johnathan Ball Foundation for Peace; 7th July Assistance and Omagh Support & Self–Help Group – United Kingdom; Associação Portugesa de Apoio à Vitima – Portugal; Familles du DC10 d'UTA – France; Associazione Vittime del Terrorismo – Italy.

The event also marked the official launch of our 'Survivors for Peace' programme, funded over three years by the Big Lottery Fund.



#### Tenants ask council to remain landlords

COUNCIL house tenants who have taken the lead in helping to shape their own future are recommending the council should remain in control of its own properties, via its 'arms length'organisation Golden Gates Housing.

The Housing Options Panel, created to lead a review of council's housing stock, has recommended to the council that the stock should be transferred to a Registered Social Landlord (RSL) and for Golden Gates Housing (GGH) to become the RSL to run it.

The decision comes following a survey of tenant's homes including feedback from tenants and GGH employees and prompted by the current GGH contract coming to an end in February 2009.

The panel, consisting of five tenants, five GGH staff and five councillors, was tasked with looking at various options to safeguard the future and standards of all 8,800 houses and flats plus 220 leasehold properties.

The panel has been meeting since April and has taken evidence on all aspects of the decision with members visiting a number of housing management organisations to assess the advantages and disadvantages of different management models.

The whole exercise is geared towards securing the best future for the housing stock, meeting tenants' needs and making sure that all the homes at least meet the national Decent Homes Standards for the next 30 years.

review also involved an independent survey of council homes,

conditions of the properties, required repairs and improvements that could be made to bathrooms, double glazing,

doors, heating, fences and gutters.
Tenants also held a variety of successful conferences where could find out more about the survey, register their feedback and discuss the review as a whole.

All the information was then used to guide the panel's thinking on a number of options before making their recommendation.

Doreen Moors, chair of the panel, said: "As a tenant I found this to have been a very interesting and productive exercise

"We looked at all the options, visits and most importantly the feedback we received from tenants, including the consultative panel, conferences and

"This proved invaluable in order to help the panel make the right recommendation for all council tenants, which will provide for continuous higher standards of decency to their homes." Coun Bob Barr, Executive Board

member for planning, regeneration and housing, said: "We are determined to ensure that our current and future tenants get the best housing service possible which delivers decent homes in good neighbourhoods. This recommendation critical to make sure that that

happens.
"I am very grateful to all members of the panel and in particular the tenants and the Chair, for the time, the care and the attention they have given to considering this important recommendation. It points the way for the best future for Warrington's housing stock.

The panel's recommendations will now go to the council's Executive Board in November, followed by Full Council

at the end of the year.
Subject to the outcomes of these council meetings a submission of options appraisal form will go to the Government Office North West for consideration and approval.





## Death of a legend

WARRINGTON Rugby League legend Harry Bath, one of the club's greatest ever players and a former World Cup-winning coach, has died in his native Australia at the age of 83 after a long battle with illness.

Bath was recognised as one of the two greatest players never to have played for Australia - another Warrington favourite, Brian Bevan, being the other.

Bath and his wife Gwen kept in

touch with Warrington, where they spent nearly 10 "very happy" years. Just two years ago, Harry donated his treasured Championship medal to help raise funds for another club Captian Mike Gregory, who was suffering from a muscle wasting

Harry and Gwen decided to donate the medal after hearing of Mike's plight via **warrington-worldwide**.

The medal now sits proudly in a



display case at the Halliwell Jones Stadium after a charity game orgaised by the club, helped raise thousands of pounds for the Mike Gregory Trust Fund.

won Premierships Brisbane Souths and Balmain before switching to an English competition in 1947, which at the time was in 1947, which at the time, was regarded as the strongest in the world.

Bath started out at Barrow before going on to enjoy tremendous success with Warrington, with whom he won the Challenge Cup in 1950 and 1954.

He was also a vital component of the Warrington team that compotent of the impressive League and Cup double in 1953/54, contributing more than 300 points to the cause and kicking goals in all the important matches.

By the time he returned home to Australia in 1957, he was the most prolific try-scoring forward, most prolific points scorer and second greatest goalkicker in the club's history.

Even now, almost half a century later, he still holds one club record, for scoring 363 points in the 1952/53 season.

The former goalkicking forward



captained Warrington to Challenge Cup glory in 1954 before a then world record crowd of 102,569 at Bradford's famed Odsal Stadium.

He is the only man to top the

pointscoring table in both England and Australia.

He returned to Australia in 1957, finishing off his career with the Dragons. Aged 32, he helped St George to three Premierships in a row before enjoying similar success with Balmain and Newtown and the people of the second Australia to proper in the second Australia to proper i also coached Australia to success in the 1968 and 1972 World Cups.

Bath passed away after a long illness and is certain to be honoured by the NRL.

## **Capital Allowances**

WHEN a business acquires a piece of plant or other capital asset then there will generally be some tax relief available in the form of 'Capital Allowances' Until recently you were allowed relief at a rate of 25% per annum, with small and medium sized businesses being able to claim a higher proportion in the year of acquisition. From April, however, all this

has changed.

1. Now all businesses, regardless of size, receive an Annual Investment Allowance of up to £50,000. Capital expenditure up to this level can be written off against tax in full in the year of acquisition, giving an effective rate of First Year allowance of 100%. Any expenditure above this limit is added to the 'pool' of the year's a Writing Down assets, and will receive a Writing Down Allowance each year. The rate at which this is given has, however, been reduced from 25% to 20%.

Groups of Companies will only be entitled to one Annual Investment Allowance between them, and this also applies to companies and other businesses which are under common control if either:

- they share premises, or
- they operate in the same or similar

Pool' was introduced for equipment that is integral to a building. These 'Integral Features' attract a Writing Down Allowance at the reduced rate of 10%. The type of assets to which this is applied includes:

- lighting and electrical systems
- cold water systems
- space or water heating systems
- air conditioning and air purification

lifts, escalators and moving walkways. Before the introduction of the Special Rate Pool any eligible assets of this nature were included in the main pool. These assets will continue to attract the normal Writing Down Allowance of 20% in the

3. Long life assets, that is assets with an expected life of more than 25 years previously attracted relief at 6% per annum. This has now been increased to 10% in line with the Integral Features, with

which they will be amalgamated.
4. Industrial and Agricultural buildings also attracted an allowance although at a much lower rate of 4%. These Industrial Building Allowances and Agricultural Building Allowances are both being

reduced by 1% each year until they are completely eliminated.

Allowances on cars are still restricted to the first  $\Sigma 12,000$  of costs although the rate is reduced from 25% to 20% meaning that the maximum allowance is now reduced from £3,000 per annum to £2,400 per annum. Similarly, the enhanced allowances of 100% are still available on


