WHAT is it about people that when it comes to taking part in surveys which could affect the place where, to slightly misquote the Bible, they live and move and having their being, they can't be bothered?

The population of Croft was asked to complete a survey on the Parish Plan – a document that could have a major impact on the future development of the village and, in particular, the fate of the local Green Belt.

Only about 180 of a potential 900 took the trouble to fill in the

There is no reason for the people of Croft to feel embarrassed about this for when a similar exercise was carried out at Culcheth and Glazebury, some time ago, the result was pretty much the same.

Seemingly, people either don't care or don't think their opinions will make any difference.

Fortunately, not all people are the same. In Croft, the 10 people who volunteered to become members of the steering group drawing up

the parish plan - and only three of them are parish councillors - have shown great enthusiasm and are apparently on course to complete their work in time to influence the borough council's Local Plan, which should be out in November.

Their chairman went so far as to accept a lift" in a microlight which flew high above the village while he took photographs to be used as part of the plan. Not too many of us would do that!

We understand that most of the villagers who took part in the survey have expressed opposition to more housing in the village – and in particular development in the Green Belt. We would hazard

a guess that most of the people who didn't take part feel the same, so their apathy in the face of a very real threat to the character of the village is all the more mystifying.

Whether or not houses will be built in the Green Belt at Croft remains to be seen, but if they are

we will certainly not be able to blame the man in the microlight and his team!



School wins bronze eco-award

BIRCHWOOD High School has been awarded the Eco Schools bronze award – despite only setting up its eco-committee in May.

Ten pupils from across all year groups were selected to go on the eco-committee – and immediately started work.

They completed a full environmental review of the schools, including areas such as litter, biodiversity and global citizenship.

Then they set out an action plan to tackle the issues around their selected focus area of litter and recycling, including providing more recycling bins, especially for classrooms and for plastic bottles.

It was also agreed to invite guest speakers into assembly and to study the possibility of having a community eco-day next year.

The eco-committee has visited all year group assemblies to raise awareness of the issues and hope that all pupils will work alongside the committee to help improve the school environment.

Parish Plan

Under the Chairmanship of Mr. Roger Lamming a team of local volunteers and Parish Councillors have been busy preparing a questionnaire to discover, amongst other things, residents' views on existing facilities and how the Parish area should develop. Unfortunately there was a problem with the distribution of the survey form, so Team members personally delivered forms to those who had not received one. The deadline for the return of completed forms was extended from 15th June to the 25th June to accommodate the late deliveries. The Team will soon start work on compiling the responses which will guide the direction of the Parish Plan. The Team has set itself the ambitious target of completing its work by October. The Team would like to thank everyone who has offered their support to this exercise as well as all residents who have completed and returned the questionnaire.

Traffic Issues

The Parish Council has been active in its opposition to a weight restriction order placed by Wigan MBC on a section of Winwick Lane. The effect of the restriction may cause heavy goods vehicles to divert along the Parish's narrow and already busy lanes. A representative of Warrington Borough Council will be attending the July 17th meeting of the Parish Council to provide an update on the traffic flows measured before and since the restriction was introduced. Residents are invited to attend and hear the discussion.

Parkside Development

Together with Culcheth & Glazebury Parish Council, Croft Parish Council retained the services of a consultant. The consultant's brief was to assess the various planning applications being made to St. Helens Metropolitan Borough Council in respect of the above site. The particular emphasis was to identify impacts on the Parish Councils' communities. The consultant prepared detailed objections which were considered and supported by both Parish Councils before being submitted to St. Helens MBC.



Local Mum launch Making a Difference

A GROUP of parents and volunteers have been working hard to change perceptions of young people in Culcheth, Croft and Glazebury after a number of anti-social behaviour incidents in

They say although the incidents were led by a handful of youths, all local young people began to get tarred with the same brush.

Groups of youngsters looking for somewhere to 'hang out' were assumed to be up to no good, when in actual fact they were just looking for somewhere safe and dry to sond time with their fair fact. dry to spend time with their friends.

Many local parents leapt to the defence of their children, as they felt they were being unfairly

represented.

Mother on one Lesley Cragg organised a meeting for residents, parents and youth organisations to air their concerns and look at how facilities and provision could be improved for young people in the area.

She said: "I felt it was important we address the issues in the local area and work together to ensure our children have services locally that they want to participate in. From this idea the Culcheth Youth

Project was born"

Through a number of meetings, a core group of about 30 volunteers, led by Lesley, established that young people felt there was a lack of things to do in the area during evenings and weekends. With the exception of uniformed groups, there was nowhere for there was nowhere for young people to spend time with their friends.

By working in conjunction with the borough council Neighbourhood Team and Culcheth High School the group compiled a consultation questionnaire which was completed by 800 Culcheth High School pupils When asked what sort of places

they would like to see in the local area, a café which offered Wi-Fi access came out top with 65 per cent of pupils selecting that as preference. Additionally, more access to sports facilities and groups was highlighted with 37 per cent asking for a kick-about area and 31 per cent hoping for 'turn up and play' sport sessions. Popular sports included football, rugby, dance, boxing, tennis, netball and basketball.

When asked what they felt would improve their lives the students top three answers were: being listened to / having a voice in decisions which affect them; feeling safe outside the house and having more opportunities to play sport and

Parish plan volunteers go above the call of duty!

MEMBERS of the steering group drawing up a parish plan for Croft have gone above the call of duty – quite literally.

Chairman Roger Lamming and a local resident who owns a microlight flew above the village and surrounding areas taking aerial photographs for use in the

The plan is due to be completed around October or November in time to have some influence on Warrington Borough Council's Local Plan

Local Plan
A consultation exercise in the village has been completed but despite the deadline being extended twice, only about 180 residents out of a possible 900 filled in survey forms.

Cllr Keith Bland (pictured) said: "It was disappointing more people did not fill in the forms. We did have a few problems distributing them but even so I would have liked to have seen more people take to have seen more people take

part. "We have a very enthusiastic

steering group – all volunteers – and they are doing great work. But it would appear a lot of local people do not realise just how important the parish plan is for the future of Croft.

"The borough council's preferred development option (PDO) for the local plan suggests that 60 houses could be built on Green Belt land at Croft. The completed survey forms I have seen suggest that Croft people don't want them – they see the Green Belt as sacrosanct.

"We know developers have

"We know developers have their eyes on Croft for some time – including big developers who will want to build a lot more than 60 houses.

The whole character of the village could be changed – and not for the better.

The Parish Plan Steering Group is made of seven residents and three members of the parish council.

Residents urged to turn up in force for HS2 meeting

RESIDENTS of the Culcheth area are being urged to turn up in force at a meeting to discuss the controversial HS2 rail line's impact on the village.

Members of Culcheth and Glazebury Parish Council fear the latest information made available by HS2 Ltd shows the environmental

by HS2 Ltd shows the environmental effect on Culcheth will be even worse than previously thought. Maps showing the route, construction compounds, public rights of way and diversions and realignments will be available at the meeting on Monday, July 2 at Culcheth Sports Club.

They are already available online but are labelled "work in

progress" so are not necessarily the final versions.

Cllr Margaret Webber, chairman of the parish council, said: "We have always made it clear to HS2 that we are completely opposed to the Golborne Link – the section of HS2 that will effect Culcheth.

"But the latest information is very disturbing.

"It appears Wigshaw Lane will be completely blocked off. "There will be tremendous disruption of Culcheth and of

communication between Culcheth and Croft and Winwick.

"We are very concerned – and we want to make sure local people realise how important it is that they attend the meeting on July 2 to

The meeting – which will be a drop-in session – is scheduled to last from 2pm to 8pm.

last from 2pm to 8pm.

Cllr Jacqui Johnson said: "The maps show more details than we have had before – whether, for instance, the line is on an embankment or bridge, on the level or in a cutting. But there are no elevations to show how high or doop it tages." deep it goes.

"But one thing to realise is that the line cuts across Wigshaw Lane which is to be stopped up.

"Traffic from Croft will have to turn right before Glaziers Lane and travel south of the railway and up an embankment to join the raised and realigned Warrington Road before turning left to rejoin Wigshaw Lane near the linear park. "It will affect walkers and cyclists

as well as vehicles.
"This stretch of HS2 will be of no benefit and will damage our villages and adversely affect residents and businesses.
"The problem is there is a set of the set of th

"The problem is there is only the Warrington Road crossing point of HS2, other than Wilton Lane to the north or the A57 to the south."

"During construction and afterwards it will add to existing traffic problems."

"Man of Steel" George to represent the UK

A 15-year-old Birchwood High School pupil has qualified to represent Team UK in this year's Obstacle Course Racing World Championships in London in

It will be nothing new for George Houghton, from Locking Stumps, because he represented the UK in the 13-17 age category in the same championships in Canada

last October.

He won three medals and was ranked 21st in the world for sprint distance – and back at Birchwood High he was dubbed "Man of Steel"

Obstacle Course Racing is

becoming increasingly popular and consists of events such as Spartan, Born Survivor, Tough Mudder and Total Warrior.

George has been excelling in such events for some time, developing his fitness and skills and has had strong finishing positions, winning a number of junior competitions and moving on to compete a 15k adult event coming complete a 15k adult event, coming first in the under-18 category.

Chairman Cllr Tony McCarthy said: "We can't support something like this when there is no infrastructure in place. committee rejected recommendation from their own officers that they should not object.

The outline application for the scheme will be dealt with by St Helens – but Warrington consulted as a neighbouring

authority.

The current application is for the first phase of the work – intended to be completed during 2020.

Phase Two would be completed in 2024 and a later proposal for a strategic rail freight interchange is targeted to be operational by 2030

Based on the emerging St Helens Local Plan, the land would be

removed from the Green Belt and allocated for employment.

But there is major opposition in the Winwick area because of the likely impact on local roads and the loss of Green Belt land. Culcheth and Glazebury Parish Council and Croft Parish Council have also lodged objections and it is understood that a number of local residents have objected directly to St Helens Council.
