# Putting the WOW in swimming and winning!

WARRINGTON Warriors is a swimming club going places. Founded in 1972, the club continues to build upon its successes turning children into competitive swimmers, winning regional, national and international medals.

Warriors of Warrington Swimming Club works closely in partnership with the borough council, which provides coaching for its top squads via the town's swim development scheme, together with water space allocated at each of the borough's pools. This partnership has seen year on year success for both swimmers and the club. However last season proved to be the club's most successful yet under the guidance of head coach Darren Ashley.
In 2008, they were promoted to the

Premier Division of the North West section of the National Swimming League. Warriors qualified for the first time in 14 years to compete in the national "B" Final, which took place in Sheffield in April last year, finishing in 6th place overall.

This year, Warriors qualified again and in April finished joint first.

During the year, the club has had four swimmers on the ASA English Talent programme; Andrew McLay and Rebecca Pye have been invited onto



the English Talent Programme Level 1 and Level 2 respectively and Aisha Thornton and Edward Shattock onto the English Talent Open Water Programme.

Warriors continued their winning ways at the Cheshire County Championships in March, Rebecca Pye breaking Helen Slatter's backstroke record which had stood for

#### Communication

Does true communication exist? After many years in practice I have come to the conclusion that it doesn't. We see examples and experience it every day.

The conversation which turns into a

row, because of a misunderstanding of a word, phrase or even the tone of voice used. The email which comes across cold, unfeeling or insensitive. Friendships near breaking point because of a misinterpretation of a written or verbal word or through the misinterpretation of an action or inaction. These are often misinterpreted due to failures in our own internal dialogue, the sleep deprived individual missing the nuances, frustration and agitation caused by tiredness. The stressed executive being assertive

which comes over as aggression.

These and many more examples can be seen around us every day, and often experienced too.

For true communication to exist, every person would have to have had same experiences, thoughts, upbringing, social background, beliefs and much more. Simply it does not exist; the best we can hope for is to convey our thoughts and feelings in an appropriate way to the individual to whom we are (trying to) communicate. Without this understanding on both sides long term friendships can dissolve within moments, irreparably damaged, or at best strained for some considerable time.

Our own internal dialogue can be misinterpreted too; we can label an emotion as anger, when it is simply frustration for example. We can also set ourselves up for failure by interpreting past events and outcomes negatively. Our own internal dialogue is very important to us, and it can make us feel successful or feel like a failure, it can make us feel happy or loved or unloved, valued or unvalued, positive or negative and

many other emotions as well.

What we tell ourselves has a massive impact on our lives, what we choose to believe can propel us to success and victory, or disappointment and defeat. As individuals having the correct label on the right emotion helps us to function well, while failure to do so will limit us in all aspects of our lives.

And yet getting this internal dialogue right is not really that difficult, we have to simply learn new ways to think, feel and behave. The person who does not feel confident or relaxed

simply has to learn to think differently. And it starts with learning that we have the power and authority in our lives. We are the controllers in our lives, not some remembered hurtful or limiting words from a dominant individual from our past, or present. Communication with others however is different; it is usually more complex especially when emotion is involved. Some would argue there is little logic in emotion, once communication breaks down into emotional responses it makes sense to try and calm things down, identify the cause and to correct it the best we can.

We all own the power or authority in our lives to think and believe what we want to about ourselves, though sometimes we have to recognise that we have that authority to do so first.

I hope I have communicated well!

# Wolves return ticket to Wembley

WARRINGTON Wolves secured a return ticket to Wembley after slaying Catalan Dragons 54-12 in the Challenge Cup Semi-Final at Widnes.

Cup fever is again gripping the town with more than 20,000 Warrington fans expected to make the journey down to London for the Final on Saturday August 28.

They routed Catalan Dragons 54-12 at the Stobart Stadium at Widnes, swiftly wiping out any fears that the French side could repeat their shock victory over Wolves at Perpignan last month.

Wolves dominated from the start. By half time they were leading 24-6 and there was no let up in the second half as they continued to pile on the pressure.

An estimated 10,000 Warrington fans were in the stadium, cheering on

the rampant Wolves. The result was never in doubt and the only fear now must be that it was too easy and that Tony Smith's team will face a much sterner test when they meet Leeds in the final.


However, there will be few who were not pleased to hear of Leeds' victory over St Helens, for if any side seems to have a jinx over Warrington it is the Saints.



# Success story from a disaster

IF it had not been for the disastrous foot and mouth outbreak of 2001, Warrington might never have had two of its most interesting shops.



Boutique Hoco, in the Old Market Place, was the brainchild of Chris and Honor Orme – but they might never have thought of it but for the spread of foot and mouth.

And if they hadn't opened Boutique Hoco, they may not have opened Pandora in Golden Square either.

There may not appear to be much of a connection between foot and mouth disease and the

and mouth disease and the jewellery, watches, bags, sunglasses and other fashion accessories that Chris and Honor sell.

But they started their business some 20 years ago, running stalls

at markets, moving on to country shows and events. They were doing well and hadn't thought of changing anything. Then foot and mouth struck – and

all the shows were cancelled.
Overnight their market vanished.
They realised they had to change
– and change fast.

- and change tast.

The first step was an accessory stall in the mall at Golden Square.

Then, on a buying trip to New York, the couple discovered PANDORA jewellery and realised it would be a big hit.

The rest, as they say, is history.

From that stall in the mall, Boutique Hoco has grown to have a shop in the Old Market Place, stores in Angleysey, Stockport and Newcastle under Lyme and more to open soon. They have also opened a store dedicated solely to PANDORA in Golden Square to cater for the growing demand for the jewellery.

All this growth at a time of recession earned Chris and Honor the Retailer of the Year title in the Warrington Business Awards.

Chris said: "The award is not just for us - its for our staff. We couldn't have done it without them.'

#### Job club success

The Jobs Club set up by MP David Mowat and Warrington South Conservatives has celebrated its latest successes with 80 per cent of those taking part finding new work.

Of the 20 people who took part in the latest programme, the fourth of its kind, 13 have already found a job and a further three decided to start their own businesses - an outstanding 80 per cent success rate.

The club was set up in April to help people who had lost their jobs during the recession. Participants are taught valuable job search skills including CV preparation, interview techniques and networking skills to help them stand out from the crowd Many of the

out from the crowd. Many of the people who have benefitted from the club had found themselves unemployed for the first time in their lives and had never had to search for a job before. To date 80 people have taken part in the programme with 60 going on to find work.

# How to get new business leads

FOR many business people the biggest sin of all is not asking for referrals for new business leads.

for referrals for new business

I asked a number of people "Do you ask for referrals" They all said that they did. Then I asked do you really ask for referrals and they actually said no they don't.

So do you really ask for referrals from your customers, friends, family sports team etc and the answer is probably no.

Quite often they don't even know that you are looking for more business and definitely don't look for referrals for you.

So why don't we ask. Either we have asked in the past and it didn't work or we are embarrassed about needing more business. It comes back to "business is great" if our network does not know we are looking for business they will not look out for it for us.

Some people seem to be embarrassed about needing more

Some people seem to be embarrassed about needing more business. You have people who know like and trust you, who would be only too willing to help you if you asked.

you asked.
Asking for referrals is a little bit like asking someone out for a date. Did the first person you asked out on a date say yes? Mine didn't. So I am now left with some choices.
I could ask them out again. I could assume that nobody will go out with me and never ask anyone again or I could go and ask someone else instead. Referrals are the same just because one person the same just because one person doesn't refer business to you go and

ask someone else. If you have an accountant in your network which doesn't refer business to you but could, just go and find another accountant!

If we do ask for referrals we often do it at the wrong time. This will all sound very obvious but people get it wrong. Utility companies ask a new customer to recommend them to a friend when they sign up a new contract. At this point the utility company has promised to save the customer money and provide a good service but has not yet delivered on that promise. So any referrals if they are lucky enough to get any will be very weak. It would not be until at least three months after they have been using the service and saving money that it would be worth asking for referrals. So the Utility Company should go back after three to six months saying "now that you are saving money with us and getting great service would there be anyone you could recommend us to?

This is a far more effective way to improve customer retention

improve customer relations and

improve customer relations and customer retention.

A travel agent I know rings her clients when they get back from their holidays to see if everything was as good as they expected and they had a good time and also asking for reterrals. This is a far better approach than if they were to ask at the time of the holiday

booking.

So have a look at when is it that my client is most satisfied with the work that I have done for them. Is it at the point of the sale or after when results can be seen? For different professions it will be different but work out when the best time to ask for referrals for you are and then just do it. The worst thing that can happen is they say no.

# Wildflowers attract a rare visitor

A RARE visitor has been attracted by wildflower areas created along busy roads in Warrington – the wildflower brown hare.

Over the last three years, the council has created colourful wildflower areas along roadsides in Birchwood, Winwick and Penketh and these have attracted bees, butterflies, ladybirds and other insects.

Local ecologist and wildlife expert Jeff Clarke was looking for ladybirds among the wildflowers along Widnes Road near his home at Penketh, however, when he spotted the hare.
He said: "I have lived here for six

years and never seen one on the previously short mown roundabout



before and I'm always on the lookout for wildlife.

"There is no question the hare would not have been here if it wasn't for the tall flowers to hide in."

Sarah Bennett, Cheshire region biodiversity manager, said: "Hares have suffered a dramatic decline in numbers since the turn of the 20th century and are now classified as a UK Biodiversity Action Plan species.

"Thanks to local conservation effort it is great news that we are starting to see more of them within the region.

Since 2007 the borough council, in conjunction with seven local parish councils, have created almost five hectares of wildflower alongside the town's roads. More than 300 school children have also been involved in sowing seeds.

THE oldest chapel in Warrington is opening its doors to the public as part of National Heritage Day.

Founded in 1662, it is the oldest chapel in Warrington and has links with many well-known people and the Warrington Academy. Writer Anna Barbauld was a member and John Howard, the prison reformer, worshipped in the chapel. Joseph Priestley - the discoverer of oxygen - was both married and ordained a minister in the chapel and Frederick Monks, who gave the Golden Gates to Warrington, is buried in the burial ground.

Also buried there is the young son of Elizabeth Gaskell the novelist and her husband William, a Latchford boy, who became one of the foremost Unitarian Ministers of his day and a noted educationalist and social reformer.

On Sunday September 19 at 3pm the chapel is holding its Annual Academy Service, when there will be talk on the life of William Gaskell.

# Allowable expenses against income from employment

We thought we would revisit the topic of expenses that are allowable against income from employment. The tax office tend to vigorously resist any claim as to be

tend to vigorously resist any claim as to be deductible the expense must be "wholly, exclusively and necessarily" incurred "in the course of performing the duties". This sets the hurdle very high as it precludes any element of choice.

For instance, a large number of people have a home office, and may think that they should be able to claim any costs incurred in running that home office against their income. However, before allowing such a claim the tax office would expect to see not only that the employee did actually perform a only that the employee did actually perform a substantial amount of duties at home but also that the home office had facilities available to the employee that were not available elsewhere, and thirdly that there was no element of choice in where he could work.

The main expense that is claimable is that of travel expenses incurred when the employee is away from his main place of employment. The cost of normal commuting is not deductible, nor is the cost of going

from one employment to another. However, the employee can claim 40p for every mile that he actually travels when attending at a that he actually travels when attending at a temporary workplace, plus 5p per mile for any passengers carried on those journeys. Similarly, he can claim the cost of any public transport used in getting to or from that temporary workplace, and also the costs of subsistence whilst there.

The rules in deciding whether a workplace is temporary or permanent are fairly complex, as are the rules in determining how many miles can be claimed for each journey. Basically, a workplace is temporary provided that it neither lasts nor is expected to last more than 24 months, and also that it attendance at that workplace does not extend to the whole of the period of that practicular employment.

particular employment.

This is one of the main advantages for some people to operate through a limited company even if they are "caught" by the IR35 regulations. If a temporary employment contract is obtained that will only last (say) 12 months then if the employee works directly for the employer any travelling


expenses incurred in getting to the employers premises will be disallowed as the are the place of employment for the whole of the period of employment. However, if the employee forms a limited company and provides the services through that company than the travelling expenses became then the travelling expenses become deductible provided only that further contracts are obtained throughthat limited

contracts are obtained intrograms.

The second main allowable expense is subscriptions paid to professional and other bodies which are approved for this purpose by the tax office.


