I have been impressed with the new temporary market and can't wait to see the new one when it comes out onto Bridge Street through the old Boots building.

Hopefully then we will have a town centre we can be proud of.

to three hours, subject to getting your ticket stamped in the market, there is plenty to be positive about.

Meanwhile I would like to take this opportunity of welcoming Warrington Wolves' new coaching team of Steve Price and Andrew Henderson.

If their passion and enthusiasm can be matched on the pitch we could be looking forward to an exciting season ahead.

Beth's Princess dreams come true

AS a young girl Beth Trainer lived in a fairytale world of Disney Princess films to help cope with the tragic loss of her mother.

Now her dreams have come true after setting up her own "Magical memories" business which has seen her land roles as Cinderella and Rapunzel in festive shows.

He is one of the most selfless people I know, and is the greatest father I could have ever wished for as he gave the strength and support of himself and of a mother who could sadly no longer be with us.

"During this time, I was still working my way through high school, where I had constant waves of up's and down's because I was not only physically changing but quickly changing as a person too. I was coming to terms with loss and learning how to cope with sadness. I was facing my own fears. Fears of failing those I loved, fears of no longer being liked at school as I no longer knew who I was. I had lost my confidence and it replaced itself with fear. Fears I may fail at making my family proud."

Beth added: "The best part of my story is years later everything changed in my life. I realised that what I was doing wasn't working for me. I tried to be more like myself and less of this idea that our media

creates of 'perfection'.

"After years of trying and failing but being okay to fail, knowing I was happy with failure as it was one step closer to my dream. I am now the owner and founder of the Warrington-based entertainment business 'Magical Memories', which has grown from strength to strength, incorporating Superheroes as well as Princesses and bringing magical memories all across the UK.

"My story is now my fuel, and I want to inspire more people to live the best life they can".

It is now a year since Beth was "blessed" by Miss British Isles to be representing her County by being crowned Miss Cheshire Elegance 2016/2017. "The glistening cherries on top of my cake then came only a few months later after being kindly made an Ambassador for Warrington through charitable giving, and volunteering to make a positive difference.

"I try to always give more than I already have. Mother Teresa said, 'Just do small things with great love'.

"This love of helping others, then made me a Patron for the sensational Shannon Bradshaw Trust, and it is an honour and a privilege to be part of their special journey. My partner Matt and I are also proud to announce that we have both been recently made Patrons for the heart-warming charity 'Room at the Inn - The Y Project' through our organisation 'In The Know Warrington'.

College celebrates Black History

COLLEGE students have gained an insight into black heritage and embraced diversity as part of Warrington & Vale Royal College's celebration of Black History Month.

A variety of workshops and enrichment activities have given students at the college's Warrington and Hartford Campuses the chance to explore the importance of tolerance and respect in today's society.

Black History Month is an annual event aimed at promoting and celebrating black contributions to British society, as well as fostering an understanding of black history in general.

As part of the week-long celebration – the first in a series of events this academic year aimed at promoting equality and diversity – students visited the International Slavery Museum in Liverpool to learn about the turmoil and hardship of black slaves. Wall and book displays were created in the college's libraries to promote discussion and enhance the student learning experience.

Cheshire Police delivered a number of talks on hate crime, focusing on the theme of black minority groups and how to combat and report all hate crime, while students were also able to take part in demonstrations of Capoeira – an Afro-Brazilian martial art combining elements of dance, acrobatics and music.

Budding young actors and dancers at the college were able to take part in African dance workshops thanks to a visit from

the 2 Dance dance company, culminating in a performance of their own choreographed piece during the college's weekly staff briefing.

Emma Bennett, a level 3 dance student at the Warrington Campus, said: "Working with Tinu and Karim from 2 Dance gave us a fantastic opportunity to learn about black history through dance. Learning about African dance helped us to better understand the culture and also how this kind of dance

and movement is used to express freedom."

The week ended with a screening of the thought-provoking film, 12 Years a Slave.

Following the screening, one student said: "I have learned that it is important to acknowledge the fact that black people were treated in a disgusting way. We as a society need to become more accepting of others and not have this separation and discrimination anymore."

Michael Smith, Director of Teaching, Learning and Professional Development, and Equality & Diversity Co-ordinator at the

college, said: "As a college, we are proud to endeavour to celebrate diversity each and every day. Celebrating Black History Month has allowed us to further enhance staff and student awareness and encourage discussion and debate. By celebrating and embracing diversity, we are ensuring students understand the importance of tolerance, respect and treating everyone equally."

Michael added: "We are passionate as a college to embrace equality & diversity as movement, not a moment. It is at the heart of what we do."



"It was great to get out on the streets of Warrington, actively take part in the clean-up and talk to the team about the work they do."



Bus company launches discounted '£1.70 to Westy' scheme

NETWORK WARRINGTON has revealed its latest discounted route, offering a cheaper service for passengers travelling to and from the interchange via Knutsford Road.

The number 2 and 12 buses now run into the town centre, and the number 1 and 11 services that run from the town centre back to Westy, are all subject to the new, cheaper ticketing scheme.

The discounted fares – £1.70 for a single and £3 return – which apply to all Network Warrington services along Knutsford Road, include stops like the cenotaph, Victoria Park, Kingsway South and Whitley Avenue.

Ben Wakerley, managing director at Network Warrington, said: "I'm pleased to announce another discounted route for our customers.

"We have listened again to our passengers who have asked for us to review our fares and I'm delighted that we've been able to

reduce the ticket costs for those travelling along Knutsford Road.

"The new ticketing structure comes into effect on a trial basis, but if passengers continue to use these discounted bus routes and support a truly multi-modal Cheshire, we will be able to maintain the cheaper fares.

"We've had success introducing lower fares on the 'Dallam Discount' and 'the Pops', so I'm equally hopeful that the new '£1.70 to Westy' scheme will prove a success for our customers too."

In 1993 the IRA exploded two bombs without warning in Warrington, killing two boys Johnathan Ball (3) and Tim Parry (12), seriously injuring 54 people.

Nearly 25 years on, in Manchester, 22 people lost their lives, numerous others sustained life-changing injuries and there are hundreds of survivors. In recent months, in London we have witnessed major four incidents.

Extremism isn't new.

Our founders, Colin and Wendy Parry, like many other victims, looked for answers to why extremists had murdered their son, and realised that a way to stop people using violence was to work with children to build their abilities and resilience to cope within the modern world. It started simply by bringing young people together, recognising differences and sharing their similarities.

The Parry's understood that you had to go further and work with families, women (mothers), communities, to support survivors of terror attacks and confront perpetrators.

The Peace Foundation is a leading UK charity that works to prevent violent extremism and support those affected. In the last four months, over 650 people

affected by the recent attacks have sought our support. But, importantly we have also been considering how best to prevent such an attack happening again.

In the days after the bombing, we experienced an incredible sense of community and amazing acts of kindness. However, as time has moved on, that 'spirit' of action has not been sustained. A woman, whose husband died in the Tunisia attack, summed it up: "I got frustrated a few months ago after the attacks in London, Westminster, Manchester and Finsbury Park, but took heart from the people and communities that came together, to help one another and I saw resilience. I decided it wasn't enough to see the flags lowered to half mast, for arrangements to be made for a minute's silence and books of condolence to be made available, whilst respectful it didn't bring about change. A day later everyone was back to working as 'normal' but for me and all those who have ever lived through, or been affected by a terror or hate crime, well, life just doesn't go back to 'normal' and no doubt, it never will."

That is why we need to take action and why we all need to 'stand together' to create lasting peace and to challenge those who use violence and show them that we are strong, resilient and unified

against hatred and violent extremism.

Violent extremism and terrorism must be confronted, and we need to capture the spirit and actions show in defiance of the recent attacks to defeat hatred and promote peace. Please join us. #WeStandTogether

Travis Frain - The latest addition to our Board of Trustees

In March of this year, I travelled to London with a class from my University, as part of my studies towards a History with Politics degree. However, the trip was cut short when myself and three other friends were injured in the Terror attack that took place on Westminster Bridge, and later in the Palace grounds itself.

It has certainly been a difficult few months since then, both physically and psychologically, made worse by the lack of support from sources where I would have expected. Speaking to other survivors, not only from the attack that I was involved in, but also from others that have happened previously, I've found that I have not been the only person in this position. The only support I received came from the people running the Survivor's Assistance Network which is a

programme of the Tim Parry Johnathan Ball Peace Foundation. They have been by my side throughout, supporting and aiding me in any way possible. Terry, Donna, and Will have done a fantastic job since then and I cannot thank them enough.

I'm a strong believer in giving something back, one good turn deserves another, and as such I applied to become a Trustee of the Foundation a little under six months following the attack. I wish to help the Foundation to grow over the years to come, and channel publicity towards the charity, thereby raising the profile of the amazing work it carries out. It is also my hope that I will be able to address the numerous issues that I and others faced in the aftermath of these heinous attacks. Whether that be the surprising torrents of abuse received, or

the sense of abandonment that many have felt upon returning home – for example we were not assigned Police Liaison Officers, as is usually the case for victims of serious violent crimes.

If I can succeed in my goal to steer attention towards the Foundation, even if it is just to make more people of aware of it, then I'll be more than happy.



The International Day of Peace - Leading Women Take Centre Stage

In September, the Foundation held its inaugural Women for Peace conference to mark International Peace Day 2017. Leading female campaigners, academics and politicians took centre stage for the event at the Peace Centre, which was attended by 70 of our Women for Peace programme alumni.

Speakers included Moss-Side anti-violence campaigner Dr Erinma Bell who was the first woman to be honoured with a sculpture in Manchester Town

Hall and Nicola Benyahia, Director of Families for Life, an organisation working to support and empower families to combat radicalisation. Closing the event was Tabitha Morton, Women's Equality Party candidate in May's Liverpool City Region Mayoral race. Tabitha campaigned to bring greater attention to the issue of gender equality across the northern powerhouse.

Also in attendance was Figen Murray, mother of Martyn Hett, one of the

22 victims of the Manchester Arena bombing. She spoke about the influence of mothers in tackling radicalisation and how she is working with the Tim Parry Johnathan Ball Peace Foundation to build a positive legacy from her son's death.

Hannah Larn, project lead for the Women for Peace programme said: "Around the world, women are disproportionately affected by violent conflict. Yet despite this, women are frequently excluded from the measures taken to seek peace - from grassroots level right up to international peace agreements. The Peace Foundation's Women for Peace project aims to train and support women in preventing and resolving community and family conflict and challenging extreme and prejudiced narratives. To date, the Peace Foundation has worked with over 200 women across the North of England. We want to empower women to become effective peacebuilders in their communities."



Small Steps for Peace

The Peace Foundation has designed a programme named 'Small Steps for Peace' which is targeted at Year 5 (9-10-year-old) school children.

This project has proved to be an excellent way of promoting society's finest values to the young. Peace Studies is not about singing kumbaya and hoping for the best, but embodies the ethos of positive action.

Ciara Kinsella, the Programme Lead, said: "We have seen 'Small Steps for Peace' delivered in the classroom and watched

how children respond to it. We have also heard the testimony of teachers who are using our programmes to improve their pupils' behaviour and understanding of one another. The Foundation has developed a Teachers pack which includes a book, games and activities, which are simple on the surface, but help young people to explain and address their feelings with confidence. The aim is that as they move into their teenage years and adulthood they will have the tools to resolve problems without violence".

Nick Taylor, CEO of the Peace Foundation, said: "The Government is setting up a commission to counter extremism and

promote British values in schools. We think they must go further, we are talking about fundamental human values, like compassion, courage, kindness. These are difficult to teach but they can be learned through experience."



Small Steps for Peace' gets a commendation from OFSTED

Although the Foundation has designed this programme to work with Year 5 pupils, it piloted a programme for Year 2 which has received a commendation from OFSTED. Here are their comments...

Pupils genuinely care about others and demonstrate a high capacity for empathy. 'Small Steps for Peace' gave pupils in Year 2 opportunities to explore their understanding of peace. The written responses from pupils demonstrated a high level of emotional understanding and engagement.

Young Women for Peace host The Great Get Together

In June, alumni from the Young Women for Peace project in Liverpool used their new peacebuilding and leadership skills to organise a community picnic. Across the country, 9.3 million people took part in various events for the 'Great Get Together' to commemorate the one-year anniversary of the murder of Jo Cox, and to celebrate communities coming together. The group in Liverpool aged 16 to 24 years old, hosted a public event in Princes Park on a sunny Sunday afternoon.

The event was attended by over 60 local community members. There was a bring and share picnic, face painting, arts and crafts, henna, and outdoor sports. Children and adults had the chance to meet their neighbours, and speak to those who they had not met previously.

One attendee commented "I heard about the event on BBC Radio Merseyside, and was keen to bring along my 8-year-old daughter. I want her to witness the power that young women have to make a positive difference."

Young Women for Peace was a six-week long project held in Liverpool, and at the Peace Centre. During this time, 15 young women explored their own identities and the struggles they sometimes faced. They built confidence in conflict resolution skills through role plays, and developed leadership abilities including public speaking. These skills were then put into practice when the young women hosted a community event to celebrate the end of the course, and to explore how their friends and family felt about issues they see in their own city.

Launch of the #WeStandTo

On Monday 25th September, the Manchester Evening News, along with the Peace Foundation, Greater Manchester Police and families affected by the Manchester Arena bombing, called on all its readers to join our campaign for a more peaceful, more tolerant and even more caring place to live.

Our three goals are:

1 To make sure every child in Greater Manchester is taught about how to solve life's problems peacefully and without turning to violence

2 To encourage and celebrate acts of love and kindness – especially when you are helping someone you don't know

3 To fight every kind of crime which is driven by hatred and instead get people from different communities talking – and together stand up to violent extremism and hate crimes

Manchester Evening News editor Rob Irvine said: "A dreadful, unforgivable atrocity happened in Manchester on May 22. This was an act of evil and hatred,

pure and simple. We had the sad duty to report the tragedy of 22 lives stolen, of many more lives scarred forever, of families and communities wracked by grief, sadness and anger. We also told countless stories that spoke of a city and its people filled with love, affection and a genuine desire to help others. In those first few days. Many thousands of you sent out a defiant message to those who want to divide our society through hatred and that message was 'We Stand Together'. So, let's take that message and turn it into positive action, starting today."

Nick Taylor, CEO of the Tim Parry Johnathan Ball Peace Foundation said: "Over the coming weeks, we will show you how individuals, families, businesses, community organisations, schools, colleges and faith groups can get involved. The Foundation will offer schools, communities and individuals, opportunities to run projects and take actions. Violent extremism and terrorism must be stopped, and we need to capture the spirit and actions shown by Mancunians to defeat hatred and promote peace. Please join us."

Communities for Peace Project

One of the Peace Foundation's Projects has made an enormous difference in the Moston area of Manchester.

Approached by the Council for our help, Christine Cox, the Project Leader, visited the neighbourhood to find what she described as a strong community spirit which had been tested by relatively elevated levels of

deprivation and rapid change.

Tension within the Moston area was much deeper than concerns about noise, parking, litter or loitering. Community tension /anxieties were about poverty, social change, people feeling left behind, ignored, threatened, misunderstood, powerless or victimised.

Christine's approach was to engage with Moston residents from diverse cultural backgrounds. To help resolve their differences, they were brought together firstly to discuss their issues and then, through several learning exercises that encourage bonding. This programme enabled people who have been bitterly at odds to take part in a three months training course to deal with their differences calmly.

Christine said: "Our work typically starts with 'conflict analysis' that looks at flashpoints in the area. We then recruit

people from these communities for free training at Peace Centre - training that can result in them emerging as local leaders".

"The programme gives people the skills to manage community conflicts, an awareness of how beliefs and values can impact on conflict, and to empower people through training them in public speaking and leading dialogue. It climaxes with an event which brings together scores of people from diverse backgrounds from the same neighbourhood".

Young People's Conference

Why Should Young People be Involved in Peace?

The Foundation welcomed 100 young people from across the North West to the Peace Centre to discuss the question 'Why Should Young People be Involved in Peace?'.

The morning began with presentations from two of the Foundation's projects involving film making – RadEqual and Think Again. Schools and colleges from across Manchester created short films to address issues such as bullying, racism and unhealthy relationships. The films stimulated conversations about important challenges faced by young people, and issues that they wanted to express. These films are available as a free online resource at www.think4peace.org.

Students had the opportunity to participate in breakout sessions on a variety of topics. The sessions explored the role of young people in political

processes; learning about the history and significance of peace symbols; looking at conflict resolution skills; exploring how media and peace interact, and developing key skills of how to facilitate open conversations. We invited partner organisations to support the conference and run some of the breakout sessions, including the Politics Project, based in Manchester, the East Cheshire Quaker Peace Education Project, Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament, and young people from Harehills in Leeds who have been engaged with the Peace Foundation through the Big Lottery Funded project, Bridging Communities.

Members of the audience were moved by the powerful songs of Parrs Wood High School choir, who sang alongside Ariana Grande at the One Love concert following the Manchester attack earlier in the year.

Colin Parry, our Chairman, spoke to the young people about the history of the Foundation and why young people have a big part to play in the future. During the day, two young peacemakers, Ben Osu and Laura Rietdyk from Liverpool, spoke about their experiences and the challenges they face as young people working towards peace. Later, Ben and Laura helped facilitate table discussions and asked participants to share their thoughts on how to overcome these challenges and explore their own role as young people in promoting peace in their communities.

The Foundation believes that to achieve sustainable peace, we must continue to seek collaborative ways to engage young people in peacebuilding.

Charity Golf Day 2017


The Foundation hosted its annual Golf day in September at Warrington Golf Club and an enjoyable day was had by all.

Civic Society would have opposed historic water tower demolition

WARRINGTON Civic Society say they would have opposed the demolition of the iconic Garnett's cabinet works water tower which they say will be a "sad loss to the town's heritage and skyline."

But they have welcomed news of the proposed restoration of the oldest building on the site - the former industrial school and council offices.

The Garnett Cabinet Works building on Barbauld Street, Warrington, will be demolished due to its unsafe and dangerous condition.

A Court order has been issued under Section 77 of the Building Act 1984 for the demolition of the building which has been unoccupied for more than 60 years.

Warrington Borough Council, who purchased the building last year from private owners, say demolition contractors will initially hoard off the site in order to preserve public safety and then commence immediate demolition works.

Civic Society Chair John Shipley said: "The demolition of the cabinet works, and especially the water tower, will be a sad loss to the town's heritage and skyline.

"Whilst we accept that certain parts of the buildings are unsafe, Warrington Civic Society did not feel that demolition of the entire site was necessary and would have objected had that been proposed in a planning application.

"Unfortunately, due to the legal route taken by the Council that was not possible."

John added: "We are pleased that restoration is proposed for oldest building on the site, the former industrial school and council offices.

"Whatever development eventually replaces the cabinet works must also be of the highest possible standard. The buildings have been unused since at least the 1990s and earlier intervention would have allowed a different outcome.

"The loss of the cabinet works highlights the importance of taking a proactive stance and this story of neglect and decay must not be repeated with the town's remaining heritage."

Andy Farrall, Deputy Chief Executive and Executive Director Economic Regeneration, Growth & Environment commented: "This is a key site in Warrington's growth agenda and will in the future provide a key linkage from Palmyra Square over to the Time Square project.

"The former Cabinet Works is in an extremely dangerous condition and has largely been unoccupied for 60 years. The roof

has collapsed and the building ravaged by vandalism and the passage of time, with numerous anti-social incursions having taken place."

The site is a key location within Warrington Borough Council's framework for growth Warrington Means Business. It will provide a direct link between the £130 million Time Square regeneration project and Warrington's Cultural Quarter and help grow Warrington town centre's leisure economy. It will allow easy access across town from the bars, restaurants

and cultural amenities surrounding Queens Gardens over to the Time Square project with its multiplex cinema, restaurants and new Market Hall.

Once cleared the site will initially be utilised as a temporary car park before works commence on an eventual residential scheme, subject to planning permission

The former Council office building to the rear of the property adjacent to the Cairo Street Chapel is currently being refurbished by a private developer with the intention of creating a restaurant.

Former Market Manager takes trip down memory lane

FORMER Warrington Market manager Jack Froggatt took a trip down memory lane as he watched the demolition of his former place of work.

Jack, now aged 83, was watching the demolition work from the new temporary market, during a shopping visit with his wife Joan.

He was in charge when Warrington Market had to move from its original town centre site in the early 1970s.

"The traders had just one day to move out and set up in the new Market," recalled Jack. "It was all done in a rush and quite a bit of stuff got left behind!"

The old Market shut on the Saturday and traders had just the Sunday to move as the developers moved in on the old site on the Monday.

"The traders couldn't get back in to get things they had left!"

"There were quite a lot of teething problems with the new building, the

lifts were breaking down, people were commandeering the lifts and there was a lot of settling in needed," said Jack. "Quite a few of the traders didn't take to the new market and some of them faded away gradually."

Jack recalled his favourite memories including the atmosphere of the old fish market.

After managing the town's market and the historic move, Jack later went on to become the manager at Birchwood Shopping Centre and then following his retirement became the face of Warrington Hospital's £1m scanner appeal.

Radio 1 is not in tune with us, say students

A BROADCAST journalist quizzed Warrington students about their radio listening habits in the wake of the falling popularity of Radio 1.

BBC Broadcast journalist Phil Pegum asked students at Priestley College about how they consume music and their answers will not have made easy listening for radio bosses.

They appeared to back up recent findings that showed Radio 1's flagship programme, helmed by Nick Grimshaw, had slumped to its lowest level on record.

Only one of more than 20 students was a regular listener to Radio 1 and many had never heard of Grimshaw.

Alex Highcock, a former Wade Deacon pupil who studies BTEC Music and the Extended Project said: "We tend to listen to our music through Spotify and YouTube."

"We like to listen to our own playlists and the problem with Radio 1 is they play the same songs all the time."

The Priestley students' comments are due to be used on Radio 4's Feedback show.

The Breakfast Show with Nick Grimshaw pulled in 4.93 million

listeners a week in the third quarter of 2017, down from 5.5 million in the second quarter and 5.25 million in the same period in 2016, according to the latest figures released by audience research body Rajar.

When asked how they

discover new music, Priestley's students said they did so through recommendations from the likes of Spotify. The majority also opted out of listening to radio because they had no interest in hearing from a DJ.

Abigail Bamford, a former pupil

at St Peter & Paul Catholic College who is studying BTEC Music and A-Level English Language and Literature at Priestley said: "I prefer to listen to songs and not people talking, Radio 1 doesn't stray from the charts and we all have a wider interest in music than that."

Padgate war hero GH (Harry) Kenwright remembered

A war veteran has finally been able to lay a wreath in memory of the local hero he buried more than 70 years ago on a German battlefield.

Known to all as Harry Kenwright, the 2nd Battalion Irish Guardsman sadly died in April 1945. A special ceremony took place at Padgate War Memorial where fellow "Mick" and friend of Harry, John Welton Bent, now aged 92 laid a poppy wreath in his memory.

Over seventy two years ago GH Kenwright (25) and John Bent (19) were in the Armoured Division of the 2nd Battalion of the Irish Guards.

On March 30th, 1945 they crossed the Rhine in their respective Sherman tanks for what was going to be the final push to end the war in Europe. Tragically Harry was to be killed three days later and John with some of his comrades had the task of burying him in a nearby field before continuing their journey through the heart of Germany. Harry's grave has since been moved to the CWGC cemetery at Rheinberg. He is named on the Padgate War Memorial in Warrington.

The memorial service at Padgate was a truly remarkable and deeply personal event for many of the gathered friends, relatives, fellow Irish Guards officers, local school children and civic dignitaries. John not only fought with Harry but buried him in the midst of battle.

The laying of a poppy wreath in honour of his brother in arms at the War Memorial was a touching and poignant moment. Harry was killed

in a selfless act of bravery when he returned to his scuttled tank to rescue a fellow crewmember who was "rattling away" from the tank, providing cover. As he reached the Sherman he was shot and killed instantly.

After an introduction from the Mayor of Warrington, MD of Culture Warrington, Emma Hutchinson spoke of the history and heritage of the war memorials within the town.

Harry's story was then told by Chris Bent, the son of John Bent, using local history records at the Library and with great help from the Commonwealth War Graves Commission. Chris managed to find Harry's surviving brother and other members of the Kenwright family and they were represented at the memorial and a letter from Harry's brother John Kenwright was read to the gathered people.

Oakwood Avenue School Headmaster Gary Cunningham spoke of the ex pupil and explained how Chris had been visiting pupils to teach them of their heroic legacy.

Children from Oakwood Avenue School Choir sang "In the eyes of an angel" and "Amazing Grace" before a reading of Sassoons "At the Cenotaph" and Laurence Binyon's "For the Fallen".

After a prayer by Rev'd Neil Shaw, of Christ Church, Padgate John Bent laid a wreath of poppies on the memorial bearing the name of his wartime companion.


