



College fund makes a difference

A FUND started by Priestley College has helped more than 124 young people to pursue their educational dreams and ambitions.

Since September the Priestley Education and Training Trust (PETT) has provided bursaries worth £7,646 to 73 students to help them pay for transport, trips, materials and equipment. One student with cerebral palsy

received a donation to help pay for a specialist wheelchair that enables

a specialist wheelchair that enables him to play competitive basketball. "As a college this is something of which we are very proud and delighted to see the difference it is making to the lives of so many young people," said Matthew Grant, Priestley's Deputy Principal and Chairman of PETT.

"We estimate that around 150 young people will benefit each year and that has been made possible thanks to the support of parents and local businesses."

Two scholarship awards have gone to students who are continuing their education at locations where they do not attract any funding via the Student Loan Company, including some of the country's leading drama colleges. A turther three scholarships

have gone to current students who will continue to receive support until they finish their courses at Priestley College assuming they meet requirements for progress and attendance.

PETT has also rewarded 48 past students for their achievements – either academically or in their contribution to college life – to the value of £4,000.

"The primary objective is to encourage, assist and enable young learners in their educational and objectives," Matthew.

"We are helping those who need support, but also recognising high achievers who have made a difference to college life."

Many parents have made donations to the registered charity as their children apply for places at Priestley after the college waived its application fee.

Others have made Gift Aid donations while many charity events – most staged by students and tutors – are held throughout the year in college.

An Amazon link on the college website ensures a donation is made to PETT whenever someone clicks through and buys from the online

Matthew said the support of parents had been vital in the success of PETT in its first full year.

"So many parents have supported the fund and we have

to thank them on behalf of all the students who have benefitted so far," he said.

World War One commemoration begins

WARRINGTON Borough Council marked 100 years since the start of World War One with the official naming of a room in the Town Hall.

The Mayor of Warrington, Cllr Ted Finnegan, opened the World War One Remembrance Room – formerly known simply as Committee Room Three - in front of council representatives including leader Cllr Terry O'Neill, deputy leader, Cllr Mike Hannon, and chief executive Professor Steven Broomhead.

The Mayor said: "As a council, we have thought long and hard about a fitting tribute that will leave a lasting legacy in Warrington. The Town Hall is and will always remain at the centre of our town - the place where the good people of Warrington flock at times of trouble and celebration.

"It is only right then that we rename this committee room. From today it will be officially known as the World War One Remembrance Room.

The council also invited residents to take part in the national "Lights Out" commemoration evening by leaving only one light or candle on between 10 and 11 pm

Millions of people across of the country took part in this shared moment of reflection.

The small ceremony also marked the start of the council's four-year First World War commemoration programme.

Education – all change again

Michael Gove's departure from the DfE has again put the spotlight on what is happening in our schools saus Paul Thompson, Deputy Head at Manchester Grammar School.

For decades education has been a priority for successive governments seeking to raise standards and participation.

These aims are laudable – there can be few things more important to

parents or the future of our country.

Initiatives have included Free Schools, Academies, the Pupil Premium, changes to inspection and exam reform. In recent years both A-levels and GCSEs have become modular in structure, with more coursework and more frequent exams.

These changes have enabled more children to achieve, but critics argue

that they have led to a lowering of standards, a re-sits culture, pressure on teachers to teach to the test and too much time spent on assessing rather than learning. Crucially, do modular courses provide sufficient challenge for all children? Some headteachers think not, and have switched to linear qualifications (with end-of course exams only) such as International GCSEs and, at

Sixth Form, International A-levels, e-Us and the International International Baccalaureate.

Government reforms aim to make UK-based GCSEs and A-levels linear once again, with greater academic challenge; critics fear that the new approach will leave behind the less academically able. This all underlines the weakness of a 'one size fits all' approach. Meanwhile, the future is uncertain: an election looms, the reform process is incomplete and changes will take years to bed in. What is certain is that education will remain on the agenda, whatever the government.

Peace Cup keeps memory alive

THE annual Peace Cup football match between Warrington Town and Crewe United from Lisburn in Northern Ireland, proved to be a great success - even if the match proved to be a one sided affair - with Warrington winning 10-0!

During the weekend visit Crewe United, who were the first organisation to visit Warrington offering the hand of peace following the bombing in March 1993, were based at the Village Hotel, who sponsored a civic welcome for the Mayor of Warrington Cllr Ted Finnegan and the Mayor of Lisburn Cllr Andrew Ewing, while also providing accommodation for the team. ieam.

The following day Warrington Borough Council, hosted a civic reception at the town hall prior the match, with Network

arrangements.

DUP Mayor of Lisburn cllr Andrew Ewing, who narrowly escaped injury himself in Ballynahinch in 1997 when he was unwittingly 1997 when he was unwittingly parked beside a car which had a bomb attached by the IRA five minutes before it exploded. He left the vehicle to get something to eat just a few minutes before the bomb went off.

The IRA were targeting an off duty soldier at the time who also narrowly escaped injury.

During the weekend he visited the Peace Centre (pictured right) created by Colin and Wendy Parry and also visited the scene of the bombings in Bridge Street. The Mayor commented: "I was humbled to have visited the Warrington peace centre and was impressed with the excellent facilities. It is nice

to see something so positive come out of such a horrendous atrocity
which resulted in Tim Parry and
Johnathan Ball losing their young
lives and many others injured."
The mayor also visited the scene

of the Warrington bombs in Bridge Street and presented Wendy Parry with a crystal candle holder on behalf of the people of Lisburn.

Wendy also gave the Mayor a personal tour of the Warrington peace centre.





Thumbs up for the planning department

WARRINGTON'S much criticised planning department has been given a "thumbs up" by applicants and councillors in a customer satisfaction survey.

Among applicants, 75 per cent said they were satisfied or very satisfied with the development management service compared with only 57 per cent in 2013.

Councillors and parish councils did not take part in the survey last year, but 73 per cent of councillors thought the planning enforcement service had improved in the last 18 months.

Only 11 per cent of councillors felt the service had not improved.

The survey was carried out in June and made comparisons with a survey carried out among applicants in June last year.

This year was the first time

the survey had also been sent to councillors - ward councillors and parish councils

Some 263 applicants were sent the survey but only 10 per cent -27 – responded.

Seventy ward councillors and parish councils were sent a councillors questionnaire but only 19 per cent responded – a total of 13.

A report to the borough's development management committee said the survey results provide a useful benchmark in which to measure user satisfaction going forward.

Staff reductions are to take place in development management from October 1 which could have an impact on performance. But this will be closely monitored and a similar survey is expected to be carried out next year.

Housing Trust launch new Neighbourhoods team

Neighbourhoods team. In 2012 the Trust's board committed £600,000 to help prepare the organisation and its tenants to deal with the affects of Welfare Reforms.

GGHT was quick to react to ensure it could support its tenants in the wake of these reforms. This has seen the development of an Employment Initiatives Team and the roll out of a series of plans to change the way the Trust delivers its services. its services.

These changes have seen GGHT place "digital" at the heart of its service delivery, bringing its staff even closer to the Trust's 20,000 tenants and residents. It has also led to the launch of a new dedicated Neighbourhoods team. The team consists of 28 Neighbourhood Officers, each delivering services Officers, each delivering services across small geographical areas consisting of just over 300 GGHT properties. The officers are using the latest digital technology, allowing them to spend more time in their specific patch, providing a visible presence to tenants and members of the community it also members of the community. It also allows them to spend more time supporting and safeguarding their most vulnerable tenants and their families, helping them make an even bigger difference to their lives.

The team offer a broad range of services for tenants going beyond

the roll of a conventional Housing Officer. Each Neighbourhood Officer will deal with issues from low level ASB, untidy gardens, arrears management, investment programme tenant liaison, welfare reform support in particular Universal Credit, signing up of new tenants and tenancy and estate
management. As well as offering
support in numeracy and literacy
issues to those tenants who need it.
The team operate fully paperless,
using iPads with software which


using iPads with software which was configured to automate GGHT's existing service forms to provide a quick and structured method of collecting information. Neighbourhood Officers are now able to provide several services. in one visit to a tenant's home. This may include taking card tenants payments, accessing details, organising repairs and immediately being able to update central records, all direct from their

GGHT Director of Housing Management, Peter Fitzhenry, commented: "It is good to see that our new Neighbourhoods team are already making such a positive start. We recognise that investing in neighbourhoods is about much more than place and that to make lasting improvements we need to support local residents to improve

"The new approach will allow our staff to get even closer to our tenants, building stronger relationships and finding a better balance between proactive and

reactive work. We are already getting a much better idea of our tenants current circumstances and are using this information to work with partners to help them tackle issues linked to health, financial difficulties, unemployment digital exclusion".

GGHT Tenant, Gill Caldwell said: "I think the changes are really positive and it is nice to see John, my GGHT Neighbourhood Officer more often out and about on my street. John has always been really helpful and nothing is ever too much trouble for him".


