# Editor's Comment



IF Warrington successfully with the big, regional shopping centres, something has to be done about parking. Not just in the south of the borough where the

the south of the borough where the council's recent proposals for payand-display parking have met with anger and dismay, but throughout the whole of Warrington.

When 5,000 people sign a petition asking for more free parking in Stockton Heath and Lymm and the council's response is to end free parking altragether. is to end free parking altogether, it is little wonder there is anger. And when those people discover that no other outlying area of the borough has to pay for parking at all, that

anger turns to outrage.

The council maintains that 30p is not a lot to pay for two hours parking, and this is true. But for the motorist stopping two minutes to pick up a pint of milk, 30p almost doubles the cost of milk.

In the neighbouring borough of Trafford the first hour of parking costs just 10p, two hours costs 30p and three hours 70p. This has resulted in more than twice as many people using the car parks, which presumably means more than twice as many people are

shopping locally.

But it is not only the pricing structure that is wrong in Warrington's flawed parking policy. In the town centre, on-street parking is free. But in most places there is a waiting limit of half an

hour.

Do any members of the council shop in Warrington town centre?

Do they realise the impossibility of the council state of the council shop has been always and the briefest that the briefest that the council should be considered by the counc completing anything but the briefest visit in half an hour?

This absurdly short waiting time makes comparison shopping, or a visit to a café, impossible.

visit to a caté, impossible.

Yes, we know about the multistorey car parks, but many people,
particularly women drivers and
the elderly, potentially the biggest
spenders, just won't use them!
Finally, let us consider the
purpose of the parking policy. The

council says it is not to make a profit. The idea is to encourage a turn-over of vehicles and deter allday parkers while at the same time balancing the books - a worthy

In fact, most of the income comes from people who simply forget to pay-and-display, or forget how long they have been away from their car. People who will probably, when caught by the prowling parking wardens, decide not to shop here again. And the parking service still runs at a thumping great loss!





# Peaceful protest from cannabis campaigners

PRO cannabis campaigners staged a peaceful protest on Warrington town hall lawn, openly smoking the drug, following the council's controversial drugs awareness campaign "It's Not Just a Joint," which suggested cannabis was stronger than heroin.

Around 20-30 protestors staged a sit down protest, many suffering from illnesses and conditions such a arthritis, which they claimed benefited from the use of cannabis. A spokesperson for the

A spokesperson for the Merseyside Cannabis Supporters Group, who were among the many who bombarded the council's facebook page, forcing it to close, following the launch of the campaign said: "Whatever statistics the council came up with for their claims that cannabis was stronger than heroin, were clearly flawed."

"The campaign was clearly targeting younger peole who could have been misled into thinking heroin was a safer drug. "Cannabis has been proven to

help people who suffer from various conditions including arthritis and MS.

"The fact that the council has

"The fact that the council has withdrawn the campaign and issued a public apology is too little too late." The council campaign had cost £1,500 prior to being withdrawn following a storm of protest and was followed by an apology to anyone who felt they had been misled by the drugs message

misled by the drugs message.

The campaign is currently being reviewed.

The 'It's Not Just a Joint' initiative was launched via the council's own electronic newsletter - "The Wire" and sparked outrage from pro-cannabis campaigners who accused the council of suggesting heroin was a safer alternative to cannabis.

Hundreds of people had commented on the council's Facebook page forcing the council to close the page.

The council's class B drug awareness initiative included the comment: "Did you know that cannabis can be stronger than heroin and cannabis related crime is now the most common drug related crime in Warrington?"

related crime in Warrington?"

The "It's not just a joint" campaign was due to run throughout July, August and September in Warrington, with adverts on buses and bus shelters in various locations around the town, and promotion via social media.

# Bus company launches 'Happy Sundays'!


LOCAL bus company Network Warrington has launched a special "Happy Sundays" service which runs until September 15

# Tweeters, texters and trolls

The problem of internet 'trolls' who send malicious, threatening or obscene messages in the often mistaken belief that they can remain anonymous, is growing. To many, tweeting and texting is as natural a part of the daily routine as eating and sleeping. It may therefore be easy to forget when typing into a keyboard, phone, or iPad that once sent a tweet, text, Facebook message or email will be impossible to retrieve. It may be re-tweeted or re-sent and seen by many other people. Although such activities are commonplace the consequences can be very serious if they are pursued in a malicious or thoughtless manner.

Given that Twitter alone currently has over half a billion users worldwide, sending an average of 58 million tweets every day, the task of monitoring internet traffic is a

gargantuan one. However the recent case involving Labour MP Stella Creasy illustrates how the police can and will intervene if they believe that a tweet or other electronic communication contravenes the criminal law. Two pieces of legislation are of particular relevance. An offence of harassment under the Protection Harassment Act 1997 is committed where there is a course of conduct involving at least two separate acts which causes alarm, distress or fear of violence to a particular individual. It often arises where a relationship has broken down and feelings of sorrow or anger are expressed persistently in an unwelcome or threatening manner. The course of conduct can include the sending of texts or other forms of electronic communication. Online bullying and trolling can also amount to harassment and whatever the context perpetrators can receive

prison sentences especially where threats of violence are made. An offence under the Communications Act 2003 does not require a course of conduct. A single electronic communication, can amount to an offence if it is grossly offensive, indecent, obscene or menacing.

Tweeters and bloggers also need to be wary of the possible consequences in civil law of commenting on a person's character, however briefly. The internet clearly provides useful tools for those who wish to organise campaigns, communicate their views about matters of public interest or simply to gossip in a public forum. But as the wife of the Speaker of the House of Commons discovered to her cost recently, the law of defamation applies to such communications just as it does to more traditional forms such as a newspaper article.

# Operating through a limited company

There are two main reasons why people consider using a limited company through which to trade.

Firstly, companies frequently enjoy a lower rate of tax than individuals, especially for levels of income that would take an individual into higher rate tax bands. Also, there are more generous tax deductions available in some circumstances, although that needs to be set against the more onerous rules concerning benefits-incar fuel. We have looked at this previously, and will no doubt come back to this at some point in the future.

Secondly, operating through a limited company helps to protect the personal assets of the individuals involved in the business. However, this protection is not complete. For instance, a bank may require a personal guarantee from a director before granting a loan or overdraft facility to a company. Also, the Courts may hold a director personally liable where there has been "wrongful trading", which normally means trading whilst insolvent.

Moreover, within the last month

Business Secretary Vince Cable has proposed making fraudulent or negligent directors of UK companies personally liable for the firm's debts as part of an overhaul of company rules. He also said that directors deemed to be reckless should be disqualified from being able to work at another firm, and that industry regulators should have the power to disqualify directors in their particular industries.

He also suggested a number of other proposals. These include extending the time limit for bringing director disqualification proceedings in insolvent company cases from two years to five, as well as preventing an individual banned from running companies outside the UK from being

companies outside the UK from being a director of a UK company.


Mr Cable said: "We're proposing tough measures to beef up the system for holding directors to account if they don't play by the rules or take their responsibilities seriously. This will mean honest, hard-working directors are not disadvantaged and will give the public greater confidence that irresponsible directors will face consequences for their actions."

We do not think that anyone could



disagree with the intentions behind these proposals. Business groups have generally supported them. However, concern has been expressed that the measures could go too far. Simon Walker, Director General of the Institute of Directors, said: "Businesses can and do fail. But this experience should not necessarily spell personal financial disaster for a director, or prevent a director from trying again."

shoppers. Now Deputy First Minister in the Northern Ireland Assembly, the former Sinn Fein chief negotiator in the Good Friday agreement, has accepted an invitation from peace campaigner Colin Parry, to re-visit the Peace Centre on September 18 to deliver the annual peace lecture on behalf of the Foundation for Peace - the international charity cofounded by Colin and wendy Parry following the bomb attack which claimed the live of their 12-year-old son Tim Parry alongside three-year-old Johnathan Ball.

The ticket only event will be hosted by Denis Murray, a former BBC Northern Ireland political correspondent.

McGuinness has acknowledged that he was a former IRA member but says he left in 1974. During a visit to the Peace Centre in 2001 he said he was sorry that

Irish republicans were responsible for the boys' deaths and that the Warrington bombing had been wrong.
