# Leaving the EU. What does it mean for you?

When we leave the European Union, we will also leave the EU customs union. The question we all want to know the answer to is 'what that means for me?' Well first, let's have a quick reminder of what the customs union is. In short, it's an agreement between European member states that there will be no internal tariffs on goods that move between them. Once goods are within the EU, they can also travel freely. This means that administrative and financial barriers to trade within the EU are massively reduced.

So why would we want to leave? The important factor of the customs union in the Brexit debate has been that while you're in it, you don't have the freedom to negotiate your own trade deals on goods from other parts of the world. The government insists that such freedom is integral to the success of Brexit.

There are alternative options to a customs union that are being considered, firstly a customs partnership in which the UK collects the EU's tariffs on goods from other countries on behalf of the EU. If the UK tariffs were lower, and those goods stayed within the UK, then companies would be able to claim back the difference. This would potentially lead to greater bureaucracy and added costs.

Secondly, the idea of a 'highly streamlined customs arrangement' has been proposed. The suggestion is that rather than getting rid of checks altogether, they would be

minimised. Trusted trader schemes and new technologies would be used to ensure companies make bulk payments for the duties, rather than each time goods cross a border. Of course, we also have the issue of Ireland to address. All involved parties have made a firm commitment to keeping an open border between the Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland. We're yet to see a suggestion that offers the perfect solution to this delicate issue.

Leaving the customs union could mean increased border checks and supply chains within industry would be heavily affected. Businesses operating 'just-in-time' production, such as those in the automotive industry, have multiple goods coming into the UK from mainland Europe every day. Honda, for example, relies on 350 trucks arriving daily; a 15-minute delay to their factory in Swindon would lead to an estimated cost of £850.000.

We are likely looking at higher tariffs. Switzerland and Norway do experience tariff-free access to the EU from outside the customs union but in return, they allow free movement of works and contribute to the EU budget. With immigration being such a large factor of the Brexit negotiations and the UK looking to restrict the free movement of people, it's unlikely that we will negotiate a similar agreement.

# Bringing a taste of Italy to Appleton

A café owner is hoping to bring a taste of Italy to Appleton after winning planning permission for a pizzeria takeaway.

Karen Howard has been granted permission by Warrington Borough Council planners to transform her Bizzie Beans café on Bridge Lane,

Appleton. The a application involves ground floor unit of No. 40 Bridge Lane, in Appleton, which is situated within a terraced row, between two convenience stores, one to either side and a hairdressers.

Residential flats are situated above the units, and the area is primarily residential in character.

Planners have agreed to allow to change of use of the unit to a hot food takeaway (A5 use class), with plans to operate as a pizzeria between 11:00 and 21:00, seven days a week.

The application was supported by local Councillor Sharon Harris who said the application had the potential to increase community cohesiveness within the Cobbs estate.

Cllr Harris said: "Bizzie Beans is a community café which provides an invaluable service to a number of local people, some of whom are somewhat vulnerable. It is greatly valued as a community resource and the change of use would not affect this. In fact, it would enable the owner to continue the business. It is well known that these units are hard to let and prior to Bizzie Beans taking occupation, the unit was empty and boarded up for several years.

Bizzie Beans hosts a number of community events such as a monthly book club and PSCO surgeries. It was also an integral part of the Christmas Lantern Walk which was organised by the South Area Team and the Parish

Cllr Harris added: "The Cobbs estate is sadly lacking in a number of amenities and the change of use from café to pizzeria would, I suspect, be something that residents would find useful. "

Karen added: "A lot of our customers are older people who are keen to see this kind of facility in the local community.

"We have been open since January 20 and this planning permission gives us an extra string to our bow. It will be an Italian style Street café. It will give the older people an opportunity to get out in the evenings, without the hassle of trying to get to Stockton Heath and finding somewhere to park.'

Karen isn't sure yet when work will start on the transformation - but the planning consent lasts for three years.

WREN is a not-for-profit business that awards grants for community, biodiversity and heritage projects from funds donated by FCC Environment through the Landfill Communities Fund.

Richard Smith, WREN's grant manager for Warrington, said: "It's always nice to see something we have funded start to take shape. We're delighted to be supporting such a worthwhile project and look forward to it benefitting community groups across Warrington.

Appleton Parish Council is also providing funds for the renovation project and the Parish Council was also successful in being awarded £1,500 from the Community Initiative Warrington Fund from Borough Council.





# **Making Tax Digital**

With only 9 months to go before many businesses are affected then it is time to once again look at the Making Tax Digital ("MTD") reporting being introduced in respect of VAT from April 2019.

MTD will affect all VAT registered businesses with UK taxable turnover in excess of the VAT registration threshold, which is currently £85,000 per annum. These businesses will be required to comply with the MTD record keeping and reporting for VAT periods beginning on or after 1st April

2019. If a VAT registered business has a turnover below £85,000 at April 2019 then they will not be required to enter the MTD regime immediately. However, those business will need to monitor their turnover on a rolling 12 month basis, in the same way as businesses not registered for VAT, and if their turnover exceeds the VAT registration threshold then they will enter the MTD regime at the start of the next VAT period. Once in the MTD regime then it will continue to apply to that business even if turnover drops below the registration limit unless the business deregisters for VAT.

HMRC have stated that they will support alternative methods of submitting VAT returns, such as the current online interactive VAT form, but only until April 2020. After that date it is possible that all VAT registered businesses will be required to enter the MTD regime.

All businesses which are caught by MTD will need to submit their VAT Returns using MTD-compatible software. This can be an accounting package or spreadsheet, but it must be able to connect directly to HMRC's systems. The system must be able to:

- Keep the required records in a digital format
- Preserve those records for up to 6 years
  Create a VAT return from those records and which will include, as well

- as the current information:

   A split of sales, and VAT chargeable, at the various VAT rates

   A record of the Input VAT claimed for each purchase

   Provide this information to HMRC digitally, without any manual intervention
- Provide HMRC with additional information as required
   Receive information from HMRC about the business's compliance record

With relevant adjustment, the above requirements apply to group registrations, and to businesses reporting under annual accounting, and to businesses using any of the special schemes, such as flat rate, retail and margin.

MTD will initially only apply to VAT reporting, and penalties will be charged for non-compliance subject to a 12 month soft-glove approach. Whilst the government's intention is to extend it to other taxes they have stated that they will not do so before "the system has been shown to work". Welcome to the world of the lab rat!
