ditor's Comment

IF you saw the BBC2 factual drama Mother's Day which was screened recently telling the story of two women brought together by tragedy following the IRA bomb attack on Warrington on March 20 1993, it will have been hard not to have been moved.

Twenty five years on from the tragedy which claimed the lives of 12-year-old Tim Parry and three-year-old Johnathan Ball, Mother's Day focused on the immediate aftermath of the bombing and how it impacted on two mums and their

By the time you read this I will be just about to, or just have completed, my first ever 10k in the annual English Half marathon.



ROCK legend Wilko Johnson is continuing his rousing return to the stage after battling cancer and is returning to Warrington next year.

The band has announced a raft of new dates, including a stop at Parr Hall

on Friday March 1 2019, with fans eagerly anticipating another whirlwind

Following Wilko's cancer recovery, the original Dr Feelgood guitarist has returned to the top of his game with a rousing return to the live arena, a Number 1 album with Roger Daltrey and a sold-out show at The Royal Albert Hall to mark his 70th birthday.

Heavily influenced by rock and roll guitarist Mick Green, Wilko employs

a finger-style, chop-chord strumming action, known as 'the stab', in his own

This allows for chords and lead guitar to be played at the same time, giving a fluency and distinctive sound very unlike the cleaner swat of a pick.

Wilko became one of the guitar heroes of an era with this economic sound, coupled with that black-suited, scowling look and the yards he covered across the stage pausing only to twist the guitar lead out from under

Following a stint with Ian Dury & The Blockheads in the 80s he eventually formed The Wilko Johnson Band with ex-Blockhead Norman Watt-Roy on

Also featuring Dylan Howe on drums, the trio have become one of the most exciting rhythm and blues bands in the world today.





"We always knew from the
moment this production was moment this production was talked about, that it would be hard hitting, but ultimately would tell a story about the families and a town coming out of a tragedy and building a sense of hope and making a real difference. "The names of Tim and Johnathan

are known across the world and their legacy lives on. Mother's Day also showed how Warrington came together, at first with some anger and confusion, but quickly leading to a search for reconciliation and peace. It was Warrington that reached out to other communities

drama was screened at the Peace Centre prior to the broadcast on BBC2, with members of the cast in attendance alongside the Parry family and Peace 93 campaigner

family and Peace 93 campaigner Susan McHugh. Written by Newton-le-Willows based Nick Leather (Murdered For Being Different), Vicky McClure (Line of Duty) plays Susan McHugh, the Dublin mother of two so outraged by the loss of young life that she organised one of the largest peace rallies in Irish history, leading thousands through the streets in protest at the continued violence of the Troubles.

Maxwell Anna (Motherland) plays Wendy Parry, the mother of 12 year old Tim, who lost his life in the attack which left two boys dead and many others

To a turnout of over 100 people, including Councillors from across Party lines, the former Transport Czar gave an impassioned speech about his views on Britain, Europe and the political processes currently playing out in Parliament around the Brexit question.

In particular the Labour Peer called for support and action to help put pressure on Councils, MP's and Ministers to support the move for "a Peoples Vote" on the final Brexit deal reached by Theresa May's Government and their Brussels counterparts.

A series of protests at Party conferences have been organised with a "Peoples March" in London planned in October, with organisers hoping to see over 1 million protesters on the streets of the Capital.

The Warrington for Europe group has been set up to raise awareness about the EU and Brexit and is backing calls for a referendum on the terms of the final Brexit deal. They plan a series of street surgeries beginning on Saturday, September 8 at Market Gate, where they will be on hand to discuss Brexit or provide information to the Warrington public.

They also plan to lobby Warrington Borough Council to undertake and publish a Brexit risk assessment and to support "the Peoples Vote" as other towns and cities have done.

The ducks were then thrown off Kingsway Bridge into the River Mersey, with prizes for first pass the finishing line.



David has reported on local news for 60 years with Gary approaching 40 years - nearly a century between them!



My Warrington Remembers Legh Street Baths

by Gordon Gandy



THIS month Gordon Gandy remembers Legh Street Baths.

The first public baths in Warrington opened on Church Street on 1 May

The foundation stone for Legh Street Baths was laid in 1865 and the site opened in 1866. They were originally privately owned by the Warrington Baths Company, who went bankrupt. The council purchased them in 1873 and added two extra pools in 1912.

The four pools were the Teaching pool, Family pool, the General pool and the Gala pool. Between them they contained over one million litres of water. All pools used to have a three-tiered diving block at the deep end. The

All pools used to have a three-tiered diving block at the deep end. The Teaching pool also had a diving platform, even though the pool was only about four feet deep at the deepest! These were later removed for health and safety reasons. The Gala pool often doubled up as a dancing venue when they covered the pool with a temporary floor.

Warrington had a taste of the Olympics in 1948, when a team of water polo players faced masters Australia in a gripping encounter at Legh Street Baths. During the late 1970s, there used to be 'Play Pool' sessions in the summer holidays for children.

In later years part of the site included a gymnasium which was formerly opened by Olympic swimmer Adrian Moorhouse on 5 April 1994. I still have the plaque from the event. The baths closed in 2003.

In 2004, former Olympic swimmer Helen Slatter expressed sadness at the closure of the baths. She trained there with the Warriors of Warrington swimming club.

The baths were demolished in 2013 to make way for a health centre, with some of the stonework from the baths incorporated into the new decor. To contact Gordon email gigan@mywarrington.me.uk

Facing higher tax bills

Millions of self-employed workers will now face higher tax bills because Chancellor Philip Hammond has scrapped plans to abolish Class 2 National Insurance contributions (NICs)

This is payable by those who earn profits of £6,205 or more per year. At the current rate of £2.95 per week it costs about £150 per year. The Treasury estimated that this tax cut would cost the exchaguer ground. cost the exchequer around £360m per year, meaning Mr Hammond now has hundreds of millions of pounds extra in the national coffers.

The abolishment of Class 2 NICs was due to occur last April, but was delayed for 12 months. The explanation for this delay was that the government wanted to "ensure that there are no unintended consequences for the lowest paid". However, coincidentally, the announcement was made within days of the Chancellor being forced into a U-Turn when he had to abandon a proposed increase of 1% in the rate of Class 4 NIC, also paid by the self-employed, which many though was against the government's election manifesto commitments not to increase tax not to increase tax.

So what excuse have they come up with now to explain this second U-Turn on tax for the self-employed? In their own words: "A significant number of self-employed individuals on the lowest profits would have seen the voluntary payment they make to maintain access to the state pension rise substantially. Having listened to those likely to be affected by this change we have concluded that it would not be right to proceed during this pertiagent given the peacetive impacts it early have a some during this parliament, given the negative impacts it could have on some of the lowest earning in our society. Furthermore, it has become clear that, to the extent that the government could address these concerns, the options identified introduce greater complexity to the tax system, undermining the original objective of the policy."

They added "The government remains committed to simplifying the tax system for the self-employed, and will keep this issue under review in the context of the wider tax system and the sustainability of the public

This view is not necessarily shared by everyone. Mike Cherry, national chairman of the Federation of Small Businesses, voiced many people's views when he said: "The self-employed community has been let down today, missing out on a promise to reduce their tax burden.

This situation was created by the government themselves when they decided to increase the voluntary Class3 contribution substantially. Originally Class 3 NIC was 10p per week lower than Class 2 so people with no other contribution record that year could pay that instead of Class 2 to protect their benefits. Now Class 3 is £761 per annum compared to £153.40 for Class 2.

famous old trophy.

Warrington eventually got on the board on the half hour mark, Ben Murdoch-Masila pouncing on a mistake by Fouad Yaha to score

a mistake by Fouad Yaha to score their opening try.
But the Dragons restored their eight point lead at the break, Ben Garcia's converted score putting them 14-6 to the good.
The first score of the second half would be crucial and it went to Catalans. Lance Todd Trophy winner Tony Gigot kicked a 40/20

to give them good field position, and from that Brayden Wiliame crossed to extend their lead to 20-

A Gigo fumbled allowed Tyrone Roberts to set up George King to drag the Wolves back in to it at 20-12 before the hour mark, but despite their efforts they couldn't break the Dragons down.

A Roberts penalty on 70 minutes at least got them within touching distance, but the Dragons held on for a famous victory in front of 50,672 – the lowest crowd at Wembley for a rugby league cup final since the second world war. But few will begrudge Catalans

their historic day as the challenge cup left English soil for the first time

in its 121 year history.

The Wolves bounced back from the disappointment with a recordbreaking 80-10 victory over Hull FC in the Super 8s at the Halliwell Jones Staidum - the heaviest ever defeat suffered by the Humberside


