She is already enjoying rotation on several radio stations across the





The Mind-Body Connection

It is becoming more widely recognized that there is a connection between our thoughts and feelings and how they affect us physically, and ultimately determine the state of our health.

There is a lot of media attention on the foods we eat and how our environment can affect us. Issues such as obesity, stress, depression, anxiety and chronic health problems are regularly highlighted on the radio and TV. Therefore we have no excuses not to address our own environmental concerns, i.e. what we do and how we live affects our mental and physical health. However, if it was so easy, we would all be doing it. So what stops us changing the things that affect our health?

We are very complicated beings and are influenced by our environment on many levels, externally and internally. The external factors may be more easily fixed, however, that depends on circumstances and the internal factors, i.e. your irrational mind.

You may be aware that the mind and body are connected by the Central Nervous System from the Enteric Nervous System in the Gut (called the second brain) to the brain in your head. Think about the

statement 'I know it in my gut', then you may get some understanding how communication travels between our two separate brains. Are you confused yet? Maybe part of you understands this, and if that is so it is most likely your gut feeling, rather than your head.

How does how environment affect this communication between gut and head? What you may find most surprising, it is mostly your internal environment, i.e. your own thoughts and belief system, which has been further influenced by your own DNA. This will have been externally influenced by our ancestors, and the environmental factors that were around in past generations as well as our own.

Do you often feel that life is moving too fast, and you can't keep up, are you still being influenced by your parents and grandparents beliefs and actions whilst attempting to move with the changes around you. An example, in point, technology – can you keep up with it?

All the factors discussed here influence our coping mechanisms and ultimately our levels of stress, resulting in health concerns. If our 'gut feeling' doesn't match up with what our head says, then chaos erupts. Our internal beliefs, attitudes and responses are

triggered and usually we revert back to the norm. This can result in inappropriate or child-like coping skills leaving us feeling helpless and out of control.

The good news is that change is always possible. Education is well documented as a way of creating positive change in people. If we learn new things about ourselves as well as about our environment, that new awareness opens doors for us. Reading this article may have already started the process for you, and started you on a journey into finding out more about the mind-body connection and how it affects you and your health.



There are also many ways that you can learn to listen to your body and to recognize the signs it gives you about what needs to change to improve your health.



Demolition work starts on Bridge Street quarter

IT'S been another very busy month with lots of development activity, the most visible of which has to be the start of the demolition works on the Bridge Street Quarter project.

The bulldozers are in and very soon all of the old Time Square buildings will be down. Construction will start later this year.

Just up the road at Stadium Quarter the external works for the Business Incubator are nearing completion and the internal fit out will soon begin in readiness for a September opening. The next few weeks will see a start on site on the construction of UTC Warrington which will be situated next door.

Across town at Omega the

external cladding is now visible on the huge 685,000sq ft HQ for The Hut Group and most of the cladding is now on the 240,000sq ft unit for Plastic Omnium. The extension of Skyline Drive which will connect Junction 8 of the M62 across to Omega Boulevard by the Royal Mail Depot is set to complete in August.

Warrington is a town in demand by business that's for sure. A recent report by JLL singled Warrington out as having the highest economic growth in the North and the fifth

highest overall in the UK. They predicted that Warrington will have second highest employment growth in the UK in the office sector over the next five years, largely buoyed by the strength and growth of the town's nuclear cluster.

The JLL report was reflective of the findings contained in Warrington's Annual Property Review which reported that 2014 was a record year for investor take-up, its second best year for deals and third best year for offices.

It was interesting then to see that further new research by Colliers International has indicated that the supply of available large scale Grade A industrial and logistics space of more than 100,000 sq ft in the North West of England will run out in early 2016, with the region having just nine months' worth of supply left.

The area zoned for industrial and logistics space at Omega is rapidly running out but I'm sure that the Colliers findings will encourage take up of the last remaining plots. Similarly the JLL report will, hopefully, spur and encourage a start on the office element at Omega and also within other locations across the area.

College students eye-opening day at St. Rocco's

HEALTH and social care students from Priestley College learned about end of life care during an educational day at St. Rocco's.

The 20 pupils, aged 17-18, spent the day learning about service provision and the role of hospices in the management of life-limiting illnesses, in preparation for college exams in June.

Patient David Chilton, 52, joined the students to talk about his illness and how he is helped by the hospice.

David, who was diagnosed with bowel cancer in December last year and attends the Day Unit once a week, said: "It was a bit nerve-wracking at first talking to the students but I really enjoyed it and they seemed to get something from it. It's important for people to learn about hospice care and what goes on at St. Rocco's."

Lynda Bond, Health and Social Care Tutor, accompanied the girls for their visit. She said: "Today has been a wonderful learning experience for the students, helping them bring their learning to life and prepare for their exams. They have all been surprised by the wonderful facilities at the Hospice and now have a much better understanding of what goes on there."

Olivia Todhunter, 17, said: "Before today I thought hospices were just a place people went to die but I've seen so much more and it's really opened my eyes."

Fellow student Carina Harper, 18, added: "I've learned that St. Rocco's looks after families as well as patients, so the support is there for everyone."

The educational visit is part of a larger initiative run by St. Rocco's, which engages with schools and colleges across Warrington. RoCON! aims to challenge misconceptions around hospices and end of life care, and change young people's attitudes to death and dying.

The initiative is led by Jan Temenos, who added: "It was wonderful to welcome the college students to the Hospice. As future care professionals, it was fantastic to see how much they learned and how their perceptions changed over the day. I would also like to acknowledge the St Rocco's team, who gave their time to making the day such a success."

Firewalking to raise money for Nepal victims

A FIREWALKING event is being held at Sankey Valley St James' CE Primary School to raise money for victims of the Nepal earthquake and deaf people in the country.

The Deaf Nepal Expedition 2015 is aiming to raise a minimum of £30,000, which will go towards Shree Buddha Dahal Deaf School in Damauli, Tanahun District in Nepal for a Hostel proposal, as well as welcoming donations for Quake Aid.

Nepal was recently hit by the worst earthquake for 80 years at a scale of 7.9, damaging many buildings including some dating back hundreds of years, with more than 5,000 people losing their lives.

The firewalking event will take place on Saturday June 13th from 4pm to 8pm, with entry to watch free of charge. There will be stalls and activities including face painting, a bouncy castle and candy floss.

In November 2015, a team of people will be flying out to Nepal to visit Deaf schools, as well as Deaf associations with the aim to develop friendships with the Nepalese Deaf schools and to offer support by providing resources and materials to improve their quality of

life and access to education.

Led by Warrington based Greg Pierssene, the team is made up of 20 deaf and non-deaf participants, with everyone involved competent in the use of British Sign Language.

Pierssene said: "Back in 2013, I was a participant in the expedition team. Proposals were sent in for how the fundraised monies would be spent. We accepted a few of the many proposals that were received. Examples of these are; the building of safety walls, kitchen refurbishment and dormitory furnishing for Taplejung Deaf school in the Far North East of Nepal which we have already visited to witness the safety walls after the completion of the works.

"Before our donations, the school only had 9 Deaf children and has now seen significant growth to over 30 Deaf children due to the increasing awareness via media. In the UK, education is as a right to us but sadly in Nepal, education seems unnecessary to many citizens.

"However, education is more important to the Nepalese population now. Vulnerable Nepalese Deaf children are doubly disadvantaged because they are uneducated and have a disability.



"Their parents do not think they have any future at all and language between the parents/hearing people and Deaf children is very limited.

"We have witnessed this in Taplejung despite Nepal having their own Sign Language just like British Sign Language in the

UK. We want to see this situation addressed and want to see a lot more Deaf children in education, therefore equaling a better quality of life and future."

Civic Society to relaunch



WARRINGTON Civic Society is set to relaunch following an initial meeting to gauge interest in the town.

The event at Fairfield and Howley Community Hub was organised by local resident John Shipley, who moved to Warrington from Scarborough just over two years ago.

He said: "Warrington has lost too many of its historic and iconic buildings over the years and those that remain deserve a strong preservation effort.

"With many new developments proposed it is also important that these are of a high standard, enhancing the built environment of our town."

At the meeting he outlined various buildings which have been lost since 1968 which include Arpley Station, Bold Street Methodist Church, the Old Market Hall, the Centenary Theatre on Winwick Road and the theatre on old Scotland Road and more recently the Old Grammar School and Mr Smith's/The Ritz Cinema.

"When you see what has been lost it is worth fighting for what we have got left."

He outlined successes in the town including the recently refurbished Grappenhall Walled Gardens at Grappenhall Heys, which had now become a successful visitor attraction. Warrington Civic Society was originally formed in 1961 and is still a registered charity but became inactive a few years ago. Existing members James Gibson, Harry Wells, Louise Doughton and Ian Smith attended the event to show their support.

James said: "A lot of Warrington was lost in the 1960s when conservation laws were weak. Concerns for our heritage took off in the 1970s and the biggest impact was the Warrington New Town, when three-quarters of our town was lost. It is hard to believe that in the 1950s Warrington was described as a fine example of a Georgian town."

Conservative 'promises'

So the polling booths have closed, the votes have been counted, the swing-o-meter has been put away for another five years, and we now have a new government. All of the parties made many promises made before the election, including the Conservatives, so now let us all hope that those promises are kept. Let us have a look at some of the main ones affecting taxation, which can be located on and after page 27 of the Conservative manifesto.

Firstly, we have been promised that there will be a "five year lock" on income tax, VAT and national insurance. This is a promise that during the period from May 2015 to May 2020 there would be:

- no increases in income tax rates,
- no increases in VAT, nor to its scope, and
- no increases in National Insurance nor to its ceiling.

More specifically, we have been promised that:

- Nobody working 30 hours on minimum wage will ever pay income tax
- The tax-free personal allowance will rise to £12,500 by 2020
- The 40p tax threshold will increase to £50,000 by 2020 and will always rise at least in line with inflation

It certainly seems strange that whilst the government has for many years considered it to be a legal requirement that employers are required to pay a minimum hourly wage they have never in the past been slow in taking some of that minimum wage in tax and national insurance.

Secondly, we have also been promised that the family home will be taken out of Inheritance Tax by increasing the threshold for married couples to £1m. This will be achieved through a new transferable main residence allowance of £175,000 per person. The manifesto says that this will be paid for by reducing the tax relief on pension contributions for people earning more than £150,000, most probably by reducing the maximum contributions on which relief is given, currently £40,000 each year, by £1 for every additional £2 of income above £150,000 to an allowance of £10,000 a year, effectively giving a marginal income tax rate of 67.5% between £150,000 and £210,000 for those making contributions.

Two more legends inducted into Hall of Fame

TWO more Warrington legends have been inducted into the Past Players' Hall of Fame - association vice-president Alistair Brindle and former winger Mark Forster.

Forward Alistair played 277 games for Warrington from 1957-1969. During that period Warrington didn't really win much, but he did win the Lancashire Cup twice. In 1959 against St Helens, who were a team of internationals and were hot favourites. The match was played at Wigan in front of over 40,000 fans.

Warrington also won the cup again in 1966 when they beat Rochdale.

Meanwhile Forster's career spanned three decades and he had the unique honour of two testimonials at the club in 1993 and 2003.
